An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of £832,684, and from moneys to credit of the General Loan Fund the sum of £233,283, to the Service of the year ending 30th June, 1909. Assent given.

Presbyterian Church Property Act (8 Ed., No. 3)—


