SYNOPSIS OF BILLS

2010

The following synopsis of Bills introduced during the First Session of the Thirty-Eighth Parliament is intended only to give a brief outline of the main features of each Bill at the stage when the second reading motion of the Bill was moved. The full second reading speech for each Bill is available in *Parliamentary Debates (Hansard)* which are available from the State Law Publisher or from the Parliament website: www.parliament.wa.gov.au. The ultimate stage reached by each Bill is also indicated. While it does not take into account amendments made in either House, reference can be made to the *Votes and Proceedings* of the Legislative Assembly and the *Minutes* of the Legislative Council where amendments have been agreed to.

- * Indicates the Act, or parts thereof, comes into operation on a date or dates to be fixed by Proclamation.
- LC Indicates the Bill originated in the Legislative Council; all other Bills without LC originated in the Legislative Assembly.
- (P.D.p.) Indicates the *Hansard* page number for the second reading of the Bill in the House in which it was first introduced.
- Note: Explanatory Memorandum are provided with all Bills First Read in the Legislative Assembly (SO 162).

Aboriginal Housing Legislation Amendment Bill 2009* (No. 086)

The purpose of this Bill is to create a mechanism—the Housing Management Agreement—under which the Housing Authority can legally control and manage the letting and leasing of housing on Aboriginal land on behalf of any Aboriginal entity that has the power to grant a lease over Aboriginal land.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Assembly was moved on 14 October 2009 (P.D.p 8027).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 10 March 2010.

(Act No. 6 of 2010 – assented to on 25 May 2010).

Acts Amendment (Fair Trading) Bill 2010* (No. 159)

The purpose of this Bill is to shift the functions of various regulatory and licensing Boards to the Commissioner under the *Fair Trading Act 2010*; establish certain investigatory and enforcement powers in relation to certain regulated persons; enable the establishment of various consumer advisory committees under the *Fair Trading Act 2010*; and to make amendments to various Acts as a consequence of enacting the *Fair Trading Act 2010*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 22 September 2010 (P.D.p. 7103).

(Act No. 58 of 2010 – assented to on 8 December 2010).

Acts Amendment (Safety and Human Rights of Persons in Custody) Bill 2009* (No. 072) (Mr E. Ripper)

The purpose of this Bill is to enact a statutory system that would enable the Inspector of Custodial Services to issue the Department of Corrective Services with a 'Show Cause' Notice in cases where the Inspector is aware of issues relating to the human rights and safety of persons in custody.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 September 2009 (P.D.p. 7188).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Agriculture and Related Resources Protection Amendment Bill 2010* (No. 129)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Agriculture and Related Resources Protection Act 1976* in order to transfer the functions conferred on the Agriculture Protection Board (APB) to the Minister or the Director General of the department principally assisting the Minister with the administration of the Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 19 May 2010 (P.D.p. 2906).

(Act No. 46 of 2010 – assented to on 28 October 2010).

Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Capital 2007-08 and 2008-09 (Supplementary) Bill 2009 (No. 090)

The purpose of this Bill is to appropriate out of the Consolidated Account a sum for capital payments made during the year ended 30 June 2008 under the authority of the *Financial Management Act 2006* and the *Treasurer's Advance Authorisation Act 2008*. It also appropriates a sum for capital payments made during the year ended 30 June 2009 under the authority of the *Financial Management Act 2006* and the *Treasurer's Advance Authorisation Act 2009*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 October 2009 (P.D.p. 8173)

(Act No. 11 of 2010 – assented to on 3 June 2010).

Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Recurrent 2007-08 and 2008-09 (Supplementary) Bill 2009 (No. 091)

The purpose of this Bill is to appropriate out of the Consolidated Account a sum for recurrent payments made during the year ended 30 June 2008 under the authority of the *Financial Management Act 2006* and the *Treasurer's Advance Authorisation Act 2008*. It also appropriates a sum for recurrent payments made during the year ended 30 June 2009 under the authority of the *Financial Management Act 2006* and the *Treasurer's Advance Authorisation Act 2009*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 October 2009 (P.D.p. 8172).

(Act No. 10 of 2010 – assented to on 3 June 2010).

Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Capital 2010-11 Bill 2010 (No. 133)

The purpose of this Bill is to grant supply and to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Account certain sums for the capital purposes of the year ending 30 June 2011.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 May 2010 (P.D.p. 3133).

(Act No. 24 of 2010 – assented to on 7 July 2010).

Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Recurrent 2010-11 Bill 2010 (No. 134)

The purpose of this Bill is to grant supply and appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Account certain sums for the recurrent services and purposes for the year ending 30 June 2011.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 May 2010 (P.D.p. 3124).

(Act No. 23 of 2010 – assented to on 7 July 2010).

Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Capital 2009-10 (Supplementary) Bill 2010 (No. 155)

The purpose of this Bill is to appropriate out of the Consolidated Account a sum for capital payments made during the year ended 30 June 2010 under the authority of the *Financial Management Act 2006* and the *Treasurer's Advance Authorisation Act 2010*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 9 November 2010 (P.D.p. 8348).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Recurrent 2009-10 (Supplementary) Bill 2010 (No. 164)

The purpose of this Bill is to appropriate out of the Consolidated Account a sum for recurrent payments made during the year ended 30 June 2010 under the authority of the *Financial Management Act 2006* and the *Treasurer's Advance Authorisation Act 2010*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 9 November 2010 (P.D.p. 8348).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Approvals and Related Reforms (No. 1) (Environment) Bill 2009* (LC No. 094)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* to remove duplicative or unnecessary appeal rights, align appeal periods across regulatory processes and to permit decision making authorities to approve minor and preliminary works to which the Environmental Protection Authority has consented.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 19 November 2009 (P.D.p. 9406).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 19 November 2009.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 14 September 2010.

(Act No. 40 of 2010 – assented to on 28 October 2010).

Approvals and Related Reforms (No. 2) (Mining) Bill 2009* (LC No. 102)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide that mine closure plans are required to be submitted with mining proposals and reviewed on a regular basis to ensure that they are up to date. The Bill also provides that mining tenement documents can be lodged at any office of the mining registrar, including Perth, rather than at the office where the mining tenement is located.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 19 November 2009 (P.D.p. 9405).

(Act No. 12 of 2010 – assented to on 3 June 2010).

Approvals and Related Reforms (No. 3) (Crown Land) Bill 2009* (No. 100)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend various Acts so as to provide efficiencies in the processes for giving notices, applying for approvals and doing various other things under those Acts which relate to the use and development of, or dealings with, Crown land and freehold land held in the name of the State.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 November 2009 (P.D.p. 9263).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 5 May 2010.

(Act No. 8 of 2010 – assented to on 3 June 2010).

Approvals and Related Reforms (No. 4) (Planning) Bill 2009* (No. 101)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Planning and Development Act 2005* to streamline and improve the approvals process.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 November 2009 (P.D.p. 9265).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 6 May 2010 and amended in the Legislative Council on 1 July 2010.

(Act No. 28 of 2010 – assented to on 19 August 2010).

Associations Incorporation Amendment (Transfer of Incorporation) Bill 2010 (LC No. 154)

(Hon S. Ellery)

The purpose of this Bill is to facilitate the movement of an organisation incorporated under the *Associations Incorporation Act 1987* to the *Corporations Act 2001*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 18 November 2010 (P.D.p. 9083).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 25 November 2010.

(Act No. 55 of 2010 – assented to on 8 December 2010)

Building and Construction Industry Training Fund and Levy Collection Amendment Bill 2010 (LC No. 135)

The purpose of this bill is to widen the list of organisations, prescribed in section 10 of the *Building and Construction Industry Training Fund and Levy Collection Act 1990*, that the Minister must consult in relation to the appointment of members to the Building and Construction Industry Training Board.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 11 August 2010 (P.D.p. 5311).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 8 September 2010.

(Act No. 47 of 2010 – assented to on 12 November 2010).

Building Bill 2010* (No. 172)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for permits for building work and demolition work; standards for the construction and demolition of buildings and incidental structures; the use and maintenance of, and requirements in relation to, existing buildings and incidental structures; and work affecting land other than land on which the work is done.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 November 2010 (P.D.p. 8493).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Building Services Levy Bill 2010 (No. 168)

The purpose of this Bill is to impose a levy in relation to certain authorisations for building services.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 November 2010.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Building Services (Complaint Resolution and Administration) Bill 2010* (No. 169)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for; a system for dealing with complaints about building services, home building work contract matters and disciplinary matters; a public officer with functions relating to building services and complaints; a levy in relation to certain authorisations for building services; a system for ensuring compliance with laws about building services and for related matters.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 November 2010 (P.D.p. 8496).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Building Services (Registration) Bill 2010* (No. 171)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the registration of certain building service providers and the approval of owner-builders. It also repeals the *Builders' Registration Act 1939*, the *Painters' Registration Act 1961* and various regulations.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 November 2010 (P.D.p. 8495).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Butane Products Control Bill 2009* (No. 041) (Mr R. Cook)

The purpose of this Bill is to reduce the incidence of illness and death related to the use of butane products by prohibiting the supply of butane products to young persons.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 September 2009 (P.D.p. 7204).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Cannabis Law Reform Bill 2009* (No. 087)

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the *Cannabis Control Act 2003* in order to
reinststate the one-time cautioning system for possession only;
introduce a new limit for possession of 10 grams of cannabis or less;
require first time offenders found in possession of 10 grams of cannabis or less to attend a
mandatory cannabis education program;
prosecute subsequent possession offences;
prosecute as criminal offences all cultivation offences;
impose harsher sentences on dealers who sell or supply illegal drugs to children;
provide offences for exposing children to harm from the manufacture of illegal drugs or
cultivation of plants; and
ban the sale of drug-use paraphernalia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 October 2009 (P.D.p. 8022).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 21 September 2010.

(Act No. 45 of 2010 – assented to on 28 October 2010).

Cement Works (Cockburn Cement Limited) Agreement Amendment Bill 2010 (No. 138)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Cement Works (Cockburn Cement Limited) Agreement Act 1971* to reflect the environmental approvals that Cockburn Cement received in 1999 and 2002, as well as subsequent approvals. It also brings new areas under the state agreement that have received environmental approvals and to ensure that the company's operations are managed consistently with those approvals.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 June 2010 (P.D.p. 4072.)

(Act No. 41 of 2010 – assented to on 28 October 2010).

Charitable Trusts Amendment Bill 2010 (LC No. 149)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Charitable Trusts Act 1962* so as to enable the trustees of certain kinds of trusts to make gifts to 'eligible recipients' even though the recipients are not charitable at law.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 21 September 2010 (P.D.p. 6874).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 2 December 2010.

Child Pornography and Exploitation Material and Classification Legislation Amendment Bill 2009* (LC No. 043)

The purpose of this Bill is to protect children and the community in Western Australia from child pornography by improving and strengthening Western Australia's criminal laws dealing with child pornography.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 6 May 2009 (P.D.p. 3396).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 6 May 2009.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 24 March 2010.

(Act No. 21 of 2010 – assented to on 7 July 2010).

Child Support (Adoption of Laws) Amendment Bill 2009 (No. 098)

The purpose of this Bill is to enable the State Parliament of Western Australia to adopt Commonwealth legislation that is based on powers referred by other states to the Commonwealth. The Bill utilises that method of adoption to allow the recent Commonwealth child support amendments to apply for the benefit of exnuptial children in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 November 2009 (P.D.p. 9770).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 11 November 2010.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 16 November 2010.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 2 December 2010.

Children and Community Services Amendment Bill 2010* (No. 130)

The purpose of this Bill is to establish a secure care facility for children and young people at extreme risk, for whom no other option is available to manage that risk and to introduce special guardianship orders for children who, for various reasons, are unable to live permanently in the care of their own families.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 22 June 2010 (P.D.p. 4236).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 21 September 2010.

(Act No. 49 of 2010 – assented to on 24 November 2010).

**Commercial Tenancy (Retail Shops) Amendment Bill 2009* (No. 081)
(Mr F. Logan)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Commercial Tenancy (Retail Shops) Agreements Act 1985* to supplement the rights of, and provide protection to, tenants under the Act, to establish the role of Commissioner for Small Business to deal with retail shop leases, and to enhance the effectiveness of the Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 October 2009 (P.D.p. 8059).

Conservation Legislation Amendment Bill 2010* (LC No. 174)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Conservation and Land Management Act 1984* (CALM Act) and the *Wildlife Conservation Act 1950* to replace the provisions for the voluntary land management agreements that presently enable land or waters to be managed by the Department of Environment and Conservation's chief executive officer, but that do not enable joint management with another party or parties. Joint management agreements are currently beyond the powers of the CALM Act, however this deficiency will be corrected and joint management agreements over private and other land will be made possible. The Bill will also provide formal recognition of the importance of land and waters to the culture and heritage of Aboriginal people.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 17 November 2010 (P.D.p. 8944).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 2 December 2010.

Credit (Commonwealth Powers) Bill 2010* (No. 120)

The purpose of this Bill is to adopt the *National Consumer Credit Protection Act 2009* (Commonwealth) as amended and the *National Consumer Credit Protection (Transitional and Consequential Provisions) Act 2009* (Commonwealth), and to refer certain matters relating to the provision of credit and certain other financial transactions to the Parliament of the Commonwealth, for the purposes of section 51(xxxvii) of the Constitution of the Commonwealth.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 22 April 2010 (P.D.p. 2068).

(Act No. 13 of 2010 – assented to on 25 June 2010).

**Credit (Commonwealth Powers) (Transitional and Consequential Provisions) Bill 2010*
(No. 122)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend or repeal various Acts as a consequence of the *National Consumer Credit Protection Act 2009* (Commonwealth).

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 17 March 2010 (P.D.p. 761).

(Act No. 14 of 2010 – assented to on 25 June 2010).

Criminal Code Amendment (Identity Crime) Bill 2009* (No. 104)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Criminal Code* to create offences for the making, use, supply or possession of identification material with the intent that the material be used to commit, or facilitate the commission of, an indictable offence. Offences are also created for the possession of equipment capable of making, using, supplying, or retaining identification material with the intent that that equipment be used to either commit or facilitate the commission of an indictable offence.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 November 2009 (P.D.p. 9269).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 26 November 2009.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 27 May 2010.

(Act No. 16 of 2010 – assented to on 25 June 2010).

**Criminal Code (Identity Theft) Amendment Bill (No. 2) 2009 (No. 092)
(Mr J. Quigley)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Criminal Code* to render unlawful the obtaining of, or dealing with, another entity's identification and/or the possession of equipment capable of copying another person's identification documentation for the purpose of committing an offence.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 October 2009 (P.D.p. 8060).

The Bill was removed from the Notice Paper, under Standing Order 144A, on 16 November 2010.

Criminal Code Amendment (Infringement Notices) Bill 2010* (No. 151)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Criminal Code* to introduce a new scheme into Western Australia whereby infringement notices can be issued for offences that are considered relatively low level or minor.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 8 September 2010 (P.D.p. 6137).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 2 December 2010.

**Criminal Code (Rock Throwing and Laser Pointing) Amendment Bill 2009
(No. 099) (Mr J. Quigley)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Criminal Code* to render it unlawful to endanger the safety of a person or the safe use of a vehicle by throwing, dropping or placing an object or by using a laser pointer.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 November 2009 (P.D.p. 8806).

The Bill was removed from the Notice Paper, under Standing Order 144A, on 16 November 2010.

Criminal Investigation Amendment Bill 2009* (No. 089)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Criminal Investigation Act 2006* to enable police officers to stop and search people in prescribed and declared areas without the consent of the person.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 October 2009 (P.D.p. 8024).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 26 November 2009.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 2 December 2010.

Criminal Investigation Amendment Bill 2010 (No. 167)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Criminal Investigation Act 2006* to authorise certain persons to conduct non-intimate, intimate and internal forensic procedures.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 November 2010 (P.D.p. 8492).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 2 December 2010.

Cross-border Justice Amendment Bill 2009 (No. 056)

The purpose of this Bill is to make two substantive amendments to the *Cross-border Justice Act 2008*. The first consists of the insertion of a new section (Section 139A) to clarify that the operation of the *Coroners Act 1996* will not be affected by the *Cross-border Justice Act 2008*. The second substantive amendment made by the Bill is to Section 36 of the Act. This section will be amended to clarify that it specifically relates to persons 'released without charge' rather than simply 'released'.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 June 2009 (P.D.p. 5166).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 9 September 2009.

Daylight Savings Amendment Bill 2009* (LC No. 040) (Hon A. Fels)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Daylight Savings Act 2006* to provide for the holding of a referendum in conjunction with a general election and for the abridgement of the daylight savings trial period.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 1 April 2009 (P.D.p. 2450).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 2 December 2010.

Environmental Protection Amendment Bill 2010 (LC No. 153)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* to create an offence that clearly prohibits 'dumping waste'.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 9 September 2010 (P.D.p. 6258).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 20 October 2010.

Equal Opportunity Amendment Bill 2009* (No. 046) (Mrs M. Roberts)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Equal Opportunity Act 1984* to prohibit discrimination against mothers' breast feeding in a public place, and for related purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 May 2009 (P.D.p. 3955).

(Act No. 2 of 2010 – assented to on 1 April 2010).

Equal Opportunity (Members of Parliament) Amendment Bill 2010 (No. 124) (Mr M. Whitely)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Equal Opportunity Act 1984* to deal with sexual harassment by Members of Parliament.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 April 2010 (P.D.p. 1968).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Fair Trading Bill 2010* (No. 158)

The purpose of this Bill is to promote and encourage fair trading practices and a competitive and fair market, protect the interests of consumers by applying the Australian Consumer Law (with modifications) as a law of Western Australia, and for providing for codes of practice. It also provides for the powers and functions of a Commissioner, including powers to carry out investigations into alleged breaches of this Act and provide for the repeal of the *Consumer Affairs Act 1971*, *Fair Trading Act 1987*, *Door to Door Trading Act 1987*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 22 September 2010 (P.D.p. 7100).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 20 October 2010.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 24 November 2010.

(Act No. 57 of 2010 – assented to on 8 December 2010).

Fish Resources Management Amendment (Fees) Bill 2010* (No. 180)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Fish Resources Management Act 1994* in relation to fees for access to the state's commercial fisheries that are now viewed as excise, and are not authorised by the Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 November 2010 (P.D.p. 9474).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Fish Resources Management Amendment (Fees) Bill (No. 2) 2010 (No. 179)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide that where a fee for the issue of an authorisation under the *Fish Resources Management Act 1994* includes an amount that is construed to be a tax, then the management plan or regulations, as the case requires, may impose the tax.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 November 2010 (P.D.p. 9475).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Franchising Bill 2010 (No. 162) (Mr P. Abetz)

The purpose of this Bill is to regulate the conduct of people who are about to enter into or who are parties to franchise agreements.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 October 2010 (P.D.p. 7651)

Referred to the Legislative Assembly Economics and Industry Standing Committee on 18 November 2010.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Grain Marketing Repeal Bill 2010* (No. 110)

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the *Grain Marketing Act 2002* following deregulation in October 2009.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 March 2010 (P.D.p. 537).

(Act No. 30 of 2010 – assented to on 25 August 2010).

Hairdressers Registration (Amendment and Expiry) Bill 2010* (No. 117)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Hairdressers Registration Act 1946* to provide for the winding up of the Hairdressers Registration Board by an administrator.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 9 March 2010 (P.D.p. 489).

(Act No. 29 of 2010 – assented to on 25 August 2010).

Health and Disability Services Legislation Amendment Bill 2009*(No. 064)

The purpose of this Bill is to implement amendments to the *Health Services (Conciliation and Review) Act 1995* to ensure the continuation of the Office of Health Review as the principal independent complaints mechanism for health and disability in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 19 August 2009 (P.D.p. 6162).

(Act No. 33 of 2010 – assented to on 30 August 2010).

Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (WA) Bill 2010* (No. 125)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for a national registration and accreditation scheme for health practitioners. The Bill also repeals various other Acts.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 May 2010 (P.D.p. 2471).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 20 May 2010.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 18 May 2010 and amended in the Legislative Council on 18 August 2010.

(Act No. 35 of 2010 – assented to on 30 August 2010).

Health, Safety and Civil Liability (Children in Schools and Child Care Services) Bill 2010 (No. 126)

The purpose of this Bill is to form part of a framework for the management of anaphylaxis in the Western Australian schools and child care service system.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 16 June 2010 (P.D.p. 3896).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 2 December 2010.

Heritage and Planning Legislation Amendment Bill 2010 (No. 178)

The purpose of this Bill is to increase the penalties for offences with respect to heritage places in Western Australia, to provide a meaningful deterrent to illegal conduct.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 November 2010 (P.D.p. 8973).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 2 December 2010.

Heritage of Western Australia Amendment Bill 2009 (No. 079) (Mr J. Hyde)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Heritage of Western Australia Act 1990* to increase the penalties for illegal works upon places entered in to Register of Heritage Places.

The motion for the First Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 September 2009.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Hope Valley-Wattleup Redevelopment Amendment Bill 2010 (No. 165)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Hope Valley-Wattleup Redevelopment Act 2000* to facilitate the next stage of strategic planning and development within the Latitude 32 Industry Zone.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 November 2010 (P.D.p. 9707).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Industrial Relations Amendment Bill 2010 (No. 147) (Mr V. Catania)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Industrial Relations Act 1979* to allow access for public sector employees to have the same rights as private sector employees to have their industrial matters dealt with by the Western Australian Industrial Relations Commission.

The motion for the First Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 August 2010.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Interpretation and Reprints Amendment Bill 2008 (No. 003)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Reprints Act 1984* to allow an authorised officer in the Western Australian Parliamentary Counsel's Office to insert an abbreviation of a unit of measurement, to insert 'and' or 'or' at the end of paragraphs in legislation and to remove a definite or indefinite article ('a' and 'the') at the beginning of a defined term in legislation.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 6 November 2008 (P.D.p. 846).

(Act No. 31 of 2010 – assented to on 25 August 2010).

Iron Ore Agreements Legislation Amendment Bill 2010 (No. 142)

The purpose of this Bill is to remove the historical concession applying to royalties for fine iron ore in the BHP Billiton and Rio Tinto state agreements and apply, instead, the royalty rate of 5.625 per cent as specified in the mining regulations.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 June 2010 (P.D.p. 4452).

(Act No. 34 of 2010 – assented to on 26 August 2010).

Iron Ore Agreements Legislation Amendment Bill (No. 2) 2010 (No. 175)

The purpose of this Bill is to authorise 11 variation agreements to amend the iron ore state agreements held by BHP Billiton and Rio Tinto, and their various joint venture partners, in order to enable the integration of infrastructure between these agreements.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 November 2010 (P.D.p. 9163).

Juries Legislation Amendment Bill 2010* (No. 160)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Juries Act 1957* to broaden community representation on juries, allow deferment of jury service for a short period of time, provide for a more streamlined process for prosecuting persons who, without proper excuse, fail to report for jury service, and to introduce a number of other minor procedural changes. The Bill also amends the *Criminal Procedure Act 2004* to provide for prosecutors and defence counsel to have the same number of peremptory challenges and for this number to be reduced from five to three.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 November 2010 (P.D.p. 9708).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Land Tax Assessment Amendment Bill 2010 (No. 132)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Land Tax Assessment Act 2002* to put in place a 100% exemption from land tax for caravan parks from 1 July 2010. It also increases the clawback period for reassessment of land tax from five years to 10 years from 1 July 2010 in the event of the subdivision of caravan park land.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 May 2010 (P.D.p. 3428).

Liquor Control Amendment Bill 2010* (No. 146)

**Local Government Amendment (Regional Subsidiaries) Bill 2010* (LC No. 184)
(Hon M. Trenorden)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Local Government Act 1995* to enable local government to establish arrangements for sharing local government functions by the formation of regional subsidiaries in a way that is consistent with the regional subsidiary model which is successfully operating in South Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 25 November 2010 (P.D.p. 9627).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 2 December 2010.

Misuse of Drugs Amendment Bill 2010* (No. 114)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Misuse of Drugs Act 1981* to assist police to more efficiently deal with seized drug property and to support the 'Frontline First' philosophy of policing.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 May 2010 (P.D.p. 2468).

(Act No. 44 of 2010 – assented to on 28 October 2010).

Misuse of Drugs Amendment Bill (No. 2) 2010 (No. 156)

The purpose of this Bill is to ensure that the sale of ice pipes in Western Australia remains prohibited.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 22 September 2010 (P.D.p. 7100).

(Act No. 50 of 2010 – assented to on 24 November 2010).

Mutual Recognition (Western Australia) Bill 2010 (No. 163)

The purpose of this Bill is to continue the adoption of the *Mutual Recognition Act 1992* (Commonwealth) (and any amendments made to it before the enactment of this Act) which provides for the recognition within each state and territory of regulatory standards adopted elsewhere in Australia regarding goods and occupations.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 October 2010 (P.D.p. 8027).

(Act No. 52 of 2010 – assented to on 8 December 2010).

No Privatisation of Hospitals and Schools Bill 2010 (No. 127) (Mr R. Cook)

The purpose of this Bill is to implement a policy that public hospitals and public schools in Western Australia be owned and operated publicly and not by private entities.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 April 2010 (P.D.p. 1965).

Second reading not agreed to in the Legislative Assembly on 17 November 2010.

Occupational Licensing National Law (WA) Bill 2010* (No. 166)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for a national law to regulate the licensing of certain occupations. This system will initially apply to up to seven economically important occupational areas. These are: air conditioning and refrigeration installers; building and building-related occupations; electricians; land transport operators – passenger vehicle and dangerous goods drivers only; maritime occupations; plumbing occupations; and property-related occupations

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 November 2010 (P.D.p. 8974).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 24 November 2010.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 25 November 2010.

Occupational Safety and Health Amendment Bill 2010 (LC No. 143) (Hon A. Xamon)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Occupational Safety and Health Act 1984* to impose additional compliance and notification obligations and provide for increased penalties for breaches of duties imposed by the Act. It also prescribes new offences under the *Criminal Code* relating to breaches of duty of care owed to workers.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 1 July 2010 (P.D.p. 4838).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 2 December 2010.

Pay-roll Tax Assessment Amendment Bill 2010 (No. 107)

The purpose of this Bill is to implement a package of measures aimed at achieving a greater level of harmonisation between Western Australia and the other states and territories in a number of areas of the payroll tax regime.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 9 March 2010 (P.D.p. 487).

(Act No. 15 of 2010 – assented to on 25 June 2010).

Pay-roll Tax Rebate Bill 2010 (No. 121)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for a rebate on pay-roll tax for the 2009–2010 assessment year.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 March 2010 (P.D.p. 756).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 20 April 2010.

(Act No. 5 of 2010 – assented to on 14 May 2010).

Perth Theatre Trust Amendment Bill 2009* (No. 035) (Mr J. Hyde)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide official recognition of the existing performing arts collection, known as the WA Performing Arts Museum, currently housed within the Perth Theatre Trust Collection at His Majesty's Theatre in Hay Street, Perth.

The motion for the First Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 March 2009.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Perry Lakes Redevelopment Amendment Bill 2010 (No. 150)

The purpose of this bill is to amend the *Perry Lakes Redevelopment Act 2005*, which holds the state responsible for the administration of building control in the Perry Lakes area. Instead, the local government, that being the Town of Cambridge, will be allowed to administer the provisions under part XV of the *Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1960*.

Perth Hills Planning Bill 2010 (LC No. 111) (Hon A. Xamon)

Petroleum and Energy Legislation Amendment Bill 2009 (LC No. 106)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the state's upstream petroleum legislation which regulates the exploration for and production of the state's petroleum resources as well as the transport of petroleum by way of pipelines. These amendments will also affect the rules and principles applying to geothermal titles in the onshore legislation.

The Acts proposed to be amended are the:

Petroleum and Geothermal Energy Resources Act 1967;
Petroleum (Submerged Lands) Act 1982; and
Petroleum Pipelines Act 1969; and
other Acts to reflect relevant legislation of the Parliament of the Commonwealth.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 26 November 2009. (P.D.p. 9858)

Pharmacy Bill 2010* (No. 128)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the registration of premises as pharmacies and to control such premises and pharmacy businesses.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 April 2010 (P.D.p. 1931).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 20 May 2010.

(Act No. 32 of 2010 – assented to on 26 August 2010).

Planning and Development Amendment Bill 2009 (No. 080) (Mr J. Hyde)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Planning and Development Act 2005* to increase the penalties for illegal works upon heritage places.

The motion for the First Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 September 2009.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Plastic Shopping Bags (Waste Avoidance) Bill 2010 (LC No. 123) (Hon S. Talbot)

The purpose of this Bill is to restrict the supply of single use shopping bags.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 1 April 2010 (P.D.p. 1210).

Police Amendment Bill 2010* (No. 137)

The purpose of this Bill is to facilitate the method by which the Police Commissioner can seek cost recovery for large-scale events of a commercial nature.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 June 2010 (P.D.p. 4453).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 16 September 2010.

This Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 2 December 2010.

Professional Combat Sports Amendment Bill 2009* (No. 074)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Professional Combat Sports Act 1987* to allow for regulation of all contests, from amateurs through to professionals, ensuring that standard health, safety and training requirements are in place for all levels of participants.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 October 2009 (P.D.p. 8028).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Professional Standards Amendment Bill 2009 (No. 044)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Professional Standards Act 1997* to ensure that the same legislation exists in all States and Territories, and to reduce the cost of schemes to occupational associations, the Professional Standards Council has also proposed the enactment of legislation providing for the mutual recognition of schemes between the participating jurisdictions.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 May 2009 (P.D.p. 3915).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 10 September 2009.

(Act No. 3 of 2010 – assented to on 7 April 2010).

Prohibited Behaviour Orders Bill 2010* (No. 113)

The purpose of this Bill is to enable courts to make orders that constrain offenders who have a history of anti-social behaviour.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 June 2010 (P.D.p. 4670).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 19 August 2010 and amended in the Legislative Council on 25 November 2010.

(Act No. 59 of 2010 – assented to on 8 December 2010).

Property Law (Mortgagee's Power of Sale) Amendment Bill 2009* (LC No. 070) (Hon S. Talbot)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Property Law Act 1969* to require a mortgagee or chargee, in exercising a power of sale in respect of mortgaged or charged land, to take reasonable care to ensure that the land is sold for not less than its market value.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 20 August 2009 (P.D.p. 6245).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 2 December 2010.

Public Sector Reform Bill 2009* (No. 103)

This purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Public Sector Management Act 1994* in order to create a new statutory office of Public Sector Commissioner, having overall responsibility for matters of efficiency and effectiveness in the public sector and for the maintenance of minimum standards of behaviour and integrity of public sector employing authorities and employees.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 November 2009 (P.D.p. 9769).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 22 June 2010 and amended in the Legislative Council on 15 September 2010.

(Act No. 39 of 2010 – assented to on 1 October 2010).

Rail Safety Bill 2009* (No. 083)

The purpose of this Bill is to make provision for rail safety and other matters that form part of a system of nationally consistent rail safety laws and, as a consequence, to repeal the *Rail Safety Act 1998*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 October 2009 (P.D.p. 8173).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 24 November 2009.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 26 May 2010.

(Act No. 18 of 2010 – assented to on 28 June 2010).

Railway (Butler to Brighton) Bill 2009 (No. 075)

The purpose of this Bill is to authorise the construction of a railway from Butler to Brighton.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 November 2009 (P.D.p. 9983).

(Act No. 26 of 2010 – assented to on 7 July 2010).

Railway (Roy Hill Infrastructure Pty Ltd) Agreement Bill 2010* (No. 141)

The purpose of this Bill is to ratify, and authorise the implementation of, an agreement between the State and Roy Hill Infrastructure Pty Ltd, Roy Hill Holdings Pty Ltd and Roy Hill Iron Ore Pty Ltd relating to the development of a railway in the Pilbara region of the State. The Bill also modifies the operation of the *Railways (Access) Act 1998* and the *Railways (Access) Code 2000*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 June 2010 (P.D.p. 4669).

(Act No. 43 of 2010 – assented to on 28 October 2010).

Railway (Tilley to Karara) Bill 2010 (No. 131)

The purpose of this Bill is to authorise the construction of a railway from Tilley to Karara.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 May 2010 (P.D.p. 2469).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 16 June 2010.

(Act No. 25 of 2010 – assented to on 7 July 2010).

Railway and Port (The Pilbara Infrastructure Pty Ltd) Agreement Amendment Bill 2010 (No. 183)

The purpose of this bill is to ratify a variation agreement between the state and The Pilbara Infrastructure Pty Ltd (TPI). The Bill is necessary to give effect to amendments to the *Railway and Port (The Pilbara Infrastructure Pty Ltd) Agreement Act 2004*. These amendments will both facilitate the expansion of the railway and port operations of TPI and make the state agreement operate more effectively

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 November 2010 (P.D.p. 9473).

(Act No. 60 of 2010 – assented to on 10 December 2010).

Referendums (Implementation of Result) Amendment Bill 2009* (LC No. 039) (Hon A. Fels)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Referendums Act 1983* to provide for the compulsory introduction of legislation and policies designed to implement the result of a referendum.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 1 April 2009 (P.D.p. 2451).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 2 December 2010.

Renewable Energy Feed-in Tariff (REFit WA) Bill 2010 (LC No. 144) (Hon R. Chapple)

The purpose of this Bill is to facilitate power industry development and employment, and to improve energy security by diversifying fuel sources through the commercialisation of renewable energy technologies in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 1 July 2010 (P.D.p. 4836).

This Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 2 December 2010.

Retail Trading Hours Amendment Bill 2009* (No. 061)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Retail Trading Hours Act 1987* to allow general retail shops in the metropolitan area to remain open until 9.00pm each weeknight.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 June 2009 (P.D.p. 5160).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 17 August 2010.

(Act No. 38 of 2010 – assented to on 1 October 2010).

Retail Trading Hours Amendment (Armadale Special Trading Precinct) Bill 2010 (No. 139)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Retail Trading Hours Act 1987* to create a new special trading precinct in Armadale.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 August 2010 (P.D.p. 4074).

The short title of the Bill was changed from ‘Tourism Precinct’ to ‘Special Trading Precinct’ via amendment in the Legislative Assembly on 12 August 2010.

(Act No. 36 of 2010 – assented to on 22 September 2010).

Retail Trading Hours Amendment (Joondalup Special Trading Precinct) Bill 2009 (No. 097)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Retail Trading Hours Act 1987* to change the term ‘tourism precinct’ appearing in Section 12A to ‘special trading precinct’, and to create a new special trading precinct in Joondalup.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 November 2009 (P.D.p. 9112).

(Act No. 22 of 2010 – assented to on 7 July 2010).

Retail Trading Hours Amendment (Midland Special Trading Precinct) Bill 2010 (No. 140)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Retail Trading Hours Act 1987* to create a new special trading precinct in Midland.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 June 2010 (P.D.p. 4073).

The short title of the Bill was changed from ‘Tourism Precinct’ to ‘Special Trading Precinct’ via amendment in the Legislative Assembly on 12 August 2010.

Revenue Laws Amendment and Repeal Bill 2010* (No. 115)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Duties Acts 2008*, the *First Home Owner Grant Act 2000*, the *State Trading Concerns Act 1916*, the *Taxation Administration Act 2003*; and to repeal the *Debits Tax Act 2002* and the *Debits Tax Assessment Act 2002*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 March 2010 (P.D.p. 534).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 20 May 2010.

(Act No. 17 of 2010 – assented to on 25 June 2010).

Revenue Laws Amendment Bill 2010 (No. 116)

The purpose of this Bill is to make amendments to the *Duties Act 2008* and the *Duties Legislation Amendment Act 2008* to make a minor change to the superannuation provision of the *Duties Act 2008*. These amendments are to close a potential loophole in the entity restructuring provisions of that Act and to delay the abolition of transfer duty on non-real business assets until 1 July 2013.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 March 2010 (P.D.p. 537).

(Act No. 9 of 2010 – assented to on 10 June 2010).

Road Safety Council Amendment (Functions) Bill 2010* (No. 173) (Ms M. Quirk)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Road Safety Council Act 2002*, enabling moneys from the road trauma trust fund to be spent on setting up a road trauma support service similar to the services that operate in Victoria, Tasmania and South Australia. It will also allow for education programs aimed at the prevention of road trauma.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 November 2010 (P.D.p. 9012).

This Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Road Traffic Amendment Bill 2010* (No. 118)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Road Traffic Act 1974* to provide for the impounding and confiscation of vehicles following the commission, or the suspected the commission, of certain offences.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 9 March 2010 (P.D.p. 487).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 19 May 2010.

(Act No. 20 of 2010 – assented to on 7 July 2010).

Road Traffic Amendment (Alcohol and Drug Related Offences) Bill 2010* (No. 176)

The purpose of this Bill is to modify fines and licence disqualification periods for drink and drug-driving offences. Additionally the bill will introduce a zero blood alcohol concentration level for drivers of buses, taxis, heavy vehicles, small charter vehicles and vehicles carrying dangerous goods and those covered under section 64A of the *Road Traffic Act 1974*, including provisional and extraordinary licence holders and recently disqualified drivers.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 November 2010 (P.D.p. 9475).

This Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Road Traffic Legislation Amendment (Disqualification by Notice) Bill 2010* (No. 157)

The purpose of this Bill is to enable a member of the police force to give a person who has tested positive to an excess .08 offence a notice that immediately disqualifies the person from holding or obtaining a driver's licence for a period of two months. The bill will require police to charge the person within 10 days of the alleged offence, otherwise police will be required to cancel the disqualification notice.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 September 2010 (P.D.p. 7246).

(Act No. 51 of 2010 – assented to on 8 December 2010).

Road Traffic Legislation Amendment (Information) Bill 2010* (LC No. 170)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Road Traffic Act 1974*, the *Road Traffic (Administration) Act 2008* and the *Road Traffic (Authorisation to Drive) Act 2008*, in relation to the disclosure of certain classes of information; that is the provision of photographs and signatures for use on learner's permits.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 10 November 2010 (P.D.p. 8448).

This Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 2 December 2010.

Royal Perth Hospital Protection Bill 2008 (No. 008)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the continued operation of part of the Royal Perth Hospital as a public hospital on the present site with the Certificate of Title Volume 1880 Folio 491.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 November 2008 (P.D.p. 75).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Standardisation of Formatting Bill 2009* (LC No. 066)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend various written laws to standardise the formatting of certain aspects of those laws. This Bill will improve the state's legislation database by having a uniform standard of layout, style and formatting for all written laws.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 18 August 2009 (P.D.p. 6002).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 19 August 2009.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 4 March 2010.

(Act No. 19 of 2010 – assented to on 28 June 2010).

Statutes (Repeals and Minor Amendments) Bill 2010 (LC No. 148)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the statute law by repealing various written laws and making minor amendments to various other written laws.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 8 September 2010 (P.D.p. 6115).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 8 September 2010.

This Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 2 December 2010.

Telecommunications (Interception) Western Australia Amendment Bill 2010* (No. 145)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend and rename the *Telecommunications (Interception) Western Australia Act 1996*. This state legislation enables Western Australia Police and the Corruption and Crime Commission to use the Commonwealth Act to investigate serious crime in Western Australia. Since the state legislation was enacted in 1996, there have been a number of amendments to the Commonwealth Act. Consequently, the state legislation now needs to be amended to accurately reflect these amendments made to the Commonwealth legislation.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 August 2010 (P.D.p. 5336).

This Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 2 December 2010.

Trade Measurement Legislation (Amendment and Expiry) Bill 2010 (No. 136)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Trade Measurement Act 2006* and the *Trade Measurement Administration Act 2006* to effect the transition of the regulation of weights and measures from the State to the Commonwealth as a consequence of the enactment of the *National Measurement Amendment Act 2008* (Commonwealth).

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 June 2010 (P.D.p. 3897).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 14 September 2010.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 24 November 2010.

Treasurer’s Advance Authorisation Bill 2010 (No. 119)

The purpose of this Bill is to authorise expenditure in the financial year ending on 30 June 2010 to make payments in respect of extraordinary or unforeseen matters or to make advances for certain purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 March 2010 (P.D.p. 533).

(Act No. 4 of 2010 – assented to on 3 May 2010).

Trustee Companies (Commonwealth Regulation) Amendment Bill 2010* (No. 161)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Trustee Companies Act 1987* to facilitate the regulation of trustee companies by the Commonwealth and as a consequence, to make certain transitional arrangements and to amend the *Trustees Act 1962*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 November 2010 (P.D.p. 9712).

This Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 25 November 2010.

Uranium Mining Prohibition (Keeping WA free from the Nuclear Fuel Chain) Bill 2009 (No. 112) (Ms A. Carles)

The purpose of the Bill is to prohibit the mining of uranium in Western Australia.

The motion for the First Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 February 2010.
