2010. Hon Murray Criddle to the Minister for Local Government and Regional Development

Can the minister please provide the following information relating to the Regional Investment Fund initiated in June 2001 -

- (1) Each successful applicant, a description of the project and the amount allocated under the Regional Infrastructure Funding Program (RIFP)?
- (2) Each successful applicant, a description of the project and the amount allocated under the Regional Development Scheme (RDS) administered by the nine Regional Development Commissions?
- (3) Each successful applicant, a description of the project and the amount allocated under the WA Regional Initiatives Fund?
- (4) For those applicants who were not successful, a list of each applicant, a description of the project and the amount requested through the -
 - (a) Regional Infrastructure Funding Program (RIFP);
 - (b) Regional Development Scheme (RDS); and
 - (c) WA Regional Initiatives Fund (WARIS)?
- (5) A list of allocations that were not the subject of an 'expression of interest' or 'application' to the Regional Investment Fund?
- (6) The total amount to date allocated under the three schemes from the original \$75 million?
- (7) The total amount remaining for allocation from the original \$75 million?
- (8) Will the remaining funds be made available through the three schemes during the 2004-05 financial year?

Hon TOM STEPHENS replied:

(1) The Regional Infrastructure Funding Program (RIFP), the major \$55 million component of the Government's \$75 million Regional Investment Fund (RIF), has been divided into three funding categories. These are RIFP contestable funding rounds (of which three have been held), strategic commitments and the Indigenous Infrastructure Program (IIP). Two main schemes were developed under IIP – the Indigenous Arts and Tourism Facilities Funding Program (IATFFP) and the Indigenous Infrastructure Projects Program (IIPP).

- (4) I am unwilling to table the information on unsuccessful applicants for RIFP and WARIS. This type of information has not been provided in Parliament before. Unsuccessful applicants are not required to meet these conditions. It would be necessary to obtain permission from each applicant to release the information, which has been provided in confidence for assessment purposes.

- (6) The total amount of funding allocated from the Regional Investment Fund to date is \$71,489,878.72. This includes two projects allocated for 2005-06 funding the Bugarrigurra Nyurdany Interpretive Centre \$750,000 out of RIFP, and the Department of Housing and Works' Workplace Relations and Recruitment Service \$300,000 out of WARIS.
- (7) The amount remaining for allocation from the original \$75 million under the three schemes, totals \$960,121, detailed as follows WARIS \$57,008.28

RIFP \$27,890 IATFFP \$1,257 IIPP \$670,966, and Excess RDS \$203,000

\$3.6 million will also be available to the nine Regional Development Commissions to allocate in their 2004-05 rounds of RDS.

(8) These funds will be allocated during 2004-05.
