Food Insecurity Feedback Year 10 & 11 Students

Group Discussion Feedback

I held group discussions with the Year 10 and Year 11 students at School and below are the suggestions/ideas that came from the discussions about addressing food insecurity.

- Major Supermarkets
 - having weekly discount days for Health Care Card Holder with the discounts applying to all items in the shops.
 - Reducing the prices of healthy foods to make them more available for those on lower incomes
 - Ongoing discounts for those in need
- Remote Locations government providing subsidies to reduce impact of transportation costs on prices of healthy food in remote communities
- Being able to access the right foods for medical conditions e.g. special dietary requirements can be quite expensive
- More Foodbank locations across the metropolitan area
 - Ask for more people to volunteer at these locations
 - Government funding for the new locations
- More food charities to provide assistance and spread the load around thus providing greater access for those in need
- All schools to provide free lunches for students that require better access to food
- When people are shopping they should only buy what they need and think of others
 - o Provide education aimed at helping people write up food plans for the week
- Encourage people to donate to charities that provide food support
 - o e.g. through the Cash 4 Cans Program
 - Schools could do fundraising to support charities providing food assistance
- Encourage people to donate to food programs for those in need
- Provide education and support for people to start vegetable gardens at their homes
 - Help with costs to establish vegetable gardens
 - o People donating time to help with setting up vegetable gardens
 - Vegetable patches in schools
- The lack of choice some people have in how they are able to cook due to living conditions, homelessness etc.
- Ongoing government help with cost of living expenses
- Support for grey water recycling in homes
