GRAIN TRANSPORT — QUAIRADING

1059. Hon KEN TRAVERS to the parliamentary secretary representing the Minister for Transport:

Considering my question was asked a couple of days ago, I hope the minister can answer it this time.

- (1) Is the Minister for Transport confident that all grain currently held at the Quairading bin will be transported to port through Cunderdin?
- (2) If no to (1)
 - (a) does the Minister expect any of the grain will be transported to port by trucks using the Quairading to York road; and
 - (b) does the minister expect that all the grain that is transported on the Quairading to York road will be transferred to rail at York?

Hon JIM CHOWN replied:

I thank the honourable member for some notice of this question.

(1)–(2) The state government, together with the commonwealth, has committed \$352 million over four years to upgrade road and rail infrastructure across the wheatbelt. This is an unprecedented investment and will help deliver a safer grain freight network to the region.
