BUSSELTON JETTY

757. Mr M.P. MURRAY to the Minister for South West:

Recent media reports have stated that the Shire of Busselton will again consider the state government's generous offer to repair and maintain Busselton jetty. This issue is a bit like an episode of *Blue Heelers*. I welcome John Wood into the chamber! Is the minister aware of any opposition to this proposal?

Mr M. McGOWAN replied:

I think the member meant Blue Hills, Mr Speaker!

I am pleased to inform the house that some councillors on the Shire of Busselton are moving to accept the state government's very generous offer to fix Busselton jetty. It appears from media commentary in the south west that Andrew Macnish, the president of the Shire of Busselton, and council staff are supporting that move.

Several members interjected.

The SPEAKER: Order, members!

Mr M. McGOWAN: It is very interesting to note that the member for Vasse has been out in the community saying that he opposes shire council staff having too much say on council issues. I quote from an article in the *Busselton Dunsborough Mail* -

Mr Buswell said -

Mr T. Buswell: Have you read the Local Government Act?

Mr M. McGOWAN: Keep saying it. What did the member for Vasse say?

Mr T. Buswell: Have you read the Local Government Act?

Mr M. McGOWAN: So the member for Vasse is still opposed?
