PUBLIC STATUTES (3) OF THE SHORT SESSION 1908,
BEING THE FIFTH SESSION OF THE SIXTH PARLIAMENT.

Supply Act (four months—8 Ed., No. 1)—

An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of £832,684, and from moneys to credit of the General Loan Fund the sum of £233,253, to the Service of the year ending 30th June, 1909. Assent given.

Claremont Municipal Rates Validation Act (8 Ed., No. 2)—

An Act to validate certain rates made by the Council of the Municipality of Claremont and the Claremont Local Board of Health. Assent given.

Presbyterian Church Property Act (8 Ed., No. 3)—

An Act to repeal the Law relating to the management of the real and personal estate of the Presbyterian Church in the State of Western Australia, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof. Assent given.

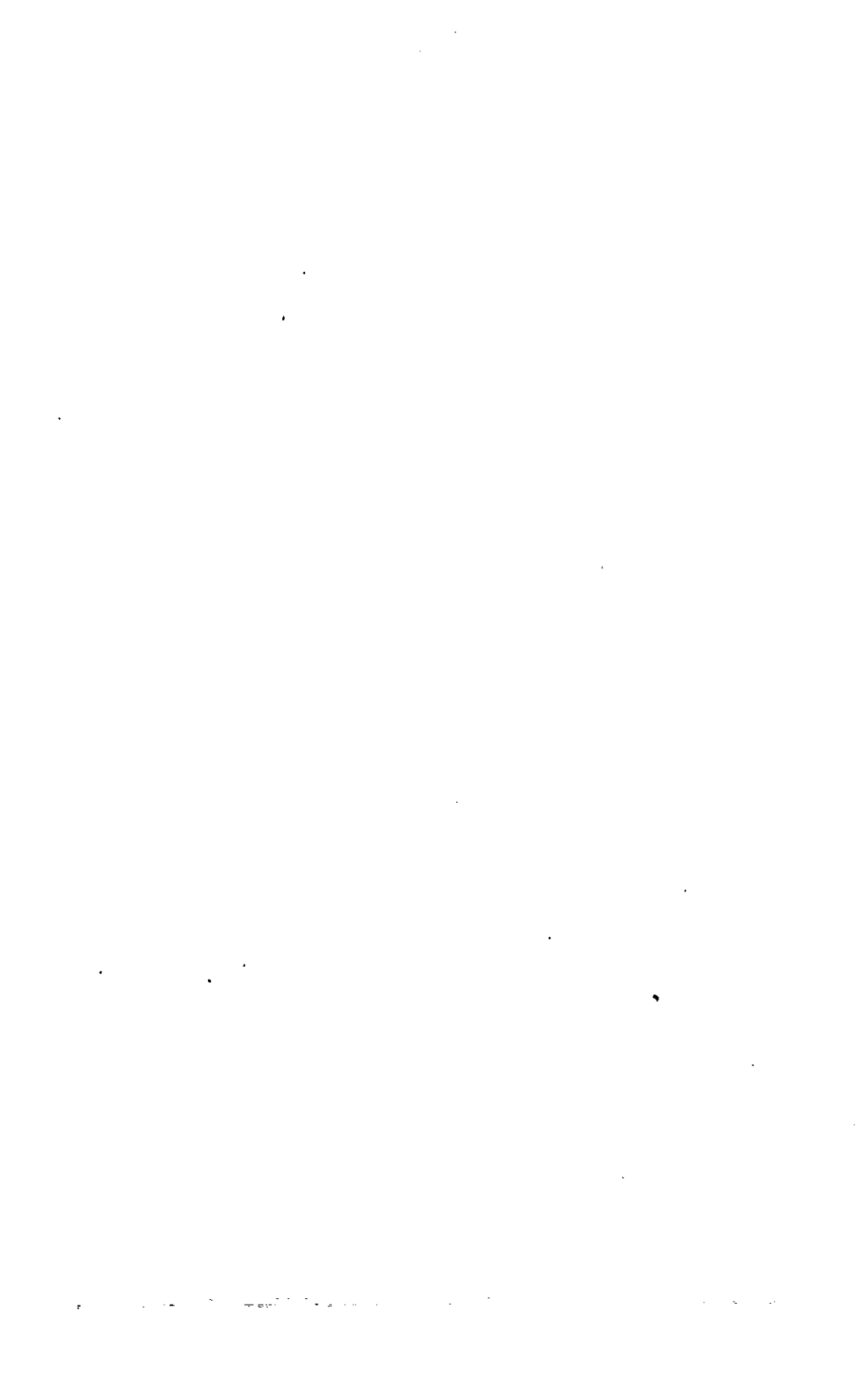
