# HOSPITALS - EAR, NOSE AND THROAT SURGERY - WAITING LISTS

## 1740. Mr P.D. Omodei to the Minister for Health

- (1) What is the wait list for ear, nose and throat surgery at -
  - (a) Royal Perth Hospital;
  - (b) Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital;
  - (c) Fremantle Hospital;
  - (d) Joondalup Hospital; and
  - (e) Princess Margaret Hospital?
- (2) How many patients are on the wait list for ear, nose and throat surgery at non-teaching public hospitals?
- (3) What is the -
  - (a) longest wait time;
  - (b) shortest wait time; and
  - (c) average wait time

patients experience to receive these procedures at each hospital?

## Mr J.A. McGINTY replied:

(1) As at 25 February 2007 the numbers of cases waiting on the ENT wait list at the specified hospitals are as follows:

(a)	Royal Perth Hospital (RPH)	438
(b)	Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital (SCGH)	176
(c)	Fremantle Hospital (FH)	89
(d)	Joondalup Health Campus (JHC)	270
(e)	Princess Margaret Hospital (PMH)	987

- (2) As at 25 February 2007 the total number of cases on the wait list for ENT surgery at the non-tertiary metropolitan public hospitals was 632.
- (3) As at 25 February 2007 ENT waiting times at the above-mentioned hospitals were as follows:
