879. Mr P.J. RUNDLE to the Premier:

The SPEAKER: Order, please.

Mr R.H. COOK replied:

We saw the fact that the Nationals WA would not even sit in the same room as the Liberal ministers when it came to decisions that it should have been active on, but that its members excused themselves on.
