## **Department of Communities**

### Hon Alison Xamon asked:

- 1) In terms of the breakdown of the \$4.5 million:
  - a) Are any of those moneys being allocated to implement any of the recommendations that arose out of the review of the disability justice centre; and

#### Answer:

No, as the recommendations are still being considered. If recommendations are adopted, there will be sufficient funding available to implement them within the current approved budget settings of the Department of Communities.

The Department of Communities has a budget of \$4.5 million for the Disability Justice Service, which includes the Disability Justice Centre, prison in-reach and clinical services. Approximately 100 people with disability who are interfacing with the justice system benefit from these services. For example, those at risk of entering the justice system, going through the court process, in custody or exiting custody. It also includes a range of other activities to promote awareness and enhance justice related supports available to people with disability in the community.

The Department of Communities deploys staff flexibly between the Centre and other parts of the service where there is an operational need.



b) Please provide a breakdown of how that \$4.5 million has been allocated across that service. Answer:

A breakdown of the allocation across the forward estimates is provided below – noting the \$4.5 million represents 2020-21.
