The Evidence (Video and Audio Links Fees and Expenses) Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2012 made under the *Evidence Act 1906* have been gazetted and are provided for your consideration. Amendments include:

an increase in fees of 2.8%. The Department has determined that costs have broadly
moved in accordance with the CPI rate of 2.8% and hence most fees were increased
by CPI the day following gazettal.

Specific amendments are as follows:

### Regulation 2 and 3 Schedule 1 amended

The fees for items 1 and 2 relating to court fees have been increased by 2.8% to match the movements in costs as determined by the Department. These applied from the day following gazettal.
