434. Hon Jim Scott to the Parliamentary Secretary representing the Minister for Planning and Infrastructure
- (1) Does the *Heathcote Co-ordination Agreement 2001* state that the lower Heathcote land be zoned as Parks and Recreation under the Metropolitan Region Scheme?
 - (2) Is the State Government bound by the *Heathcote Co-ordination Agreement*?
 - (3) If not, why not?
 - (4) Has the City of Melville declared the lower Heathcote land as public open space?
 - (5) Does the State Government intend to zone the land in keeping with the City of Melville's public open space plan?
 - (6) If not, why not?
 - (7) Has the National Trust heritage listed Heathcote, including the lower land?
 - (8) Has the Government consulted with the Department of Indigenous Affairs regarding significant Aboriginal sites at the Heathcote lower land?
 - (9) If yes, will the Minister table correspondence between the Department of Planning and Infrastructure and the Department of Indigenous Affairs?
 - (10) Does the Government intend to allow housing on the lower Heathcote land?
 - (11) If so, at what R-code?
