We, the undersigned say:

1. That a Hazardous Waste Treatment Plant at Kemerton Industrial Park would impinge on the amenity and safety of neighbouring residents.
2. Public drinking water would be at risk of contamination.
3. Vulnerable fauna and flora would suffer loss of habitat and suffer from fugitive emissions.

The petition bears 2 650 signatures and I certify that it conforms to the standing orders of the Legislative Assembly.

It might be of interest to you as well that there have been 124 petitions this session of Parliament; only one other petition has achieved more than 5 000 signatures, as this one has done. I also present a petition that reads as follows -
