MENTAL HEALTH - REGIONAL INITIATIVES

3764. Hon Murray Criddle to the Parliamentary Secretary representing the Minister for Health

In relation to mental health initiatives in regional Western Australia, and the State Government's \$173 million, three year mental health strategy, I ask -

- (1) How much of the \$173 million has been allocated to mental health initiatives in regional Western Australia?
- (2) Can you please detail each regional mental health initiative, including the amount allocated in each year and the location?
- (3) Does the \$173 million over three years represent the State Government's total commitment to Mental Health over the next three years?
- (4) If not, please detail the additional funding that will be allocated to regional mental health initiatives in each of the next three years, including each project to be funded, amount allocated and its location.
- (5) In relation to the Federal Government's \$1.8 billion mental health initiative -
 - (a) What portion of the \$1.8 billion has been allocated to mental health initiatives in regional Western Australia in each of the next three years?
 - (b) Please detail what initiatives have been funded in regional areas, how much has been allocated to each initiative in each year and where the initiative is located.

Hon SUE ELLERY replied:

(1) The WA Country Health Services Mental Health budget allocation for 2005/06 is \$27.213m. In addition, of the State Governments \$173m allocated through the Mental Health Strategy 2004 - 2007, WA Country Health Services has been allocated a total of \$6.5m over three years for the expansion of Community Mental Health Services across regional WA.

The remaining Mental Health Strategy 2004 - 2007 funding will be allocated to individual CSRUs upon completion of the competitive tendering process.

In addition, the following capital initiatives are also being progressed:

- The Bunbury Mental Health Inpatient Unit, with capital funding of \$6.052m, is being expanded by a further 18 beds.
- A new Community Mental Health Clinic is to be built with capital funding of \$3.18m.

Funding allocations for recurrent FTE are yet to be determined. The DHW have called for tenders, for both facilities, with a contract to be awarded by 27 October 2006. The DHW anticipate commencement by the builder to be 1 November 2006.

- (3) The \$173m represents additional mental health funding over three years.
- (4) Not applicable.
- (5) The Federal Government has not released details of this initiative at this time.
