## Introduction

Each electorate subreport contains estimates of unemployment statistics for that electorate from the December quarter 2008 through to the September quarter 2013. Data Analysis Australia was contracted to perform this analysis in August 2013.

The analysis in this report is based upon data obtained from the Small Area Labour Markets (SALM) publications that have been produced by the Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations (DEEWR). DEEWR estimates have in turn been produced using the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) Labour Force Survey data, Census data and Centrelink data.

Note that these statistics refer to the new electoral boundaries as of the state election in March 2013 and hence are not comparable to earlier publications that used former electoral distributions.

## Methodology

Published quarterly, DEEWR produces estimates of unemployment and the labour force for approximately 1,400 statistical local areas (SLAs) across Australia. DEEWR produces unemployment estimates for each SLA by taking the level of unemployment, which has been published by the ABS for a region, and apportioning it across each of the SLAs that fall within that region. This apportioning is in accordance with the distribution of Centrelink, Newstart and Youth Allowance (Other) beneficiaries. SALM estimates are smoothed using a four-quarter average in order to minimise the variability that is inherent in small area data.

Using the SALM data, it is possible to construct estimates of unemployment statistics for each of the state electoral divisions (SED) in Western Australia. The estimates are based on the WA State Electoral Boundaries that came into effect as of the state election on 9 March 2013. To construct estimates for each of the electorates it is first necessary to allocate SLAs to SEDs. Some SLAs fall wholly within an electorate, others do not. When an SLA overlaps two or more electorates, the unemployment and labour force estimates for that SLA have to be apportioned between electorates. From the 2011 Census of Population and Housing it is known how the population of overlapping SLAs is distributed between electorates and this proportion is used to distribute unemployment and labour force totals. Furthermore, the data is aggregated for SLAs and part SLAs within electorates and an overall unemployment rate for each electorate is calculated. A copy of the concordance used is available upon request.

It should be noted that unemployment rates by electorate are approximations only and therefore should be treated with caution. This is due to some SLAs overlapping two or more electorates and the crude method of dealing with this issue (using population data as the basis for apportioning unemployment and labour force totals between electorates).

The graphs in this publication display unemployment rates for each electorate and compare them to the state and national average unemployment rate for each quarter. In previous editions of this publication a trendline for each electorate was determined by producing a polynomial regression model of order two (represented by a dotted trendline in each graph). However, with the change in unemployment rates experienced over the most recent year and differences at the electorate level this is no longer appropriate and the trendline has been dropped for this release.

## Party Abbreviations

The following abbreviations for parties have been used. The political parties shown against each seat are as they stand currently.

ALP            Australian Labor Party

LIB            Liberal Party

NAT            The Nationals

## Definition of Unemployment Rate

Unemployed persons are defined by the ABS as those civilians aged 15 years and over who, during a period of one week (called the reference week), were not employed, but were available to start work in the reference week and had actively looked for work in the previous four weeks, or who were waiting to start a new job within four weeks from the end of the reference week and could have started in the reference week if the new job had been available then.

Work is defined as work for profit, commission or payment in kind; in a job, business or farm; or without pay in a family business or farm.

The number of unemployed workers, expressed as a percentage of the labour force, is called the unemployment rate.

"Uet %" is used to represent "unemployment rate" in the tables throughout this publication.

## Summary of the Unemployment Rate Ranked by SED

For the September quarter 2013, unemployment rates ranged from 1.8% in Hillarys (LIB), Kingsley (LIB) and Nedlands (LIB) to 10.5% in Kimberley (ALP).

The average unemployment rate for Western Australia for the September quarter 2013 was 4.6%. More than half of the WA electorates had unemployment rates that were above the state average. Of the 45.8% of WA electorates that had unemployment rates below the state average, the Liberal Party holds 20 seats (33.9% of all LIB seats), the Labor Party holds 5 seats (8.5% of all ALP seats) and the National Party holds 2 seats (3.4% of all NAT seats).

The national average unemployment rate for the September quarter 2013 was 5.5%. The total percentage of WA electorates who had an unemployment rate below this national average was 72.9%. Of these, the Liberal Party holds 26 seats (83.9% of all LIB seats), the Labor Party holds 11 seats (52.4% of all ALP seats) and the National Party holds 6 seats (85.7% of all NAT seats).

In comparison to the June quarter 2013, Balcatta (LIB) and Mount Lawley (LIB) experienced the greatest improvement in their unemployment rate, both down by 0.2%. Kimberley (ALP) experienced the greatest increase (2.0%) in their unemployment rate followed by North West Central (NAT) and Pilbara (NAT).

Of those electorates that experienced an improvement in their ranking for the September 2013 quarter compared to the June 2013 quarter, the Labor Party holds 12 seats (57.1% of all ALP seats), the Liberal Party holds 13 seats (41.9% of all LIB seats) and the Nationals hold 2 seats (28.6% of all NAT seats).

For those electorates that exhibited a decline in their ranking for the September 2013 quarter, in comparison to the June 2013 quarter, the Labor Party holds 5 seats (23.8% of all ALP seats), the Liberal Party holds 5 seats (16.1% of all LIB seats) and the National Party holds 5 seats (71.4% of all NAT seats).

Of those electorates that were ranked in the top 10 in the June 2013 quarter, all remained in the top 10 in the September 2013 quarter. Similarly, all of those electorates that were ranked in the bottom 10 in the June 2013 quarter remained in the bottom 10 in the September 2013 quarter.

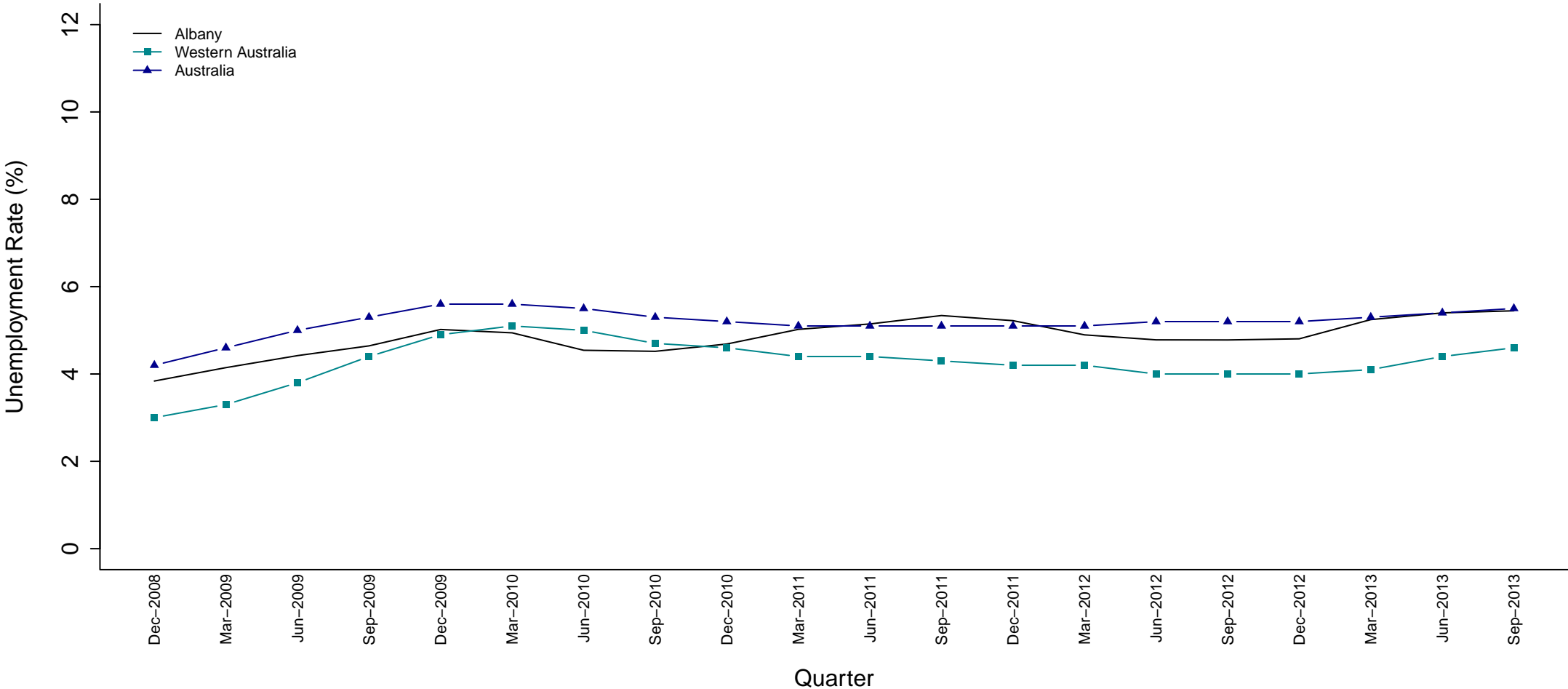
In the September 2012 quarter the unemployment rate ranged from 1.5% to 7.8%. The range for the September 2013 quarter was significantly wider at the larger end, ranging from 1.8% to 10.5%. In the June quarter 2013, the unemployment rate ranged from 1.7% to 9.7%.

The Hillarys (LIB), Kingsley (LIB) and Nedlands (LIB) electorates had the lowest rates of unemployment for the September 2013 quarter. Moore (NAT) had the lowest rate for the September 2012 quarter. Kimberley (ALP) had the highest unemployment rate for the September 2013 quarter, while Kwinana had the highest unemployment rate in the June 2013 and September 2012 quarters.

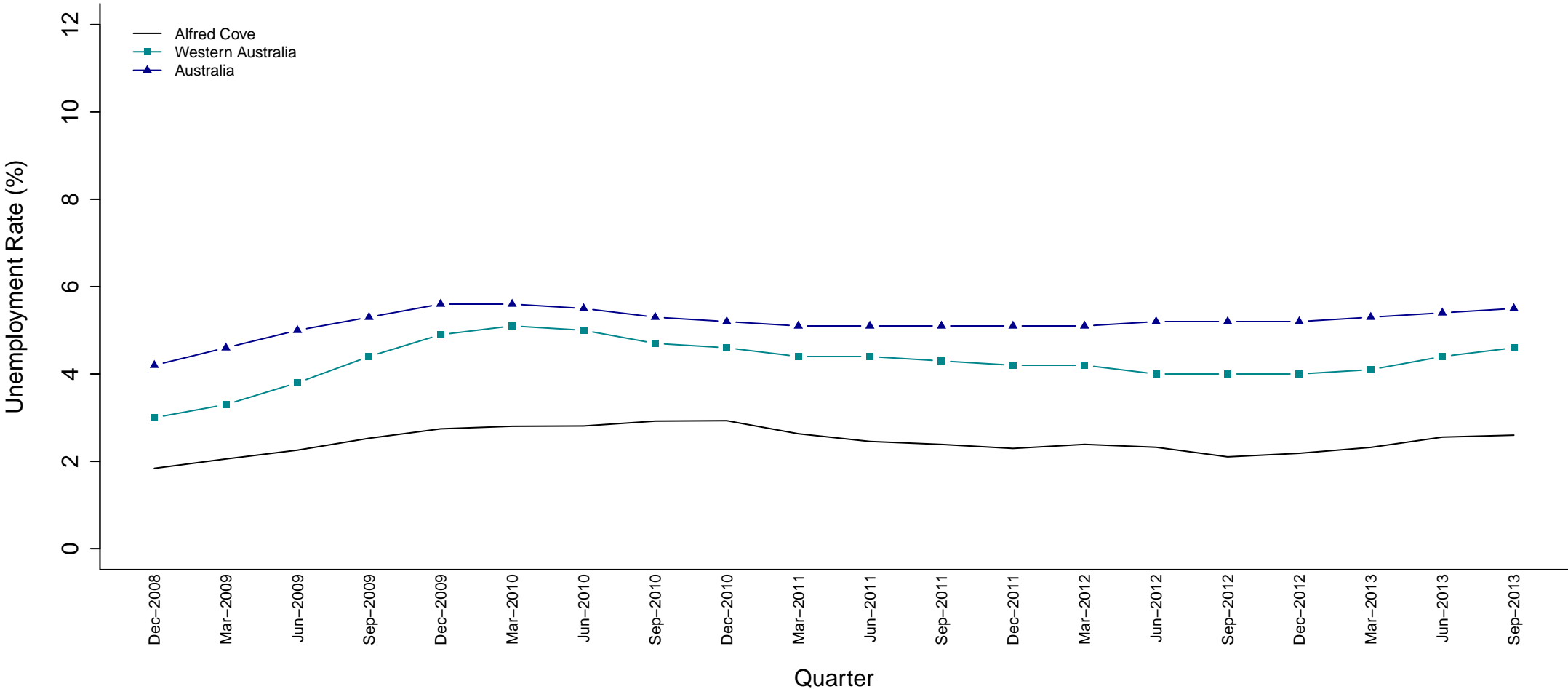

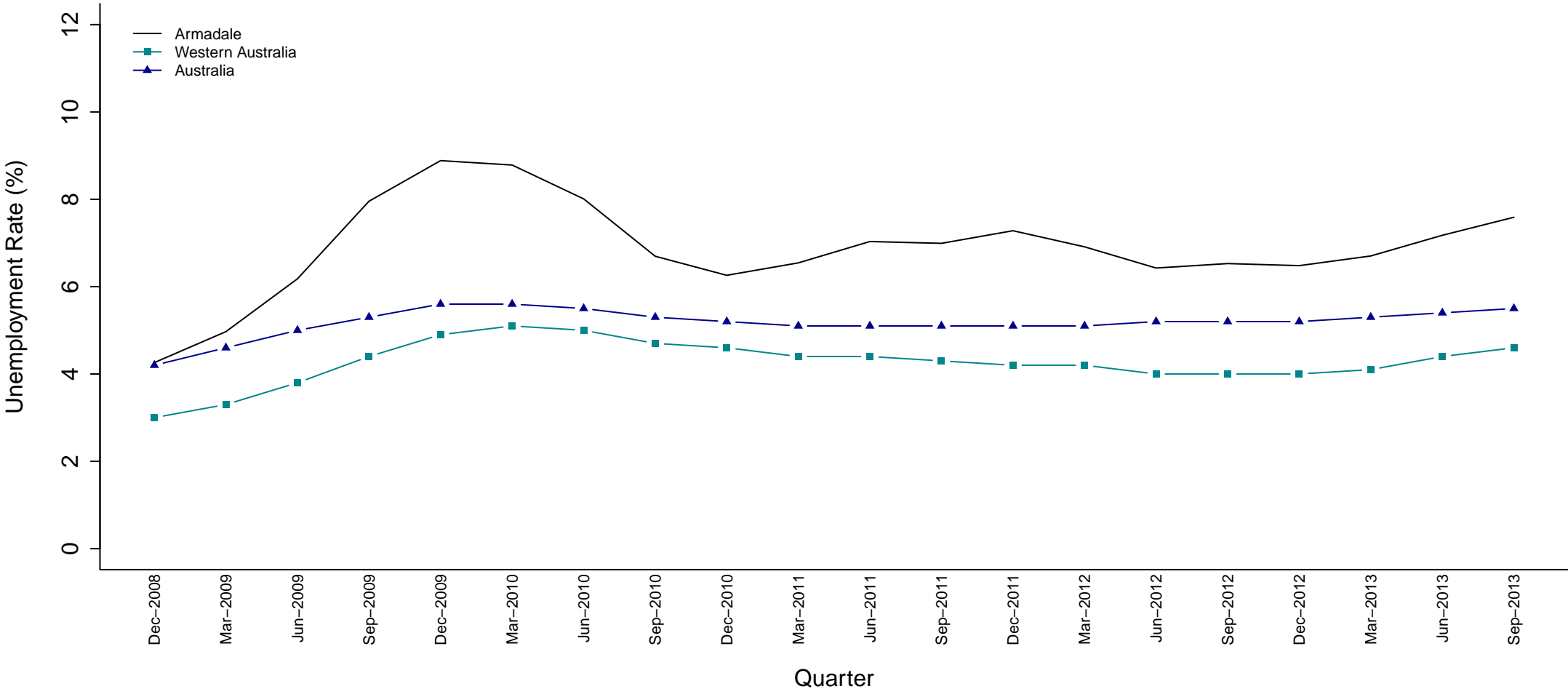

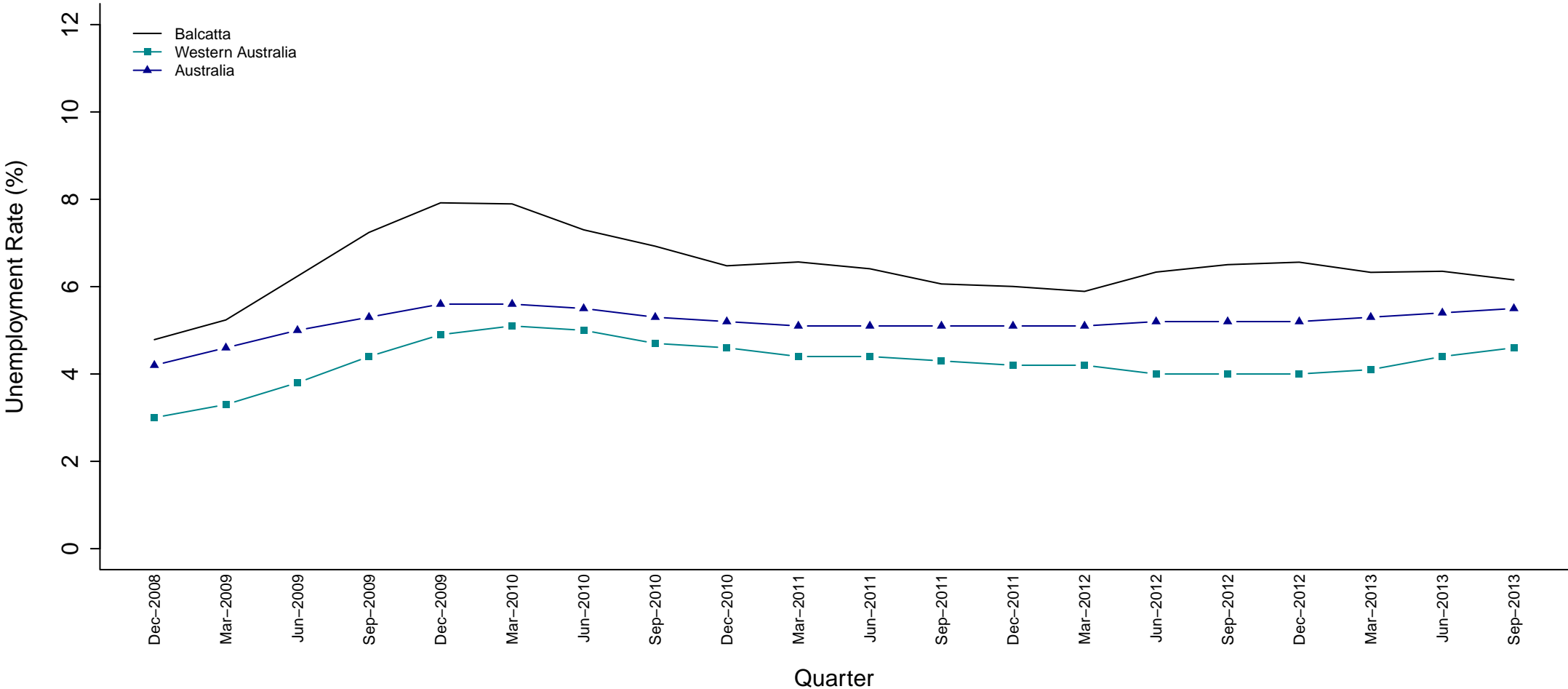

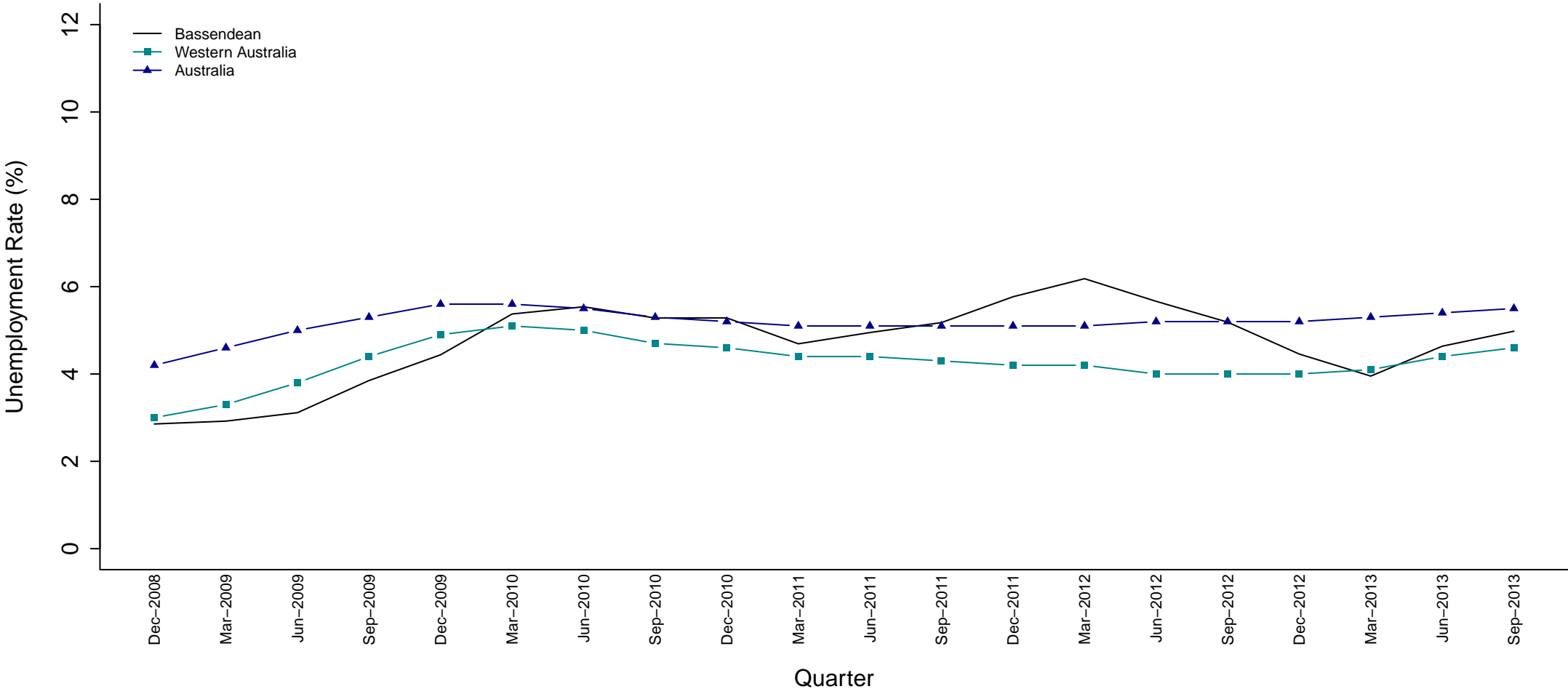

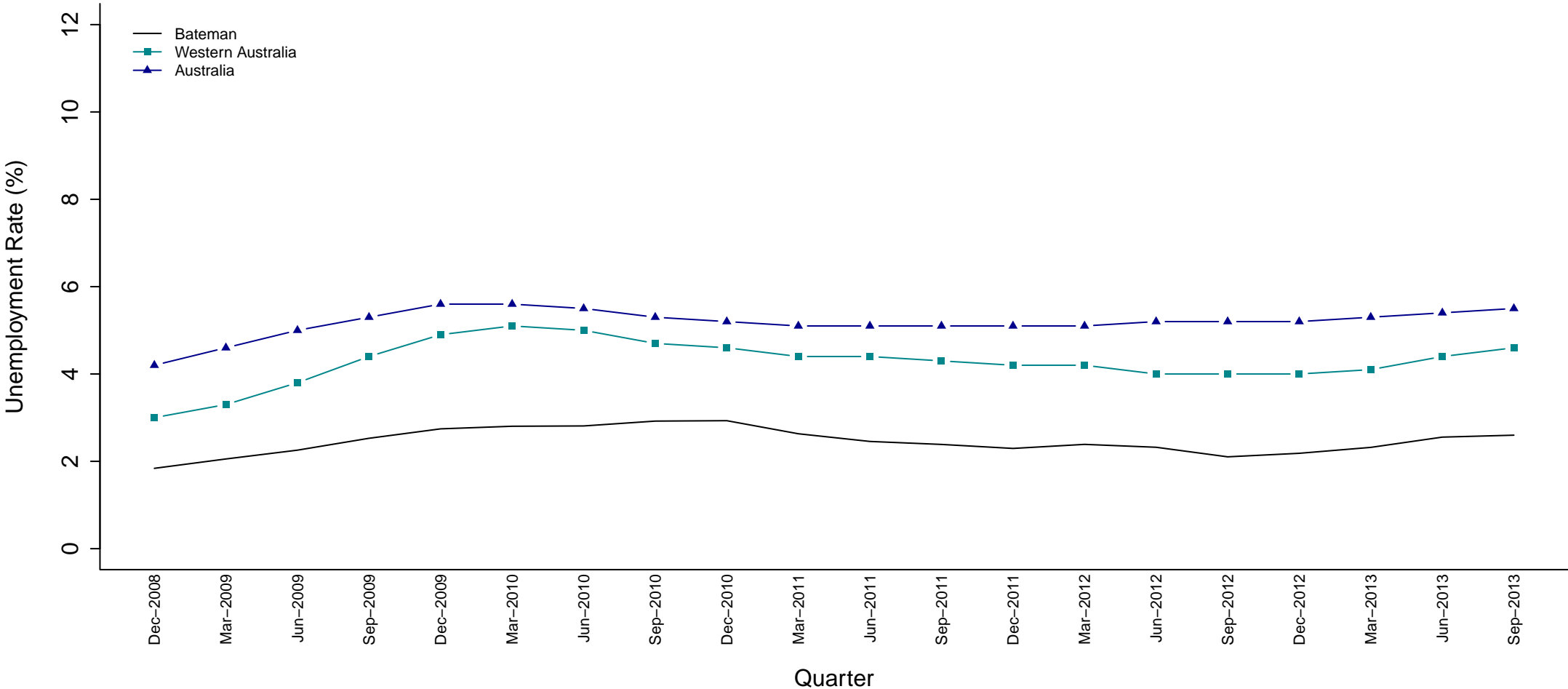

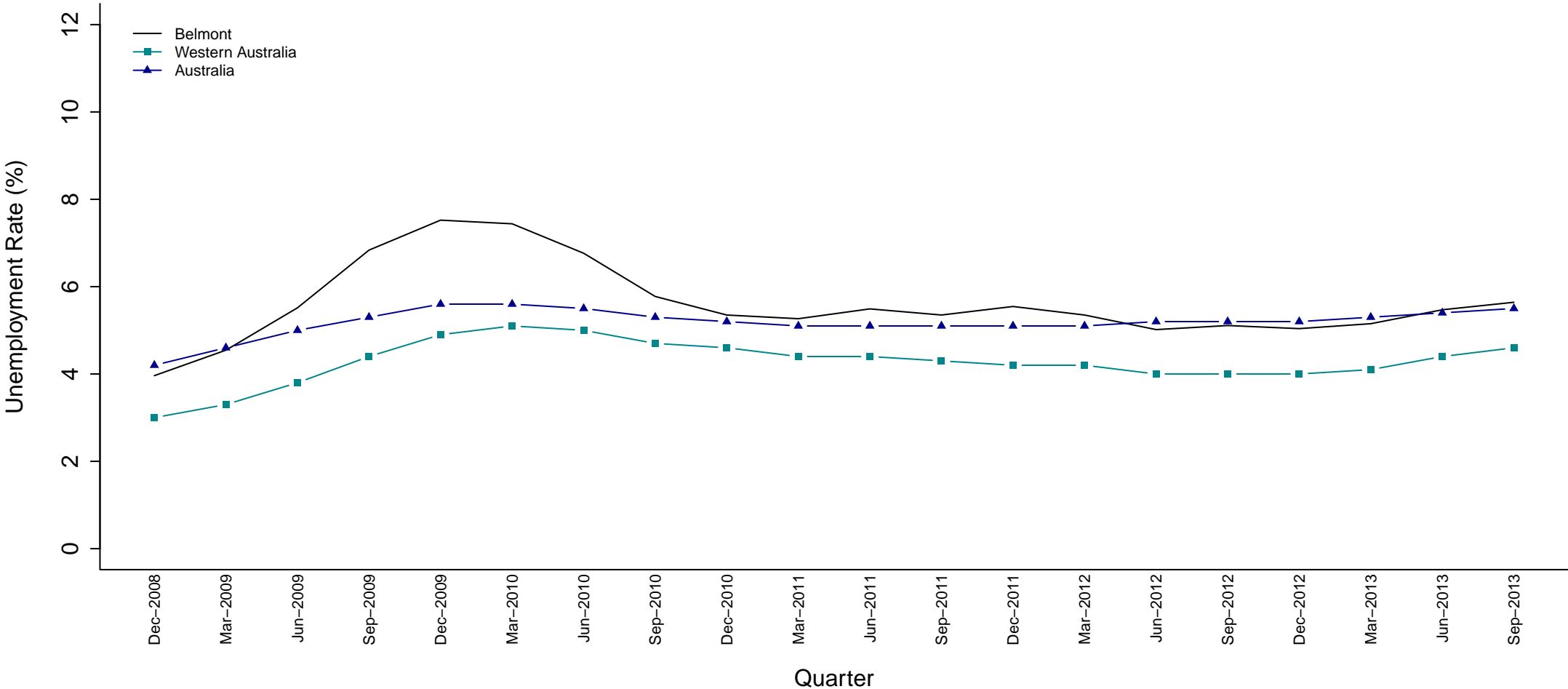

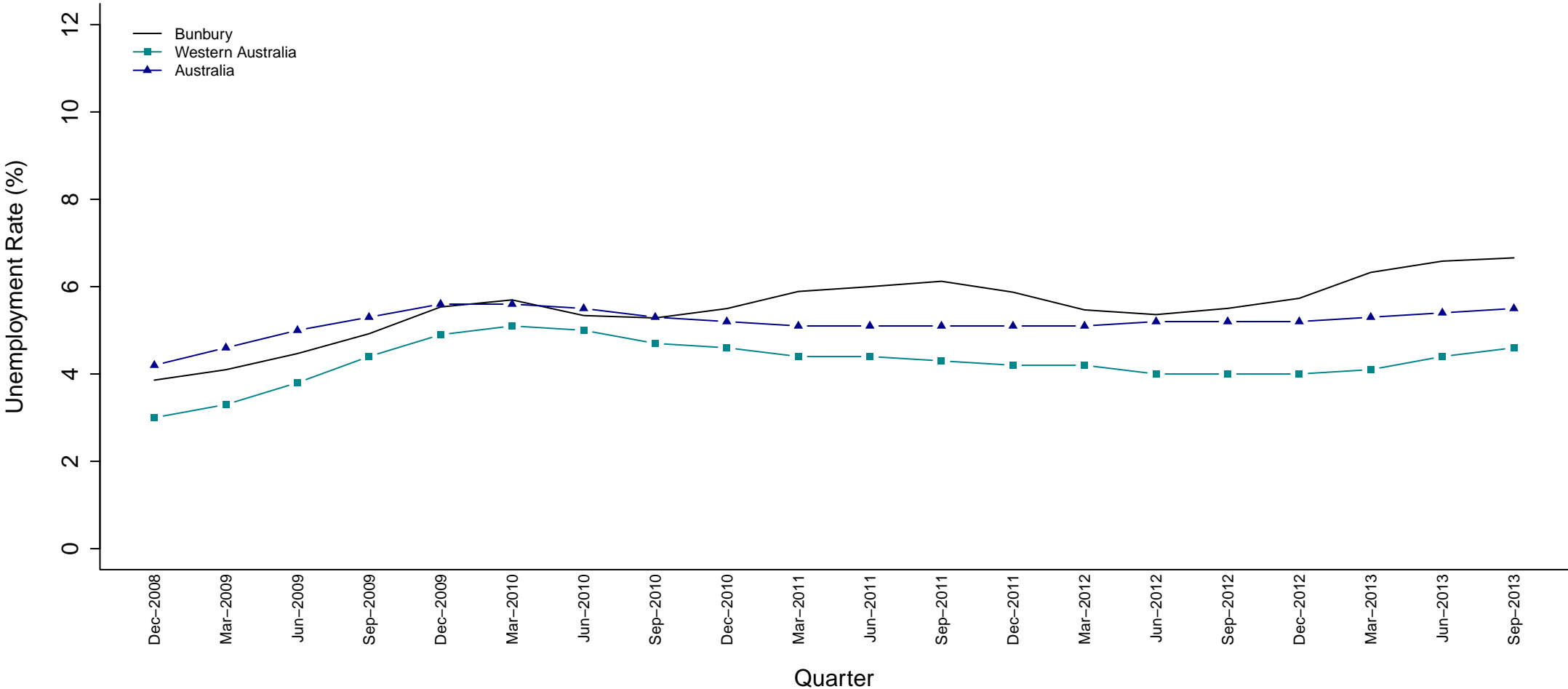

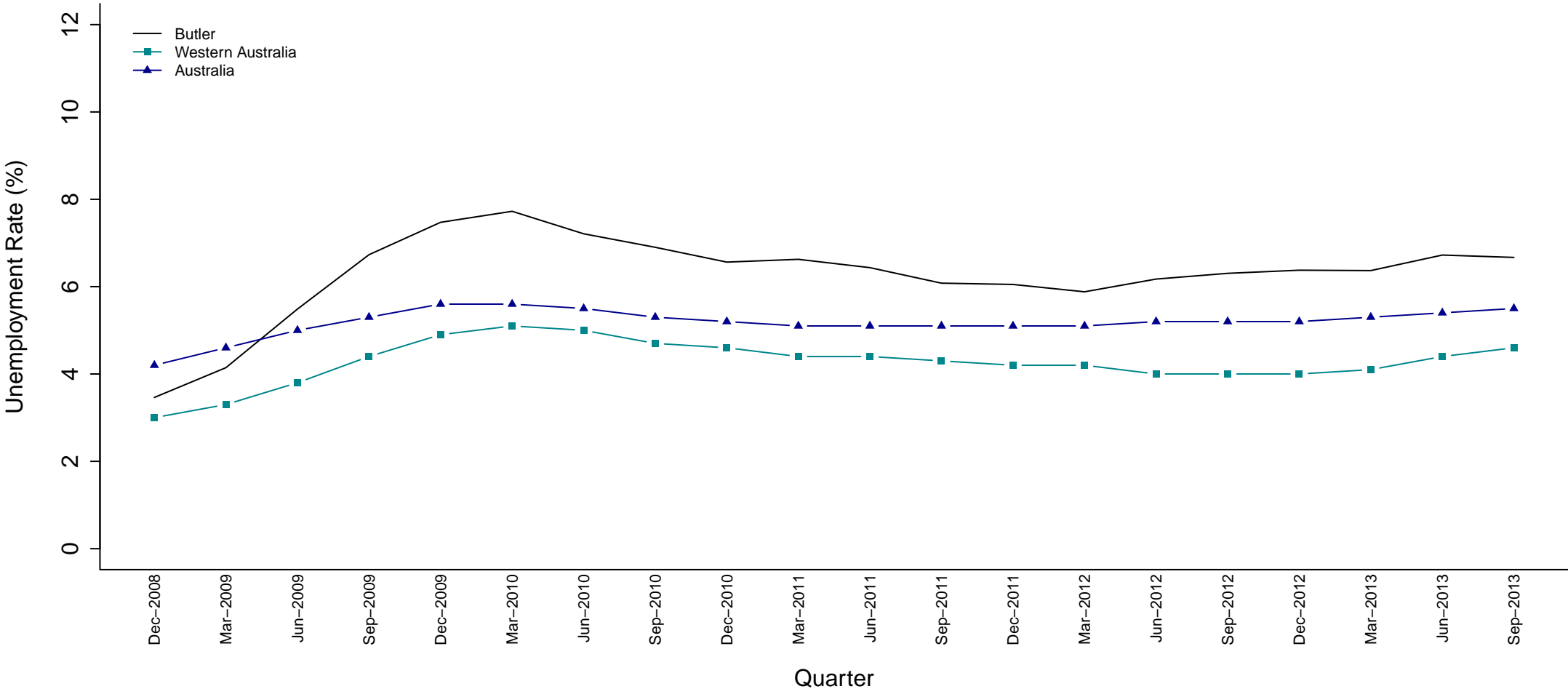

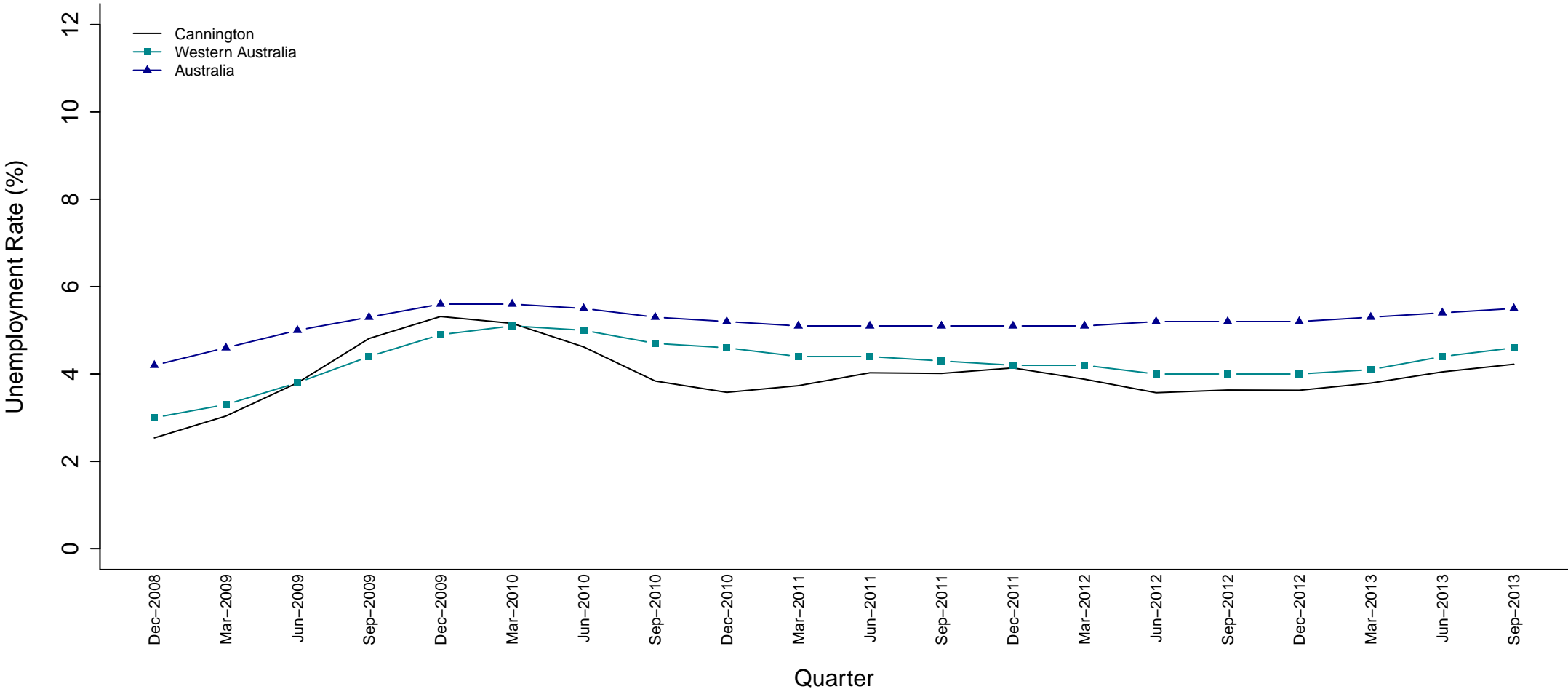

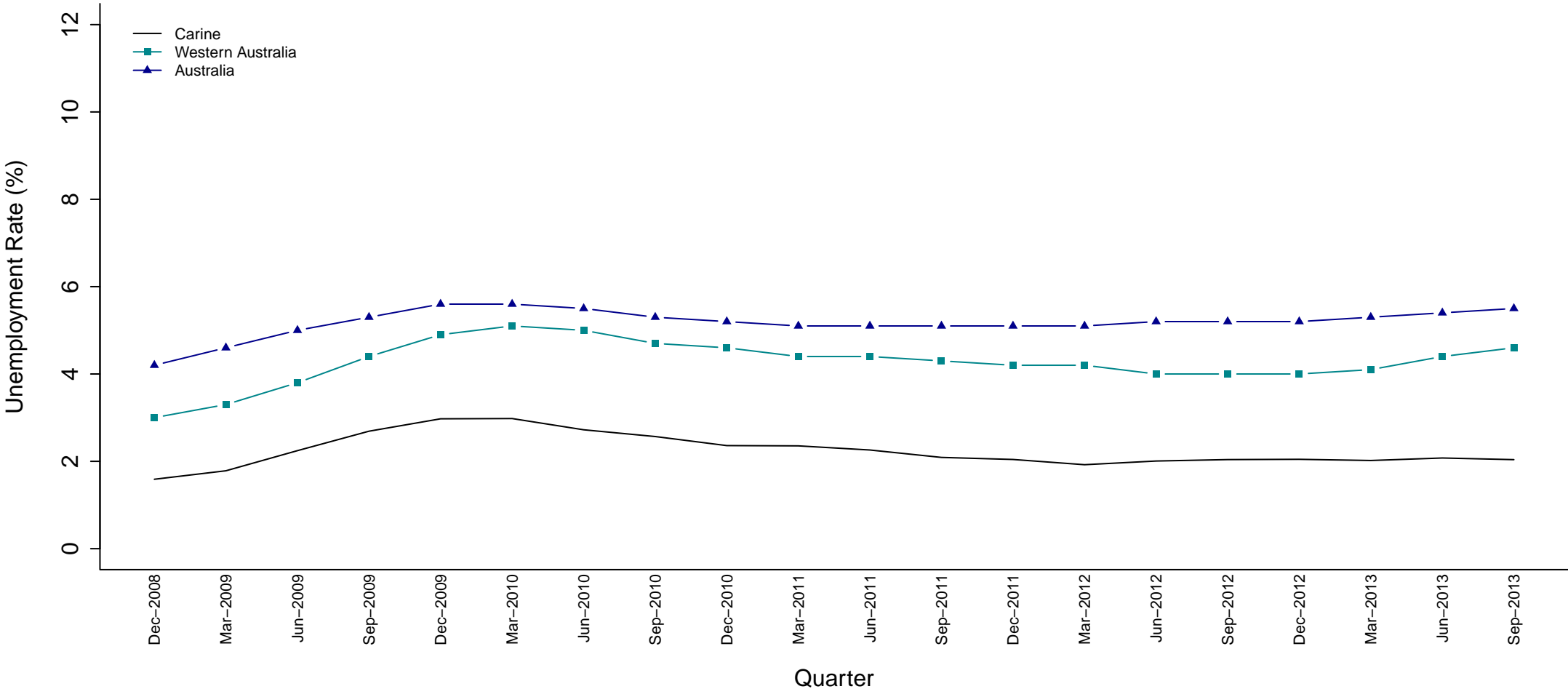

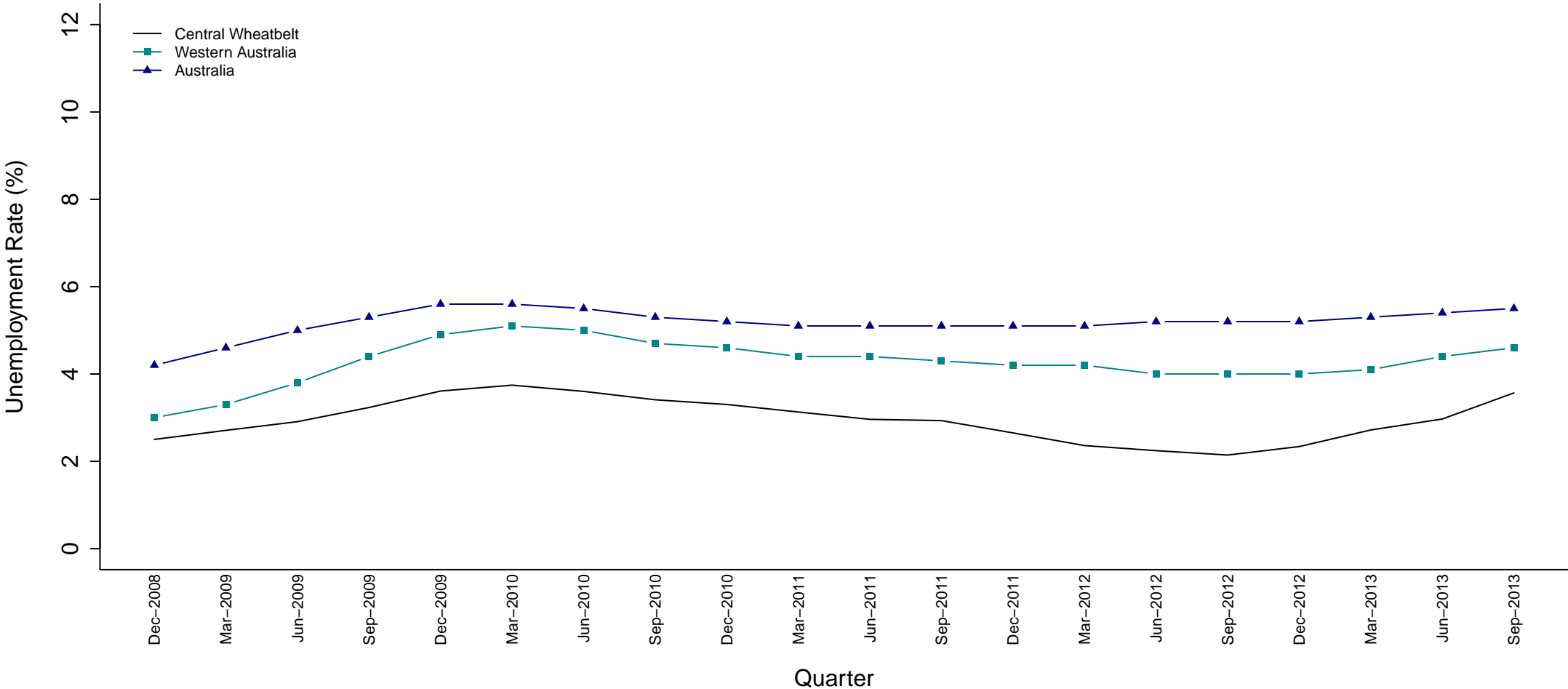

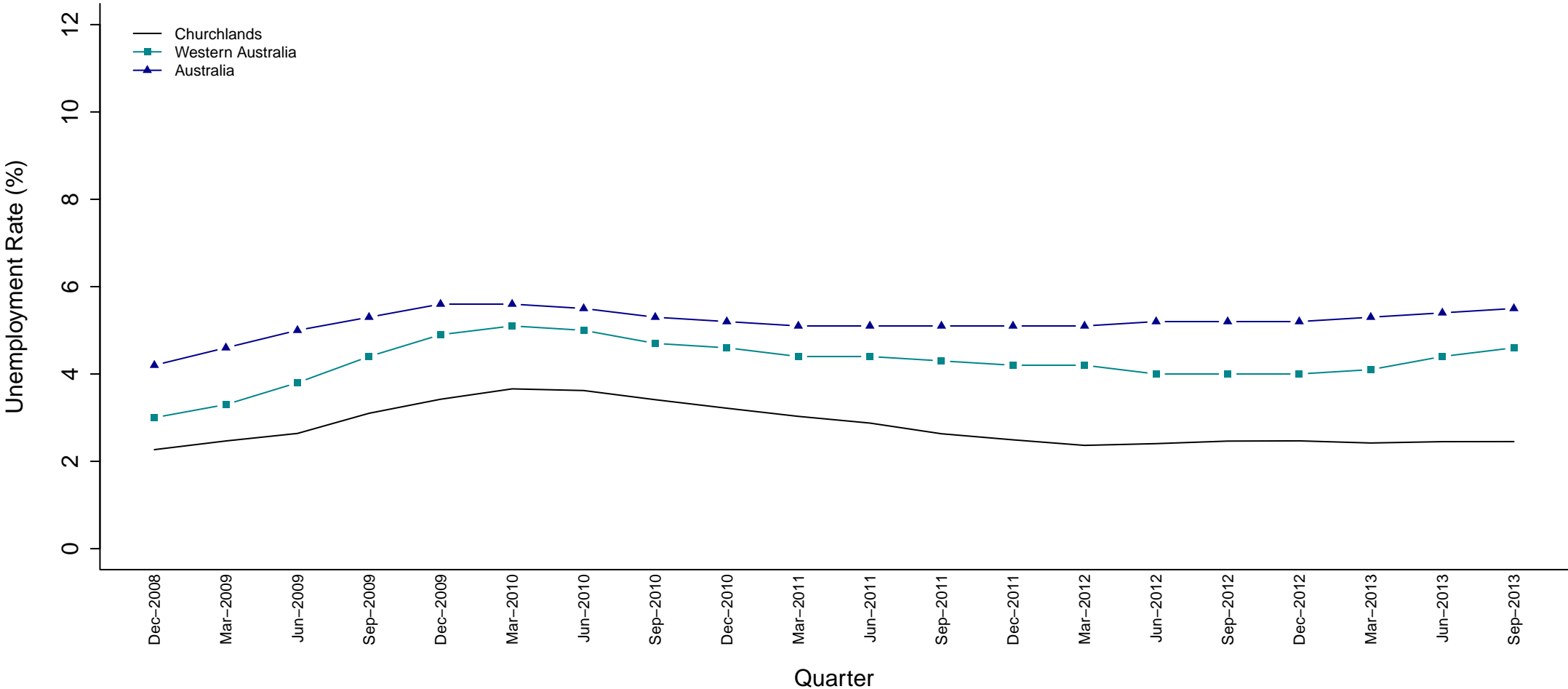

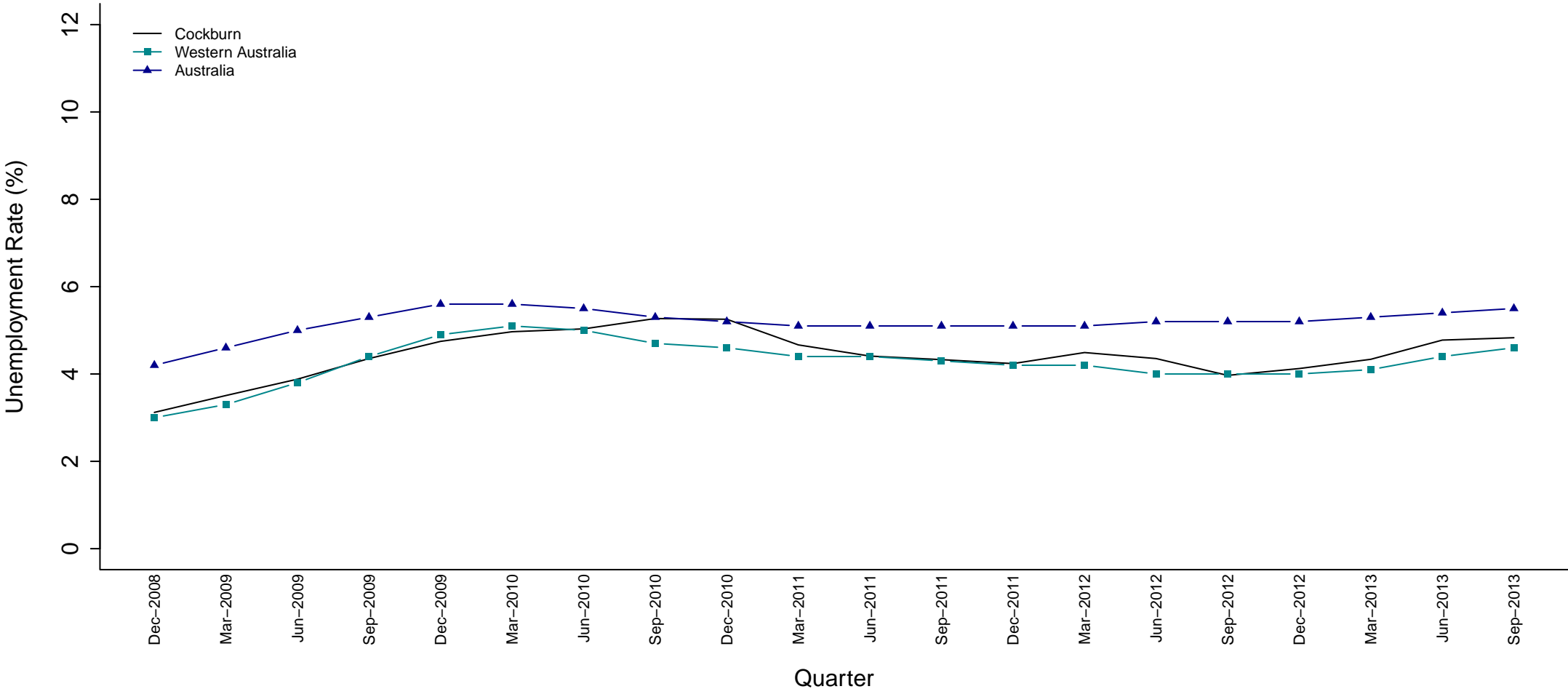

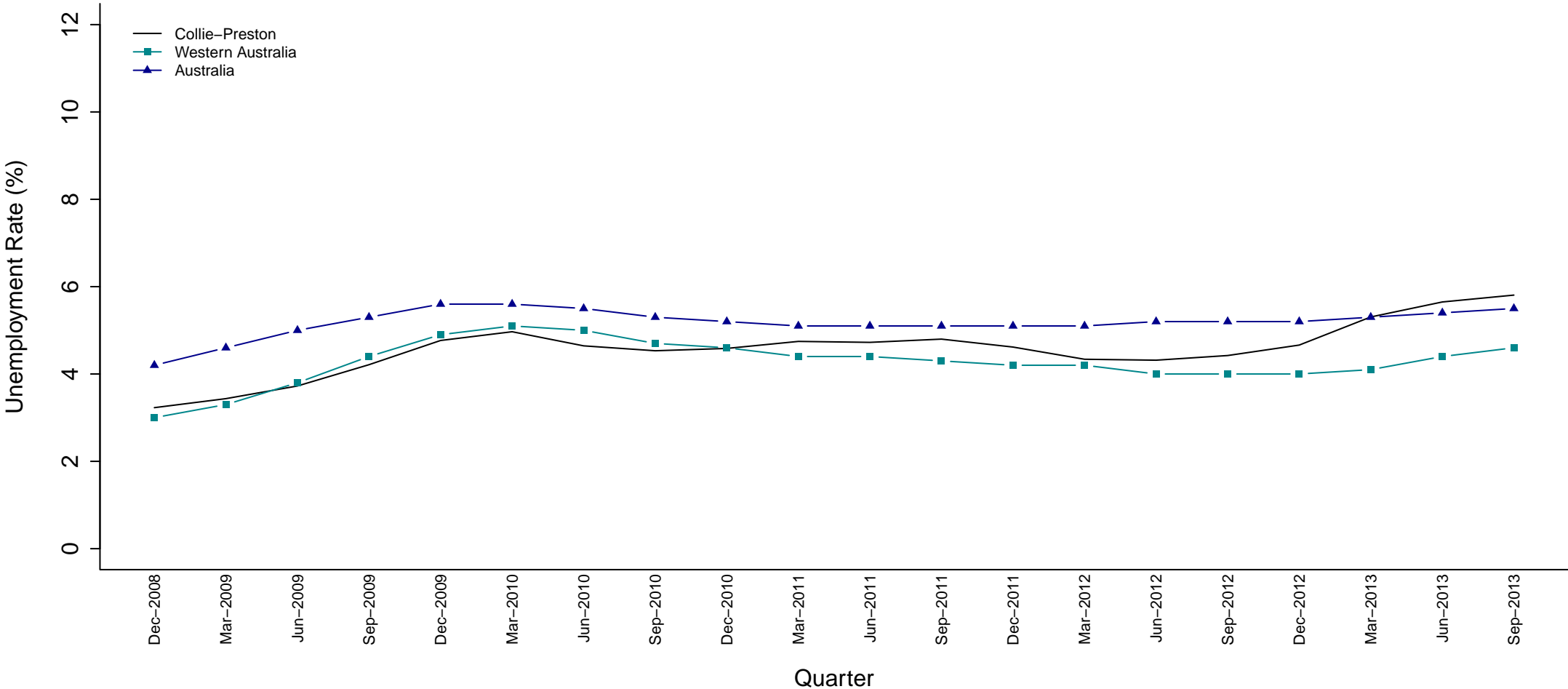

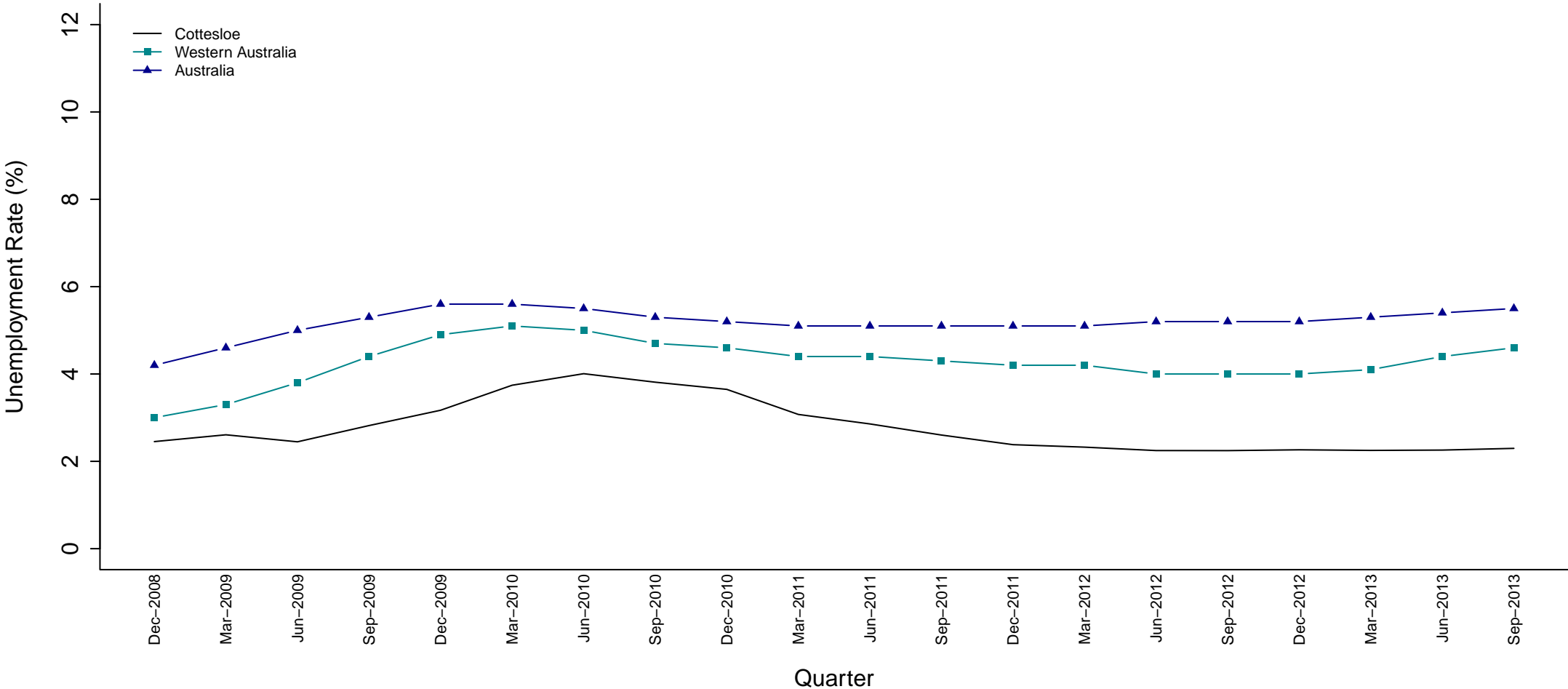

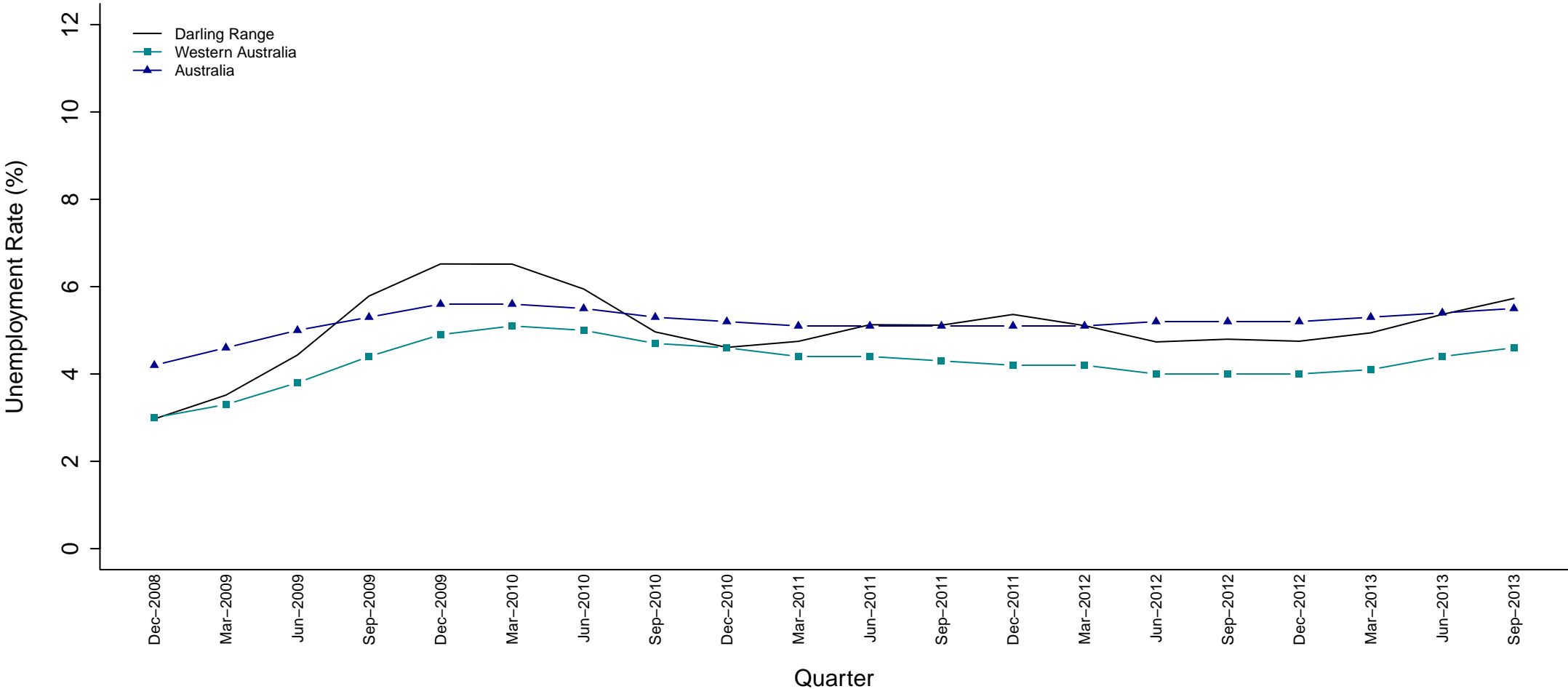

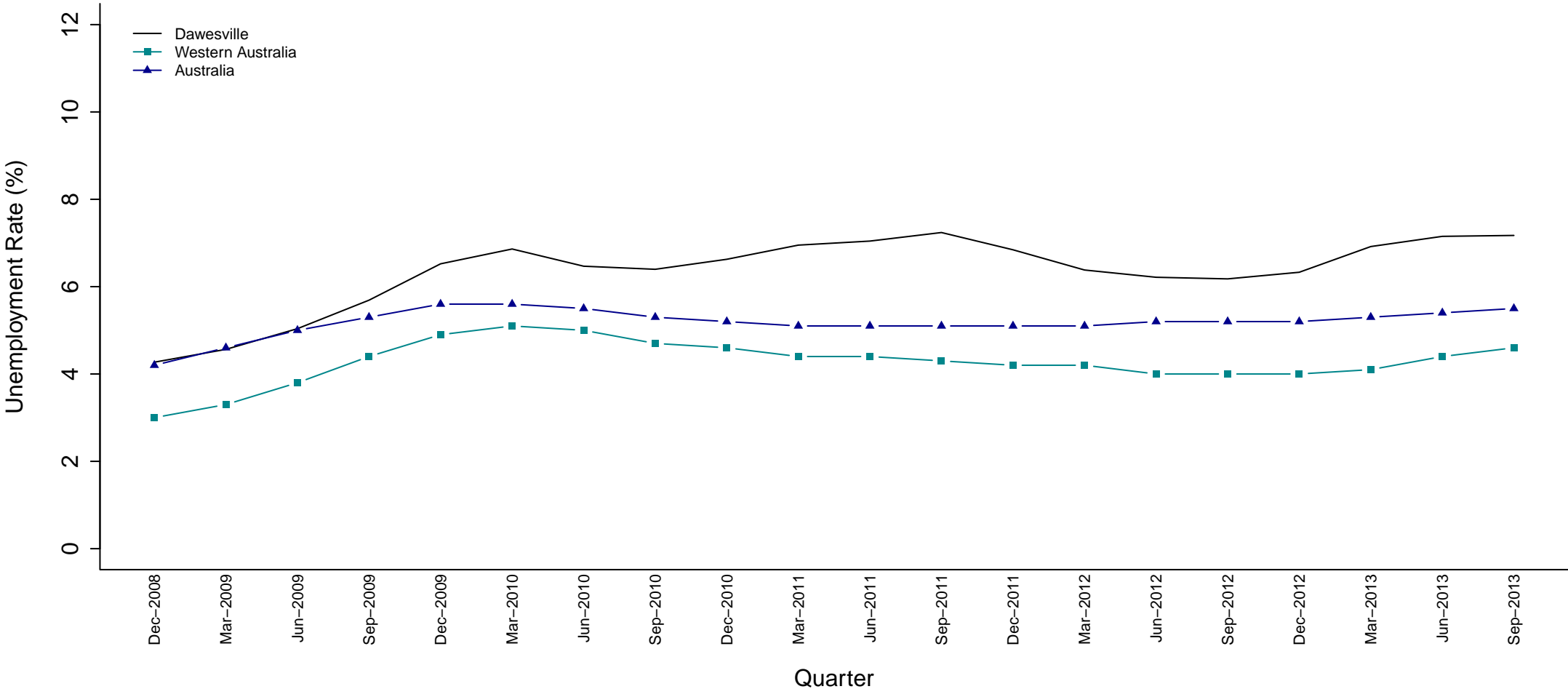

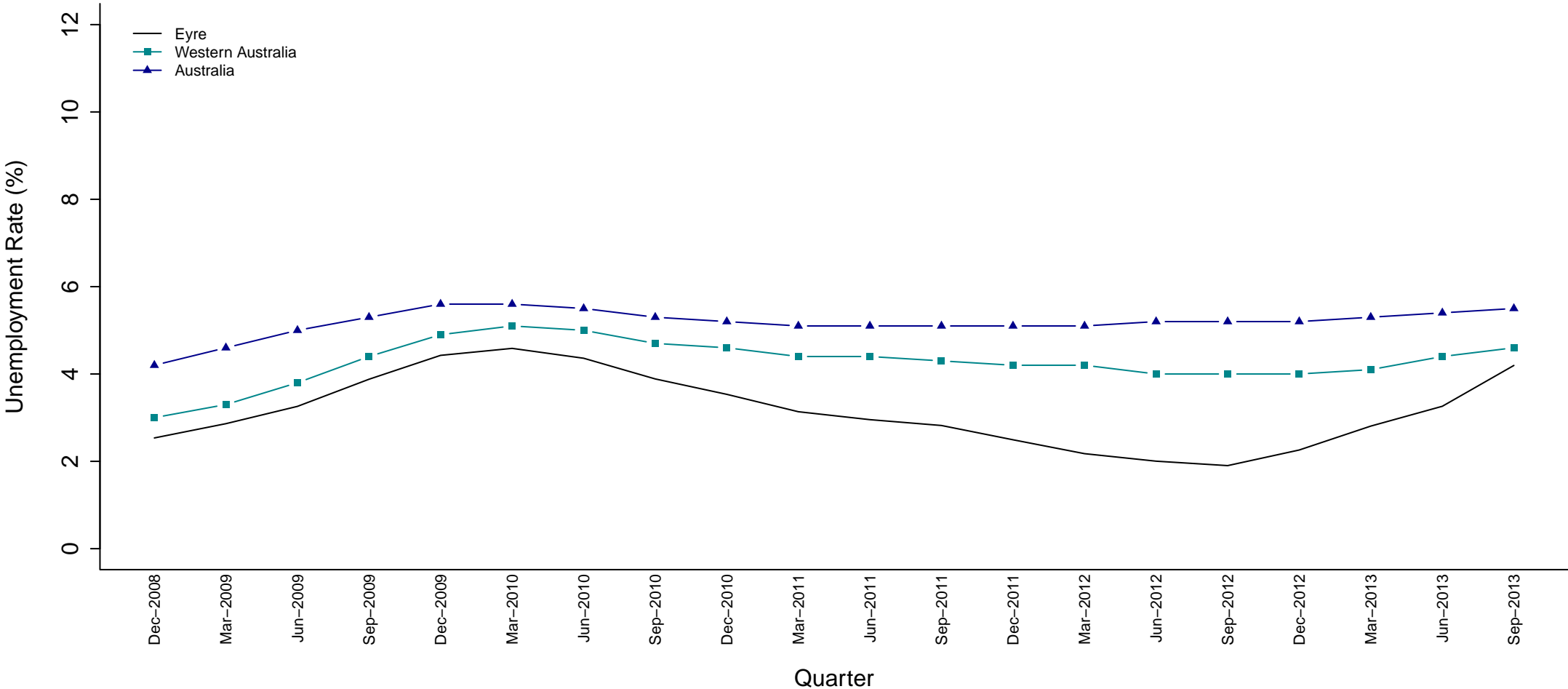

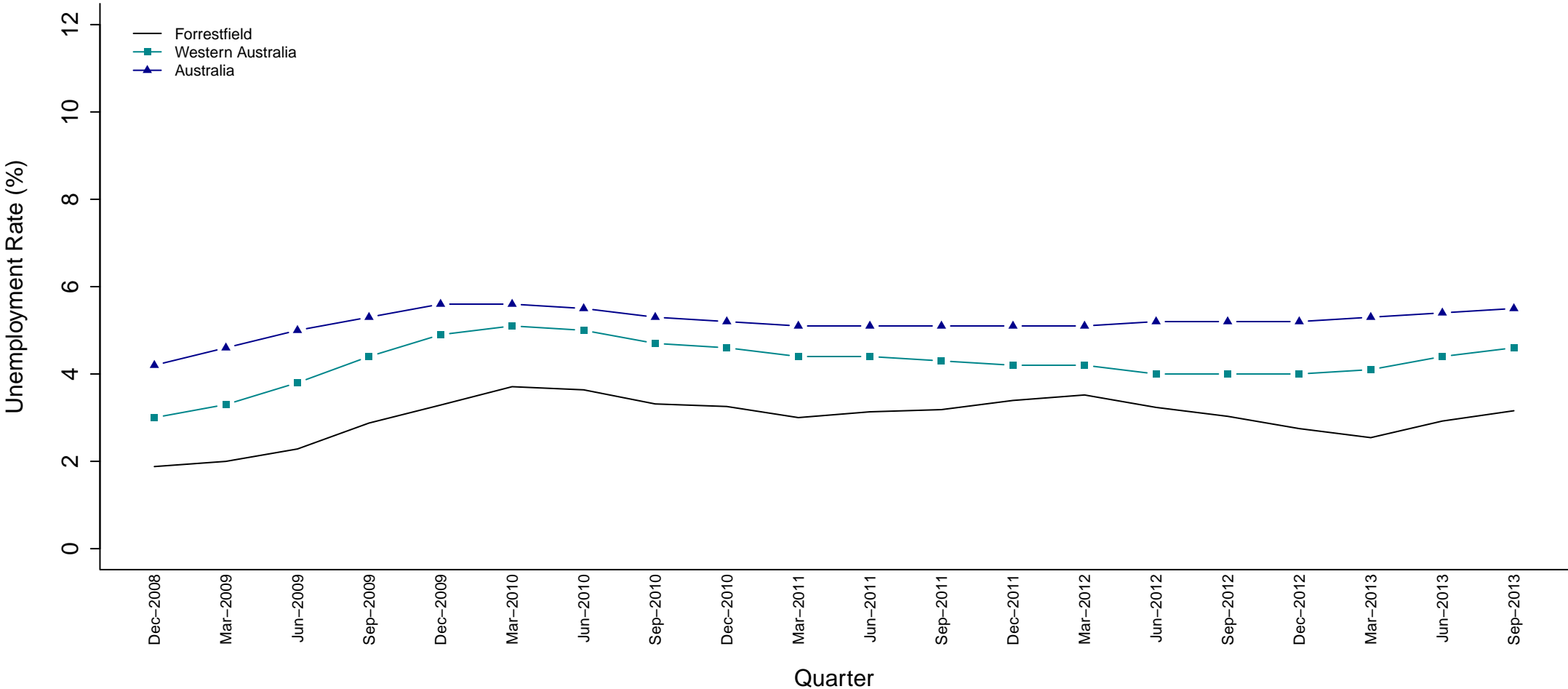

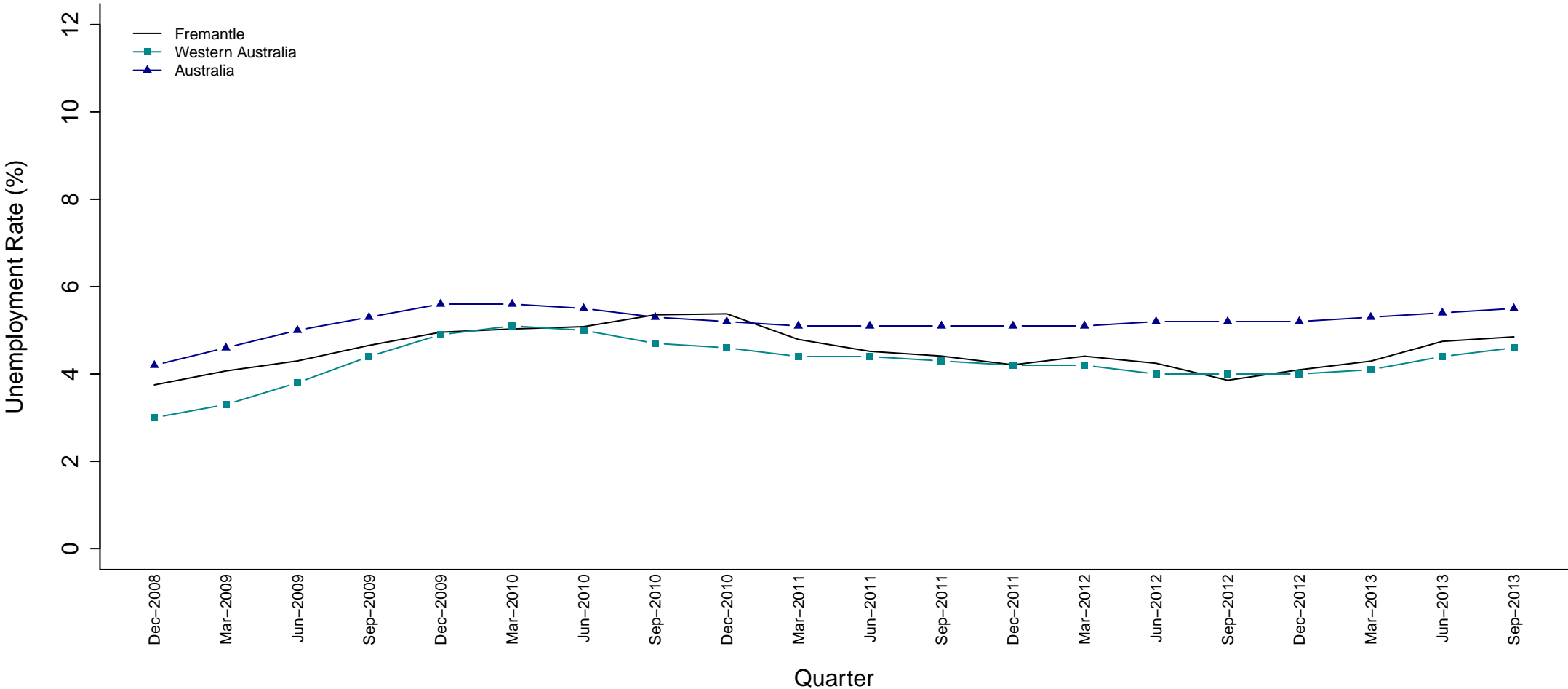

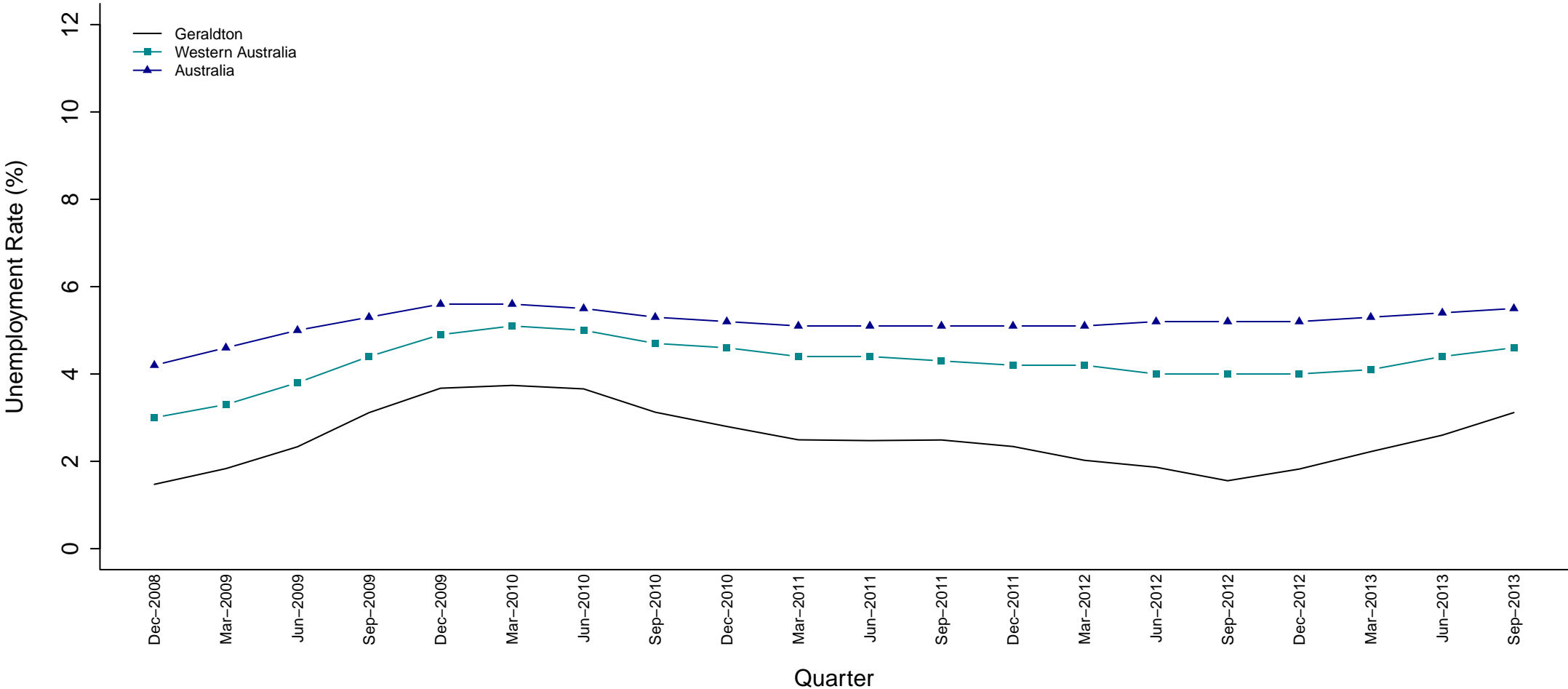

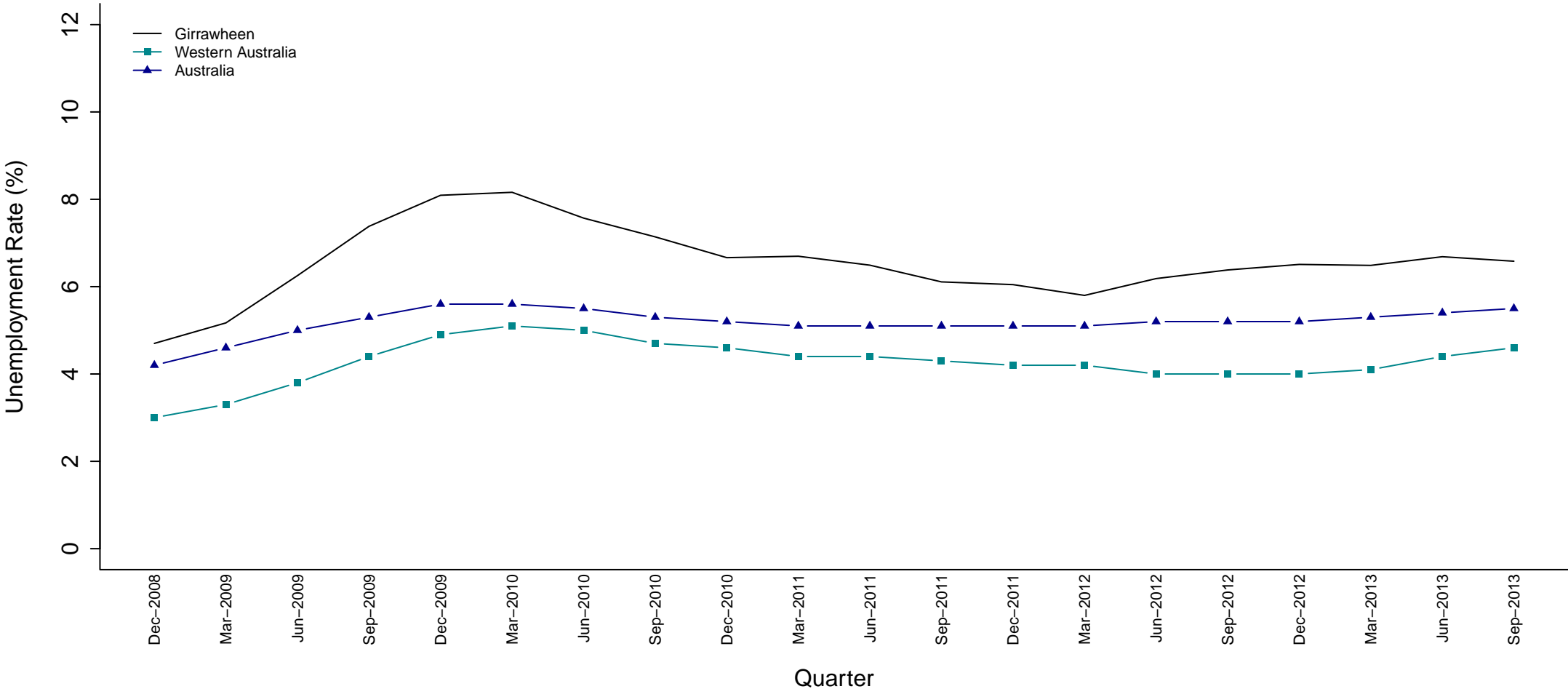

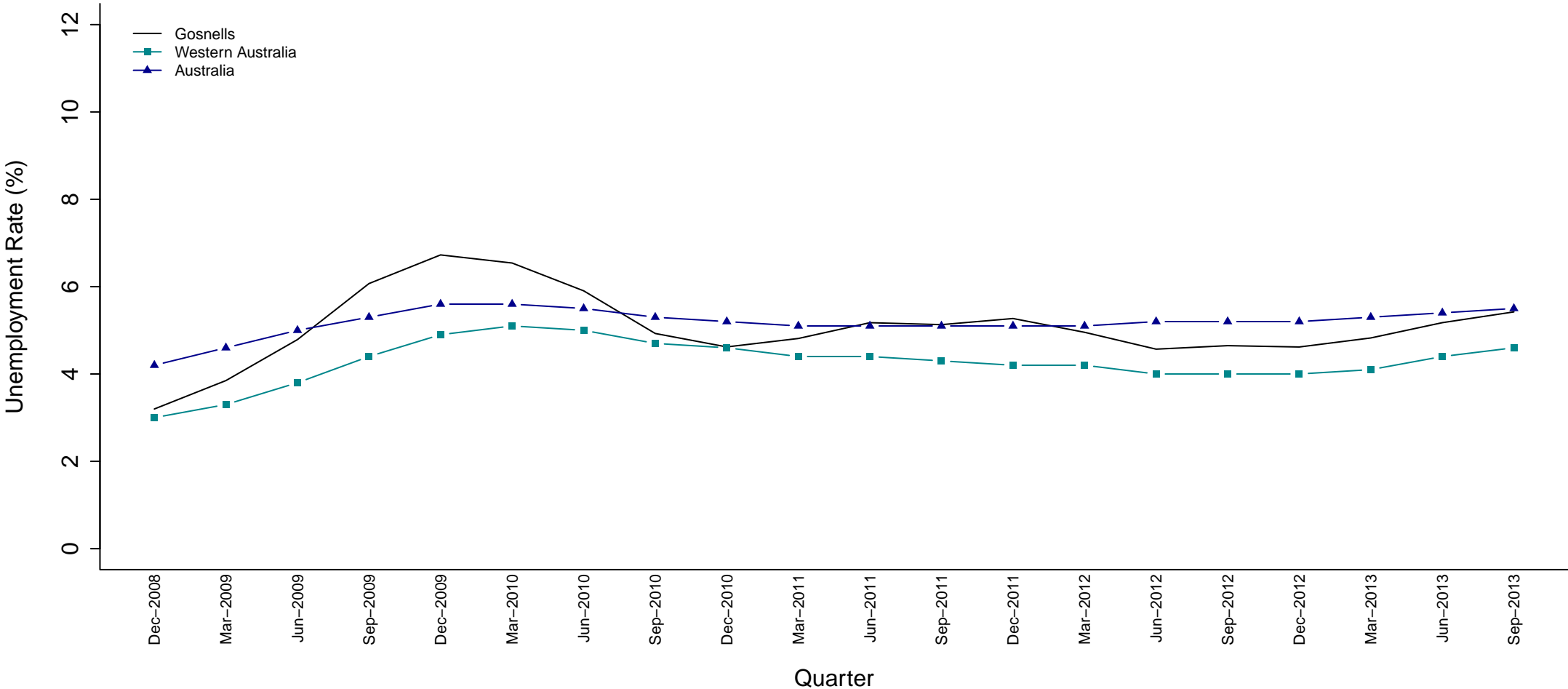

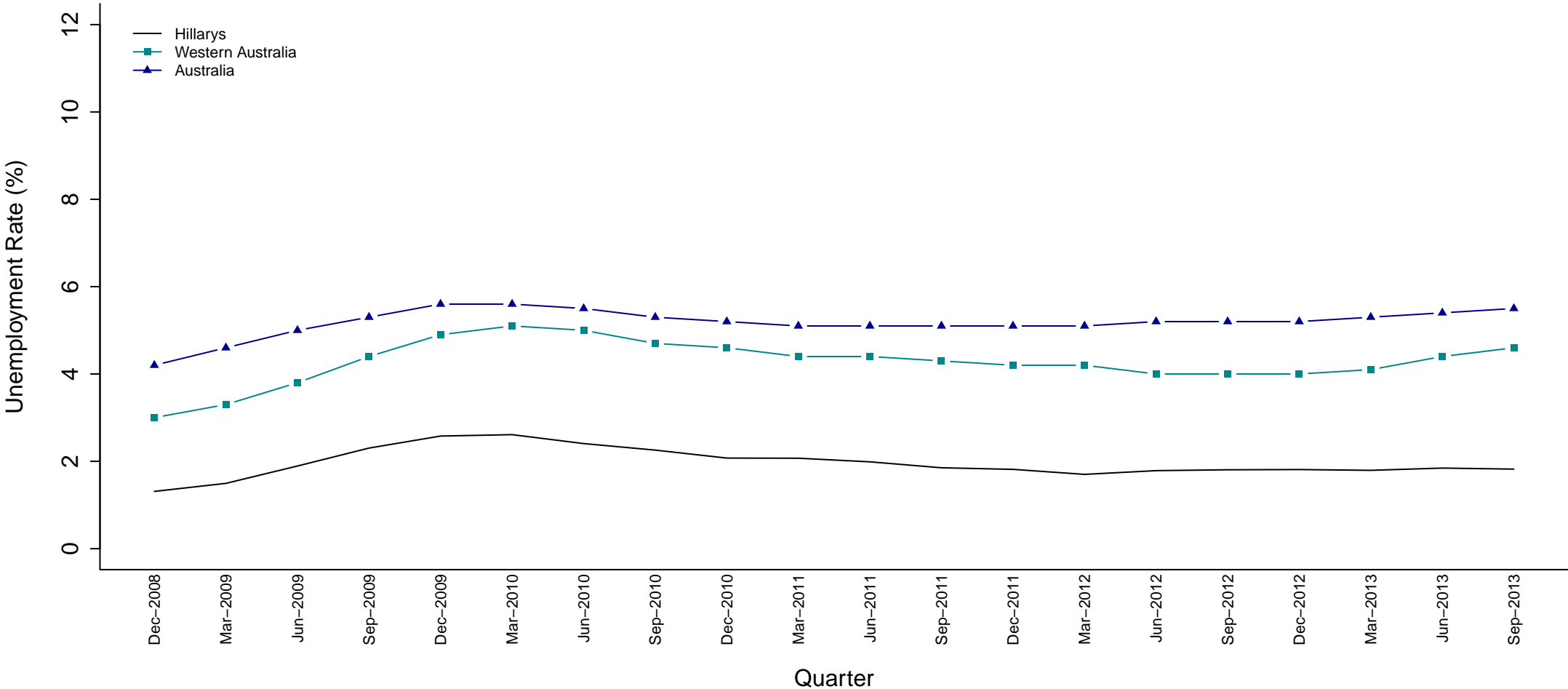

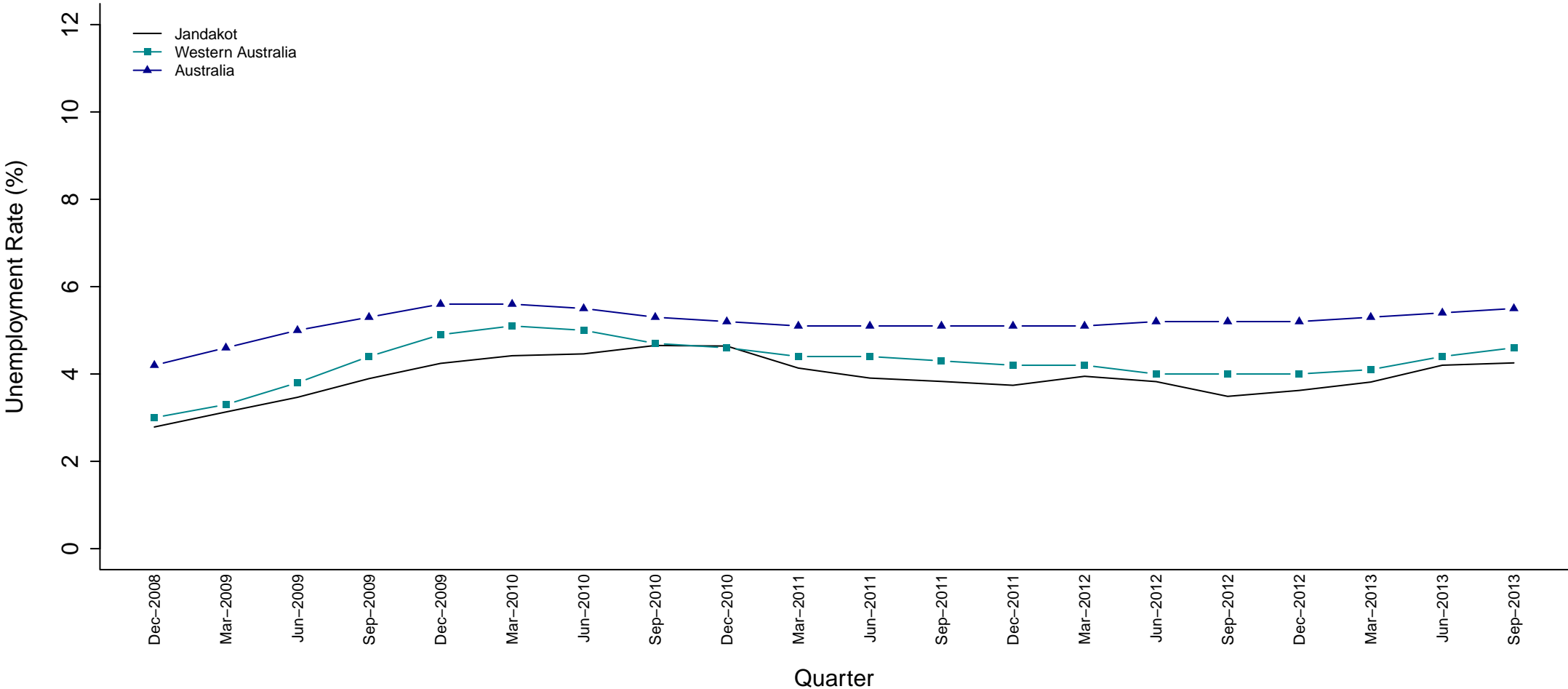

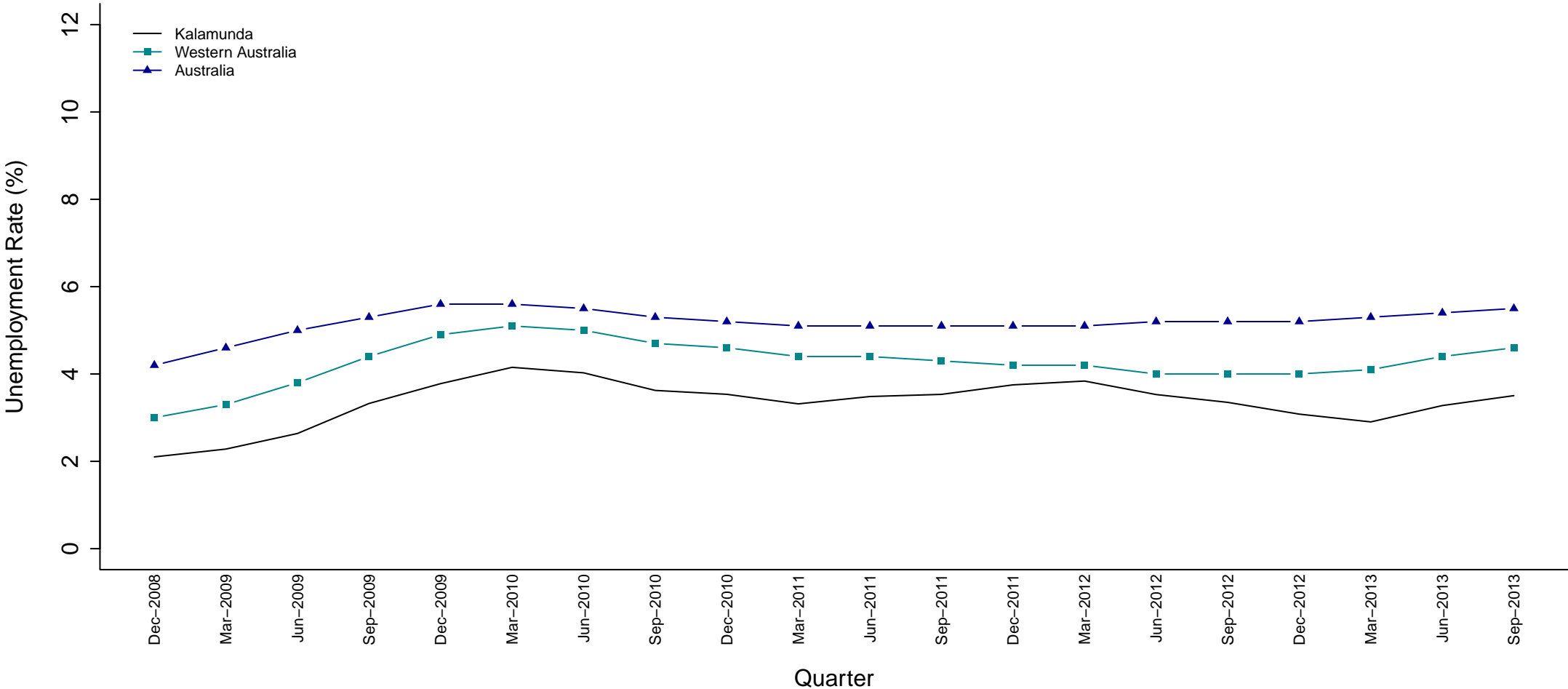

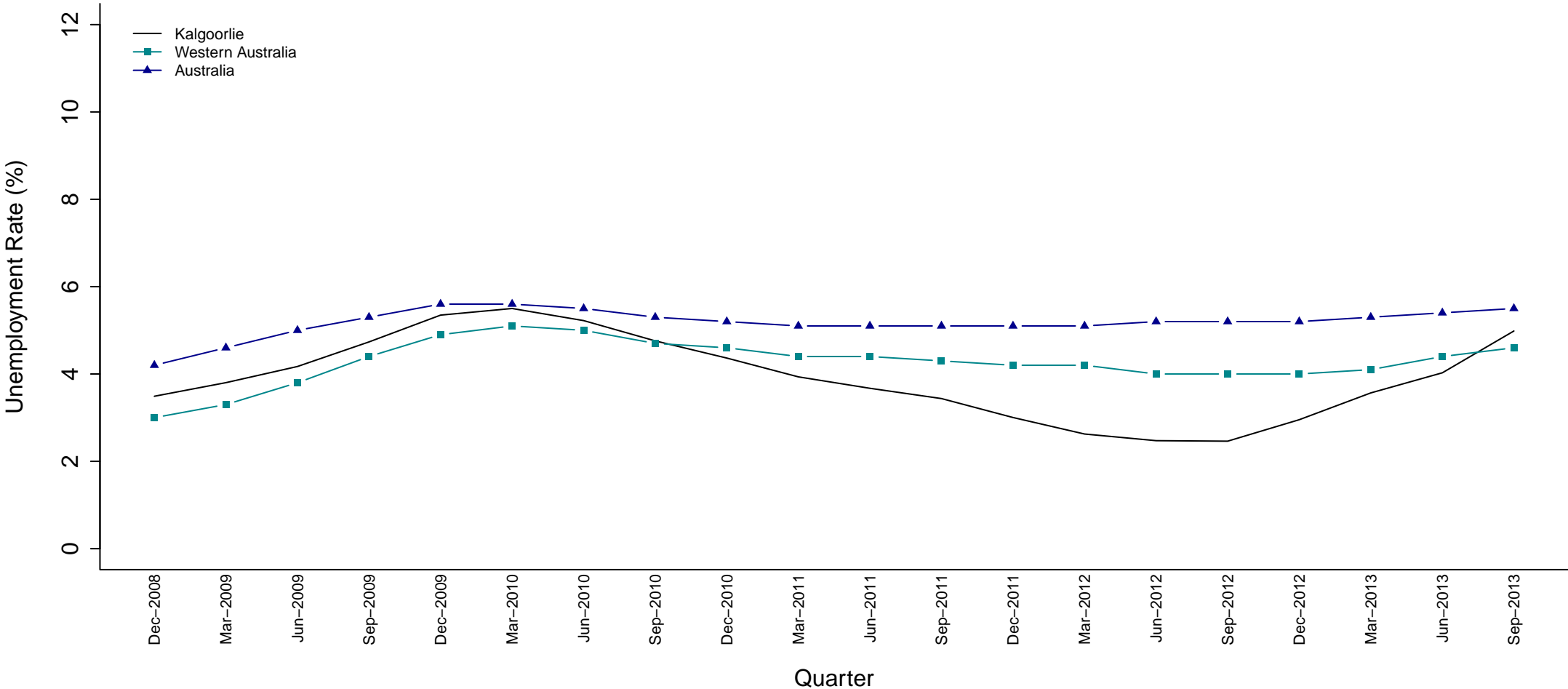

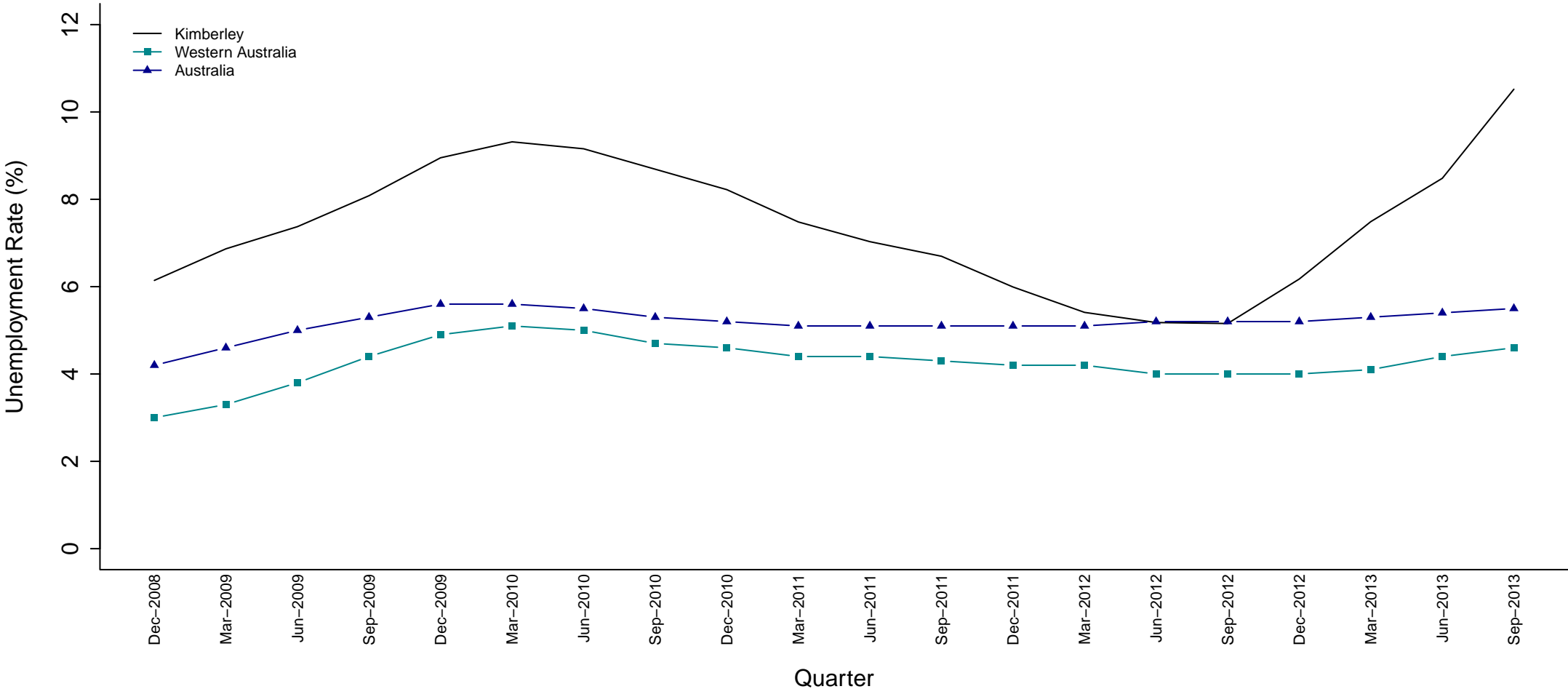

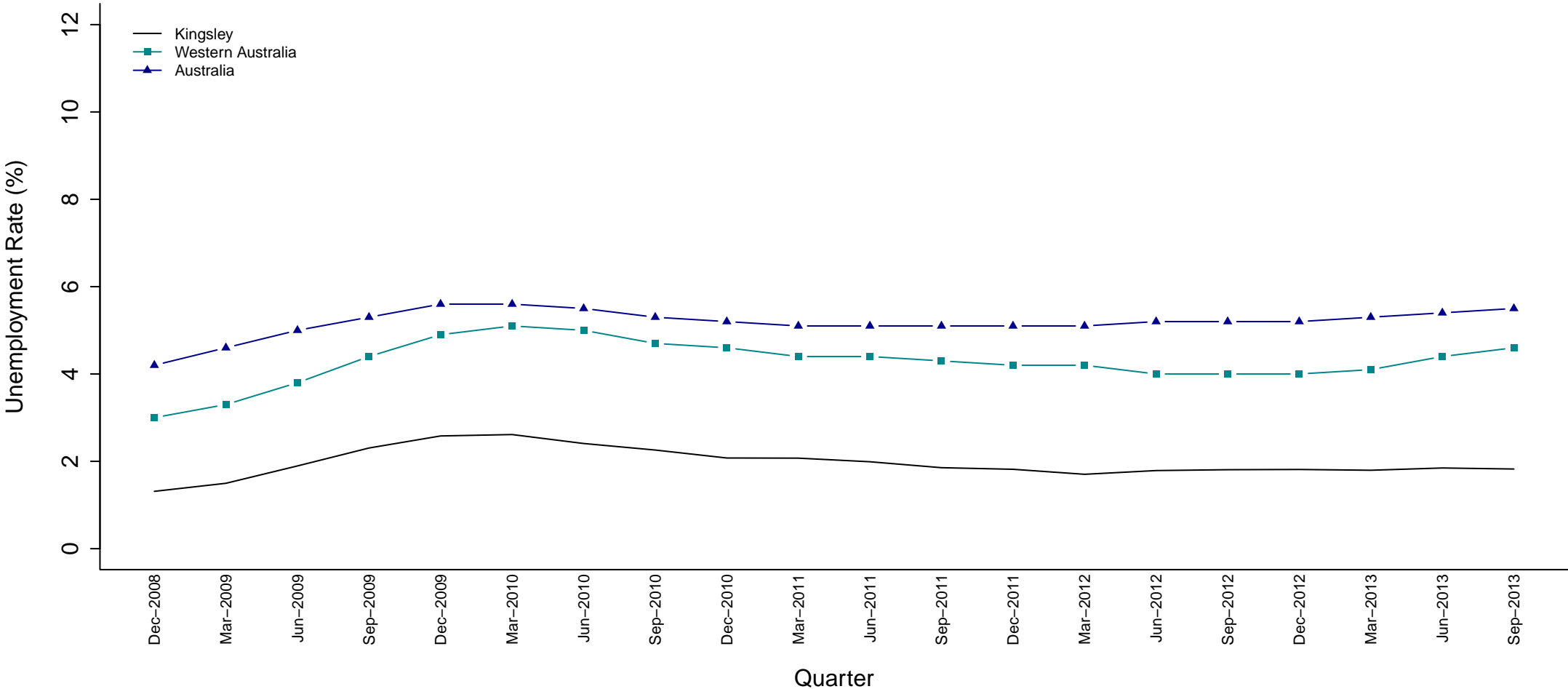

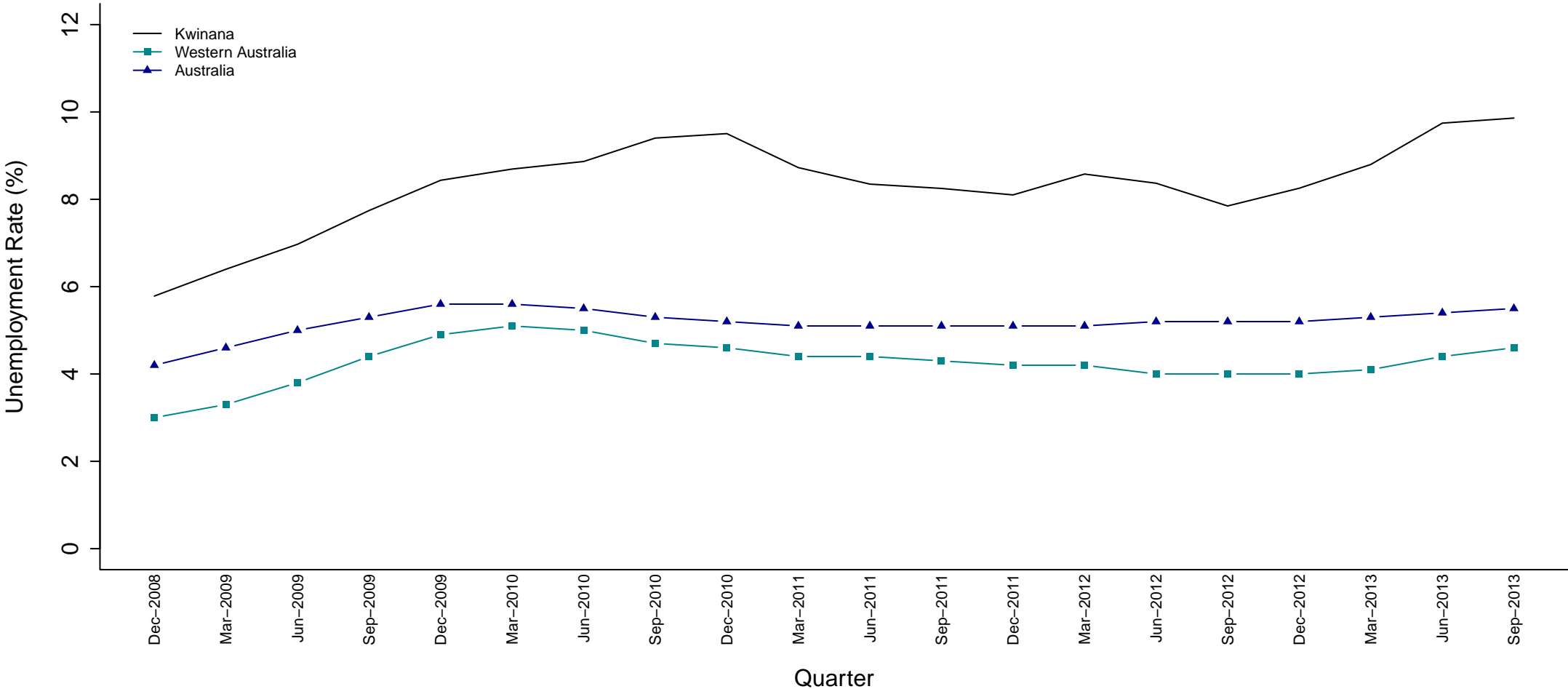

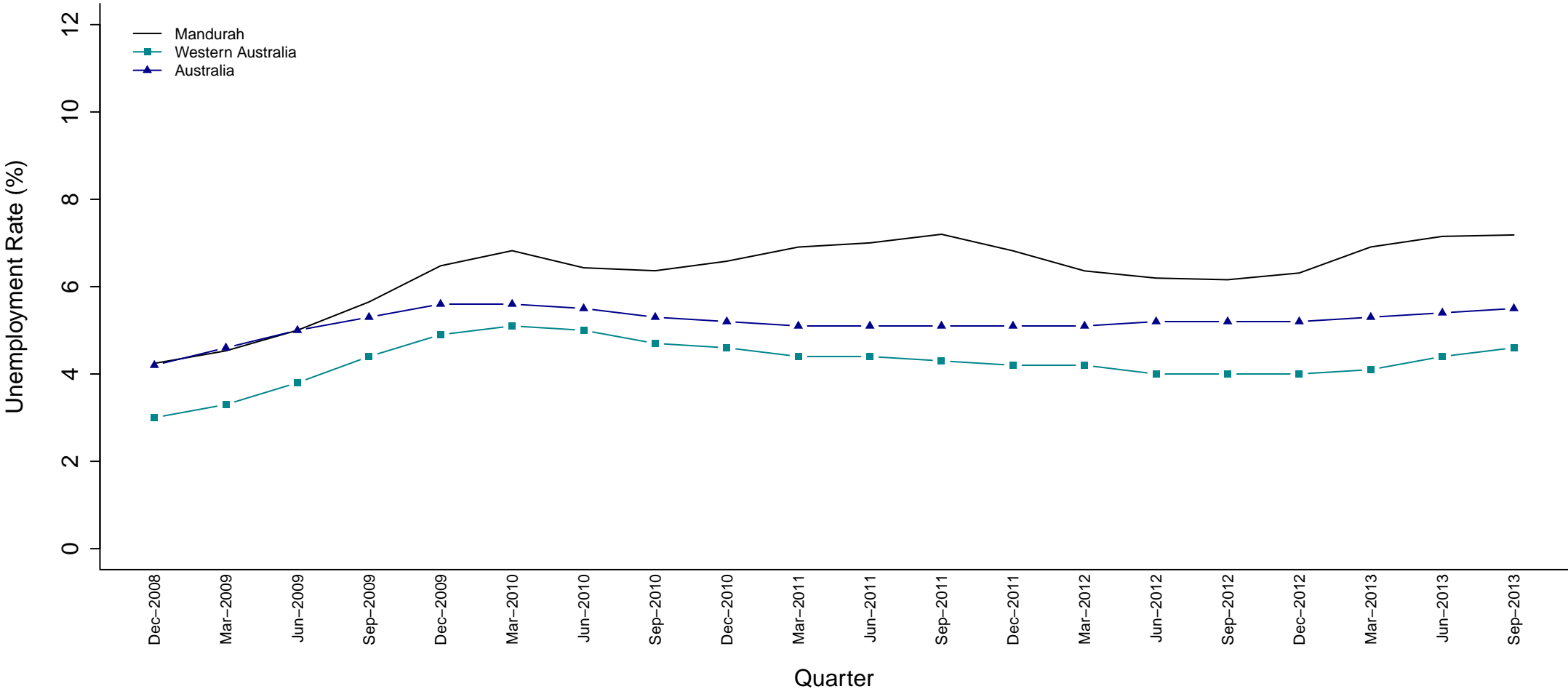

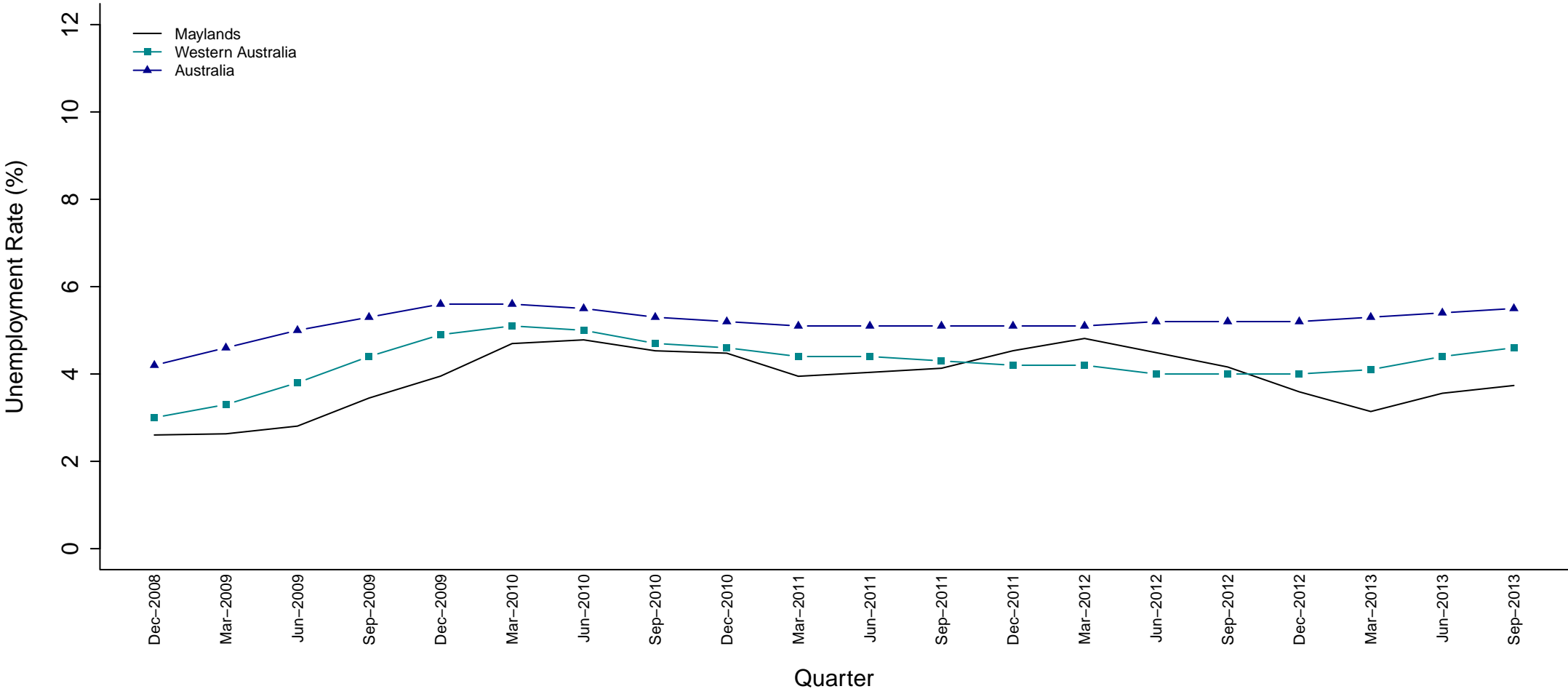

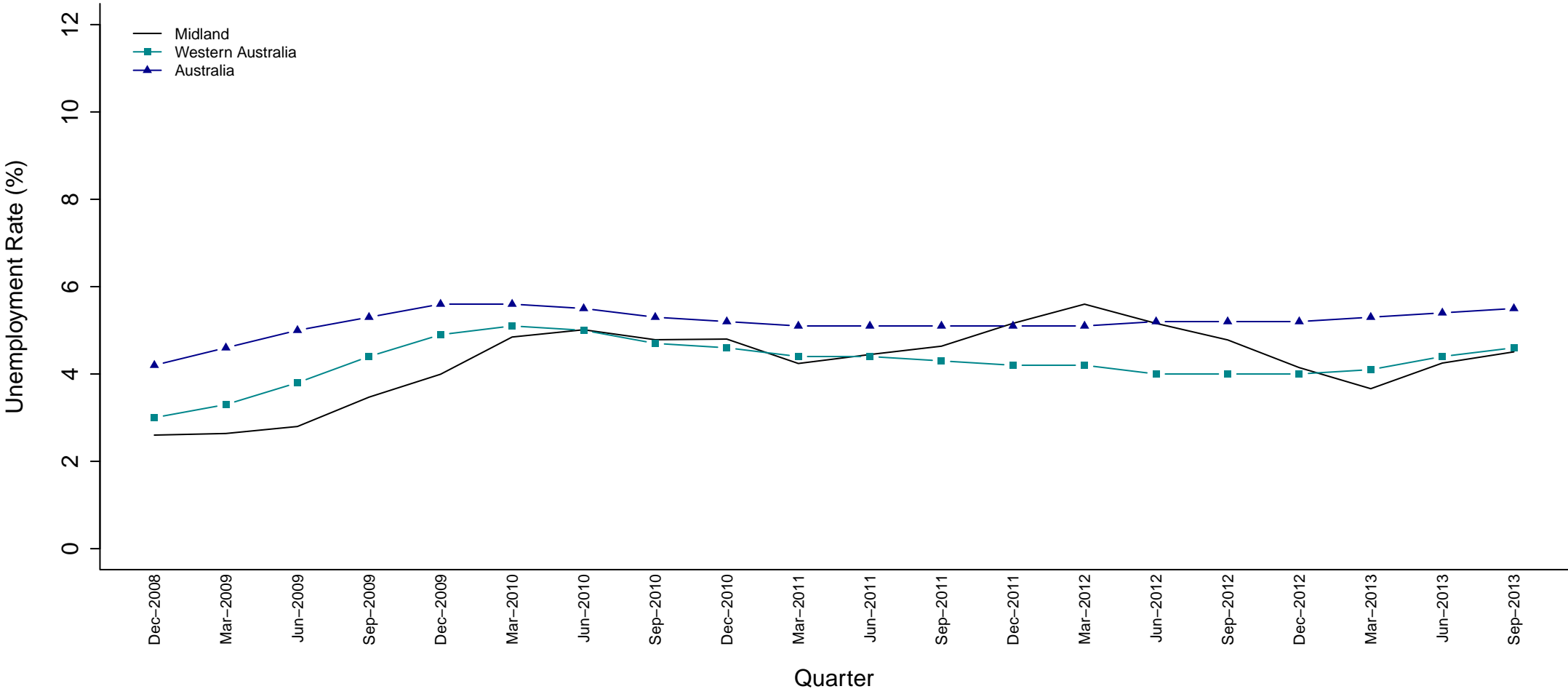

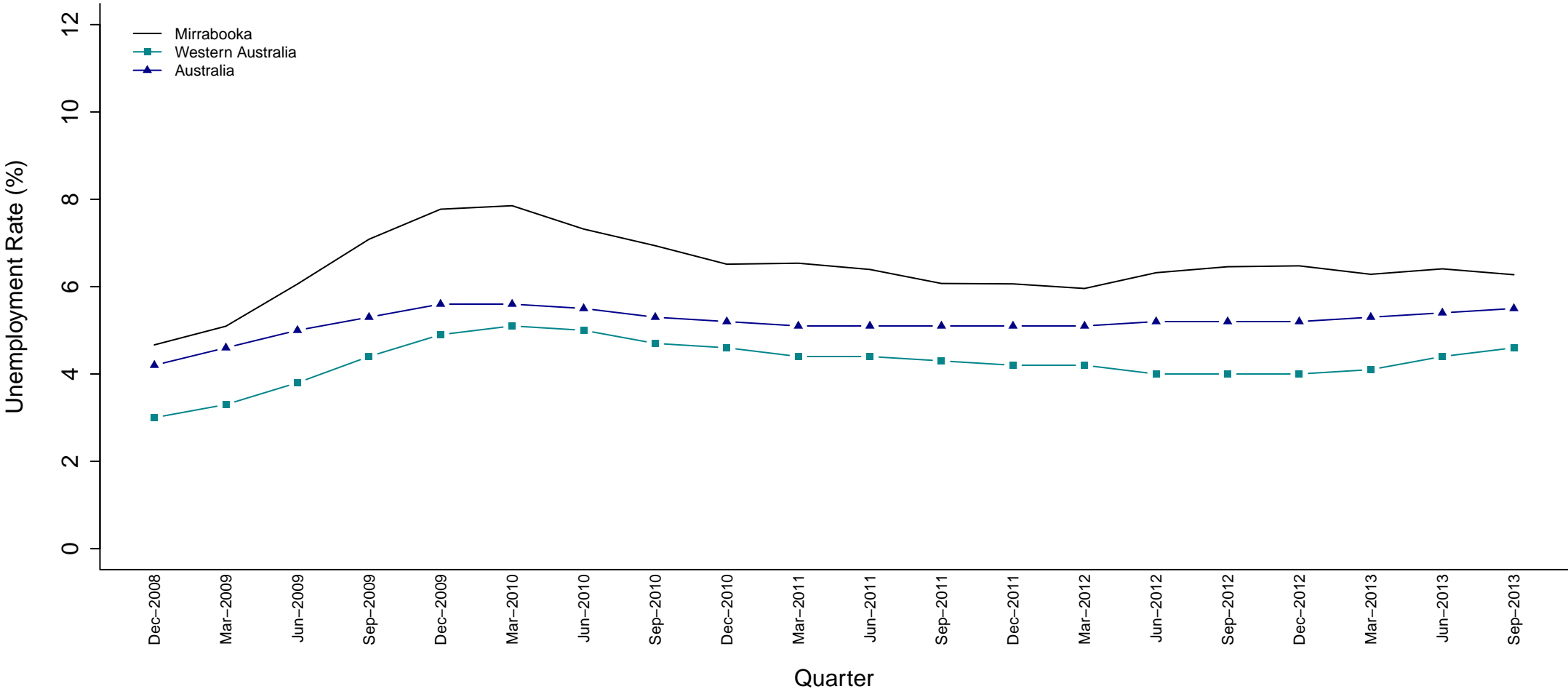

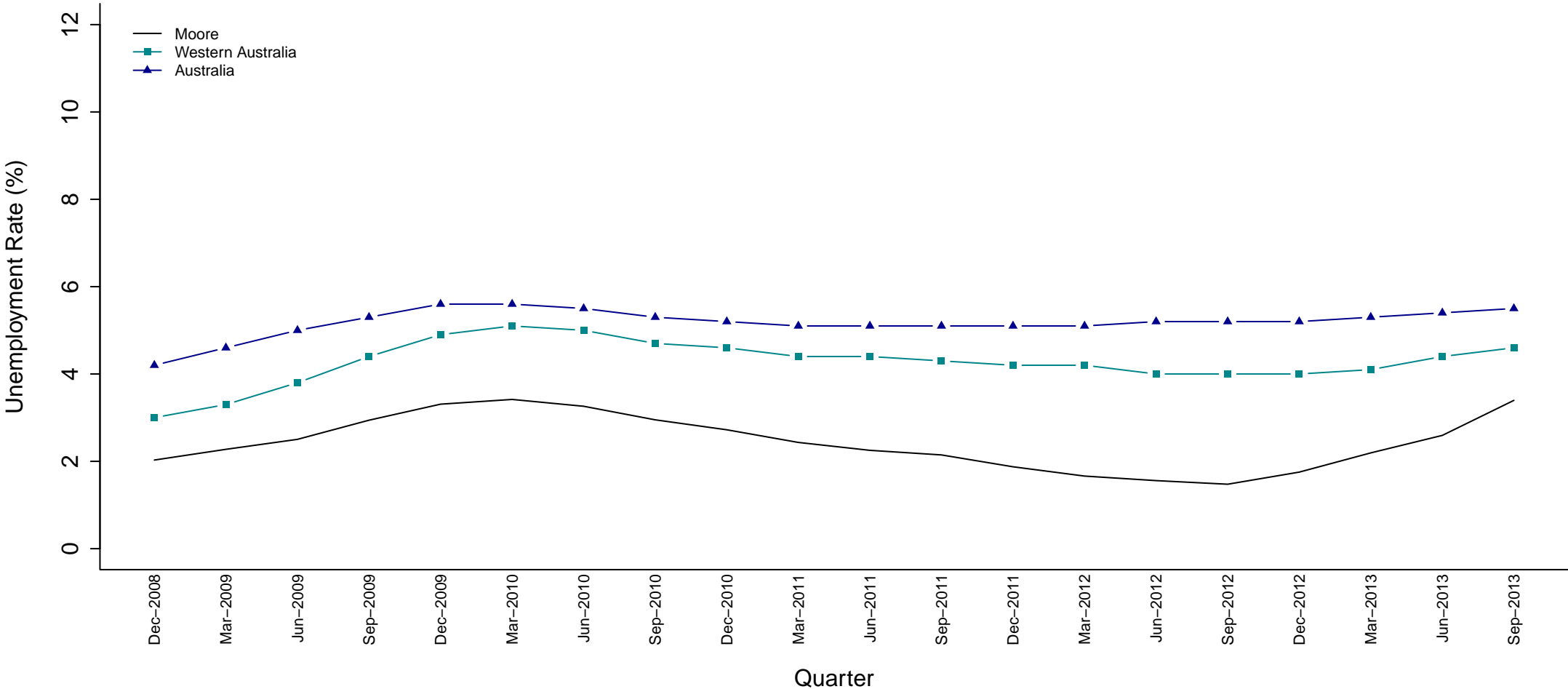

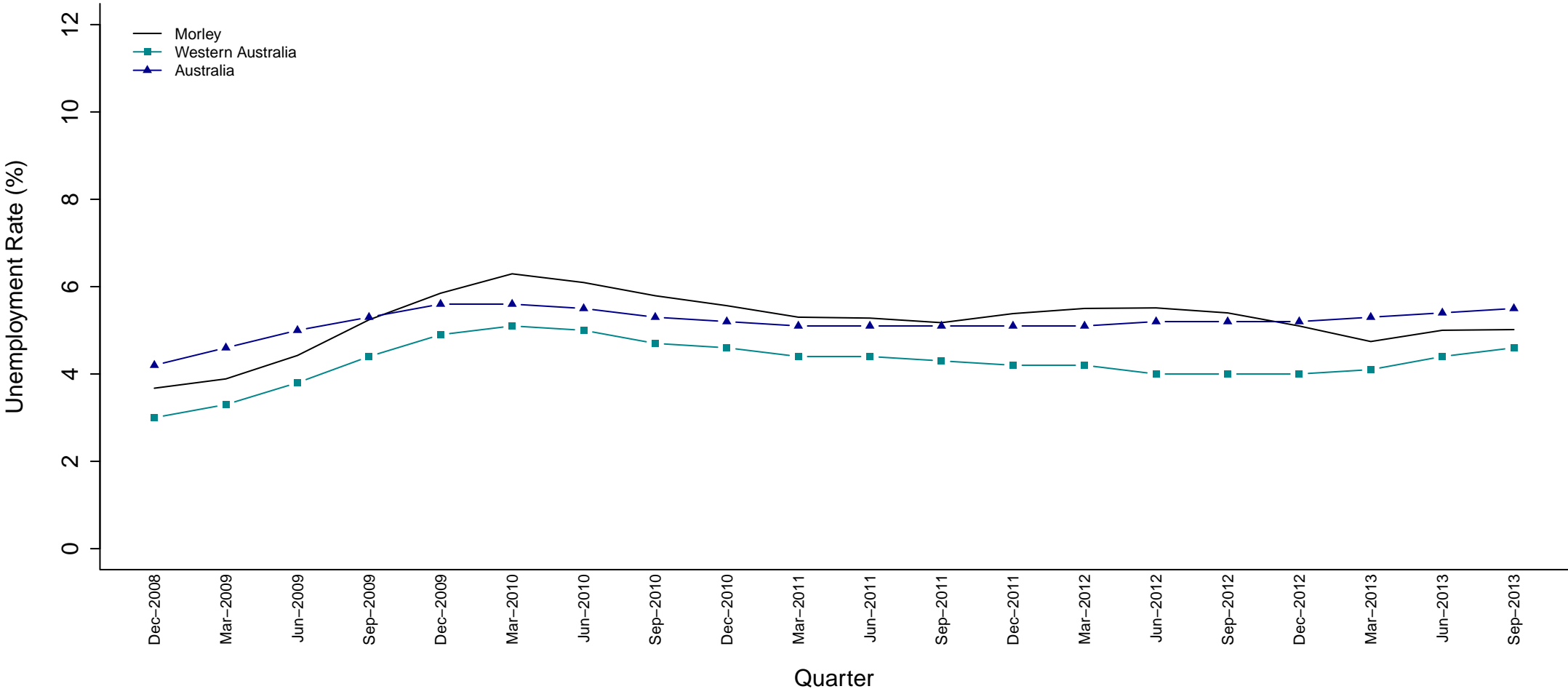

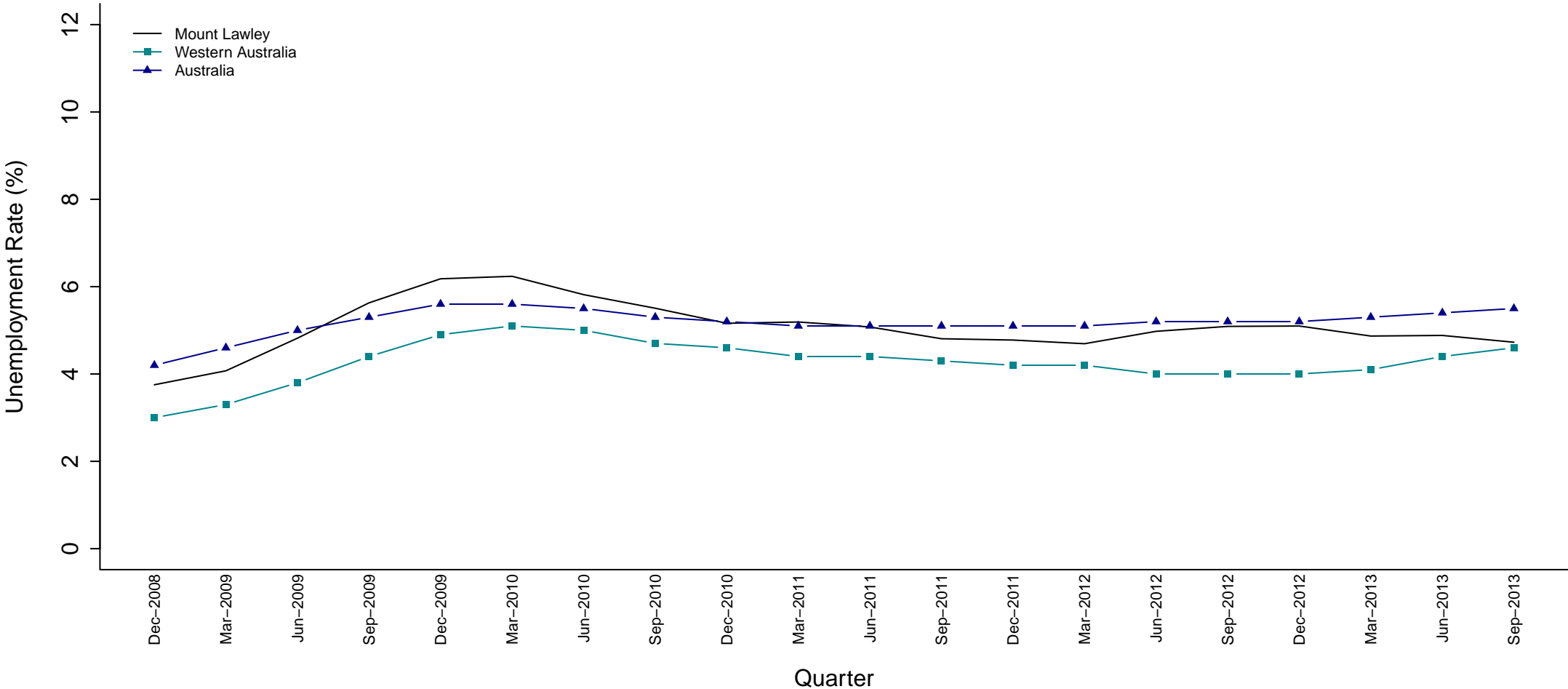

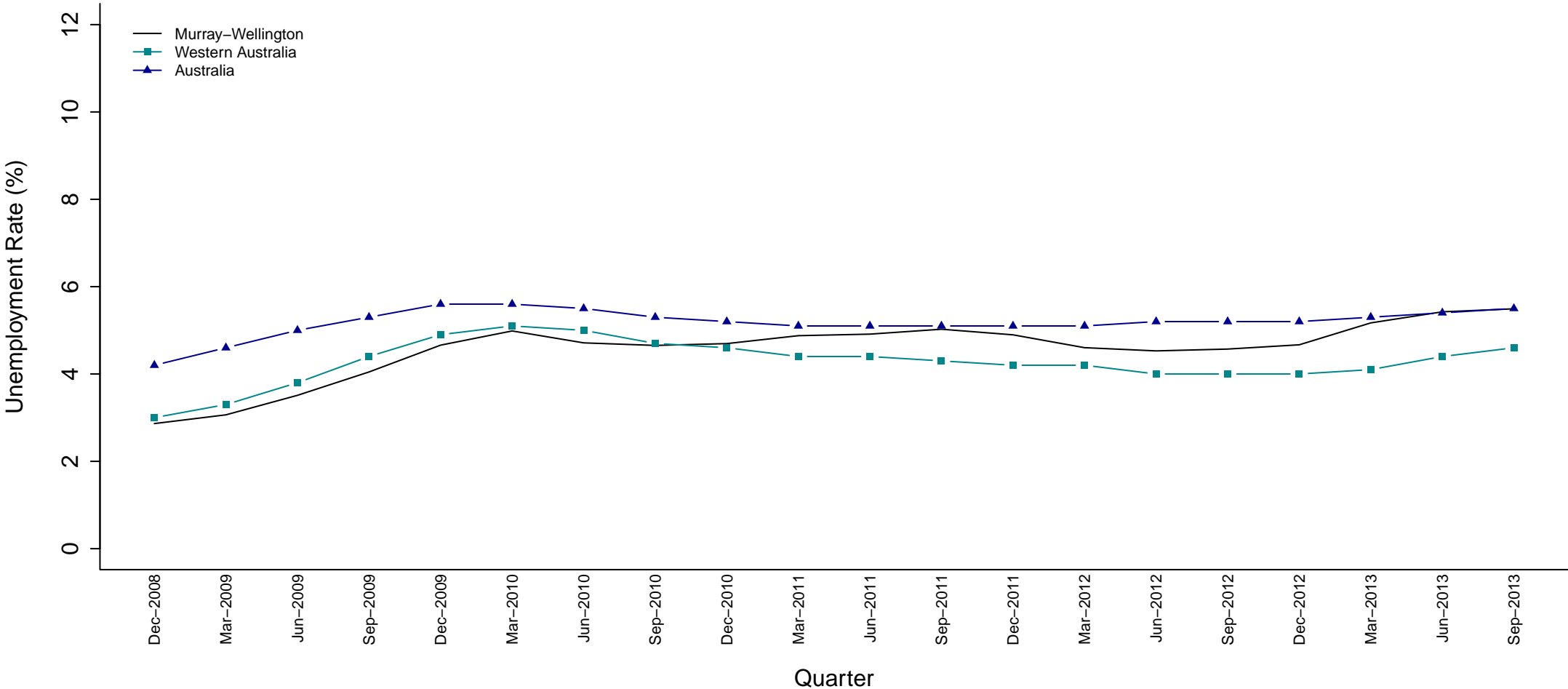

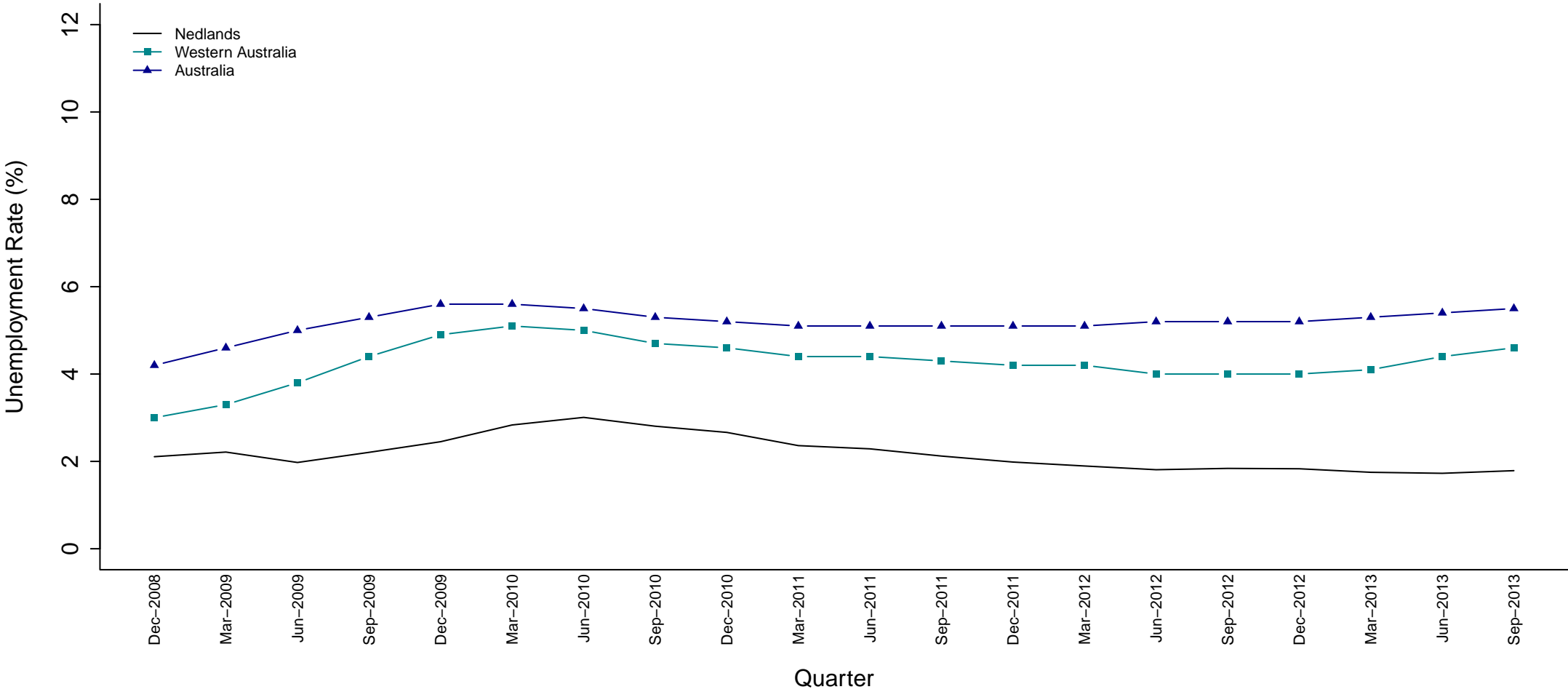

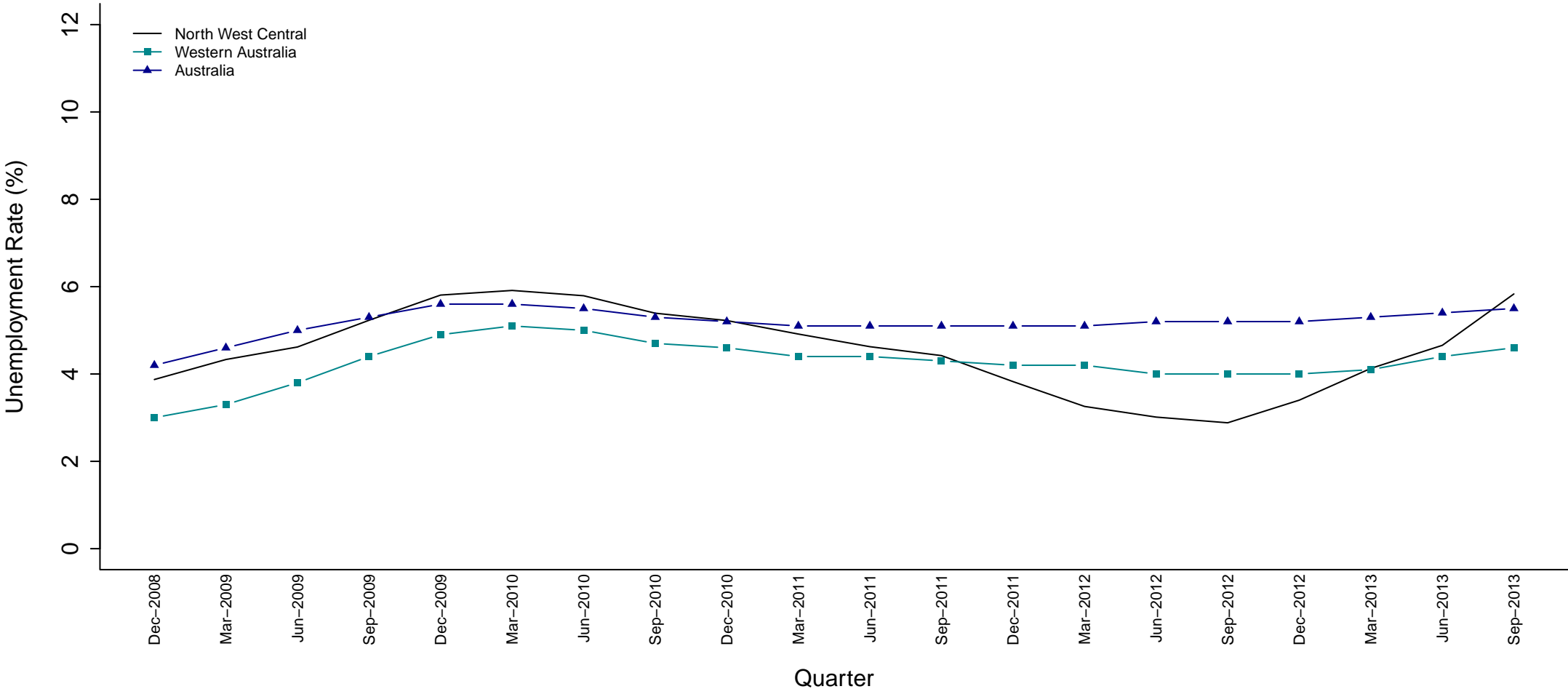

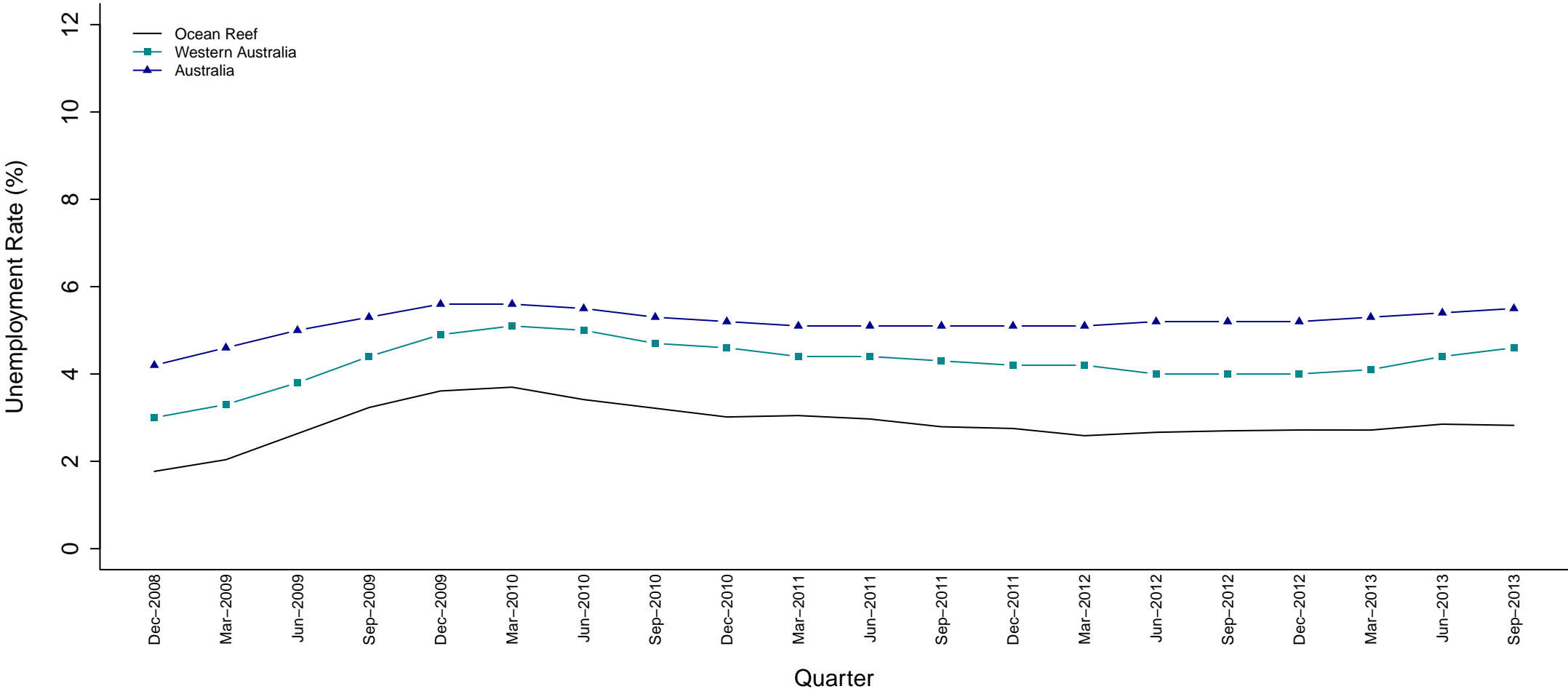

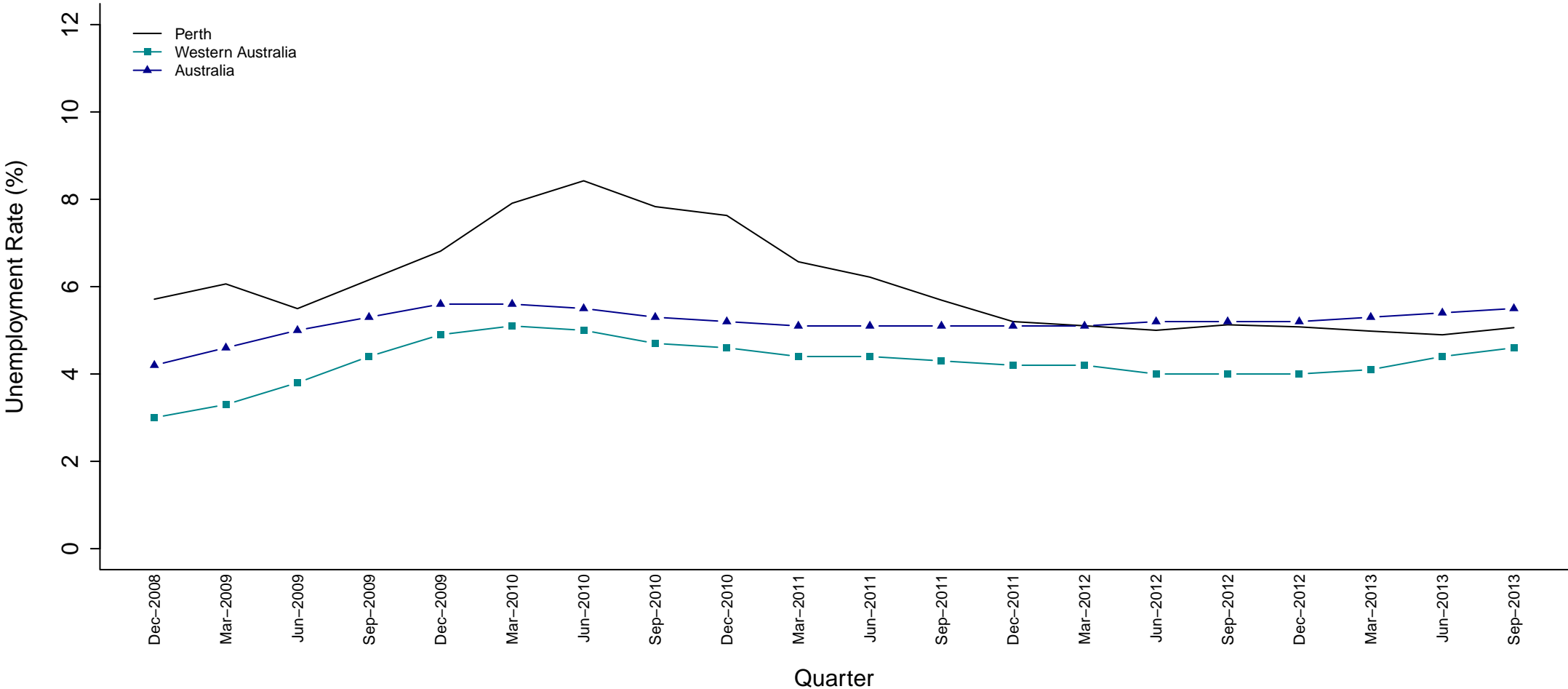

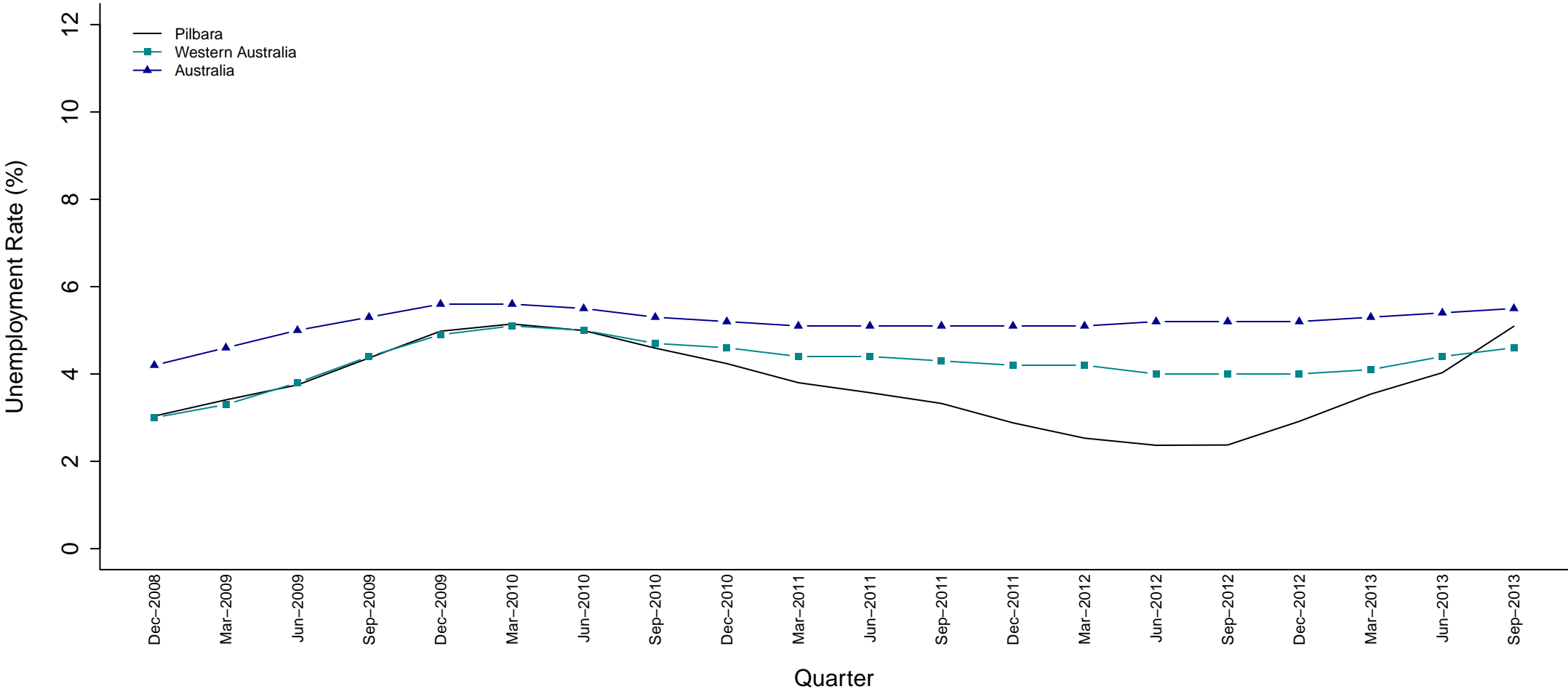

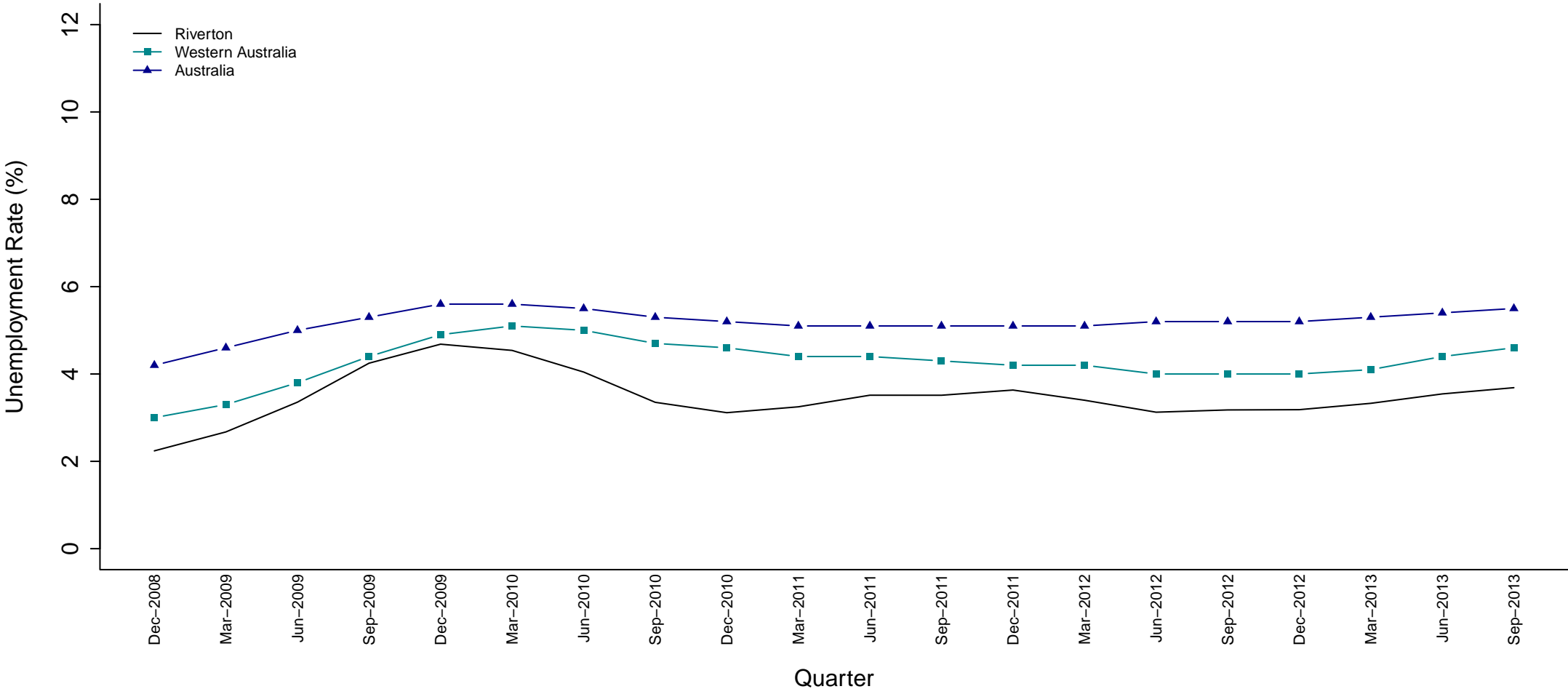

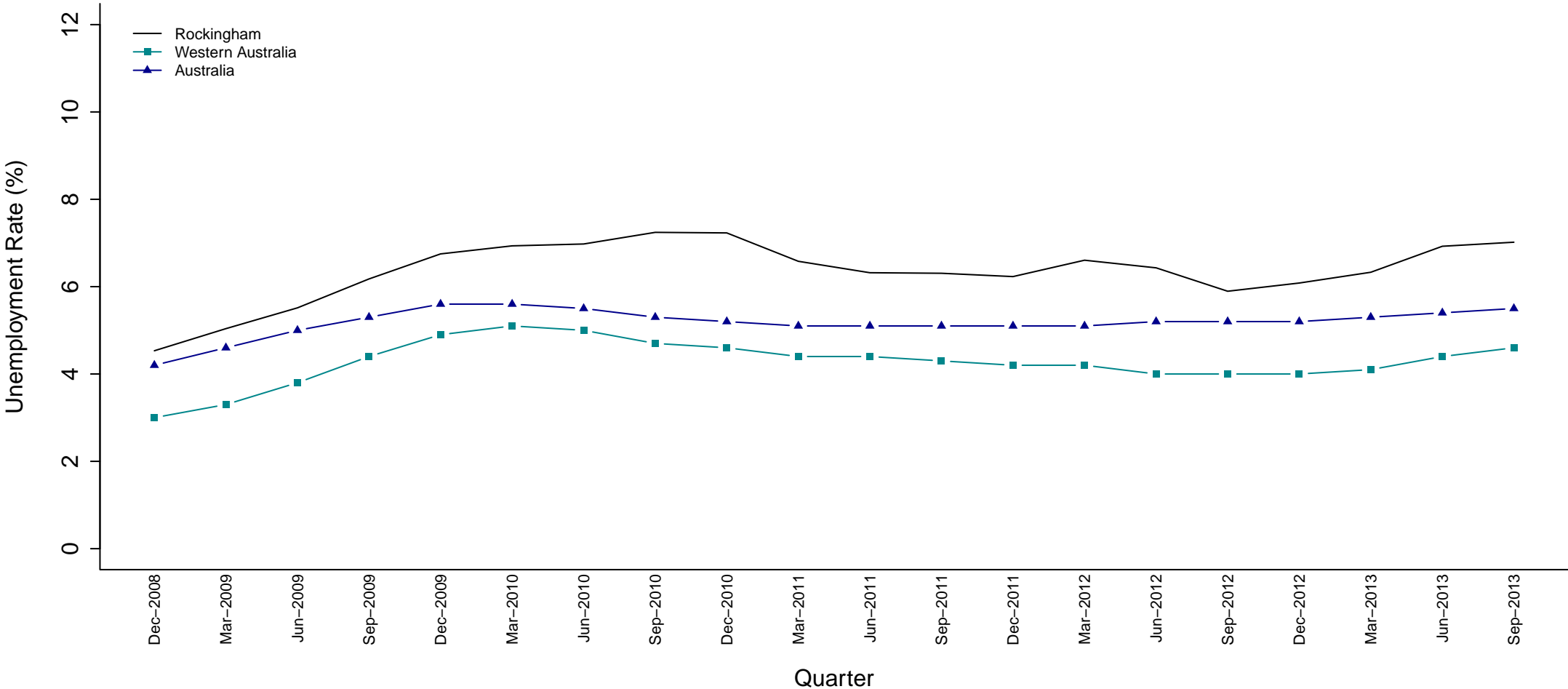

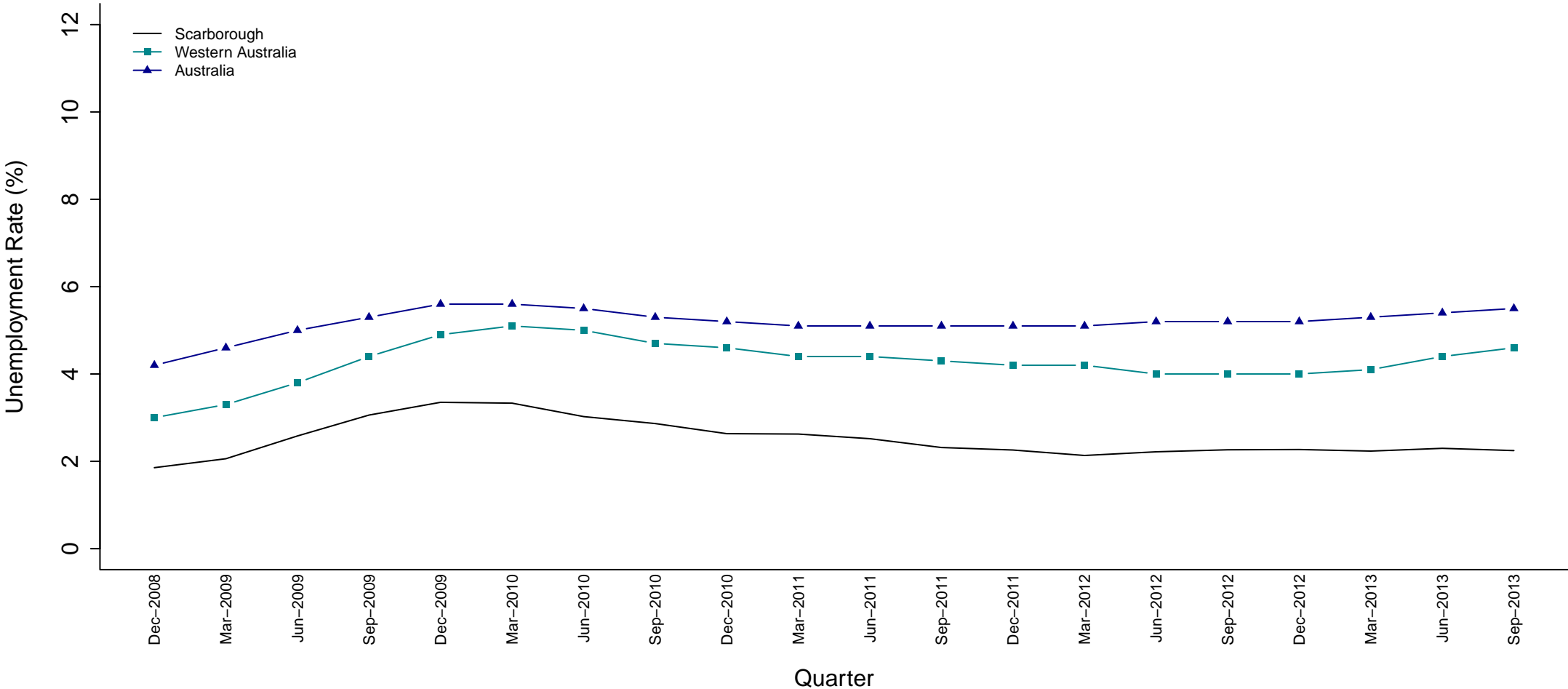

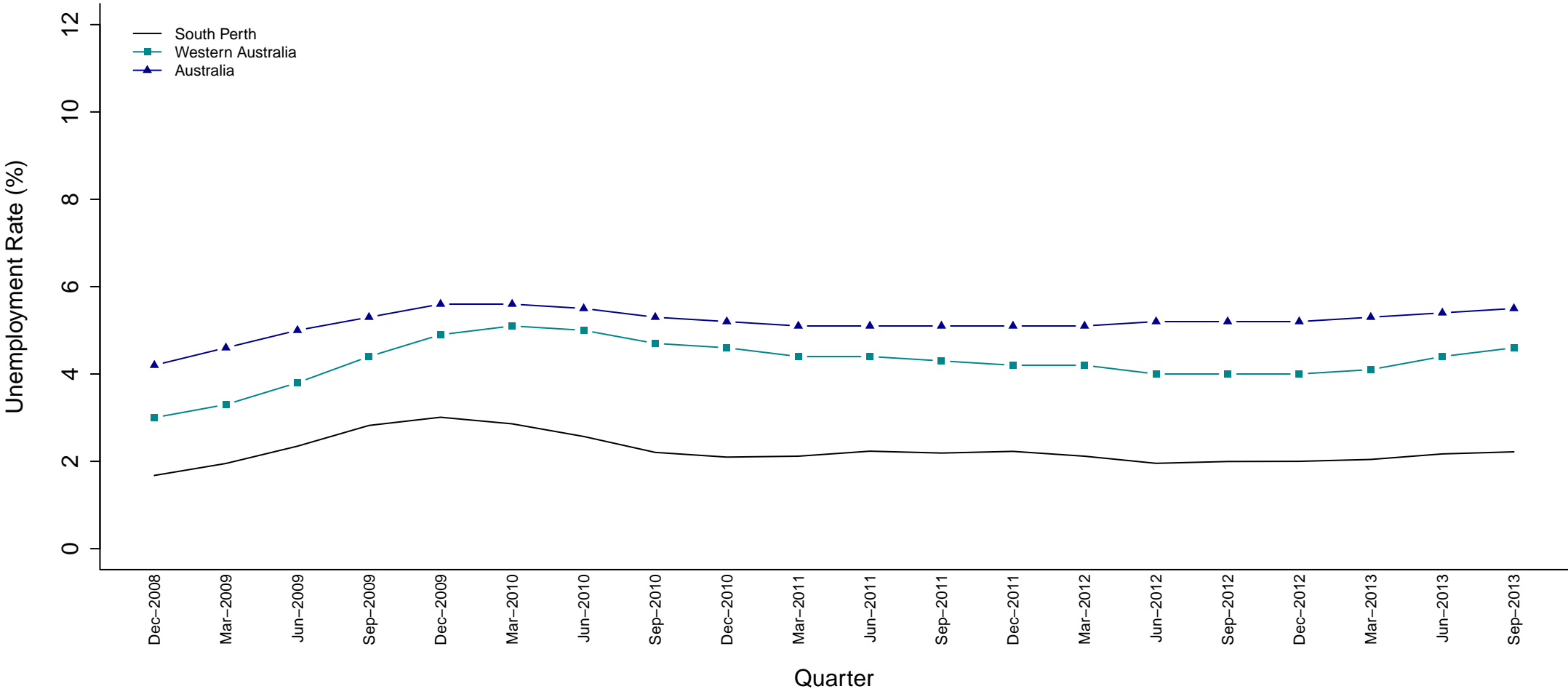

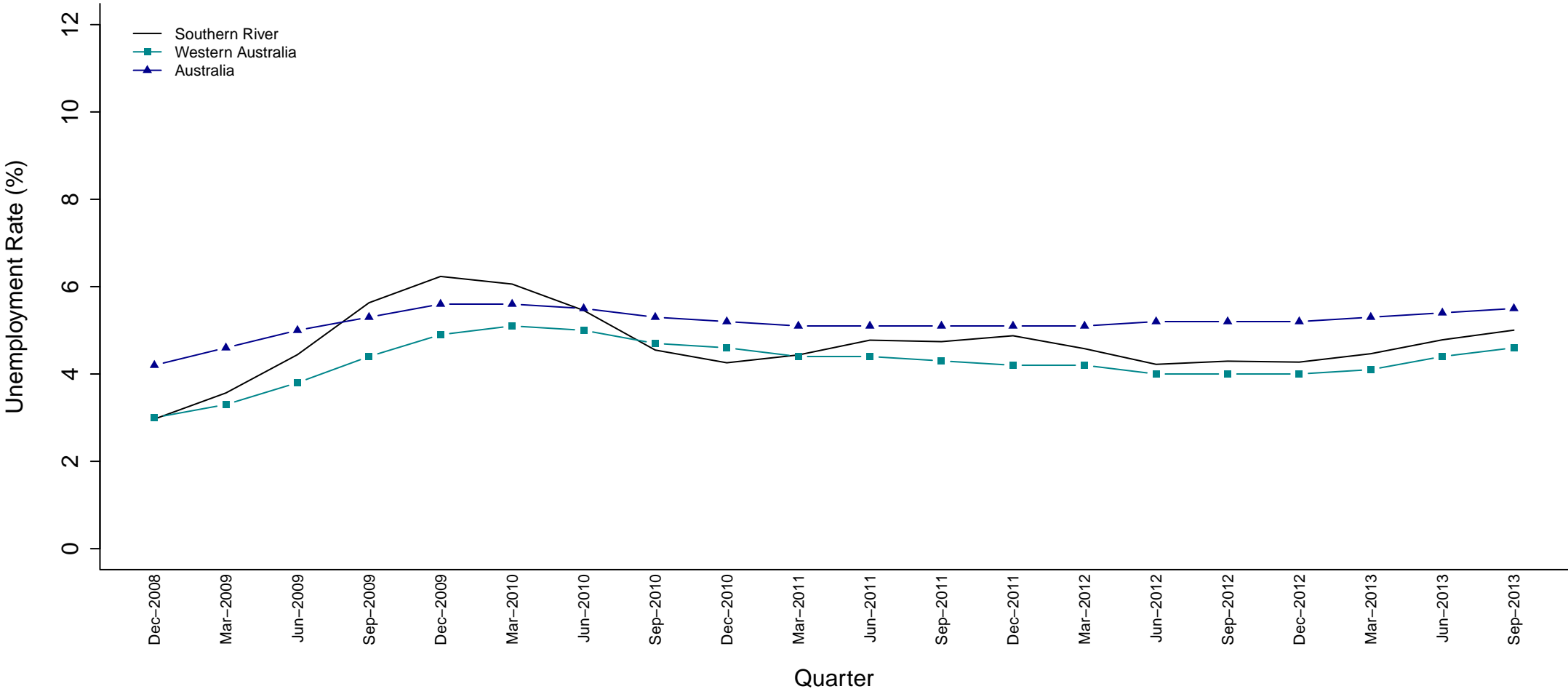

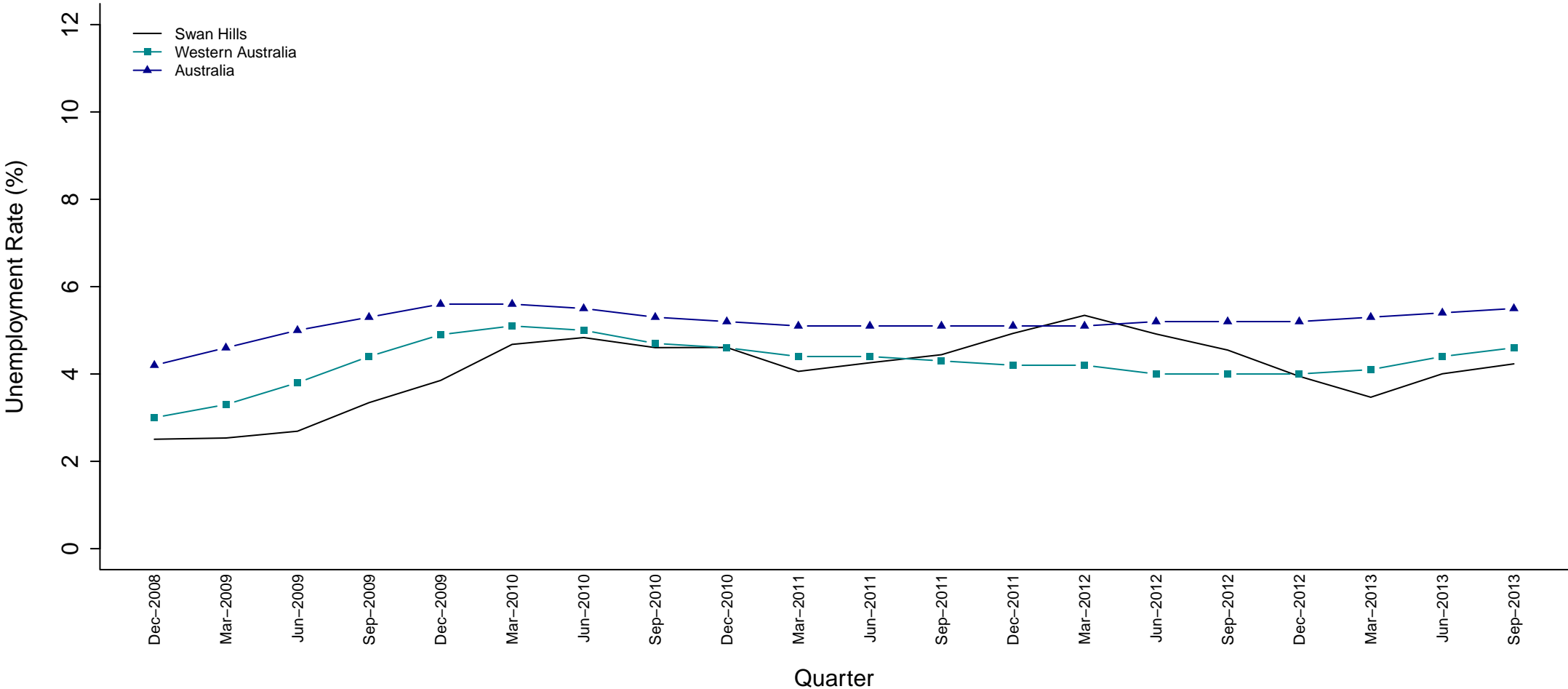

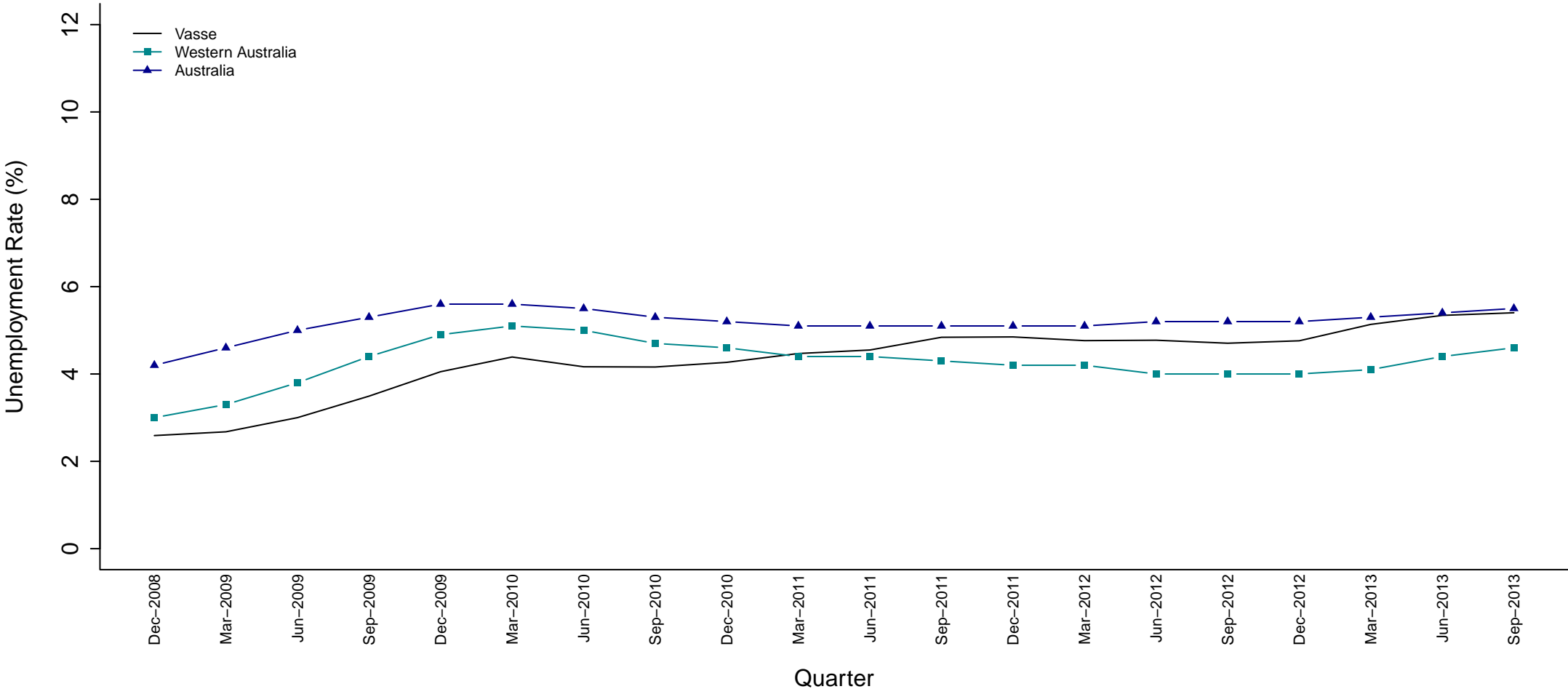

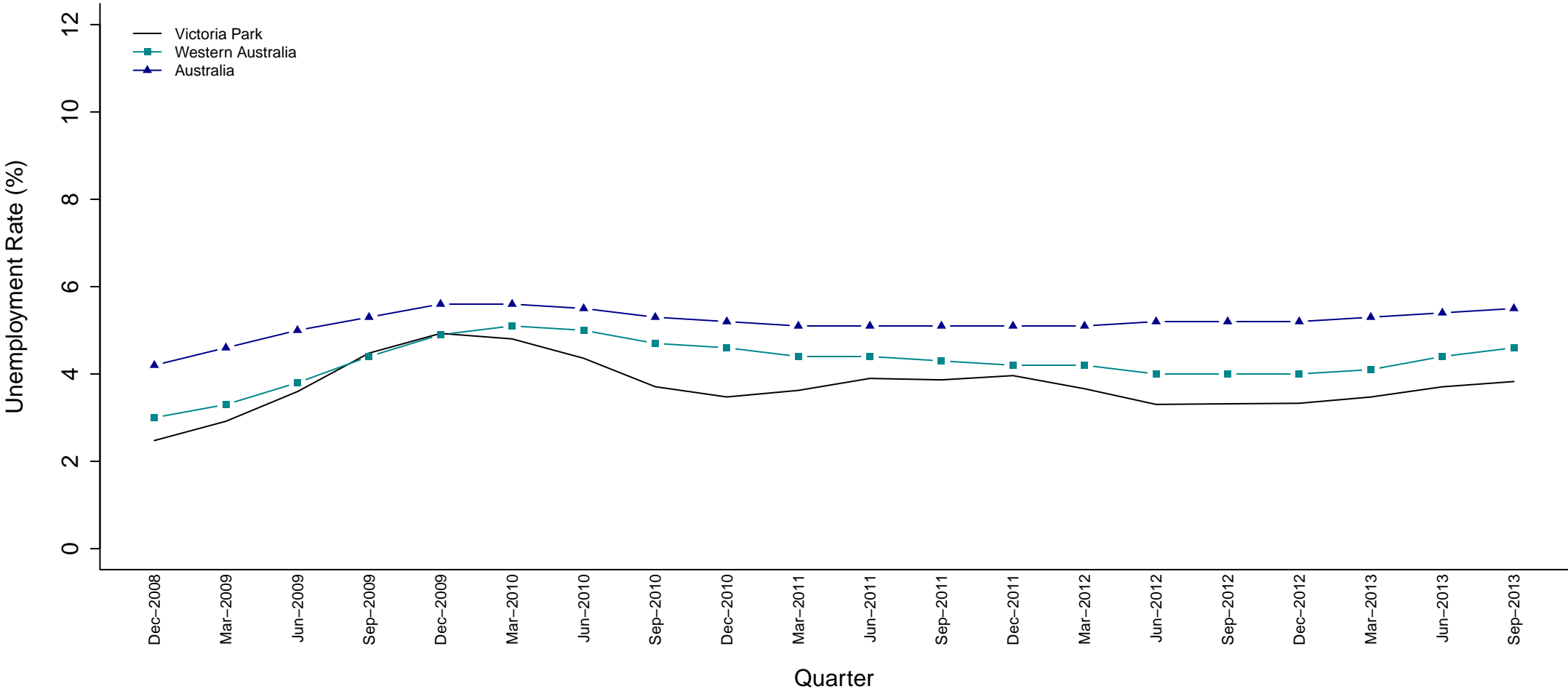

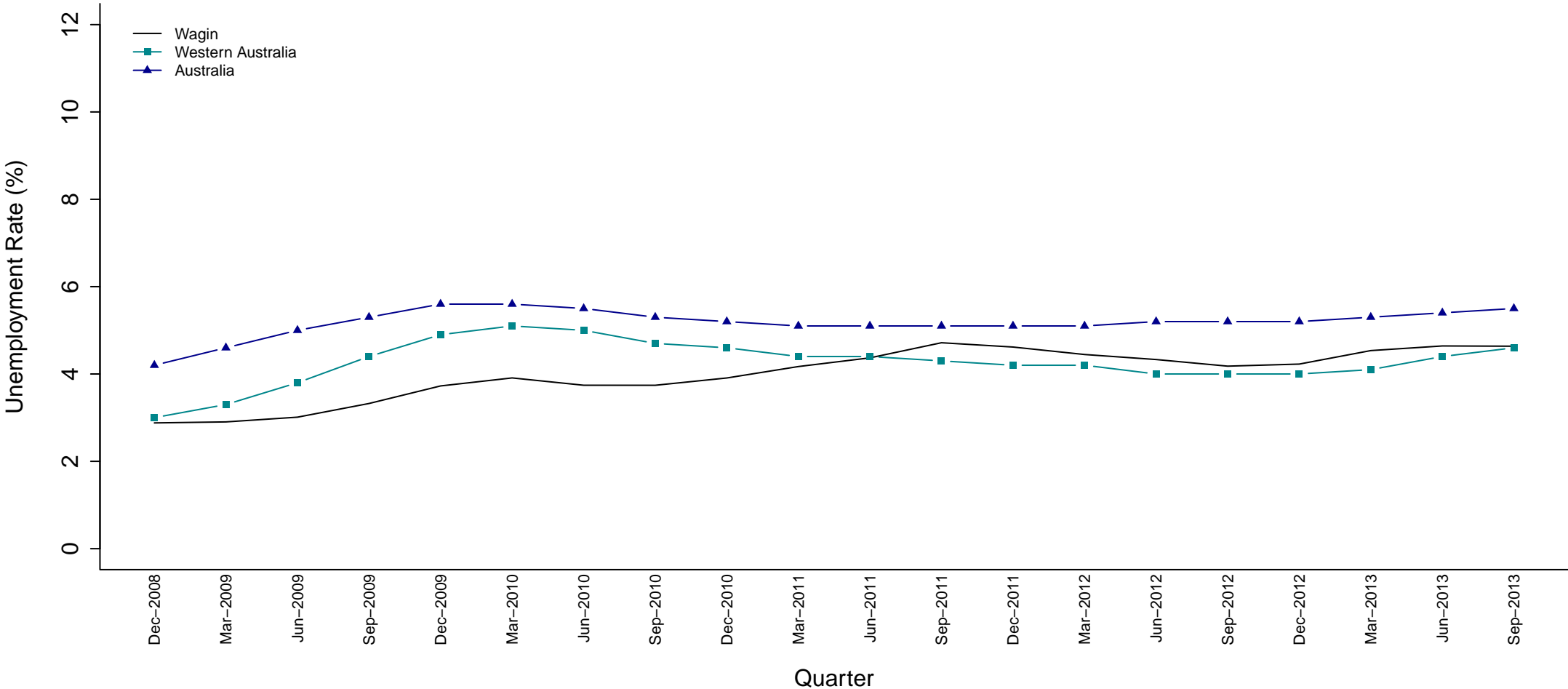

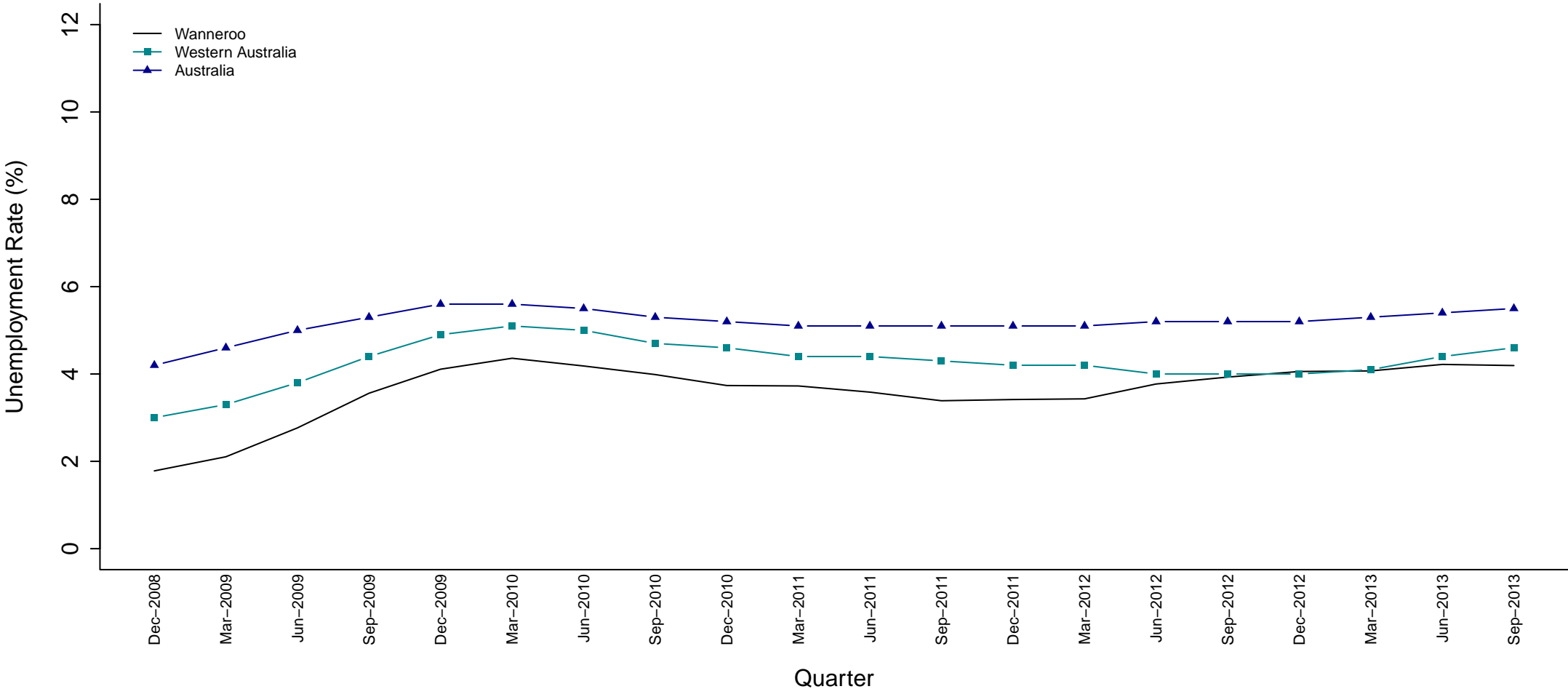

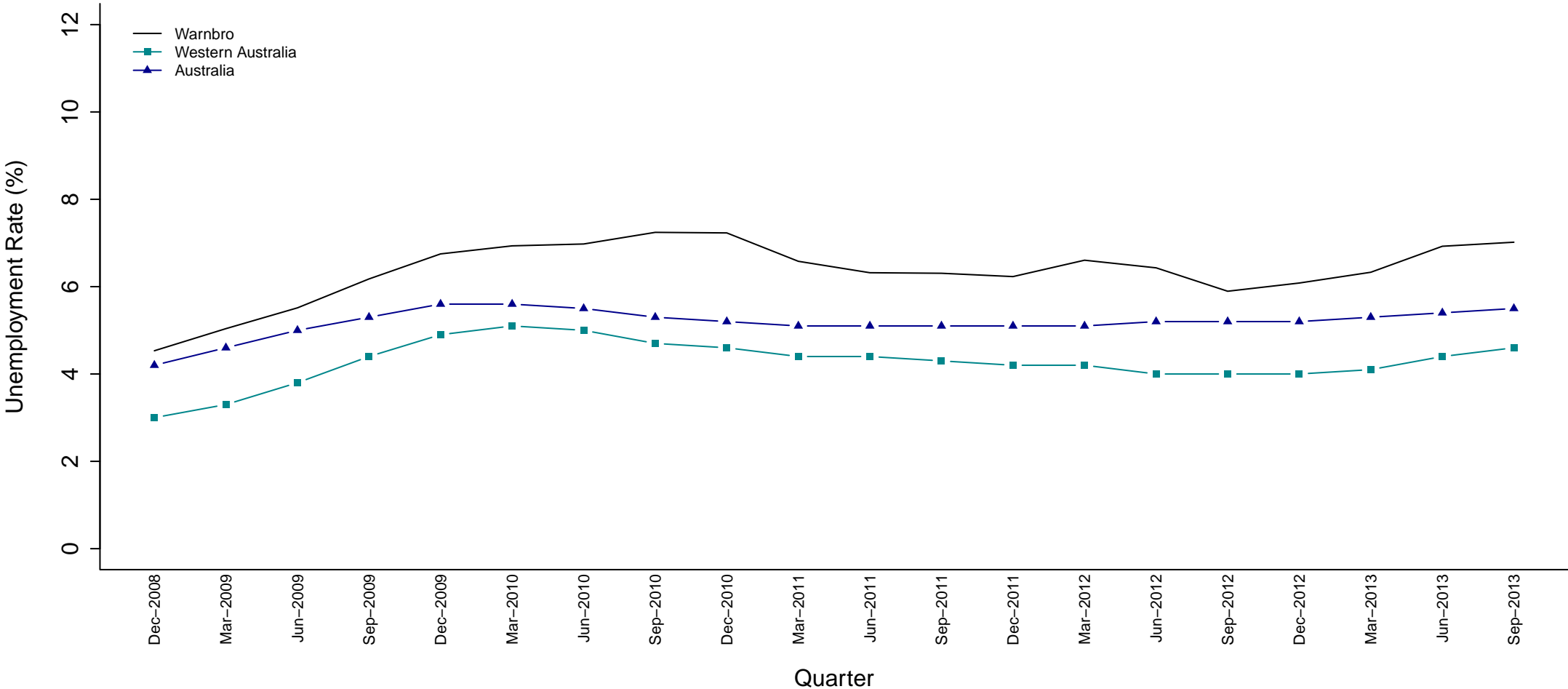

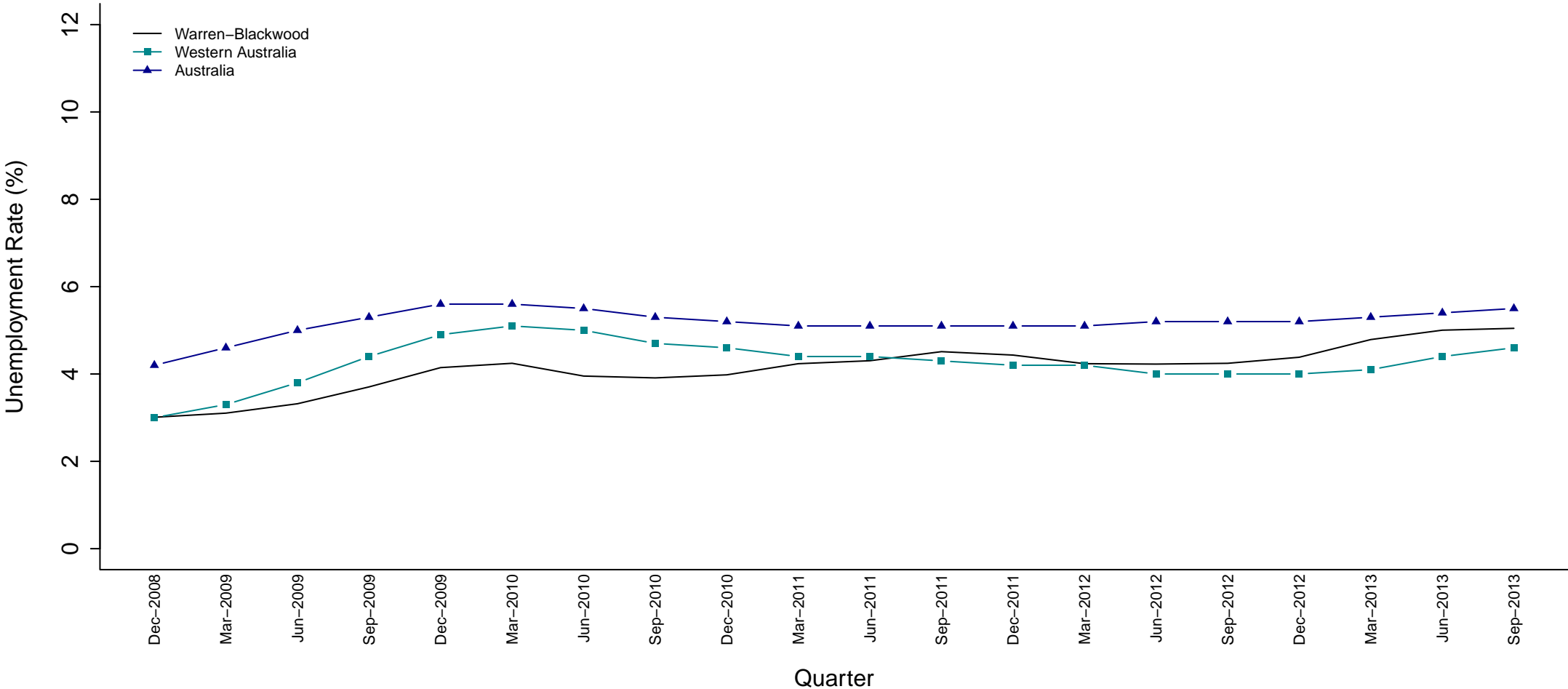

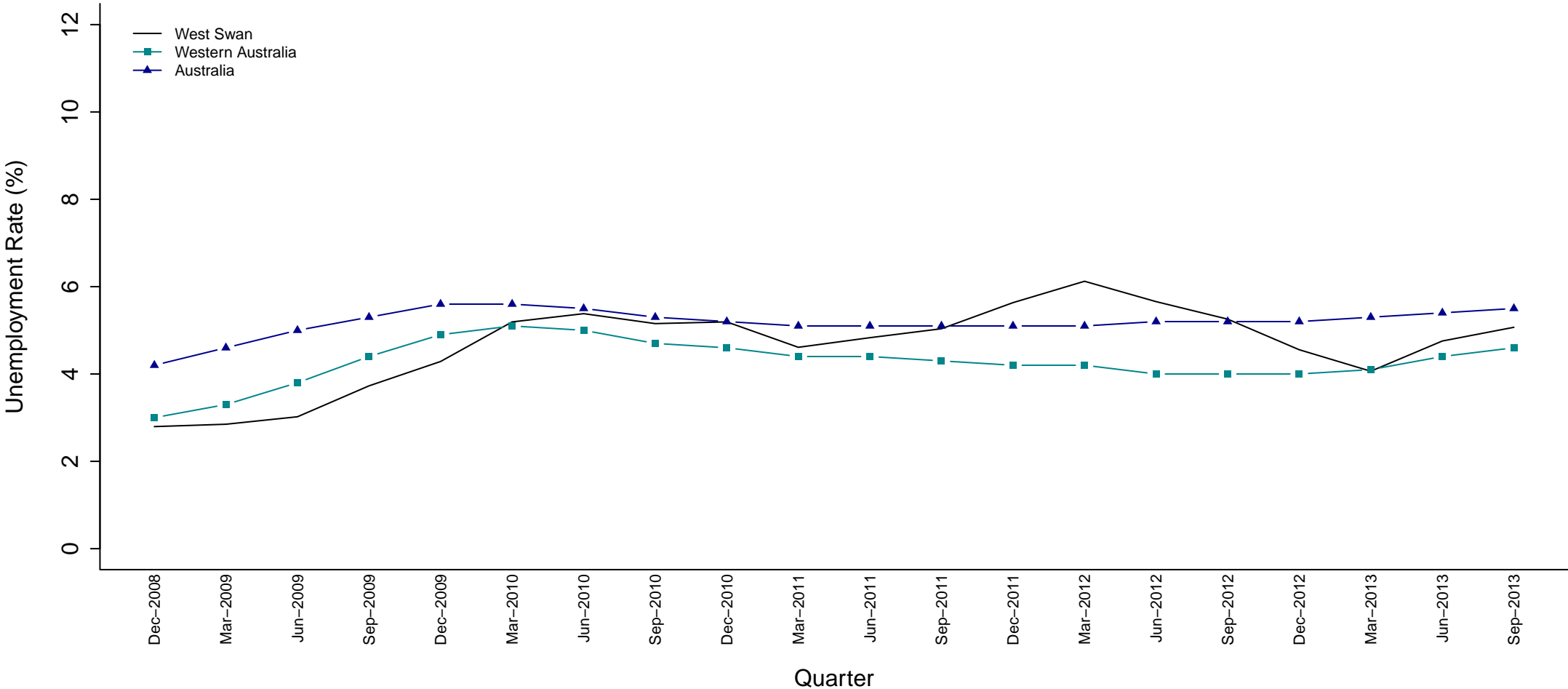

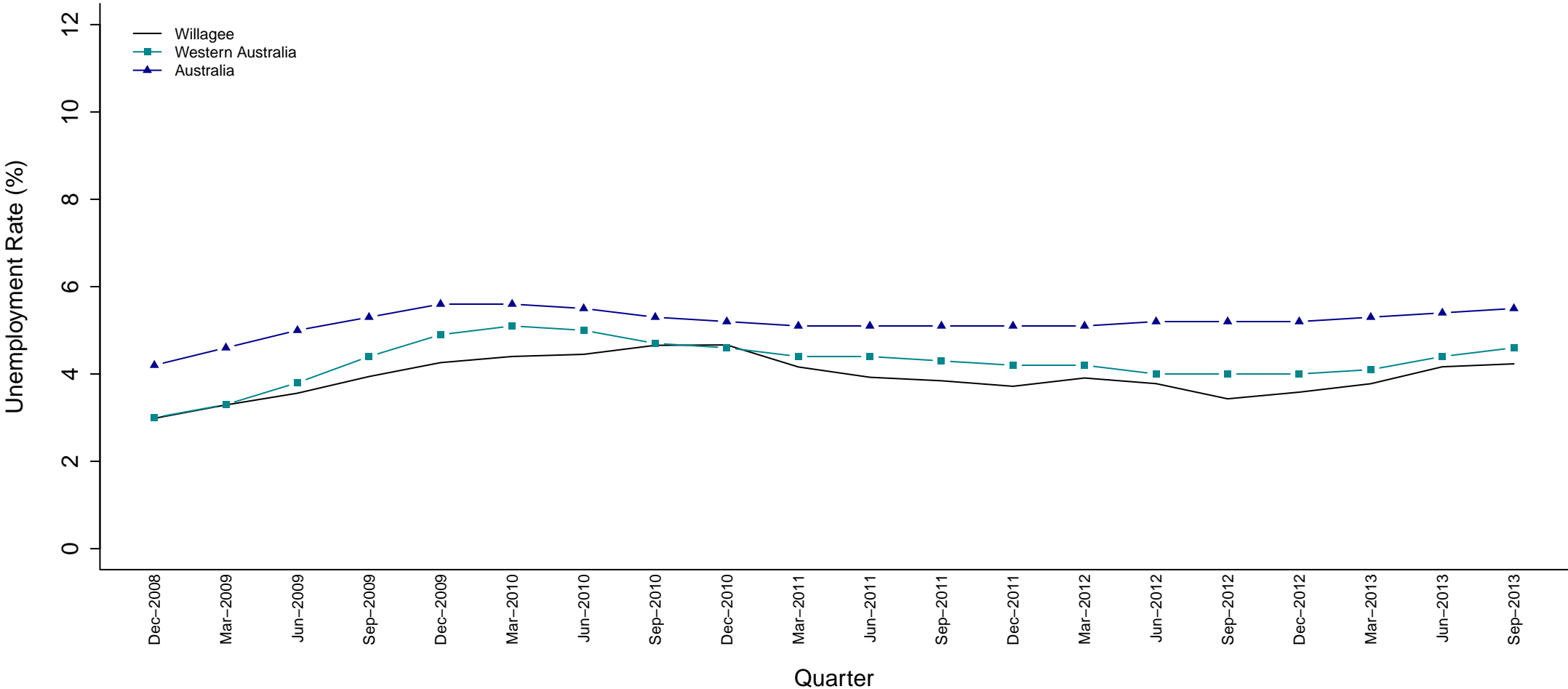
