Seniors' Cost of Living Rebate – Mr P.B. Watson presented a petition from 385 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly calls on the Government to immediately restore the annual Seniors' Cost of Living Rebate to previous levels and also to adjust future payments in line with the Western Australia Consumer Price Index and maintain the level and scope of concessions applicable to WA Seniors' Card holders (P. 193).

Motorcycling Western Australia – Mr M.J. Cowper presented a petition from 165 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly supports the campaign for the Government to invest in Motorcycling Western Australia's plan to purchase land and establish a multi-function ride facility near Pinjarra as a home for motorcycling in Western Australia (P. 194).
