- (1) How much was spent on hosting functions for 'guests' of Parliament in 2006-2007 and can the Speaker advise the proposed budget for functions in 2007-2008?
- (2) How much did the 'Hard Hat' function cost upon completion of the refurbishments of the Legislative Assembly?
- (3) What was the total cost of the audiovisual screens in the public gallery, including the total cost of installation and the cost per screen?
- (4) What works are yet to be completed in the Legislative Assembly and what is the estimated cost of this future work?
- (5) Can the Speaker provide a full list of all contractors that have undertaken work at Parliament?
- (6) Can the Speaker provide a list of the building maintenance backlog?
- (7) Can the Speaker provide a list of the furniture (and the cost of replacement) that is being replaced in Parliament House and associated offices (i.e. Committee offices)?

Mr F. RIEBELING replied:

(1) The following were the main functions held by the Legislative Assembly or were held in the Chamber during 2006-07:

Items a, b, c and g are events that will not recur in the next financial year.
