Question on Notice 6315 — Answer Advice

MR M.P. MURRAY (Collie-Preston) [3.18 pm]: I missed the jump a little earlier on at the conclusion of questions without notice. I ask about question on notice 6315 —

The SPEAKER: Member for Collie-Preston, I know that we discussed this and I have given you this opportunity and some leniency because of the situations that developed after question time, but question 6315 was asked within the last calendar month; you need to wait for at least one month after you have put that question to the ministers. I also note that the minister is not in the house. Realistically, as I think I explained to the member for Rockingham yesterday, for those questions on notice for which you have not received a response, you need to wait another calendar month before you can raise it in the house. There is no other opportunity that I can give you, Member for Collie-Preston.

Mr M.P. MURRAY: If I may, with due respect: I certainly understand that, but the minister herself insists that this question has been answered, but it has not.

The SPEAKER: All I can suggest to the member for Collie–Preston is that he takes it up with her office.
