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# COMPLIANCE WITH, AND ANY DEPARTURE FROM, THE REID REPORT AND THE 2005-2015 HEALTH CLINICAL SERVICES

### SUMMARY

## **Key Facts:**

- 66 reform projects are completed and well into implementation.
- 26 reform projects are ongoing and have a long-term timeframe. However 11 of these projects (42%) are delayed beyond the original HRIT Workplan. These projects have been reviewed and have had an extension to their implementation timeframe. There are varying causes for the delay of these projects ICT delays being the most reported cause. The status of these projects was reported annually to the DG and HRISC, who noted and approved the change of these projects to ones of an ongoing nature.

## Background:

- The Government-endorsed HRIT Work Plan (Version 4) November 2004 stipulates a timeline for deploying 92 projects addressing the 85 health reform recommendations over an initial 4-year timeframe, with some longer-term projects implemented beyond the 4-yr timeframe.
- HRIT have recently progressed the acquittal of the Year Four projects by ensuring that
  each of the respective project managers or Lead Executive have reviewed the content of
  each of the project summary forms, noting the progress of the respective reform projects.
  These progress forms along with a Year Four summary report were forwarded to the
  Director General for approval.

## **Current Status:**

- The overall reform program is largely completed or in the process of implementation.
- A small number of reform recommendations have not been progressed due to changes in policy direction. These changes include:

(i) agreement to split KEMH and PMH,

- (ii) agreement not to have a joint management structure between SCGH and RPH
- (iii) agreement to have the State Trauma Centre located at FSH not RPH, and

(iv) agreement to maintain RPH as a tertiary facility.

 A number of reform projects are still ongoing. These have been aligned to reporting strategies that more accurately measure their successful implementation, such as the annual Operational Plan. Attached is a table listing these projects with a brief overview of current status.

## **ATTACHMENT A**

The following recommendations are still ongoing after year 4 implementation timeline and have been reported in the Year Four progress report on reform projects:

- Recommendation 1 (Health System Objectives). This recommendation is an ongoing culmination of all system-wide reform projects and is not reported as an independent discrete project.
- Recommendation 5 (Phone Coaching Service). Major milestones planned for 2008/09 include evaluation report completed and recommendations regarding program beyond pilot phase. This evaluation report is close to completion.
- Recommendation 7 (GP Discharge Summaries received within 12hrs and, Standardised Hospital Discharge Summaries). The project has been aligned with the national electronic discharge summary standardisation initiative under NEHTA and establishment of a HealthConnect presence in WA. Further changes in the scope of this project have included other electronic forms of clinical patient care information e.g. referrals. Currently, work is being done on solutions design scheduled for completion in early 2010. The project has dependencies with NEHTA progress n a Unique Health Identifier, in particular, provider identification.
- Recommendation 11 (Pathways Home Program). The original completion date for this project was 30 June 2008. However the Commonwealth has agreed to extend the project to the end of June 2009.
- Recommendation 18 (Patient Focused System Wide Clinical Information System). WA Health has chosen to present an eHealthWA Program Business Case as a way to simplify and streamline the approval of the IT infrastructure projects that are critical to the success of the overall Recommendation 18 reform project, but are not independently self-justifying. The approach has been ratified by the eHealthWA Project Council and the eHealthWA Business Case has been signed off by the Minister for Health and awaits consideration by DTF.
- Recommendation 22 (Enhancement of Telehealth). Further development of this project will rely on clinical leadership and the availability of appropriate bandwidth and IT infrastructure. Commonwealth funding through the Clever Networks Program has become available and will address the issue of appropriate bandwidth. The Operations Review Committee of SHEF will take over management of the program and provide leadership through the Area Chief Executive of WA Country Health Services.
- Rec 31 (Re-build of PMH and KEMH and Women's and Children's Health Service would remain separate and independent). Recommendation was only partially supported by Government when the HRIT Workplan was established, with the subsequent decision to split women's health services from paediatric services. The relocation of PMH to SCGH campus is still being considered.
- Recommendation 39 (Transplantation services for liver, heart and lung should continue as at present). Completion of the Fiona Stanley Hospital business case

and final confirmation of transplantation services to be relocated was reviewed in Dec 2007 and endorsed by ERC in June 2008. The revised scope of transplantation services will be improved through an integrated approach to clinical planning. In early 2009, a role delineation process for tertiary services has revisited the distribution of Transplantation services across the tertiary facilities in WA.

- Recommendation 41 (Expand Palliative Car Services). This is a long term project and is currently funded until June 2009.
- Review and KEMH as a centre of excellence). The Statewide Obstetric Support Unit (SOSU) has conducted obstetric service reviews at a number of health services (Pilbara, Great Southern and South Metropolitan Area Health Service). A number of other reform initiatives are due to be completed in June 2009 by SOSU in collaboration with Women's and Newborns' Health Network include: a statewide maternity and newborn service map analysis, metropolitan perinatal loss needs analysis project, development of a statewide education directory, GP Obstetric think thank planning sessions and advocated for a statewide CTG (cardiotocographs) education package for all hospital with maternity facilities.
- Recommendation 42b (Gynaecological and Obstetric Services at the four designated general hospitals). This is an ongoing project and is related to the implementation of the Clinical Services Plan and implementation of the Maternity Services Framework.
  - The Women's and Newborns' Health Network (WNHN) has collaborated with Area Health Service obstetric and newborn working groups to improve capacity and service delivery in maternity and newborn care in hospital with maternity facilities in Western Australian.
  - The WA Health Clinical Service Framework has been revised in collaboration with the WNHN. The framework revised the role delineation definitions and levels of service for obstetrics and neonatology.
  - A Framework for the care of neonates has been developed and endorsed by ORC regarding service capacity and planning until 2015.
  - Obstetric and neonatal service (Level 5) have been included in Phase 1 of Fiona Stanley hospital.
  - Recommendation 48a, 48b & 49b (Pharmacy Reforms). Implementation of the pharmacy reforms is heavily reliant on available IT infrastructure to support the reforms. The pharmacy reforms are therefore subject to the successful deployment of the ICT reforms. A replacement Pharmacy system has been acquired and testing is underway. The pharmacy reforms are under the governance of ORC (SHEF Operations Review Committee).
- Recommendation 75 (Health System Performance Framework). This project is ongoing and a number of activities are listed for completion between Feb 2009 -June 2009.
- Recommendation 78 (Construct a Central Data Repository). This project will be integrated with the eHealthWA program. At present the eHealthWA program has not finalised the procurement of an appropriate solution that will provide components of

the underlining technology required to deliver a Statewide CDR and associated BI tool.

- Recommendation 79 & 80 (Measure and Report on the Reduction of Growth in Health Expenditure and Analysis of hospital cost drivers). Reforms in a number of areas will be implemented to reduce the growth in health expenditure over the next five years.
- Recommendation 82 (Capital investments supported by robust business cases, service provision planned and managed to achieve 2% reduction in cost growth). The infrastructure development business case guidelines are continually reviewed and refined by the evaluation team, lead by the Infrastructure Policy and Coordination Unit. A number of major milestones are planned for 2008/2009.
- Recommendation 86 (Clinical Senate of WA). In June 2008 the clinical senate executive reviewed and revised both its' terms of reference and charter. Minor changes to membership were made along with key additional inclusions to nominating bodies. The Clinical Senate is progressing successfully, continuing to inform the DG and SHEF on key health issues. The Senate will enter its' fourth term in July 2009.
