

GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS, EPA POSITION STATEMENT

654. Hon Jim Scott to the Minister for Housing and Works representing the Minister for the Environment and Heritage
- (1) Does the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) have a Position Statement or Policy on greenhouse gas emissions from proposed projects?
  - (2) If yes, when was it published?
  - (3) If not, why not?
  - (4) What methodology does the EPA use for assessing greenhouse gas emissions from proposed developments?
  - (5) Will this approach be applied to the desalination plant which the Water Corporation is proposing for Kwinana?
  - (6) Which agency is responsible for maintaining Western Australia's inventory of greenhouse gas emissions?
  - (7) Is this inventory available to the public?
  - (8) If yes, where?
  - (9) If not, why not?

Hon TOM STEPHENS replied:

- (1) The Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) has an interim guidance statement 'Minimising Greenhouse Emissions' that provides proponents and the public with information on EPA environmental impact assessment requirements.
- (2) June 1998. Since then considerable development and consultation have occurred with a view to publishing a revised guidance statement.
- (3) N/A.
- (4) The EPA follows the methodology of the National Greenhouse Gas Inventory Committee.
- (5) This is a matter for the EPA.
- (6) The Australian Greenhouse Office maintains a National greenhouse gas inventory and State greenhouse gas inventories.
- (7) Yes. Although the latest National inventory is based on 1999 data the WA inventory uses 1995 data. I understand that from next year the National data will be presented in a way that allows State data to be extracted.
