

POLICE, COMPLAINTS BY MR LEO MORRISSEY

2168. Hon Jim Scott to the Minister for Housing and Works representing the Minister for Police and Emergency Services
- (1) Between December 2001 and February 2002, did you receive letters from Leo Morrissey complaining that he was a victim of daily violence, threats, abuse and stalking in his own home and that the police and Commissioner of Police refused to conduct a proper investigation or act on his legitimate complaints?
- (2) On what date did you receive the first letter?
- (3) How many letters did you receive from Mr Morrissey on this matter?
- (4) What action have you taken on this matter?

Hon NICK GRIFFITHS replied:

- (1)-(4) I have received numerous letters from Mr Morrissey since early 2001. The vast majority of these have not been directly addressed to me, but copied to myself. Mr Morrissey has received responses from myself, the former Commissioner of Police, the Assistant Commissioner (Professional Standards), the Police Service Internal Investigations Unit, and the Officer in Charge of the Police Service Freedom of Information Services. Mr Morrissey's complaint has been investigated by Police and he has been advised that unless he raises new issues or provides new evidence, his letters will be noted and filed.
