Public Transport Authority Hon Martin Aldridge MLC asked:

- A1. In relation to the question I asked prior to the Hearing in reference to Page 624 of budget paper no 2, Service Summary line 3 Regional School Bus Services, and the answer received to parts f) and g) about surveys of bus routes:
 - How many surveys are done in a year;
 - ii. How many surveys are currently underway; and
 - iii. What are the current areas that are subject to these surveys?

Answer:

The use of the term 'survey' refers to student numbers being 'surveyed'. This information is used to ensure the right size bus is secured for the service.

As outlined in the answers to the Questions Prior to Hearing, a service 'review' is undertaken when there is either a significant change in the eligible student population, a new school is commissioned, or a school is closed. These reviews may result in a requirement for additional services, or a rationalisation of services where this is appropriate. Reviews are not undertaken as a 'matter of course', but occur in response to changing conditions at the local level.

For the 2020 school year, the PTA completed three reviews. There are currently two reviews being undertaken in Albany and Mandurah/Lake Clifton.
