HON KEN TRAVERS ASKED -

B2: Why is your annual report not on your website.

Answer:

- B2 This was an error in not checking within a reasonable time that the PDF version had been uploaded to the website.
- B3: I am talking about the figures that are listed in the budget for the actual figures in 2007-08 and the variation between what is listed in your annual report as being the actual figures in the 2007-08 financial year. In your annual report you list both this year's and last year's figures for each line item so we can compare but they have changed since the figures that appeared in the budget. I am trying to work out why.

Answer:

B3 The Treasury Information Management System is presented in a different format to the Annual Report statements. The Annual Report statements are prepared in accordance with the Treasurer's Instructions Model Statements and Annual Report framework. The TIMS report is prepared as required by the DTF automated system. The TIMS system has its own chart of accounts which is different to the whole-of-government chart of accounts that are used in the Annual Report. The rolling up of transactions into the two forms of statements can contribute to the minor differences in presentation as it is a judgement call in some cases where the items should sit and in the matching of the TIMS charts to the whole-of-government charts.

There are differences in the presentation of line items between the two, but the overall end result should be the same.

In the case of the 2007–08 year the Income Statement is consistent with the results being the same. Note the Annual Report is presented over 15 line items while TIMS contain only 13 line items.

The Balance Sheet has had a restatement on the plant, property and equipment after the change in accounting treatment from a \$1,000 to a \$5,000 asset capitalisation threshold. This caused the balance sheet to have a difference of \$29,000. The 2007–08 property, plant and equipment was restated for the 2008–09 annual report. This was on the instruction of the Auditors. Note: Annual Report is presented over 16 line items while TIMS contain 15 line items.

The cash flow overall end result is consistent between the two statements and as per the other statements the two forms of recording produce different results. The annual report cash flow for operating activities contains 12 line items while TIMS contains 9 line items. The cash flow statement for the annual report is also prepared via a cash flow working paper (as supplied by the auditors) while the TIMS cash flow is system generated by the TIMS system.

The Commission has now rolled into the Department of Treasury and Finance shared service environment and it is hoped that in the future there is a mechanism developed for an improvement in the matching of the two different charts of accounts and statement presentation.

HON PHILIP GARDINER MLC ASKED -

B4: Let us go to the expenditure for 2008—09 for a start. Roughly, how much of that would be put into social expenditure? How much of the money that you spent in 2008–09 are you putting into social quality area for your region to help communities so you do not have the crime that keeps occurring now? I was going to ask the same thing based on the applications for royalties for regions for the regional grants scheme.

Answer:

B4 Expenditure on social projects in 2008–09, including infrastructure enhancements that led to social outcomes – Regional Development Scheme projects \$239,030 and other projects \$414,108.

Expenditure on social projects through the Royalties for Regions South West Regional Grants Scheme 2008-09 - \$ 1,258,097.

B5: Can you provide a list of all those that applied but were unsuccessful in their application? Can you provide us with the program that they wanted funded and the amount of funding that they sought?

B10 Can you tell us what, in terms of this year's budget that money is going to be allocated to?

Answer:

B10 The question refers to the salary difference between the South West Development Commission's approved staffing level of 25 and actual employment level of 23. Funding that could have been used to employ to the full approved level of 25 was directed towards projects within the Commission's strategic priority of "Investing in People".

The projects were:

- Completion of an Active Ageing Strategy,
- Enhancement of public walkways and physical activity through the provision of outdoor fitness equipment across the South West.
- Improved disability accessibility to beaches in Bunbury through funding of beach wheelchairs.

These projects are part of a broader strategy to build the quality of life in the region to a point where it can meet or exceed metropolitan standards.

HON. KEN TRAVERS ASKED -

B11 What do you use the \$4,049 million for? Can we get a breakdown of what those are, though, by project and program?

Answer:

B11

- \$128,000 non cash item for depreciation.
- \$2,543,000 Employee costs salaries and wages, superannuation, staff travel and other staffing costs. (Includes non cash accrued wages and superannuation, leave provisions etc).
- \$377,000 estimate for accommodation costs includes utilities and maintenance costs. Current lease expires in 2011 so future accommodation cost is unknown. This is a non cancellable lease the Government holds for the Bunbury Tower. Also offices in Manjimup and Collie.
- \$625,000 includes rates and charges for Commission land holdings, vehicle leasing and operational costs, equipment repairs, IT support, Insurance, advertising, client survey, communication, consumables, repairs and maintenance. This can also include amounts associated with undertaking projects in the region.
- \$26,000 audit fees (OAG).
- \$80,000 Office of shared Services fees.
- \$70,000 South West Events Grant Program.
- \$200,000 funds that are used to assist projects that fit within the Commission's strategic priorities of "Investing in People", "Investing in Infrastructure and Place" and "Investing in Knowledge and Innovation". These funds are usually used to leverage other funds to assist regional projects.
