

**HERITAGE (CONSEQUENTIAL PROVISIONS) BILL 2000**

*Introduction and First Reading*

Bill introduced, on motion by Mr Kierath (Minister for Heritage), and read a first time.

*Second Reading*

**MR KIERATH** (Riverton - Minister for Heritage) [9.45 am]: I move -

That the Bill be now read a second time.

The Heritage (Consequential Provisions) Bill amends or modifies certain related legislation in order to give effect to the provisions of the Heritage Bill 2000. Those changes are minor in scale but necessary in order to resolve such matters as: The removal of the requirement for applications for planning consent and building licence approval for heritage places to be referred to the Heritage Council of Western Australia for comment, as the Heritage Bill provides for a separate approval system for works to such places; providing a procedure for the determination of certain heritage related matters through the planning appeals system; and replacing the name “Heritage of Western Australia Act 1990” with “Heritage Act 2000” wherever that occurs.

I commend the Bill to the House.
