## NON-METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICTS, STAFFING LEVELS

## 1400. Hon MURRAY CRIDDLE to the minister representing the Minister for Police and Emergency Services:

Following my recent visit to Esperance, I read in *The Esperance Express* that of the 14 police districts in Western Australia 11 are undermanned.

- (1) Can the minister release the staffing levels and current vacancies at the following non-metropolitan districts -
  - (a) Kimberley;
  - (b) Pilbara;
  - (c) midwest-Gascoyne;
  - (d) the south west;
  - (e) Albany;
  - (f) the great southern;
  - (g) the wheat belt; and
  - (h) Goldfields-Esperance?
- Will the minister commit to fully staffing these districts, and, in particular, fill the two vacant positions in Esperance and one in Northam?
