HOSPITALS AND HEALTH SERVICES ACT 1927 PART IIIA - PRIVATE HOSPITALS APPROVAL OF PREMISES AS A DAY HOSPITAL LICENCE TO CONDUCT A DAY HOSPITAL – CLASS A

This is to certify that:

- (1) the premises situated at 231 Timberlane Drive, Woodvale WA 6026 known as Woodvale Private Hospital for Women are approved as suitable premises under section 26C of the Hospitals and Health Services Act 1927; and
- (2) J C Investments Pty Ltd is hereby granted a licence to conduct a day hospital facility under section 26D of the Hospitals and Health Services Act 1927, for the period commencing 1 January 2009 to 31 December 2009.
- (3) The licence to conduct a day hospital facility is granted subject to the following conditions:
 - (a) The maximum number of patients that may be treated at any one time: 16
 - (b) the classes of patients that may be treated at the day hospital facility: Medicine: Gynaecology Surgery: Gynaecology Surgery and Laser Surgery.
 - (c) the number and categories of staff:

Two Registered Nurses are to be on duty when general anaesthetics are administered. When consecutive general anaesthetics are administered one extra Registered Nurse or Enrolled Nurse is required for each list. A Registered Nurse is to be on duty in the recovery room at all times when patients are present. A receptionist is to be in the waiting area for each list.

(d) the kinds of nursing and other care that shall be provided or available at the day hospital facility and the periods and times at which they shall be provided or available:

Nursing care appropriate to day surgery patients shall be provided. At all times that the day hospital facility is operating, a Registered Nurse must be on duty.

- (e) other conditions:
 - (i) The Hospital stay of any patients is not to exceed twenty-three consecutive hours.
 - (ii) The Inpatient Statistics set out in Annexure A to this Licence instrument; and
 - (iii) The conditions set out in Annexure A to this Licence instrument; and
 - (iv) Such other conditions as may be imposed by the Chief Executive Officer, Director General of Health, from time to time.
