

MAIN ROADS WESTERN AUSTRALIA — SPEED SIGNS — HILLSBOROUGH DRIVE, NOLLAMARA
625. Hon AMBER-JADE SANDERSON to the parliamentary secretary representing the Minister for Transport:

I refer to the 50-kilometre-an-hour speed limit on Hillsborough Drive, Nollamara, which runs off the 70-kilometre-an-hour-speed-limited Morley Drive. There are regular reports of drivers speeding along Hillsborough Drive, endangering children from the nearby school and sporting fields.

- (1) Will Main Roads WA authorise the erection of a “Remember: 50 in built up area” signs along this road, as there are along Creswell Road, Dianella, which is also situated near a school and playing fields?
- (2) If no to (1), why not?
- (3) Can the minister confirm that local governments are not permitted to erect such signage on local government roads without approval from Main Roads?

Hon JIM CHOWN replied:

I thank the honourable member for some notice of the question.

- (1)–(2) Not applicable.
- (3) This is a matter for local government. Main Roads has an agreement with local government whereby a council can install “Remember: 50 in built up area” signs on roads within the council’s area of responsibility on a temporary rotational basis.
