Answer: The 37,009 Telehealth Occasions of Service noted in the WACHS Annual Report relate to the 2016/2017 Financial Year (FY) for Mental Health, Outpatients and the Emergency Telehealth Service (ETS). A breakdown of these Occasions of Service has been provided in the below tables.


