## Inquiry into WorkSafe Western Australia

Thank you for your letter of 11 April 2018 regarding your Committee's examination of funding models for WorkSafe Western Australia and requesting information on how WorkSafe Tasmania is currently funded.

Below are answers to the specific questions in your correspondence.

- I. Is WorkSafe Tasmania still funded through consolidated revenue funding? If no, how is WorkSafe Tasmania funded now?
  - Insofar as funding generally is concerned, this is determined based on the 'Output Budgeting' structure that has been adopted by the Tasmanian Government through the Department of Treasury and Finance (DTF). Although, funding is also provided to WorkSafe Tasmania through the WorkCover Tasmania Board (WCTB) for the delivery of statutory functions for and on behalf of the WCTB.
- 2. Is WorkSafe Tasmania still a separate organisation to WorkCover? If no, when did this change?
  - WorkSafe Tasmania encompasses entities formerly known as Workplace Standards and WorkCover following an organisational restructure in early 2013. However, it is important to note the statutory arrangements that still exist for the WCTB which invariably delegates certain functions to officers of WorkSafe Tasmania.
- 3. What relationship does WorkSafe Tasmania have with WorkCover?
  - WorkSafe Tasmania maintains a close relationship with the WCTB which pursuant to Schedule 2 Part 2 clause (g) of the Work Health and Safety Act 2012 (Tas) has a role to monitor and review the regulator in connection with the exercise of powers and the performance of functions Work Health and Safety Act 2012 (Tas).

#### 4. What is the scope of WorkSafe Tasmania's operations?

WorkSafe Tasmania has responsibility for three (3) distinct policy areas as follows:
