INTRODUCTION

This paper provides an analysis of the 2021 Western Australian election result. It contains details of voting for all Legislative Assembly districts and Legislative Council regions, as well as relevant summary statistics for both chambers.

The election produced the most one-sided result in Western Australia's political history. It was the third election held since the introduction of a fixed election date election, and the fourth since the introduction of one-vote one-value district boundaries for the Legislative Assembly. The election was conducted on new electoral boundaries, though the changes to boundaries since 2017 were generally minor.

Format for Legislative Assembly Results

For all Legislative Assembly districts, details of the first preference and final counts are shown in the following format.

First Count: The total of first preferences for each candidate is shown, along with a percentage calculated by dividing the candidate's vote by the formal vote. Swing is calculated by subtracting the percentage vote received by the candidate or party at the 2017 election from the percentage received at the 2021 election. Where the parties contesting differs from the 2017 election, 'ghost' candidates (indicated by '....') have been included to represent candidates and parties not contesting the 2021 election. All results from 2017 have been adjusted to take account of the redistribution.

Final Count: Represents the final two-candidate preferred count after the distribution of preferences from excluded candidate. Two-candidate preferred percentages are calculated by dividing each candidate's final count by the total votes remaining in the count, that is the formal vote minus exhausted votes. (See exhausted votes next page.) Two-candidate preferred swings are shown compared to the results of the 2017 election adjusted for the redistribution. Where the party composition of the final two candidates differs from the 2017 election (e.g. Fremantle), ghost candidates appear and three swing figures are shown.

2-Party Preferred: This total appears in districts that did not finish as a contest between Labor and Liberal candidates at the 2017 or 2021 elections. The only district not to finish as a two-party contest at the 2021 election was Fremantle.

Two-Candidate Preferred versus Two-Party Preferred Results

The final or two-candidate preferred count for a district is the final tally of votes after the formal distribution of preferences. The count is carried out in all districts even if not required to determine the winner. It is undertaken by the successive exclusion of the lowest polling candidates and the re-examination and transfer of their ballot papers to the next available preference. A two-party preferred count represents a similar distribution of preferences, but at all stages retains the final two candidates as representatives from Labor and the Liberal or National Parties.

At the 2021 election, 58 of the 59 Legislative Assembly districts finished as two-candidate preferred contests between Labor and Liberal or National candidates. The district of Fremantle finished as a contest between Labor and the Greens and an estimated two-party preferred margin has been calculated based on Green preferences in other inner-Perth seats. The estimates used has been to distribute Greens' preferences 84% to Labor at the final exclusion.

Summary of Redistribution, Notional Seat Status and Sitting Members

A summary of the 2019 redistribution can be found on page 97. It includes old and new margins for all seats, along with notes on retiring members. The boundary changes produced by the redistribution were minor compared to the extensive changes introduced by the 2015 redistribution. Only one district changed name, the northern Perth district of Girrawheen re-named Landsdale. Only eight districts had their margins altered by more than two percentage points.

By-elections, Casual Vacancies and Party Changes

There were two by-elections conducted between the 2017 and 2021 elections and one change of party affiliation in the Assembly. There were no Council casual vacancies during the term.

In March 2018 the Liberal Party retained Cottesloe at a by-election following the resignation of former Premier Colin Barnett. A second by-election was held for Darling Range in June 2018 following the resignation of former Labor MLA Barry Urban. The by-election produced a change of party status, being won by former Liberal MLC Alyssa Hayden. Results for both by-elections can be found on page 23.

In mid-2019, Geraldton MLA Ian Blayney resigned from the Liberal Party and subsequently joined the National Party. He contested Geraldton for his new party at the 2021 election. East Metropolitan Region MLC Charles Smith was elected as a One Nation candidate in 2017 but resigned from the party in 2019 and contested the 2021 election for the Western Australia Party.

Exhausted Votes

The Western Australian Electoral Act permits Legislative Assembly ballot papers with a valid first preference vote, but a duplicate or missing further preference, to remain in the count as a formal vote. Depending on which candidates are excluded during the distribution of preferences, these ballot papers can 'exhaust' their preferences before reaching one of the final two candidates in the contest. A total for the small number of exhausted ballot papers is shown in the results where appropriate.

Results Decided on Preferences

The 2021 election produced the most one-sided result in Western Australian electoral history, and one of the greatest landslides recorded in any Australian jurisdiction. The overall vote for third parties and independents declined, which resulted in preferences playing less of a role than at recent elections.

Of the 59 Legislative Assembly districts, 46 were won on first preferences, all by the Labor Party. Labor won another seven seats on preferences including three districts won from second place (Carine, Churchlands, Warren-Blackwood). The Liberal Party's two seats were won after preferences, as were the National Party's four seats. Of those four, North West Central was won by the National Party from second place, though Labor began the count trailing the combined National and Liberal vote. Preferences were required for National victories in Central Wheatbelt, Moore and Roe, but the combined National and Liberal first preference vote was above 50% in all three districts.

Of the 36 Legislative Council seats, 23 were elected during the initial stages of the count from quotas filled in first preferences. The filled quotas elected 13 Labor, seven Liberal and three National MLCs. The remaining 13 MLCs were elected by the distribution of preferences. Six were elected after leading on votes remaining after the election of candidates with filled quotas, and seven were elected after trailing in the count in the early stages.

Format for Legislative Council Results

Results for the Legislative Council are published in several formats beginning on page 31. Tables with overall Council totals and totals by region are provided. The tables include vote by party, percentage vote, quotas and change in vote since the 2017 election.

Following the summary tables, a more detailed breakdown of votes recorded by candidate and group/party is provided for each region. The total number of ticket votes for each group is shown as

well as the percentage of each group's vote that were ticket votes. Sitting members, elected and defeated candidates are shown.

For each region a summary of significant exclusions during the distribution of preferences is provided. There are also tables of Legislative Council results by group for each lower house district in a region, and tables of Legislative Council party vote by district across the state (see page 74).

Analysis of Preferences

This publication does not include the detailed analysis of party preferences undertaken for the previous publication on the 2017 election. That analysis had been undertaken due to interest in preference flows with the re-emergence of Pauline Hanson's One Nation. It required re-processing of WAEC tally sheets, a laborious task that I could not repeat in 2021.

Some basic statistics on preference flows can be gleaned by examining the last excluded candidate in the published distribution of preferences. In 44 of the 59 Assembly districts, the final candidate excluded represented the Greens. Overall Green preferences at the final exclusion split 80.4% to Labor and 19.6% to the Liberals or Nationals. The rates of Green preference flows ranged from 65.9% in Vasse to 89.7% in Perth.

There were 10 districts where three-cornered contests saw preferences from a Liberal or National candidates distributed at the final exclusion. There were three National exclusions where preferences flowed 70.0% to Liberal and 30% to Labor. There were six Liberal exclusions flowing 78.5% to National and 21.5% to Labor. A Liberal candidate was the last excluded in Fremantle with preferences flowing 34.4% to Labor and 65.6% to the Greens.

I would like to express my thanks to the staff of the Western Australian Electoral Commission for their assistance in providing the data used in preparing this publication. All results have been taken from the drafts of the official Statistical Returns and checked against the WA Electoral Commission's website.

Statistical Highlights

- A record 19 parties registered to contest the 2021 election, five up on the record 14 parties registered in 2017. All 19 parties contested the Legislative Council election, 17 contesting all six regions, but only 15 parties nominated candidates for the Legislative Assembly.
- For the second election in a row there were a record number of nominations for both chambers. There were 788 candidates in total, with 463 nominating for the 59 Legislative Assembly districts, an average of 7.8 candidate per district and up from a record 415 candidates in 2017. There were 325 candidates for the Legislative Council, an average of 9.1 candidates per vacancy, up from the previous record of 302 candidates in 2017.
- Twelve candidates nominated for Albany, the most candidates to ever contest a lower house seat at a WA state election. There were also 11 candidates in Bunbury, Collie-Preston, Dawesville, Mandurah and Murray-Wellington. Only five candidates nominated for Carine, Perth and South Perth.
- In the Legislative Council, the number of candidates ranged from 47 in East Metropolitan to 64 in South Metropolitan. The number of groups/columns on Legislative Council ballot papers ranged from 20 in East Metropolitan to a record 26 in South Metropolitan. The previous record was 25 in South Metropolitan in 2017.
- The number of enrolled electors increased to 1,716,732, a rise of 7.8% since 2017. Turnout was 85.50% in the Legislative Council, down 1.51 percentage points compared to 2017. Informal voting declined in both chambers, to 3.76% (-0.78) in the Assembly, and 1.95% (-0.76) in the Council.
- The 2021 election produced Western Australia's, and probably Australia's, most one-sided election result. The Labor Party's first preference vote in the lower house was 59.9%, up 17.7 percentage points since 2017. Labor recorded 69.7% of the two-party preferred vote, a two-party preferred swing of 14.2 percentage points. Labor won 53 of the 59 seats in the Legislative Assembly, 89.8% of seats, surpassing the 87.6% of seats won by the Liberal National Party at the 2012 Queensland election. Labor had won its highest ever share of Assembly seats with 41 of the 59 seats in 2017 (69.5%), a record that was easily surpassed in 2021.
- Labor won 42 of the 43 seats in the Perth metropolitan area, seven of eight in South West Region, three of four in Mining and Pastoral and one of four in Agricultural. The Labor Party won the traditional Liberal seats of Churchlands, Nedlands and South Perth for the first time. The only seat the Liberal Party retained in Perth was Cottesloe. Labor won 12 of 18 Legislative Council seats in Perth, and 10 of 18 in non-metropolitan regions. Labor won three of the six Council seats in Agricultural Region for the first time.
- Since Labor's defeat on the re-election of the Barnett government in 2013, Labor's first preference vote has risen 26.8 percentage points from 33.1% to 59.9%. The two-party preferred swing over two elections has been 27%, and Labor has gained 32 seats in lifting its representation in the Legislative Assembly from 21 to 53 seats.
- Labor also won 22 of the 36 seats in the Legislative Council in 2021, a gain of eight seats. This delivered the Labor Party an upper house majority for the first time in its history. Labor's first preference vote in the Council was even higher than in the Assembly at 60.3%, up 19.9 percentage points since 2017.
- Premier Mark McGowan won his seat of Rockingham with a remarkable 82.8% of the first preference vote and 87.7% after preferences. Both figures were the highest in the state. Labor recorded more than 70% of the two-party preferred vote in 35 of the Assembly's 59 seats. (See two-party analysis and new electoral pendulum, page 24).
- To win the 2025 election, the Liberal and National Parties need to gain 24 seats on a uniform swing of 23.4 percentage points.
- The Liberal Party's support fell further from its record low in 2017, down 9.9 percentage points to just 21.3%. The party was reduced from 13 seats to just two, fewer than the four seats won by the National Party. For the first time since 1943, the Liberal Party finished with fewer seats than Nationals. (The two parties were known as Nationalist and Country Party in 1943).

- In Perth the Liberal Party polled 21.9% (-11.9) in the Assembly to Labor 63.3% (+18.0). Outside of Perth, Labor polled 49.2% (+16.3), the Liberals 19.5% (-4.1) and the Nationals 16.9 (-5.0). One Nation polled 2.0% (-7.1) in non-metropolitan seats. (See regional totals, page 29).
- Comparing results in the two chambers, the Labor Assembly vote in Perth was 63.3% compared to a slightly lower 62.5% in the Council. In non-metropolitan regions, Labor's vote rose from 49.2% in the Assembly to 53.4% in the Council. Labor appeared to attract Council votes from both opposition parties in non-metropolitan regions, the Liberal non-metropolitan vote down from 19.5% in the Assembly to 15.8% in the Council, and the Nationals down from 16.9% to 11.8%. (See table of party support in the two chambers page 92).
- Support for minor parties declined from 21.2% to 14.8% in the Assembly and from 28.5% to 19.2% in the Council. The Greens polled 6.9% (-2.0) in the Assembly and 6.4% (-2.2) in the Council. One Nation contested 40 Assembly districts, up five on 2017, but lost three quarters of its support in polling 1.3% (-3.7). In the Council One Nation polled 1.5% (-6.7). No other party polled more than 2% in either chamber.
- Of the 59 members in the old Legislative Assembly, 40 were re-elected, 10 defeated and nine retired. Thirty-four of Labor's 40 sitting MLAs were re-elected and six retired to be replaced by new Labor members. There were 13 new Labor members representing seats gained at the election, including Darling Range which was re-gained after being lost at a 2018 by-election. (See summary of new and departing members in both chambers, page 95).
- Only two Liberal MLAs were re-elected, eight were defeated, and three members retired with their seats lost to Labor. Of the six National MLAs, four were re-elected and two defeated, including Geraldton MLA Ian Blayney who had switched from the Liberal Party in 2019. (See New and Departing Members page 95).
- Of the 36 new Legislative Councillors, 19 were re-elected (including two Labor members who switched region) and there were 17 new members. Of the 17 departing members, six did not contest the election and 11 members were defeated. The defeats included all nine cross bench members. Of the 17 new members, five retained seats held by their party in the previous Council, while 12 were changes in party representation. (See New and Departing Members page 95).
- The Greens lost all four Legislative Council seats won in 2017 but gained a seat in South Metropolitan. One Nation failed to retain the three seats the party won in 2017, and the Liberal Democrats and Shooters, Fishers and Farmers lost the single Council seats each won in 2017.
- Two new parties entered the Council in 2021, Legalise Cannabis Western Australia winning a seat in both East Metropolitan and South West Regions, and the Daylight Saving Party achieving a remarkable victory in Mining and Pastoral Region.
- Wilson Tucker (Daylight Saving Party) won his seat despite polling only 98 votes, 95 above-the-line group ticket votes, three below-the-line, with the party's number two candidate polling zero votes. Of the 12 groups whose above-the-line preferences formed part of Tucker's final vote, 10 recorded more first preference votes than the Daylight Saving Party. More than two-thirds of the party's final tally came from just three parties, Legalise Cannabis WA, the Greens and the Shooters Fishers and Farmers. More than half of the tally came from the Greens and Shooters Fishers and Farmers. (See Mining and Pastoral Region result and preference distribution beginning on page 63).
- The control of preferences achieved through group voting tickets was also highlighted by victory of Sophia Moermond (Legalise Cannabis) in South West Region. Labor began the count with 114,713 votes, just 1,710 votes short of a fourth quota. Labor's vote increased by a net 777 votes during the count, most of that increase due to below-the-line preferences received on the exclusion of the final Green candidate. In contrast the vote for Legalise Cannabis increased nearly seven-fold from 4,531 to 30,724. The party received 25,519 votes as preferences via group voting tickets from 12 other groups, compared to just 674 below-the-line preferences. The Labor Party polled 4.61 quotas on first preferences, enough to fill four vacancies and compete for an unprecedented fifth seat. In contrast the Liberal Party failed to fill a vacancy on first preferences, polling just 0.96 quotas. The Greens polled 0.42 quotas, trailing and competing with Labor's partial quota for the final seat. The remaining parties held one quota between them, but with parties such as Legalise Cannabis and the Australian Christians putting major parties ahead of each other, victory for a minor party required one of their number to pass the Greens to gain Green preferences.

By the time only six candidates remained, 14 groups had been excluded. Eight groups had preferences that flowed to Charles Smith (Western Australia Party), five to Maryka Groenewald (Australian Christians) and one for Brian Walker (Legalise Cannabis WA). These preferences saw Groenewald rise from fifth to third and Charles Smith from tenth to sixth.

The group voting tickets distributed to this point were –

- **To Charles Smith (WAP)** – 8,388 ticket votes received in order from IND Doan (458), Great Australian Party (707), Daylight Saving Party (773), Sustainable Australia (897), Health Australia Party (965), Liberals for Climate (1,741), Liberal Democrats (1,767) and IND Larsen (1,080)
- **To Maryka Groenewald (ACP)** – 15,828 ticket votes received in order from WAXit (1,114), IND Lyndon-James (2,053), No Mandatory Vaccination (3,645), Shooters, Fishers and Farmers (4,162) and One Nation (4,854)
- **To Brian Walker (LCW)** – Animal Justice (2,321)

The tables below include transfers of below-the-line votes as well as group voting tickets. Excluding the quotas set aside for the four elected Labor members, the party totals and change in total vote by party since the first preference tally stood as follows following the exclusion of One Nation.

Had Charles Smith (WAP) led Brian Walker of Legalise Cannabis at the above count, as had been suggested by analysis of the ticket votes, then Walker would have been excluded and Legalise Cannabis and Animal Justice Party ticket votes would have flowed to Smith, putting him ahead of Tim Clifford from the Greens. Clifford would then have been excluded in place of Smith and Green preferences would have elected the fifth Labor candidate.

Instead, with below the line votes included in the count, Smith fell short of Walker at this count and was the next candidate excluded. Of the preference tickets Smith had received to the above count, 1,165 from IND Doan and the Great Australian Party flowed to Groenewald (ACP), while ticket votes totalling 7,223 from the other six parties, plus another 2,770 Western Australia Party tickets, all transferred to Brian Walker of Legalise Cannabis. This put Walker 668 votes ahead of sitting Greens MLC Tim Clifford as shown below.

Tim Clifford (Greens) was now excluded. Of his 21,876 votes, 18,869 were Greens ticket votes with next preference for Brian Walker of Legalise Cannabis. Note that there were 1,952 below the line Greens votes that flowed to the remaining Labor candidate, Robert Green, compared to only 717 below the line votes that matched the party's ticket vote by flowing to Brian Walker.

Revealing the power of ticket preferences, Walker had received 32,872 preferences since Count 1, the Australian Christians 17,702, Labor 2,134 and the Liberals just 757.

The exclusion of Australian Christian's candidate Maryka Groenewald now began with the distribution of her first preference votes, including 8,436 Australian Christian ticket votes with next available preference for Liberal Donna Faragher. This put Faragher over the quota to fill the fifth vacancy.

Having passed the quota for election, Faragher could not receive further preferences. Only two candidates capable of receiving preferences remained in the count, Brian Walker (Legalise Cannabis) and Robert Green (Labor).

Further distribution of Groenewald's votes distributed ticket votes from Independent Lyndon-James (2,053) flow to Labor. Three other tickets flowed to Brian Walker, from WAXit (1,114), No Mandatory Vaccination (3,645) and Shooters, Fishers and Farmers (4,162). After these distributions, Brian Walker (Legalise Cannabis) had reached the quota to fill the sixth vacancy.

Of votes remaining with Groenewald, there were 4,854 One Nation ticket votes with next preference for Walker, and 458 Independent Doan ticket votes and 707 Great Australian Party ticket votes with next preference for Labor.

The Labor Party polled 4.11 quotas to fill four vacancies on first preferences while the Liberal Party polled 1.63 quotas to fill one vacancy and compete for a second seat with the Green total of 0.52 quotas. Other parties had 0.74 quotas between them raising the possibility that chains of preferences could put one minor party ahead of the remaining Liberal or Green candidate in the race for the final seat.

By the time only six candidates remained, 17 groups had been excluded. Eleven groups had preferences that flowed by group voting ticket to Daithi Gleeson (Liberals for Climate), four to Louise Hildebrandt (Australian Christians) and two to Max Armstrong Moore (Legalise Cannabis WA). Liberals for Climate rose from 12th on first preference totals to fourth at this point in the count.

Legalise Cannabis preferences had narrowed the gap between Hildebrandt and Gleeson but left Gleeson in fourth place and next to be excluded. In order these included ticket votes from Australian Christians (5,900), WAXit (1,134), Shooters Fishers and Farmers (2,265), One Nation (4,716) and No Mandatory Vaccination (4,202). All had next preference for Tjorn Sibma (Liberal).

These distributions were enough to elect Tjorn Sibma (Liberal) to the sixth vacancy, defeating sitting Greens MLC Alison Xamon. Group voting tickets from 12 parties and independents representing 9,847 ticket votes remained undistributed with Louis Hildebrandt at the end of the count.

The Labor Party polled 4.41 quotas to fill four vacancies on first preferences. The Liberal Party polled 1.23 quotas and elected one member, and the Green on 0.48 quotas were competing with Labor for the final seat. Other parties had 0.88 quotas between them raising the possibility that chains of preferences could put one minor party ahead of the remaining Labor or Green candidate in the race for the final seat.

By the time only five candidates remained, 21 groups had been excluded including one group that did not lodge a group voting ticket. Ten groups had preferences that flowed by group voting ticket to Aaron Stonehouse (Liberal Democrats), nine to Cam Tinley (No Mandatory Vaccination) with the Socialist Alliance ticket flowing to the Greens. Preferences had seen a tenfold increase in the vote for No Mandatory Vaccination, rising from eighth on first preferences to lead the race for the final vacancy. The Liberal Democrats had risen from ninth to fourth.

- **To Brad Pettitt (GRN)** – Socialist Alliance (777)

The final step in the count was the exclusion Aaron Stonehouse (LDP). All ticket votes were distributed, including 13,635 ticket votes from 10 different parties with next preference for Cam Tinley (NMV).

Two other tickets flowed to Brad Pettitt (GRN) putting him over quota and electing him to the sixth seat. Those tickets were 351 votes from Foley (Independent) and the Liberal ticket ballot paper at reduced transfer value equal to around 12,000 votes. Had this Liberal ticket listed Tinley ahead of Pettitt (Greens), then the Cam Tinley (No Mandatory Vaccination Party) would have won the final seat instead of Pettitt.

The Labor Party polled 3.18 quotas to fill three vacancies on first preferences. The Nationals elected one MLC on first preferences with 0.86 quotas remaining with the party's second candidate, close to the 0.86 quota total vote for the Liberal Party. Other parties polled 1.10 quotas in total, enough to elect a member if preference swaps between the parties were tight.

By the time only six candidates remained, 19 groups had been excluded. Thirteen groups had group voting tickets with preferences for Bass Tadros (Health Australia), three had preferences for Rod Caddies (One Nation), two for Stuart Ostle (Shooters Fishers and Farmers) and one for Martin Aldridge (National). Health Australia had polled only 201 first preference votes, but its tally had been boosted fifteen fold by the transfer of group voting tickets from excluded groups.

- **To Stuart Ostle (SFF)** – Great Australian Party (163), Labor Party (around 2,100)
- **To Martin Aldridge (NAT)** – IND Singh (101)

Labor polled 3.99 quotas, electing three MLCs on first preferences and leaving the party on the cusp of electing a fourth. The Liberal Party polled 0.75 quotas, the Nationals 0.72 quotas. There was a total of 1.54 quotas spread across the other 18 groups on the ballot paper, the Greens on 0.35 quotas, Shooters Fishers and Farmers 0.24 and One Nation 0.21. Relevant for the eventual result, the Daylight Saving Party polled 98 votes or just 0.0140 quotas, finishing 18th out of the 21 groups on the ballot paper.

By the time only six candidates remained, 15 groups had been excluded. Ten groups had preferences tickets that flowed to Wilson Tucker (Daylight Saving Party), four to Matt Priest (Shooters Fishers and Farmers) and one to Nicholas Fardell (National). The Daylight Saving party had risen dramatically from 98 votes to 3,598 at this stage in the count.

The group voting tickets distributed to this point were –

The Labor Party polled 3.92 quotas to fill three vacancies and be well placed to win a fourth seat. The Liberal Party polled 1.29 quotas to elect one MLC. The Nationals and Greens polled just under 0.42 quotas. The Shooters Fishers and Farmers polled 0.18 quotas, with Agricultural Region MLC Rick Mazza having moved to contest South West Region. Legalise Cannabis WA was in fifth place with 0.15 quotas but would eventually defeat Labor's fourth candidate in the race to win one of the final seats.

By the time only seven candidates remained, 16 groups had been excluded. Nine of these groups had group voting tickets that flowed to Daniel Minson (Sustainable Australia), four to Sophia Moermond (Legalise Cannabis) and three to Rick Mazza (Shooters Fishers and Farmers). Ticket preferences had delivered Sustainable Australia a sixfold increase on the party's initial vote.

The control of preferences achieved through group voting tickets is highlighted by Legalise Cannabis winning a seat ahead of Labor. Labor began the count with 114,713 votes, just 1,710 votes short of a fourth quota. Labor's total increased by a net 777 votes during the count, most of that increase due to below-the-line preferences received on the exclusion of the Greens. In contrast the vote for Legalise Cannabis increased from 4,531 to 30,724. The party received 25,519 preference through group voting tickets from 12 other groups, but only 674 votes as below-the-line preferences.

New and Departing Members

Legislative Assembly

Of the 59 members in the old Legislative Assembly, 40 were re-elected, 10 defeated and nine retired. Thirty-four of Labor's 40 sitting MLAs were re-elected and six retired to be replaced by new Labor members. There were 13 new Labor members representing seats gained at the election. Girrawheen Labor MLA Margaret Quirk was re-elected though her seat had been re-named Landsdale.

Only two Liberal MLAs were re-elected, eight members were defeated, and three members retired with their seats lost to the Labor Party. Of the six National MLAs, four were re-elected and two defeated, including Geraldton MLA Ian Blayney who had switched from the Liberal Party in 2019.

There were 19 new members elected to the Legislative Assembly at the 2021 election, all representing the Labor Party. Six replaced retiring Labor MLAs and another 13 members were elected from seats held by the Liberal and National parties before the election.

Legislative Council

Of the 36 new Legislative Councillors, 19 were re-elected members (including two Labor members who switched region) and there were 17 new members. Of the 17 departing members, six did not contest the election and 11 members were defeated. The defeats included all nine cross bench members. Of the 17 new members, five retained seats held by their party in the previous Council, while 12 were changes in party representation.

Of Labor's 14 members in the old Council, one retired, and one lost pre-selection and 12 were re-elected. Two re-elected Labor MLCs (Pierre Yang, Alannah MacTiernan) switched region. There were 10 new Labor MLCs, eight representing seats gained from other parties.

Of the Liberal Party's nine members in the old Council, five were re-elected, two retired to be replaced by new Liberal MLCs, and two were defeated after being demoted on the party ticket in pre-selection. There were four Nationals in the old Council. Two were re-elected, two retired and one new member was elected.

All crossbenchers elected in 2017 were defeated and four new MLCs elected in their place. All four Green MLCs elected in 2017 were defeated, while Brad Pettitt gained a seat for the Greens in South Metropolitan Region. All three MLCs elected in 2017 representing Pauline Hanson's One Nation were defeated, including Charles Smith who recontested for the Western Australia Party. Shooters, Fishers and Farmers MLC Rick Mazza was defeated after switching from Agricultural to South West Region, and Liberal Democrat Aaron Stonehouse was also defeated.

As well as the new Green MLC, there were two new Legalise Cannabis WA MLCs and one from the Daylight Saving Party. The summary of representation changes by region are set out below.

East Metropolitan Region

Labor and Legalise Cannabis gained seats at the expense of the Greens and Western Australia Party (ex-One Nation). Defeated members were **Tim Clifford** (Greens) and **Charles Smith** (WA Party, ex-One Nation), new members **Lorna Harper** (Labor) and **Brian Walker** (Legalise Cannabis).

North Metropolitan Region

Labor gained two seats, one each from the Liberal Party and the Greens, and there were three changes in representation. Two new Labor MLCs were elected, **Ayor Makur Chuot** and **Daniel Caddy**, replacing the defeated **Alison Xamon** (Greens) and **Michael Mischin** (Liberal). Mischin had been demoted to an unwinnable position on his party's ticket. A change in regions contested saw **Pierre Yang** move from South Metropolitan and replace **Alannah MacTiernan** who was elected for South West Region.

South Metropolitan Region

Labor and the Greens gained a seat each at the expense the Liberal Party and Liberal Democrats and there was one other change in representation. Labor MLC **Pierre Yang** moved to contest North Metropolitan Region and there were two new Labor MLCs, **Klara Andric** and **Stephen Pratt**. **Simon O'Brien** (Liberal) retired, his seat was lost by the Liberal Party, and **Aaron Stonehouse** (Liberal Democrat) was defeated. **Brad Pettitt** (Greens) gained a seat for his party.

Agricultural Region

Labor gained a seat from the Shooters, Fishers and Farmers and there were three changes in representation. Labor's **Laurie Graham** retired, and two new Labor MLCs were elected, **Shelley Payne** and **Sandra Carr**. On the Liberal ticket, **Steve Martin** was elected in place of **Jim Chown** who had been demoted on the Liberal ticket. **Rick Mazza** (SFF) moved to contest South West Region where he was defeated.

Mining and Pastoral Region

Labor gained two seats and the Daylight Saving Party one at the expense of the Nationals, Greens and One Nation. There were four changes in representation. The new members were **Peter Foster** (Labor), **Rosetta Sahanna** (Labor), **Wilson Tucker** (Daylight Saving Party), and **Neil Thomson** (Liberal) replacing the retiring **Ken Baston** (Liberal). **Robin Scott** (One Nation) was defeated, while **Jacqui Boydell** (National) and **Robin Chapple** (Greens) retired, both retirements representing seats lost by their party.

South West Region

Labor and Legalise Cannabis gained a seat each at the expense of the Greens and One Nation, the changes corresponding to three changes in representation. For Labor, new members were **Alannah MacTiernan** after moving from North Metropolitan Region, and **Jackie Jarvis** newly elected, while **Adele Farina** departed after losing Labor pre-selection. National **James Hayward** was elected in place of the retiring **Colin Holt**. **Diane Evers** (Greens) and **Colin Tincknell** (One Nation) were defeated with **Sophia Moermond** (Legalise Cannabis) the new crossbench member. **Rick Mazza** (SFF) was defeated after shifting from Agricultural Region.
