Dear Committee Members,

MY INTEREST IN THIS MATTER.

I am in my 80th year and in good health but had friends who despite the best and legal palliative care, suffered and appealed to have an end to their life. To allow a dog to experience similar agony and suffering is illegal. My father was a Uniting Church minister and until recently I was an Anglican Bishop's Warden. With this as my background, I became the WA representative of Christians Supporting Choice for Voluntary Euthanasia.

GENERAL COMMENTS.

Prior to the WA Election of 11TH March, I emailed all candidates for whom I had email addresses. A summary of the replies of the survey are attached.

A national Morgan Poll in 2002 revealed that a majority of Christian worshippers supported 'end of life choices'. Anglican 81%, Catholic 69%, Uniting Church 74%, Lutheran 74%, Baptist 68%.

A co-founder of Christians Supporting Choice for Voluntary Euthanasia, Baptist Minister Rev. Trevor Bensch says: "My call for legal Voluntary Euthanasia is compassionate and thoroughly consistent with the teachings of Jesus".

A similar view is held by former Anglican Archbishop of South Africa, Desmond Tutu who says; "I have been fortunate to spend my life working for the dignity of the living. Now I wish to apply my mind to the issue of dignity for the dying. I revere the sanctity of life – but not at any cost".
