PROSTITUTION

Petition

MR P.D. OMODEI (Warren-Blackwood - Leader of the Opposition) [2.51 pm]: I have a petition from 1 951 petitioners opposed to the legalisation of prostitution in Western Australia in the following terms -

To the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly in Parliament assembled:

Because the legalisation of prostitution in other Australian States has led to

- an increase in the number of brothels, both legal and illegal
- an increase in the number of young women becoming prostitutes
- an increase in the number of men using prostitutes

and because prostitution compounds social injustice through

- the degradation of women who enter prostitution
- the demeaning of women whose husbands and boyfriends use prostitutes
- the fracture and consequent welfare dependency of families broken by the infidelities of men with prostitutes

we respectfully urge the Parliament not to legalise any aspect of the trade of prostitution in Western Australia.

Instead, we urge the Parliament to enact laws to

- enforce a complete ban on advertising of prostitution, especially in the "Personal" columns of The West Australian newspaper
- ensure adequate police powers and realistic penalties to make running brothels and escort agencies unviable
- support rehabilitation programs for prostitutes, such as Linda's House of Hope.

This petition conforms to the standing orders of the Legislative Assembly.
