Question: Ms Hodson-Thomas asked that the minister provide the cost of the Marnja Jarndu audit and to clarify who BDO is.

Answer: The service provided by BDO was to identify the expected budget outturn for 2001-02 financial year and to assist Marnja Jarndu to formulate a budget for 2002-03 within available funding. Current cost of the service is \$3 357.00. BDO is one of the five largest accountancy firms in the world. BDO were contracted by the department through an open tender process to provide ongoing independent financial consultancy services to the department.

Question: Mr Johnson asked for a detailed breakdown of the budget for Seniors Interests.

Answer: The budget allocated to Seniors Interests totals \$3 986 581 in 2002-03 while estimated expenditure in 2001-02 is \$3 912 838. The budget is split across three new outputs -
