SYNOPSIS OF BILLS 2008

The following synopsis of Bills introduced during the First Session of the Thirty-Seventh Parliament is intended only to give a brief outline of the main features of each Bill at the stage when the second reading motion of the Bill was moved. The full second reading speech for each Bill is available in *Parliamentary Debates (Hansard)* which are available from the State Law Publisher or from the Parliament of WA website: www.parliament.wa.gov.au). The ultimate stage reached by each Bill is also indicated. While it does not take into account amendments made in either House, reference can be made to the *Votes and Proceedings* of the Legislative Assembly and the *Minutes* of the Legislative Council where amendments have been agreed to.

Acts Amendment (Advance Health Care Planning) Bill 2006* (No. 149)

[Name changed to Acts Amendment (Consent to Medical Treatment) Bill 2006]

This Bill reforms the law relating to medical treatment for the dying. This Bill is necessary to give people certainty when dealing with end of life issues, enabling terminally ill people to govern their medical treatment and protecting medical professionals who adhere to their wishes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 June 2006 (P.D.p. 4061).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 29 November 2006. Short title of the Bill changed to Acts Amendment (Consent to Medical Treatment) Bill 2006.

Acts Amendment (Assaults on Police Officers) Bill 2008 (No. 267) (Mr R. Johnson)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend two Acts in a number of respects such that minimum mandatory sentences are introduced for offences where individuals seriously assault police and other public officers. Furthermore, anyone found guilty of seriously assaulting a public officer will not be able to have the offence recorded as a spent conviction.

Acts Amendment (Consent to Medical Treatment) Bill 2006* (No. 149)

The Short Title of the Bill was amended from Acts Amendment (Advance Health Care Planning) Bill 2006 to Acts Amendment (Consent to Medical Treatment) Bill 2006.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 29 November 2006 and in the Legislative Council on 29 May 2008.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 6 December 2006 (P.D.p. 9244).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 5 September 2007.

(Act No. 25 of 2008 – assented to on 19 June 2008)

Acts Amendment (Justice) Bill 2007* (No. 231)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the relevant Acts in order to allow for the improvement of procedural aspects of existing legislation necessary for the administration of justice.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 September 2007 (P.D.p. 5954).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 26 February 2008.

(Act No. 5 of 2008 – assented to on 31 March 2008).

Acts Amendment (Weapons) Bill 2008 (No. 273)

The purpose of this Bill is to enhance public safety, particularly in entertainment precincts, by introducing a series of four new offences into the *The Criminal Code* and increasing existing penalties for offences under the *Weapons Act 1999*. The new offences to be introduced into *The Criminal Code* are targeted towards the possession of dangerous or offensive weapons or instruments (including firearms), in and around places of public entertainment, by persons who may be involved in illicit activities such as the drug trade.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 9 April 2008 (P.D.p. 2057).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Acts Amendment (Western Australia Day) Bill 2008 (No. 280) (Hon. C. Barnett)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1972* by replacing Foundation Day with Western Australia Day.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 May 2008 (P.D.p. 3005).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Alcohol and Drug Authority Repeal 2005 (No. 070)

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the *Alcohol and Drug Authority Act 1974*. The Bill dissolves the Western Australian Alcohol and Drug Authority and, as a consequence:

- staff employed by the Authority will be employed by the Minister for Health in his incorporated capacity pursuant to section 7 of the *Hospitals and Health Services Act 1927*; and
- all liabilities, rights and assets of the Authority will be appropriately invested in the Minister for Health.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 1 September 2005 (P.D.p. 5015).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

ANZAC Day Amendment Bill 2005 (No. 066)

The Bill proposes the deletion of sections 5(4) and 7(3) of the principal Act as a result of the removal of the legislative restriction prohibiting race meetings or sporting events being held on Anzac Day if it falls on a Sunday.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 June 2005 (P.D.p. 3596).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Bill (No. 1) 2008 (No. 278)

The purpose of this Bill is to grant supply and to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Account certain sums for the recurrent services and purposes of the year ending 30 June 2009.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 8 May 2008 (P.D.p. 2750).

(Act No. 34 of 2008 – assented to on 29 June 2008)

Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Bill (No. 2) 2008 (No. 279)

The purpose of this Bill is to grant supply and to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Account certain sums for the capital purposes of the year ending 30 June 2009.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 8 May 2008 (P.D.p. 2758).

(Act No. 35 of 2008 – assented to on 29 June 2008)

Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Bill (No. 5) 2007 (No. 243)

This Bill seeks to appropriate out of the Consolidated Account the sum of: \$298,768,898.32 for the recurrent payments made during the financial year ended 30 June 2007, for the purposes and services detailed in Schedule 1 of the Bill.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 October 2007 (P.D.p. 6694).

(Act No. 32 of 2008 – assented to on 29 June 2008)

Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Bill (No. 6) 2007 (No. 244)

This Bill seeks to appropriate out of the Consolidated Account the sum of: \$44,056,450.47 for capital payments made during the financial year ended 30 June 2007, for the purposes detailed in Schedule 1 of the Bill.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 October 2007 (P.D.p. 6694).

(Act No. 33 of 2008 – assented to on 29 June 2008)

Bail Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 217)

The Bill implements the recommendations of the Doig Report. The Bill amends the *Bail Act 1982* and the *Supreme Court Act 1935* to accommodate new appeal provisions.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 June 2007 (P.D.p. 3428).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 22 November 2007.

(Act No. 6 of 2008 – assented to on 31 March 2008)

Botanic Gardens and Parks Amendment Bill 2006 (No. 157) (Ms S. E. Walker)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the Sunset Hospital site (Reserve No. 1720) to be known as 'Sunset Park' and be protected under the *Botanic Gardens and Parks Act 1998*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 August 2006 (P.D.p. 5112).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Casino (Burswood Island) Agreement Amendment Bill 2007 (LC No. 213)

The purpose of this Bill is to ratify the Eleventh Supplementary Agreement, which in turn amends the *Casino (Burswood Island) Agreement Act 1985*. The Supplementary Agreement expands the purposes on which the Board may expend its funds and changes the composition of the Burswood Park Board.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 14 August 2007 (P.D.p. 3799).

(Act No. 17 of 2008 – assented to on 16 April 2008)

Children and Community Services Amendment (Body Piercing) Bill 2007 (No. 230) (Dr J. Woollard)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Children and Community Services Act 2004* in order to make it an offence for a person to pierce any part of the body of a child (defined in the Act as a person under the age of 18) without obtaining the written consent of the child's parent.

The Bill will provide the same penalty for body piercing a child under the age of 18 as already exists for tattooing or branding a child.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 August 2007 (P.D.p. 4501).

Referred to the Legislative Assembly Community Development and Justice Standing Committee on 7 May 2008.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Children and Community Services Amendment (Reporting Sexual Abuse of Children) Bill 2007* (No. 257)

The purpose of the Bill is to introduce legislation for the mandatory reporting of child sexual abuse by amending the *Children and Community Services Act 2004*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7901).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 3 June 2008.

(Act No. 26 of 2008 – assented to on 19 June 2008)

Co-operatives Bill 2007* (No. 160)

The purpose of this Bill is to replace the existing *Companies (Co-operative) Act 1943* and the *Co-operative and Provident Societies Act 1903* with legislation that is reflective of the current commercial and social environment of co-operatives in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 November 2007 (P.D.p. 8036).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 3 April 2008.

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 9 April 2008.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Community Protection (Offender Reporting) Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 256)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide a valuable tool for the Western Australia Police to monitor offenders who pose a risk to the community, particularly those who pose a risk to children.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7897).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 15 May 2008.

(Act No. 27 of 2008 – assented to on 1 July 2008)

Constitution Amendment Bill 2005* (LC No. 001)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Constitution Acts Amendment Act 1899* by giving the President a deliberative vote on all questions that come before the House, and by removing the President's casting vote.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 30 March 2005 (P.D.p. 29).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Contractual Benefits Bill 2007* (No. 240)

The purpose of this Bill is to restore the right of employees of constitutional corporations to make a claim for denied contractual benefits in the Western Australian Industrial Relations Commission.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 September 2007 (P.D.p. 5958).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 26 June 2008.

The Bill passed the Third Reading stage, with amendments, in the Legislative Council but had not been returned to the Legislative Assembly upon prorogation.

Corruption and Crime Commission Amendment (Investigative Function) Bill 2007 (No. 262) (Hon. P. Omodei)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Corruption and Crime Commission Act 2003* to enable the Corruption and Crime Commission and Western Australia Police to engage in joint taskforce operations to investigate offences independently of the Western Australia Police.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7933).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Criminal Code Amendment (Sale of Spray Paint Cans) Bill 2007 (No. 248) (Mr T.R. Sprigg)

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce legislation that makes it an offence for retailers to sell spray paint cans to minors under the age of 18.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7127).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Criminal Law Amendment (Homicide) Bill 2008* (No. 269)

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce significant reforms to the law of homicide in accordance with the recommendations of the Law Reform Commission made in the *Final Report on the Review of the Law of Homicide*. Some of the key reforms implemented by this Bill are the consolidation of wilful murder and murder into one crime of murder; increased flexibility in sentencing for murder, including the ability for judges to impose tougher sentences on murderers; the simplification and clarification of defences to murder; and the introduction of a new offence to deal with 'one punch' homicide cases.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 19 March 2008 (P.D.p. 1209).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 8 May 2008.

(Act No. 29 of 2008 – assented to on 27 June 2008)

Criminal Law and Evidence Amendment Bill 2006* (No. 145)

This Bill is an amalgamation of two proposed reform packages, amending the *Evidence Act 1906*, the *Criminal Code* and *The Criminal Procedure Act 2004*. This will give effect to procedural reforms in sexual assault cases in order to complete the reforms intended as part of the Sexual Assault Reforms Package. It will also amend *The Criminal Code*, the *Criminal Procedure Act 2004* and the *Criminal Appeals Act 2004* to provide for a right to appeal by the prosecution against acquittals in trials before juries and to remedy certain deficiencies in existing provisions.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 22 June 2006 (P.D.p. 4211).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 2 November 2006 and in the Legislative Council on 20 February 2008.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 21 March 2007.

(Act No. 2 of 2008 – assented to on 12 March 2008)

Cross-border Justice Bill 2007* (No. 236)

This Bill seeks to break down the barriers that state borders create in the administration of justice in the cross-border region. The Bill will enable Western Australia to participate in cross-border justice schemes in conjunction with South Australia and the Northern Territory.

For cross-border schemes to operate, it will be necessary for each jurisdiction to have corresponding laws. Therefore the Bill will also serve as a model to be followed by the governments of South Australia and the Northern Territory.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 October 2007 (P.D.p. 6314).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 21 November 2007.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 28 February 2008.

(Act No. 7 of 2008 – assented to on 31 March 2008)

Daylight Saving Amendment Bill (No. 2) 2007 (No. 196) (Mr M.J. Birney)

This Bill seeks to amend the *Daylight Saving Act 2006* by removing the months of February and March from the daylight saving trial and any future daylight saving model.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 March 2007 (P.D.p. 514).

The Bill was discharged from the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper under Standing Order 144A on 1 April 2008.

Daylight Saving Amendment Bill (No. 3) 2007 (LC No. 246) (Hon. N. Moore)

This Bill amends the *Daylight Saving Act 2006* in order to change the timeframe for the proposed referendum on daylight saving. It changes the prescribed timeframe from between 10 May 2009 and 13 September 2009 to between 13 April 2008 and 18 May 2008.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 25 October 2007 (P.D.p. 6788).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Dental Bill 2005* (No. 113)

This Bill provides for effective registration of persons practising dentistry and for dental prosthetics. It controls the use of the titles 'dentist', 'dental prosthetist', 'dental therapist', 'school dental therapist' and 'dental hygienist'. It seeks to prevent conduct from non-dental professionals that may be misleading to consumers and the general public. Importantly the Bill adequately identifies members of the dental profession, enabling consumers of dental services to make informed decisions when engaging a practitioner.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 November 2005 (P.D.p. 7646).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 4 May 2006.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Diamond (Argyle Diamond Mines Joint Venture) Agreement Amendment Bill 2008 (No. 290)

The purpose of this Bill is to ratify an agreement made on 21 May 2008 between the State, Argyle Diamond Mines Limited and Rio Tinto Diamonds Limited. This agreement provides for the variation of an agreement made on 17 November 1981, titled the *Diamond (Argyle Diamond Mines Joint Venture) Agreement Act 1981*.

This legislation is necessary in order to give effect to the variation of the State Agreement set out in the Variation Agreement.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 June 2008 (P.D.p. 3682).

(Act No. 37 of 2008 – assented to on 1 July 2008)

Director of Public Prosecutions (Standing Committee) Amendment Bill 2006 (No. 181) (Ms S.E. Walker)

This Bill amends the *Director of Public Prosecutions Act 1991* to establish a joint standing committee which oversees aspects of the role of the Director of Public Prosecutions.

This Bill was introduced and read a first time in the Legislative Assembly on 29 November 2006.

The Bill was discharged from the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper under Standing Order 144A on 26 February 2008.

Duties Bill 2007 (No. 259)

The purpose of this Bill, alongside the Duties Legislation Amendment Bill 2007, is to put in place a new duties regime to replace the outdated stamp duty arrangements that are currently imposed by the *Stamp Act 1921*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7893).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 11 March 2008.

(Act No. 11 of 2008 – assented to on 14 April 2008)

Duties Legislation Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 260)

The purpose of this Bill, alongside the Duties Bill 2007, is to put in place a new duties regime to replace the outdated stamp duty arrangements that are currently imposed by the *Stamp Act 1921*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7896).

(Act No. 12 of 2008 – assented to on 14 April 2008)

Eastern Goldfields Transport Board Repeal Bill 2007 (No. 199)

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the *Eastern Goldfields Transport Board Act 1984* and to amend certain other Acts as a consequence and for related purposes.

The Bill provides for existing employees of the Board to transfer to the Public Transport Authority on commencement of the Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 May 2007 (P.D.p. 2311).

(Act No. 28 of 2008 – assented to on 1 July 2008)

Education and Training Legislation Amendment and Repeal Bill 2008 (No. 277)

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the *Industrial Training Act 1975* and modernise the *Vocational Education and Training Act 1996*. The modernised apprenticeship system will combine apprenticeships and traineeships within a single legislative framework consistent with other states and territories.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 May 2008 (P.D.p. 3166).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 18 June 2008.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 26 June 2008.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Electoral Amendment Bill 2008* (No. 284)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend *Electoral Act 1907* to provide that the Chair of the Electoral Distribution Commissioners be a judge or a retired judge of the Supreme Court, the District Court or the Family Court of Western Australia, or, a retired judge of the Supreme Court of another State or Territory or of a Commonwealth Court.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 May 2008 (P.D.p. 2974).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 18 June 2008.

(Act No. 38 of 2008 – assented to on 3 July 2008)

Electoral Amendment Bill (No.2) 2008* (No. 285)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Electoral Act 1907* to be consistent with Commonwealth electoral legislation by enabling prisoners serving a sentence of less than three years to be eligible to vote in State elections.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 May 2008 (P.D.p. 2973).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 18 June 2008 and in the Legislative Council on 26 June 2008.

The Bill passed the Third Reading stage, with amendments, in the Legislative Council but had not been returned to the Legislative Assembly upon prorogation.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Electricity Corporations Amendment Bill 2006 (No. 132) (Mr M.W. Trenorden)

The purpose of the Bill is to amend section 126 of the *Electricity Corporations Act 2005* to provide for dividend paying corporations. The Bill provides that the Electricity Networks Corporation must not pay any dividend.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 May 2006 (P.D.p. 2511).

The Bill was discharged from the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper under Standing Order 144A on 18 June 2008.

Electricity Industry (Western Australian Renewable Energy Targets) Amendment Bill 2005* (LC No. 097) (Hon. P. Llewellyn)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Electricity Industry Act 2004* to impose, as a condition of holding a retail license to sell electricity in the South West interconnected system, an obligation to acquire target levels of electricity generated from renewable energy sources.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 1 December 2005 (P.D.p. 7964).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Employment Dispute Resolution Bill 2007* (No. 239)

This Bill develops the role of the Western Australian Industrial Relations Commission (WAIRC) in the provision of dispute resolution and mediation services. The Bill will enable parties to employment disputes the opportunity to avail themselves of the WAIRC's extensive experience in industrial dispute resolution.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 September 2007 (P.D.p. 5959).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 8 April 2008.

(Act No. 18 of 2008 – assented to on 19 May 2008)

Equal Opportunity Amendment Bill 2006 (No. 173)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend Part III of the *Equal Opportunity Act 1984*, which deals with discrimination on the grounds of race. The Bill inserts a new division into Part III entitled 'Racially Offensive Behaviour'. It will be unlawful for a person to do any act, otherwise in private, which is reasonably likely to offend, insult, humiliate or intimidate another person on the ground of race, or on the ground of a characteristic appertaining or imputed to persons of that race.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 1 November 2006 (P.D.p. 8015).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Equal Opportunity Amendment Bill 2008 (No. 271)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Equal Opportunity Act 1984* to extend coverage of the Act to sexual harassment by members of Parliament. The Bill will provide that it is unlawful for a member of Parliament to harass sexually an officer appointed to assist the member of the Parliament; an officer appointed to assist another member of Parliament; an officer or member of the staff of Parliament; or any other person who in the course of employment performs duties at the Parliament or place where either house, or a committee of either or both houses, meets.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 9 April 2008 (P.D.p. 2054).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Fatal Accidents Amendment Bill 2008 (No. 274)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Fatal Accidents Act 1959* so that damages for pain and suffering and loss of enjoyment of life received by the estate of a victim of an asbestos related disease under the *Law Reform (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1941* are not taken into account when calculating the value of the benefits lost by the victim's dependants for the purpose of a claim by those dependants under the *Fatal Accidents Act 1959*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 9 April 2008 (P.D.p. 2056).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 6 May 2008.

(Act No. 20 of 2008 – assented to on 19 May 2008)

Fines Legislation Amendment Bill 2006* (No. 161)

The purpose of this Act is to amend the *Fines, Penalties and Infringement Notices Enforcement Act 1994* and the *Sentence Administration Act 2003*. The amendments will increase the level of flexibility of fines enforcement to assist people to pay fines whilst maintaining the integrity of the fine as a sentence. As a result, there will be a reduction in the number of people imprisoned for fine default only.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 September 2006 (P.D.p. 5857).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 28 November 2006 and in the Legislative Council on 5 December 2007.

(Act No. 3 of 2008 – assented to on 12 March 2008)

Food Bill 2005* (No. 110)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the safety and suitability of food for human consumption, and for related purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 November 2005 (P.D.p. 7657).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 20 June 2006.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 22 June 2006.

(Act No. 43 of 2008 – assented to on 8 July 2008)

Freedom of Information Amendment Bill 2007* (No. 191)

The Bill's purpose is to ensure that the *Freedom of Information Act 1992* (the FOI Act) remains an effective tool in ensuring open and accountable government, by providing an effective regime for access to the information held by government.

The Bill includes amendments:

- relating to access to documents under the FOI Act;
- relating to the determination of complaints;
- relating to the ongoing review of the FOI Act and its operation; and
- which address practical problems relating to the operation of the FOI Act, and which are intended to enhance the effective operation of the FOI Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 March 2007 (P.D.p. 827).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Gene Technology Amendment Bill 2005 (No. 018)

This Bill provides for a person, who is the holder of a licence to deal with genetically modified organisms, to pay a charge for that licence. The amount of the charge is prescribed by regulations.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 7 April 2005 (P.D.p. 580).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Greenhouse Gas Emission Reduction (Hot Water Systems) Bill 2007 (LC No. 263) (Hon. P. Llewellyn)

The purpose of this Bill is to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in Western Australia by providing that only efficient hot water systems may be offered for sale.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 6 December 2007 (P.D.p. 8249).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Greenhouse Gas Emission Reduction (Power Stations) Bill 2008 (LC No. 291)

The purpose of this Bill is to establish a greenhouse gas emissions standard for new power stations in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 5 June 2008 (P.D.p. 3541).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Health (Fresh Produce - State or Territory of Origin) Amendment Bill 2005 (No. 067) (Mr D.T. Redman)

This Bill provides for origin labelling of 'fresh produce' such as fruits, vegetables and nuts. It means that all fresh produce displayed for retail sale, originating from within the Commonwealth, must be labelled indicating the item's state or territory of origin.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 June 2005 (P.D.p. 3630).

Referred to the Legislative Assembly Economics and Industry Standing Committee on 29 June 2005. The Bill was investigated within the scope of the Committee's *Inquiry into the Production and Marketing of Foodstuffs* and, following the tabling of the Committee's report, was not restored to the Notice Paper.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Heritage of Western Australia (Crown Acquisition of Registered Places) Amendment Bill 2006 (No. 182) (Ms S.E. Walker)

This Bill provides that an owner whose land has been entered in the Register of Heritage Places has the right to require the Crown to acquire the owner's estate or interest in the land at a price determined by reference to the value of the land before the entry was made in the register.

The Bill was introduced and read a first time in the Legislative Assembly on 23 November 2011.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Human Reproductive Technology Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 194)

The Bill amends the *Human Reproductive Technology Act 1991* (the HRT Act) in respect of the regulation of embryo research and prohibited practices that relate to reproductive technology. In summary, the amendments:

- retain the existing framework in relation to embryos created by fertilisation of human eggs by human sperm. Such embryos can only be created for the purpose of achieving pregnancy in women. If at the end of the assisted reproductive technology (ART) treatment the embryos are excess to the needs of the people to whom they were created they can be donated for research. Any use of the ART embryos for research will continue to be subject to the strict licensing requirement that are provided in the HRT Act;
- retain the ban on human cloning for reproductive purposes;
- allow for the creation of embryos by means other than fertilisation and the use of those embryos for research. Both the creation and the use of the embryo is subject to the same strict licensing that applies to excess ART embryos. Embryos created by means other than fertilisation cannot be developed by any means for more than 14 days and must not be used for reproductive purposes;
- require the tabling of reports prepared by the relevant Commonwealth Minister regarding the establishment of a national stem cell bank, a national register of excess ART embryos that have been donated for research and the feasibility of a national approach to non-blood human tissue-based therapies; and
- require the Western Australian Minister to cause a further independent review of the legislation in three years (which may be undertaken as part of the required review of the Commonwealth Acts).

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 March 2007 (P.D.p. 831).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 18 September 2007.

Second reading not agreed to in the Legislative Council on 6 May 2008.

Indigenous Conservation Title Bill 2007* (No. 237)

The purpose of the Bill is to create a form of title that recognises Indigenous interests in the Rudall River National Park and the Gibson Desert Nature Reserve.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 September 2007 (P.D.p. 5798).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 26 June 2008.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Industrial and Related Legislation Amendment Bill 2007* (No. 238)

The primary objective of this Bill is to strengthen protections for vulnerable workers by addressing the following issues:

- child labour protections;
- occupational safety and health protections;
- protections for injured workers;
- access to the common law; and
- amendments to the *Industrial Relations Act 1979*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 September 2007 (P.D.p. 5957).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 24 October 2007 and in the Legislative Council on 26 June 2008.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Industrial Relations Amendment Bill 2008* (LC No. 293)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Industrial Relations Act 1979* to abolish the position of the President of the Western Australian Industrial Relations Commission as established by the *Industrial Relations Act 1979*, with many of these functions to be undertaken by a Supreme Court judge. Minor consequential amendments to other statutes are included in the Bill.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 18 June 2008 (P.D.p. 4023).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Industrial Relations (Prohibition of Bargaining Services Fees) Amendment Bill 2007* (No. 221) (Mr M.J. Cowper)

The purpose of this Bill is to bring the *Industrial Relations Act 1979* into alignment with the Workplace Relations Amendment Bill currently before federal Parliament. The proposed amendments would insert an amendment into section 96A of the *Industrial Relations Act 1979* which deals with freedom of association. The purpose is to clarify and simplify the interpretation of 'bargaining services' and 'bargaining services fees'. A further proposed amendment would insert after section 96B a section to be known as 96BA which will expressly provide that any award, industrial agreement or order under the Act shall not include in it a 'bargaining services fee'.

The Bill was introduced and read a first time in the Legislative Assembly on 21 June 2007.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Information Privacy Bill 2007* (No. 193)

This Bill will amend the *Freedom of Information Act 1992* and the *Parliamentary Commissioner Act 1971*, as well as other Acts. The Bill aims to:

- regulate the handling of personal information by the public sector;
- regulate the handling of health information by the public and private sectors;
- create a right to apply for access, and amendment of, health records held by the private sector; and
- facilitate the exchange of personal or health information held by the public sector in appropriate circumstances.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 March 2007 (P.D.p. 824).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Inheritance (Family and Dependants Provision) Amendment Bill 2007* (No. 234)

The purpose of this Bill is to update and modernise the law in relation to family provision. In particular, this Bill will enable a claim to be made against a deceased estate by a step-child in two limited circumstances, and where there exists a duty to maintain a step-child or there is a legitimate expectation.

The Bill will also address the following areas of family law:

- kinship relationships;
- costs;
- undisclosed property;
- interim orders;
- probate and letters of administration; and
- evidence.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 September 2007 (P.D.p. 5956).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Integrity of Parliamentary Process Bill 2005 (LC No. 002) (Hon. P.G. Foss)

The purpose of this Bill is to protect the integrity of the parliamentary process from undue influence from outside or within the Parliament and to assist Members in making decisions as a parliamentary representative in the best interests of their electorate

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 30 March 2005 (P.D.p. 33).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Legal Profession Bill 2007* (No. 245)

The purpose of this Bill is to complete the legislative reform that the Parliament commenced when it enacted the *Legal Profession Act 2003*. The Bill seeks to regulate the legal profession in a way that is sufficiently flexible to balance the requirements of small local firms and larger national firms.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 October 2007 (P.D.p. 6695).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 21 November 2007.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 14 May 2008.

(Act No. 21 of 2008 – assented to on 27 May 2008)

Liquor Control Amendment Bill 2008 (No. 289)

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce a number of amendments to the *Liquor Control Act 1988* to allow juveniles, aged 16 or 17 years, who have graduated from a prescribed training course, to serve liquor whilst employed on licensed premises. The service of liquor under this provision must be ancillary to a meal, and the work carried out by the juvenile supervised at all times. Employment of the juvenile on licensed premises must also be approved by the director of liquor licensing.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 June 2008 (P.D.p. 4050).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Lobbying Disclosure and Accountability Bill 2007* (No. 242) (Dr E. Constable)

This Bill introduces measures to ensure openness and accountability of professional lobbying activities directed at members of Parliament, ministerial staff and other public officials in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 October 2007 (P.D.p. 6342).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Local Government Amendment Bill 2008* (No. 288)

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce amendments to improve the operation of the *Local Government Act 1995*.

The key amendments include provisions for:

- new powers for local governments to enter private land to remove graffiti;
- widening the circumstances that local government can take gravel and other building materials from land for building purposes;
- improving various accountability provisions relating to declaring financial interests, elections donations and restricting the types of gifts that council members may receive; and
- stronger powers for the Minister and the Department of Local Government and Regional Development to obtain information from local governments when carrying out investigations.

The Bill also incorporates a range of technical improvements to the legislation and several minor drafting improvements.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 June 2008 (P.D.p. 4049).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Major Events (Aerial Advertising) Bill 2008* (No. 286)

The purpose of this Bill is to control aerial advertising at major events, and for related purposes. This Bill seeks to ensure the rights and privileges of the sponsors of major events in Western Australia will be protected at law, and provide a further incentive to a sponsor to continue to invest in major events and associated activities in the state.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 May 2008 (P.D.p. 2972).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Medical Practitioners Bill 2006* (No. 183)

This Bill repeals the *Medical Act 1894* and replaces it with a modern registration scheme to ensure that only properly qualified and competent persons are registered to practise medicine and to regulate the practice by those persons for the purpose of protecting consumers of health services in Western Australia. The Bill implements the recommendations of the review of the *Medical Act 1894* which was provided to the Minister for Health in 2001.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 30 November 2006 (P.D.p. 9044).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 14 November 2007.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 21 November 2007.

(Act No. 22 of 2008 – assented to on 27 May 2008)

Minerals and Energy Research Amendment Bill 2006 (No. 122)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Minerals and Energy Research Act 1987*. The Act establishes the Minerals and Energy Research Institute of Western Australia, the function of which is to encourage the development of the minerals and energy industries for the benefit of the State by fostering and promoting all aspects of minerals and energy research.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 April 2006 (P.D.p. 1169).

(Act No. 23 of 2008 – assented to on 13 June 2008)

Mines Safety and Inspection Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 210)

The Bill has been developed to strengthen and improve the existing provisions of the *Mines Safety* and *Inspection Act 1994*. The changes contained in the Bill are in the following broad areas:

- the Occupational Safety and Health Tribunal;
- typographical errors;
- safety and health representatives;
- review of notices;
- penalties in line with general penalty provisions;
- alternative labour hire arrangements; and
- clarification of the definition of 'exploration manager'.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 June 2007 (P.D.p. 3009).

(Act No. 16 of 2008 – assented to on 16 April 2008)

Mining Legislation Amendment and Validation Bill 2007* (No. 232)

The purpose of this Bill is to:

- validate miscellaneous licences made for purposes pursuant to regulation 42B(n) of the *Mining Regulations 1981*;
- validate the extension of term of certain exploration licences lodged at the incorrect office of the Department; and
- amend section 19 of the *Mining Amendment Act 2004* to provide for the lodgement of the extension of term of exploration licences and compulsory surrenders at any office of the Department.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7501).

(Act No. 19 of 2008 – assented to on 19 May 2008)

Miscellaneous Amendments (Bankruptcy) Bill 2008 (No. 287)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend 92 State Acts by removing any reference to a 'deed of assignment', a 'deed of arrangement' and a 'composition', and by replacing these terms with the words 'personal insolvency agreement'. These amendments will bring the relevant State laws into line with the Commonwealth *Bankruptcy Act 1966*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 June 2008 (P.D.p. 4050).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Misuse of Drugs (Methylamphetamine) Amendment Bill 2007* (No. 222) (Mr M.J. Cowper)

The intent of this Bill is to have continuity between possession of amphetamine and methylamphetamine, so that law enforcement officers dealing with drug offenders can charge without having to differentiate the weight of the two prohibited drugs before processing offenders to the appropriate court.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 September 2007 (P.D.p. 5853).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

National Environment Protection Council (Western Australia) Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 188)

The purpose of the Bill is to implement minor amendments to the *National Environment Protection Council (Western Australia) Act 1996* (NEPC (WA) Act). The main effect of the amendments are to:

- allow the National Environmental Protection Council (NEPC) Service Corporation to provide support and assistance to other Ministerial Councils;
- provide a simplified process for making minor variations to the National Environment Protection Measures; and
- require five-yearly reviews of the NEPC (WA) Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 March 2007 (P.D.p. 833).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 5 September 2007.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

National Gas Access (Western Australia) Bill 2008* (No. 294)

The purpose of this Bill is to implement the new national third party access regime for natural gas pipeline systems in Western Australia. The Bill implements the national gas access reforms that are embodied in the National Gas Law and in the National Gas Rules. In addition the Bill provides modifications to those national laws to suit Western Australia's specific circumstances.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 June 2008 (P.D.p. 4051).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Nickel Refinery (BHP Billiton Nickel West Pty Ltd) (Termination of Agreements) Agreement Bill 2008 (No. 276)

The purpose of this Bill is to ratify an agreement, as varied by a subsequent agreement between the State and BHP Billiton Nickel West Pty Ltd (Nickel West) that provides for the termination of:

- an agreement made on 19 January 1968 and subsequently varied, titled the *Nickel Refinery (Western Mining Corporation Limited) Agreement Act 1968*; and
- an agreement made on 4 November 1970 and subsequently varied, titled the *Nickel Refinery (Western Mining Corporation Limited) Agreement Act Amendment Act 1970* (collectively referred to as the 'State Agreement') between the State and Nickel West (under its former name, Western Mining Corporation Limited 'Western Mining'); and
- to validate the renewal of certain leases.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 May 2008 (P.D.p. 3168).

(Act No. 36 of 2008 – assented to on 27 June 2008)

Nuclear Facilities Prohibition Bill 2007* (No. 212)

The purpose of the Bill is to prohibit the construction and operation of nuclear facilities in Western Australia. The Bill provides that no State laws or authorisations granted under State laws allow the construction or operation of a nuclear facility or other activities prohibited by the Bill.

The Bill makes it an offence to construct and operate a nuclear facility in Western Australia with a penalty of \$500,000.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 June 2007 (P.D.p. 3427).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 14 November 2007.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Occupational Safety and Health Legislation Amendment Bill 2007* (No. 223)

The purpose of the Bill is to clarify amendments made to the *Occupational Safety and Health Act* 1984. The amendments contained in this Bill relate to the following broad areas:

- alternative labour arrangements;
- safety and health representatives;
- the Occupational Safety and Health Tribunal; and
- police officers.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 August 2007 (P.D.p. 4466).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Parental Support and Responsibility Bill 2005* (No. 041)

This Bill is for an Act to provide for responsible parenting agreements and responsible parenting orders. The Bill provides for information sharing between government agencies, and makes consequential amendments to the *Children's Court of Western Australia Act 1988*, the *Young Offenders Act 1994* and provides for related purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 1 June 2005 (P.D.p. 2585).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 30 November 2005.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 3 April 2007.

(Act No. 14 of 2008 – assented to on 15 April 2008)

Pay-roll Tax Assessment Amendment Bill 2008 (No. 283)

The purpose of this Bill is to implement a package of measures aimed at achieving a greater level of consistency between Western Australia and the other States and Territories. Consistency will be in eight specific areas:

- timing of the lodgement of returns;
- motor vehicle allowances exemption;
- accommodation of allowances exemption;
- treatment of fringe benefits;
- treatment of employee share acquisition schemes;
- treatment of services performed outside a jurisdiction;
- treatment of superannuation contributions; and
- grouping.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 May 2008 (P.D.p. 2971).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 17 June 2008.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Pharmacists Bill 2006* (No. 185)

The objective of the Bill is to protect the public of Western Australia from potential harm by providing for the effective regulation of pharmacy. To achieve this objective, the Bill vests the Pharmacists Board of Western Australia with two principal statutory functions:

- registration the Board is responsible for determining who may be registered as pharmacists in
 Western Australia by reference to eligibility criteria that are contained in the Bill. The Board is
 also responsible for the registration of pharmacy premises and to ensure that pharmacy premises
 meet appropriate standards; and
- professional regulation the Board is authorised to inquire into complaints about pharmacists and to take appropriate action where a disciplinary or impairment matter as set out in the Bill is established.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 November 2006 (P.D.p. 8930).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 3 April 2007.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Police Amendment Bill 2006* (No. 184)

The purpose of the Bill is to amend the *Police Act 1892* and various other Acts to update provisions relating to Aboriginal aides who are now known as 'Aboriginal police liaison officers'.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 November 2006 (P.D.p. 8929).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 5 December 2007.

(Act No. 8 of 2008 – assented to on 31 May 2008)

Police (Compensation for Injured Officers) Amendment Bill 2006* (No. 159) (Mr M.J. Cowper)

There is currently no statutory provision for the support, compensation and rehabilitation of members and former members of the WA Police Force who retire, resign or otherwise leave the Police Force with residual illness or injuries which arise through the performance of a police duty or function.

Police are specifically excluded from coverage of the *Workers' Compensation and Injury Management Act 1981* (except in death) and this Bill addresses that anomaly by amending the *Police Act 1892* to provide compensation and ongoing medical benefits for officers injured in the course of duty.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 August 2006 (P.D.p. 5115).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Police (Former Officers' Medical and Other Expenses) Bill 2008* (No. 292)

The purpose of this Bill is to establish a post-separation medical benefit scheme for all former police officers and Aboriginal police liaison officers (APLOs). The Police Commissioner will be the responsible party for the payment of medical and other expenses incurred by former officers in relation to injuries arising out of their former duties as police officers or APLOs.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 June 2008 (P.D.p. 4048).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Prisoners (Interstate Transfer) Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 250)

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce nationally agreed changes to the range of factors taken into account when a transfer of a prisoner is requested.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7502).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Professional Combat Sports Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 235) (Mr T.R. Sprigg)

The purpose of the Bill is to provide for the Minister to give directions in writing to the Professional Combat Sports Commission with respect to the exercise by the Commission of its powers generally or with respect to a particular matter.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 September 2007 (P.D.p. 5833).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Prostitution Amendment Bill 2007* (No. 226)

The purpose of the Bill is to provide a framework for addressing the regulation of prostitution in a manner that is conducive to public health, protects sex workers from exploitation and protects children from being involved in or exposed to prostitution.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 August 2007 (P.D.p. 4467).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 23 October 2007.

(Act No. 13 of 2008 – assented to on 14 April 2008)

Public Notaries Amendment Bill 2005* (LC No. 008)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Public Notaries Act 1979*. This Bill proposes to simplify procedures by transferring the functions of the Attorney General to the Legal Practice Board, which will then report directly to the Chief Justice regarding the suitability and fitness of an applicant and the need for a further appointment.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 30 March 2005 (P.D.p. 30).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Public Transport Authority Amendment Bill 2008* (No. 275)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide strong penalties to support the Public Transport Banning Orders which were introduced in February 2008 to combat antisocial behaviour on, and criminal damage to, Western Australia's public transport system.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 May 2008 (P.D.p. 2975).

(Act No. 42 of 2008 – assented to on 3 July 2008)

Public Trustee and Trustee Companies Legislation Amendment Bill 2006 (No. 102)

The purpose of this Bill is to modernise the Public Trustee's legislative framework which has remained largely unchanged for over 60 years. This will allow the Public Trustee to remove inequitable investment and fee arrangements which currently disadvantage some of the most vulnerable members of the Western Australian community, and to provide full trustee services in terms of performing essential financial and legal functions. This Bill will provide for the reform of the Public Trustee's operations and services and enable it to bring its activities up to date with industry best practice, in line with the other Public Trustees in Australia and the Trustee Companies Act. It will also allow the Public Trustee to achieve self-funding over time.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 November 2006 (P.D.p. 8932).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 4 April 2007 and in the Legislative Council on 6 December 2007.

(Act No. 9 of 2008 – assented to on 31 March 2008)

Real Estate and Business Agents Amendment Bill 2007* (No. 247-1)

The purpose of this Bill is to assist in removing red tape in relation to the licensing requirements for business agents, while increasing competition in the marketplace.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7091).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Revenue Laws Amendment Bill 2008 (No. 281)

The purpose of this Bill is to implement the taxation measures announced in the 2008–2009 State Budget that relate to the land tax, metropolitan region improvement tax, duties and rates and charges legislation.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 May 2008 (P.D.p. 2967).

(Act No. 30 of 2008 – assented to on 27 June 2008)

Revenue Laws Amendment Bill (No.2) 2008* (No. 282)

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce amendments necessary to implement the taxation administration measures that were announced as part of the 2008–2009 State Budget.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 May 2008 (P.D.p. 2969).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 19 June 2008.

(Act No. 31 of 2008 – assented to on 27 June 2008)

Road Traffic (Administration) Bill 2007* (No. 252)

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce various components of the model provisions contained in the federal Road Transport Reform (Compliance and Enforcement) Bill, required to effectively investigate and enforce breaches of the mass, dimension and load restraint requirements throughout the road transport chain.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7899).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 20 March 2008.

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 20 March 2008.

(Act No. 39 of 2008 – assented to on 15 August 2008)

Road Traffic Amendment Bill 2008 (No. 272)

The purpose of this Bill is to prepare for the introduction of the Repeat Drink Driving Strategy. This is intended to provide a further strong deterrent to unauthorised driving. This is considered necessary so that affected drink driving offenders will not consider unauthorised driving as an alternative to obtaining the proposed conditional driving authorisation. In summary, the amendments will:

- increase the period of time a police officer may impound a vehicle used in the commission of an impounding offence (driving) from 48 hours to seven days for a first offence and 28 days for a second and subsequent offence;
- extend the definition of 'road rage circumstances' to include places other than a road such as car parks and private property;
- amend vehicle confiscation provisions as they relate to both hoon and road rage offences so that where an application is made by Police to have a vehicle confiscated, a court may order the impounding of the vehicle for a period of up to six months as an alternative to confiscation; and
- target those drivers who speed excessively by increasing the court imposed fines for reckless driving.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 April 2008 (P.D.p. 2209).

(Act No. 24 of 2008 – assented to on 13 June 2008)

Road Traffic Amendment (Confiscation and Disposal of Vehicles) Bill 2008 (No. 268) (Mr R. Johnson)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Road Traffic Act 1974* to:

- increase the impoundment period of a vehicle to seven days;
- require for impoundment of the vehicle for a period of three months upon conviction for a second offence of driving without a driver's licence, or racing or road rage offences;
- require confiscation of the vehicle upon conviction for a third offence of driving without a driver's licence, or racing or road rage offences;
- require confiscation of the vehicle upon conviction for driving without a driver's licence that has been suspended or cancelled due to a drink driving offence; and
- give the Commissioner the discretion to sell, crush or use the vehicle in police covert operations upon the making of a confiscation order, or upon a failure to collect an impounded vehicle.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 2 April 2008 (P.D.p. 1687).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Road Traffic (Authorisation to Drive) Bill 2007 (No. 249)

The purpose of this Bill is to facilitate the introduction of the national Road Transport Reform (Compliance and Enforcement) Bill.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7898).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 13 March 2008.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 20 March 2008.

(Act No. 40 of 2008 – assented to on 15 August 2008)

Road Traffic (Consequential Provisions) Bill 2007 (No. 253)

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal and delete the various clauses of the *Road Traffic Act 1974* which have been moved to new statutes and provides for the amendment of all other legislation impacted by these changes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7900).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 20 March 2008 and in the Legislative Council on 26 June 2008.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 20 March 2008.

The Bill passed the Third Reading stage, with amendments, in the Legislative Council but had not been returned to the Legislative Assembly upon the prorogation of Parliament.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Road Traffic (Vehicles) Bill 2007 (No. 251)

The purpose of this Bill is to facilitate the introduction of the national Road Transport Reform (Compliance and Enforcement) Bill.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7898).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 20 March 2008

Amended in the Legislative Council on 26 June 2008.

The Bill passed the Third Reading stage, with amendments, in the Legislative Council but had not been returned to the Legislative Assembly upon the prorogation of Parliament.

Bill lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Road Traffic (Vehicles) (Taxing) Bill 2007 (No. 254)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide the legal mechanism whereby vehicle licence fees can exceed the administrative costs associated with issuing a vehicle licence.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7900).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 20 March 2008.

(Act No. 41 of 2008 – assented to on 15 August 2008)

Rottnest Island Authority Amendment Bill 2007* (No. 201)

The Bill's purpose is to amend the *Rottnest Island Authority Act 1987* to address corporate governance issues raised by the Rottnest Island Taskforce Report 2004 and to create the Rottnest Island Wadjemup Conservation Reserve under the care, control and management of the Rottnest Island Authority.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 May 2007 (P.D.p. 2224).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Security and Related Activities (Control) Amendment Bill 2007* (No. 241)

The purpose of this Bill is to bring together a range of major reforms and minor administrative changes to the *Security and Related Activities* (Control) Act 1996.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 October 2007 (P.D.p. 6310).

(Act No. 4 of 2008 – assented to on 2 April 2008)

Seeds Amendment Bill 2007 (LC No. 209)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Seeds Act 1981* with the principal purpose of increasing the flexibility and usefulness of that Act in relation to seed that is prohibited.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 29 August 2007 (P.D.p. 4434).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Sentence Administration (Interstate Transfer of Community Based Sentences) Bill 2007* (No. 255)

The purpose of the Bill is to provide for the formal transfer and enforcement of community based sentences between jurisdictions.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7503).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 8 April 2008.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 10 April 2008.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

State Supply Commission Amendment Bill 2007* (No. 225)

The purpose of this Bill is to formally transfer accountability for State Fleet from the State Supply Commission (SSC) to the Department of Treasury and Finance (DTF). The amendments incorporated into this Bill will:

- enable the SSC to enter into an agreement with the Minister of another agency (in practice this will be the Treasurer and DFT respectively) for the SCC's functions to be transferred to the Treasurer, and delegated by the Treasurer to DFT, to the extent necessary to permit DTF to provide the State Fleet services in its own right;
- enable DTF to draw on the powers of the *State Supply Commission Act 1991* to the extent necessary to undertake the State Fleet functions. The powers required will include powers to contract with any person, to set and retain charges from other government agencies and to borrow; and
- amend the Act's accounting provisions to provide that the State Fleet functions will be accounted for as DTF functions in its budget and annual report, in compliance with the *Financial Management Act* 2006.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 August 2007 (P.D.p. 4095).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 1 April 2008.

(Act No. 15 of 2008 – assented to on 14 April 2008)

Statutes (Repeals and Minor Amendments) Bill 2006 (LC No. 170)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the statute law by repealing various Acts and adopted imperial Acts, and making minor amendments to various other written laws and adopted imperial Acts, and for related purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 18 October 2006 (P.D.p. 7142).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 18 October 2006.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 19 June 2008.

The Bill passed the Third Reading stage, with amendments, in the Legislative Council but had not been forwarded to the Legislative Assembly for concurrence upon prorogation.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Statutes (Repeals and Minor Amendments) Bill 2008 (LC No. 265)

The purpose of this Bill is to make minor amendments to various Acts and to repeal Acts that are no longer required. The Bill repeals unproclaimed or obsolete, redundant, spent and inoperative Acts. The Bill also makes a range of miscellaneous and administrative amendments to a number of Acts across various portfolio areas.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 20 March 2008 (P.D.p. 1309).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 7 May 2008.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Sunset Hospital Site Bill 2006 (No. 137)

The purpose of this Bill is to facilitate land tenure and planning amendments to A Class reserve 1667 to enable implementation of the Sunset Community Master Plan, providing for:

- the timely adaptive reuse and conservation of the heritage-listed Sunset Hospital site;
- most of the Sunset site remaining as an A Class reserve and being placed under the custodianship of the University of Western Australia for use as the UWA Arts Centre and for development of a residential aged care facility;
- excision of a relatively small part of the A Class reserve 1667 for the development of residential apartments;
- appropriate amendment to the Metropolitan Region Scheme; and
- minor boundary rationalisation to protect improvements owned by the City of Nedlands.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 May 2006 (P.D.p. 2862).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Surrogacy Bill 2007* (No. 190)

This Bill provides for the regulation of surrogacy arrangements and for the parentage of children born as a result of those arrangements. Under the Bill surrogacy will be provided for by:

- allowing access to IVF for a women who has agreed to bear a child for a women or couple who would be eligible for IVF;
- providing a parentage order which will alter the birth certificate to make the arranged parents the legal parents of the child; and
- regulating activities around the making of surrogacy arrangements.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 1 March 2007 (P.D.p. 193).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 5 September 2007 and in the Legislative Council on 25 June 2008.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 14 November 2007.

The Bill passed the Third Reading stage, with amendments, in the Legislative Council but had not been returned to the Legislative Assembly upon prorogation.

Bill lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Terrorism (Preventative Detention) Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 215)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Terrorism (Preventative Detention) Act 2006* (the Act) in order to avoid any doubt about the ability of ASIO to take a person who is in preventative detention under the Act into their custody.

It is necessary to amend the Act to refer to the updated provisions of the *Australian Security Intelligence Organisation Act 1979*. The Bill will achieve this by making a number of housekeeping amendments to the *Terrorism (Preventative Detention) Act 2006*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 June 2007 (P.D.p. 3426).

(Act No. 1 of 2008 – assented to on 5 March 2008)

Treasurer's Advance Authorisation Bill 2008 (No. 266)

The purpose of this Bill is to allow for supplementary funding of annual appropriations for unforseen and/or extraordinary events during the financial year, as well as short-term repayable advances to agencies for working capital purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 March 2008 (P.D.p. 656).

(Act No. 10 of 2008 – assented to on 14 April 2008)

Uranium Mining (Implementation of Government Commitments) Bill 2007 (LC No. 198) (Hon. G. Watson)

The purpose of this Bill is to prohibit the mining of uranium in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 4 April 2007 (P.D.p. 1164).

Second Reading not agreed to in the Legislative Council on 10 April 2008.

Water Services Licensing (Water Conservation Target) Amendment Bill 2007 (LC No. 264) (Hon. P. Llewellyn)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Water Services Licensing Act 1995* to impose, as a condition of holding specified operating licences for water supply services, an obligation to meet a specified water conservation target, and for incidental purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 6 December 2007 (P.D.p. 8248).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.

Western Australian Resources Heritage Fund Bill 2007* (No. 197) (Hon. J. Day)

The Bill provides for the establishment of the Western Australian Resources Heritage Fund. The purpose of the Bill is to create a secure capital fund using a proportion of Western Australia's considerable earnings from non-renewable resources. Once established, the Fund will generate a stable, long term income stream to benefit future generations of Western Australians when the State's non-renewable resources are depleted.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 April 2007 (P.D.p. 1222).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the 37th Parliament.
