# (JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE ON DELEGATED LEGISLATION)

## District Court of Western Australia Act 1969

## District Court (Fees) Amendment Regulations 2007

The District Court (Fees) Amendment Regulations 2007 have been made under the District Court of Western Australia Act 1969 to amend regulations to:

• provide for an increase of 4.8% to match CPI movements as approved by the Department of Treasury and Finance and the Expenditure Review Committee of Cabinet to apply for fee increases from 1 July 2007.

Specific amendments are as follows:

# Regulation 4 Schedule 1 amended

These Schedule 1 fees relate to fees taken by the Registry. With the exception of items 13(a) and 14(c), relating to photocopying that will remain unchanged, all fee items have been increased by 4.8% to match CPI movements approved by the Department of Treasury and Finance and the Expenditure Review Committee of Cabinet to apply from 1 July 2007.

#### **Review of Fees and Charges**

In 2006, the Office of the Auditor General (OAG) undertook an audit of fee setting practices across Government and on 30 August 2006 tabled concerns in Parliament that current court fee structures may be recovering more than 100% of the cost of providing the services.

To address these concerns and also ensure compliance with the Department of Treasury and Finance fee review process the Department of the Attorney General undertook a comprehensive review of court fees to cost the service for which fees are charged an identify any areas where over recovery of costs is occurring.

In addition to the photocopying fees identified above (which are to be held at current levels), the review identified some individual fees which are currently over recovering costs. In relation to the District Court, these fees are as follows:

Having identified the over recovery of this fee, the review examined how these fees compare to other interstate jurisdictions. The results of this analysis are outlined in the following table:

	Interstate Comparison	
Registrar's Certificate	This fee is largely paid for a legal practitioner to gain a certificate from the Supreme Court stating that he or she is a certified legal practitioner in WA. It has been included as a District Court fee for consistency sake. In consultation with the District Court, it is understood that the issuing of any sort of this type of certificate in the District Court is extremely rare. Therefore the costing of this fee and its interstate comparisons have been based on the Supreme Court activities when issuing a certificate to a legal practitioner. An examination of fees in interstate found three examples of comparable fees. The fee for a certificate in the Supreme Court of NSW is currently \$44, \$47 in the ACT and \$126.80 in the Victoria. This compares against the current WA fee of \$46.	

Examining the WA fee against other jurisdictions reveals that overall the current fee is not excessive when compared interstate. In fact these fees outlined above are either average or below average when compared interstate. This is contrary to the situation with photocopying fees, which reveals that WA has one of the highest court photocopying charges off all Australian jurisdictions.

It is important to note that according to the Report of Government Services 2007, total civil recovery in the District Court is currently only 18.9%. As such, the District Court does not over recover costs in total.

Taking these factors into account, it is considered appropriate policy for fees which are currently average or below average when compared interstate to continue to be indexed with CPI. As such it is proposed that the fee for a Registrar's certificate be indexed with CPI from 1 July 2007.

However, as photocopying charges are currently in excess of cost recovery and are currently high when compared interstate, it is proposed to maintain these fees at current levels until interstate parity is achieved in the future.
