Fulltime/contract staff

- 1.16 31 FTE staff for 2016-17
- 1.17 A contract of service (permanent staff) 94%

A contract for services (contractors) - 6%

- 1.18 One contract staff member is a part-time receptionist who works limited hours. The other contract staff member is an advisory officer in the second year of a contract. It is the Department's usual practice to employ staff initially on a 1-2 year contract before permanency is granted.
- 1.19 There are no additional costs to the Department in employing staff on a contract basis.
- 1.20 Staff who are employed on contracts are not paid at a different rate to those who are employed on a permanent basis, in a similar role.
