POLICE — REGIONAL ENFORCEMENT UNIT

639. Hon JIM CHOWN to the minister representing the Minister for Police:

I refer to the current Premier's statement made on 20 December 2016, which states —

"WA's road toll is devastating. Every life lost on our roads, is one too many.

. . .

"With 62 per cent of road deaths occurring in regional WA we need to act now.

I also note he stated —

"The new Regional Enforcement Unit will travel around the State to target areas where the regional road toll is disproportionately high.

To this end, it states —

An additional \$3.7million will be provided for WA Police ...

- (1) When will the regional enforcement unit be operational?
- (2) How many police will be allocated to the unit?
- (3) Will the regional enforcement unit staff be part of a dedicated team committed solely to the role of the enforcement unit, as defined by the Premier?
- (4) Can the minister explain the shortfall of \$1.2 million from the election promise made by the Premier of \$3.7 million that was to be allocated to the police budget?

Hon STEPHEN DAWSON replied:

I thank the honourable member for some notice of this question.

- (1) The regional enforcement unit will commence operations in 2017–18.
- (2) There will be 25 police allocated to the unit.
- (3) Yes.
- (4) There is no shortfall of funding. The government has allocated \$18.54 million for the regional enforcement unit across the forward estimates, starting with \$2.5 million in its establishment year in 2017–18.
