I also was diagnosed with a rare bone condition in 1971, and my parents were unable to find out any medical information to assist in my treatment because of the rules. I have always tried to find information regarding my biological families, but it is so hard. It has cost me a lot of money joining groups trying to gain any information I can gain, trying to meet people who may be related to me and a lot of heartache because of rejection.

While growing up I was rejected by my peers due to having a condition that no one else in the world has (so I was advised by the specialists). As previously stating being rejected by the family I grew up with and now by my (due to being different). All my medical issues required Mum and Dad to have to travel from Albany to Perth each time and pay out of their pockets for all costs.

My medical issues meant I was in and out of hospital for about every two years and now 3 of my 4 children have the conditions too and still no knowledge on the cause, and we are having to travel from Albany to Perth as well.

The government apologized to the Aboriginals for their forced adoptions and the Caucasian mothers who were forced to give up their children but what about the Caucasian children getting apologies and maybe a financial assistance as an apology and admitting what was done to them was wrong.

Please try and put yourself in the same situation and see how you'd feel if you lost everyone and everything you knew.

Look forward to seeing the Government doing the correct thing for its people.
