## Introduction

Each electorate subreport contains estimates of unemployment statistics for that electorate from the March 2011 quarter through to the December 2015 quarter. Data Analysis Australia was contracted to perform this analysis in April 2016.

The analysis in this report is based upon data obtained from the Small Area Labour Markets (SALM) publications that have been produced by the Department of Employment. The Department of Employment estimates have in turn been produced using the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) Labour Force Survey data, Census data and Centrelink data.

Note that these statistics are not comparable to publications prior to February 2015. This is due to changes in the level of reporting of SALM data and underlying methodology in constructing the estimates, as well as backcasting of unemployment figures by the ABS.

## Methodology

Published quarterly, the Department of Employment produces estimates of unemployment and the labour force for approximately 2,100 Statistical Areas Level 2 (SA2s) across Australia. The Department of Employment produces unemployment estimates by taking the level of unemployment, which has been published by the ABS for a region, and apportioning it across each of the SA2s that fall within that region. This apportioning is in accordance with the distribution of Centrelink, Newstart and Youth Allowance (Other) beneficiaries. Labour force estimates are produced by allocating the total labour force to an SA2 according to a labour force weighting. This labour force weighting is calculated by taking the 2011 Census labour force participation rate of each SA2 and applying the latest available ABS estimated residential population (ERP) data. SALM estimates are smoothed using a four-quarter average in order to minimise the variability that is inherent in small area data.

Using the SALM data, it is possible to construct estimates of unemployment statistics for each of the state electoral divisions (SED) in Western Australia. The estimates are based on the WA State Electoral Boundaries that came into effect as of the state election on 9 March 2013. To construct estimates for each of the electorates it is first necessary to allocate SA2s to SEDs. Some SA2s fall wholly within an electorate, others do not. When an SA2 overlaps two or more electorates, the unemployment and labour force estimates for that SA2 have to be apportioned between electorates. From the 2011 Census of Population and Housing it is known how the total labour force of overlapping SA2s is distributed between electorates and this proportion is used to distribute unemployment and labour force totals. Furthermore, the data is aggregated for SA2s and part SA2s within electorates and an overall unemployment rate for each electorate is calculated. A copy of the concordance used is available upon request.

It should be noted that unemployment rates by electorate are approximations only and therefore should be treated with caution. This is due to some SA2s overlapping two or more electorates and the crude method of dealing with this issue (using labour force data as the basis for apportioning unemployment and labour force totals between electorates).

The graphs in this publication display quarterly unemployment rates for each electorate and compare them to the state and national average unemployment rate.

## Party Abbreviations

The following abbreviations for parties have been used. The political parties shown against each seat are as they stand as of May 2016.

ALP            Australian Labor Party

LIB            Liberal Party

NAT            The Nationals

## Definition of Unemployment Rate

Unemployed persons are defined by the ABS as civilians aged 15 years and over who, during a period of one week (called the reference week), were not employed, but were available to start work in the reference week and had actively looked for work in the previous four weeks, or those who were waiting to start a new job within four weeks from the end of the reference week and could have started in the reference week if the new job had been available then.

Work is defined as work for profit, commission or payment in kind; in a job, business or farm; or without pay in a family business or farm.

The number of unemployed workers, expressed as a percentage of the labour force, is called the unemployment rate.

"Uet %" is used to represent "unemployment rate" in the tables throughout this publication.

## Summary of the Unemployment Rate Ranked by SED

For the December quarter 2015, unemployment rates ranged from 2.5% in Alfred Cove (LIB) to 17.2% in Mirrabooka (ALP).

The average unemployment rate for Western Australia for the December 2015 quarter was 5.9%. Less than half of the WA electorates had unemployment rates that were above the state average. Of the 61% of WA electorates that had unemployment rates below the state average, the Liberal Party holds 25 seats (80.6% of all LIB seats), the Labor Party holds 6 seats (28.6% of all ALP seats) and the National Party holds 5 seats (71.4% of all NAT seats).

The national average unemployment rate for the December 2015 quarter was 6.1%. The total percentage of WA electorates that had an unemployment rate below this national average was 67.8%. Of these, the Liberal Party holds 26 seats (83.9% of all LIB seats), the Labor Party holds 7 seats (33.3% of all ALP seats) and the National Party holds 7 seats (100% of all NAT seats).

In comparison to the September 2015 quarter, Gosnells (ALP) and Armadale (ALP) experienced the greatest improvement in unemployment rate, down by 0.5%. Kimberley (ALP) experienced the greatest increase (1.1%) in their unemployment rate followed by Mirrabooka (ALP) (0.9%).

Of those electorates that experienced an improvement in their ranking for the December 2015 quarter compared to the September 2015 quarter, the Liberal Party holds 12 seats (38.7% of all LIB seats), the Labor Party holds 5 seats (23.8% of all ALP seats) and the Nationals hold 1 seat (14.3% of all NAT seats).

For those electorates that exhibited a decline in their ranking for the December 2015 quarter, in comparison to the September 2015 quarter, the Liberal Party holds 13 seats (41.9% of all LIB seats), the Labor Party holds 8 seats (38.1% of all ALP seats) and the National Party holds 6 seats (85.7% of all NAT seats).

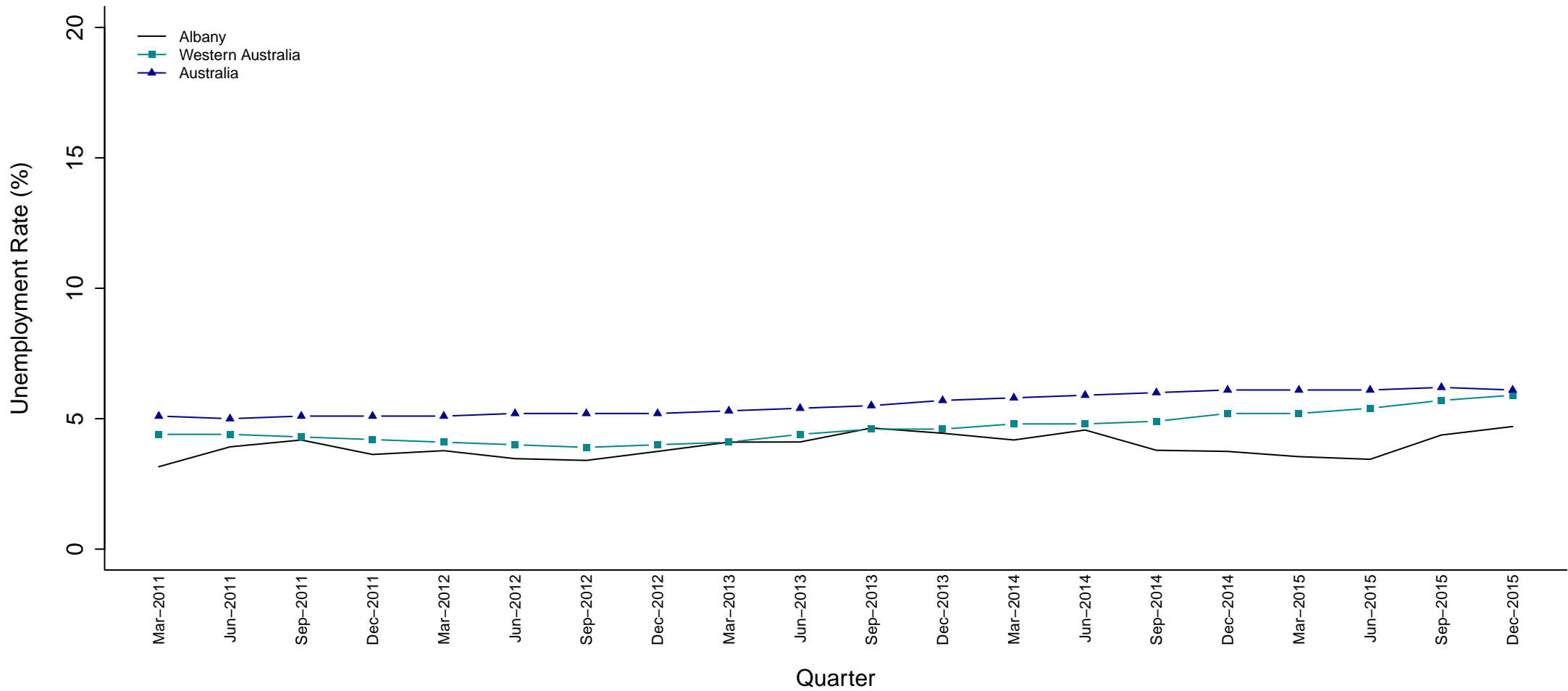
Of those electorates that were ranked in the top 10 in the September 2015 quarter, all remained in the top 10 in the December 2015 quarter. Conversely, 9 of those electorates that were ranked in the bottom 10 in the September 2015 quarter remained in the bottom 10 in the December 2015 quarter.

In the December 2014 quarter the unemployment rate ranged from 2.2% to 13.3%. The range for the December 2015 quarter was wider at the larger end, ranging from 2.5% to 17.2%. In the September 2015 quarter, the unemployment rate ranged from 2.4% to 16.3%.

The Alfred Cove (LIB), Bateman (LIB) and Carine (LIB) electorates had the lowest rates of unemployment for the September 2015 and December 2015 quarters. Carine (LIB) and Hillarys (LIB) had the lowest rates for the December 2014 quarter. Mirrabooka (ALP) had the highest unemployment rate for the December 2014, September 2015 and December 2015 quarters.

For this edition of the Estimates of Unemployment WA State Electoral Divisions publication it is not appropriate to compare figures with earlier quarters in editions published before February 2015.

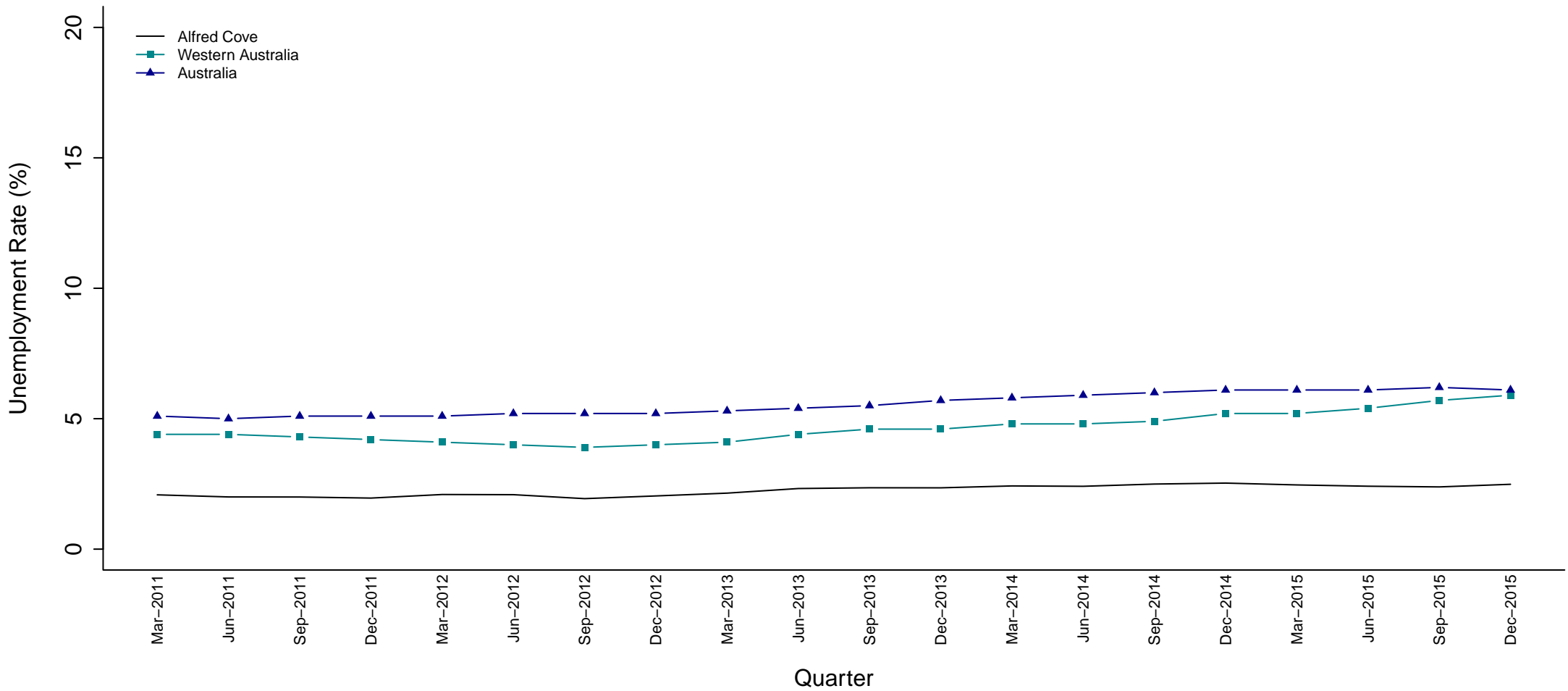

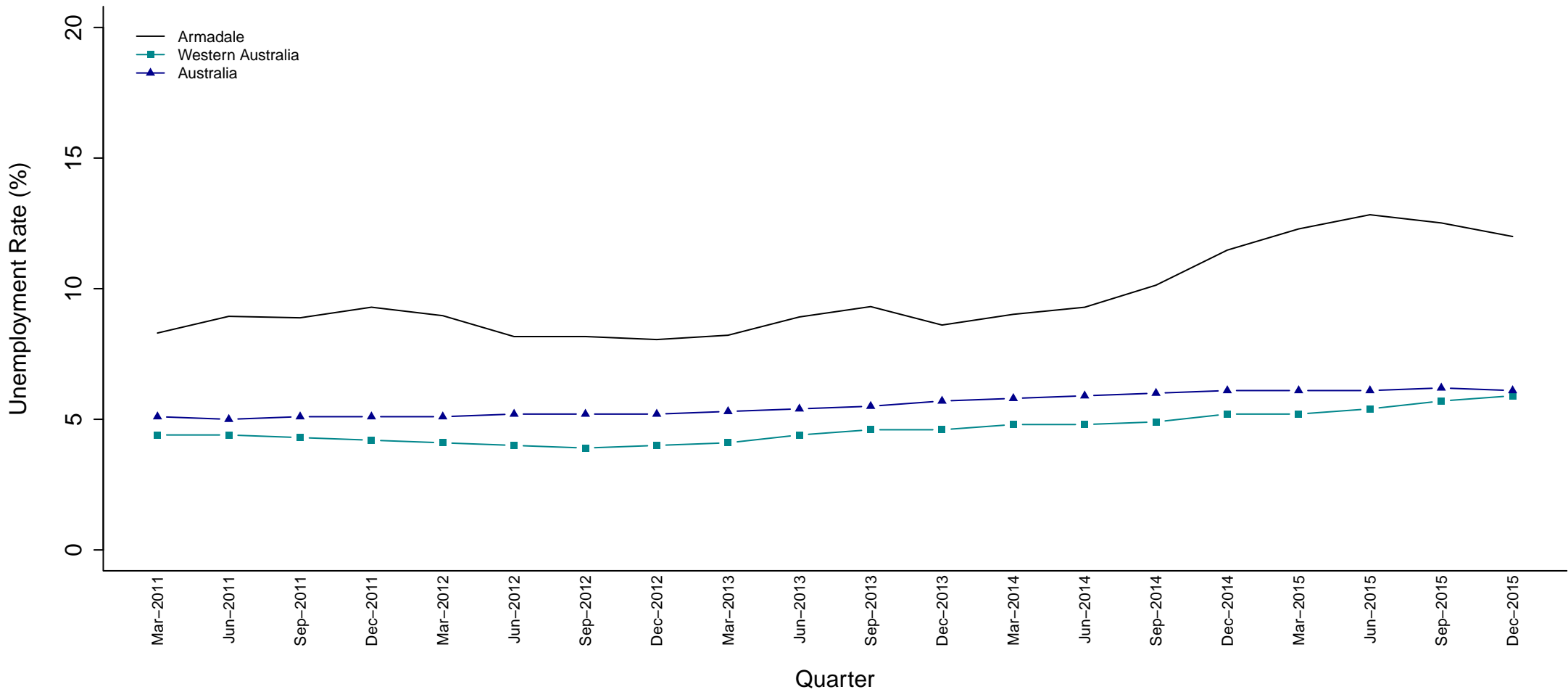

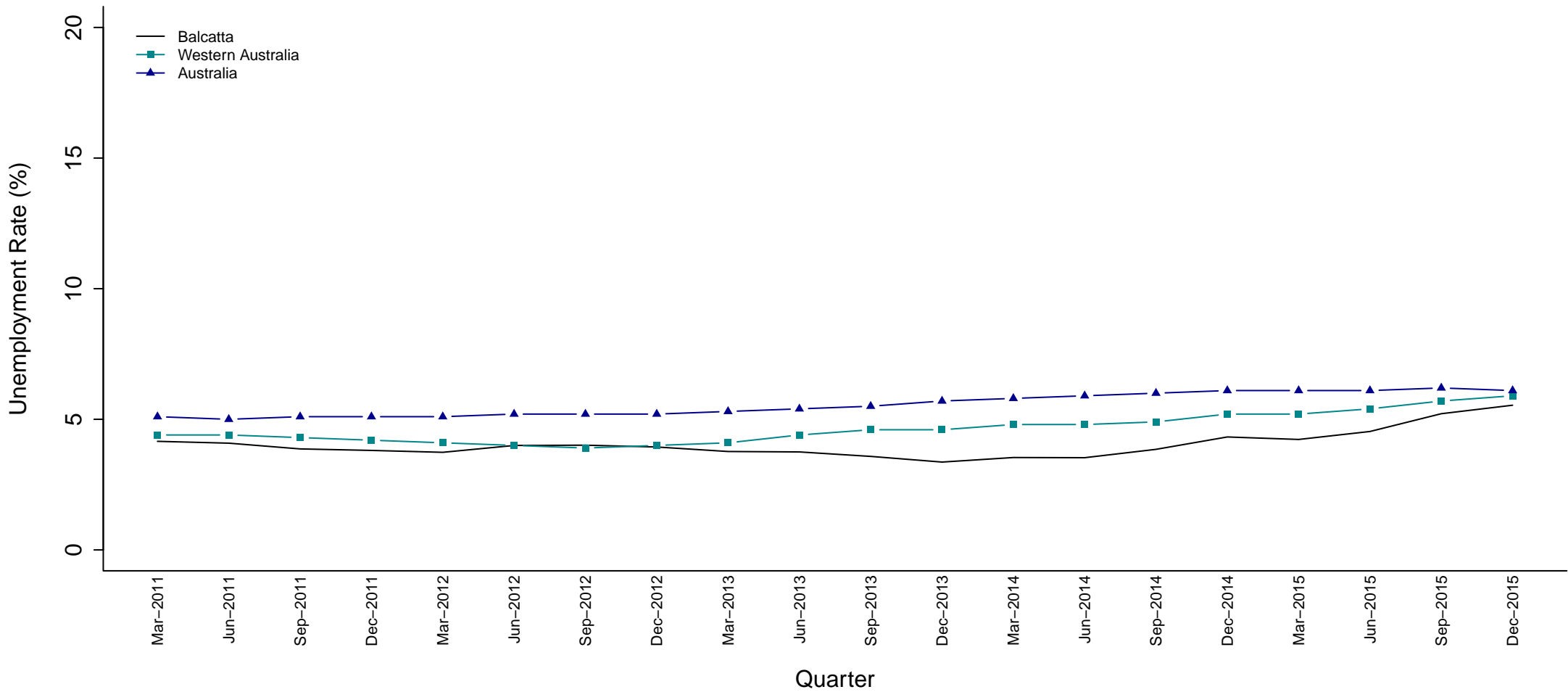

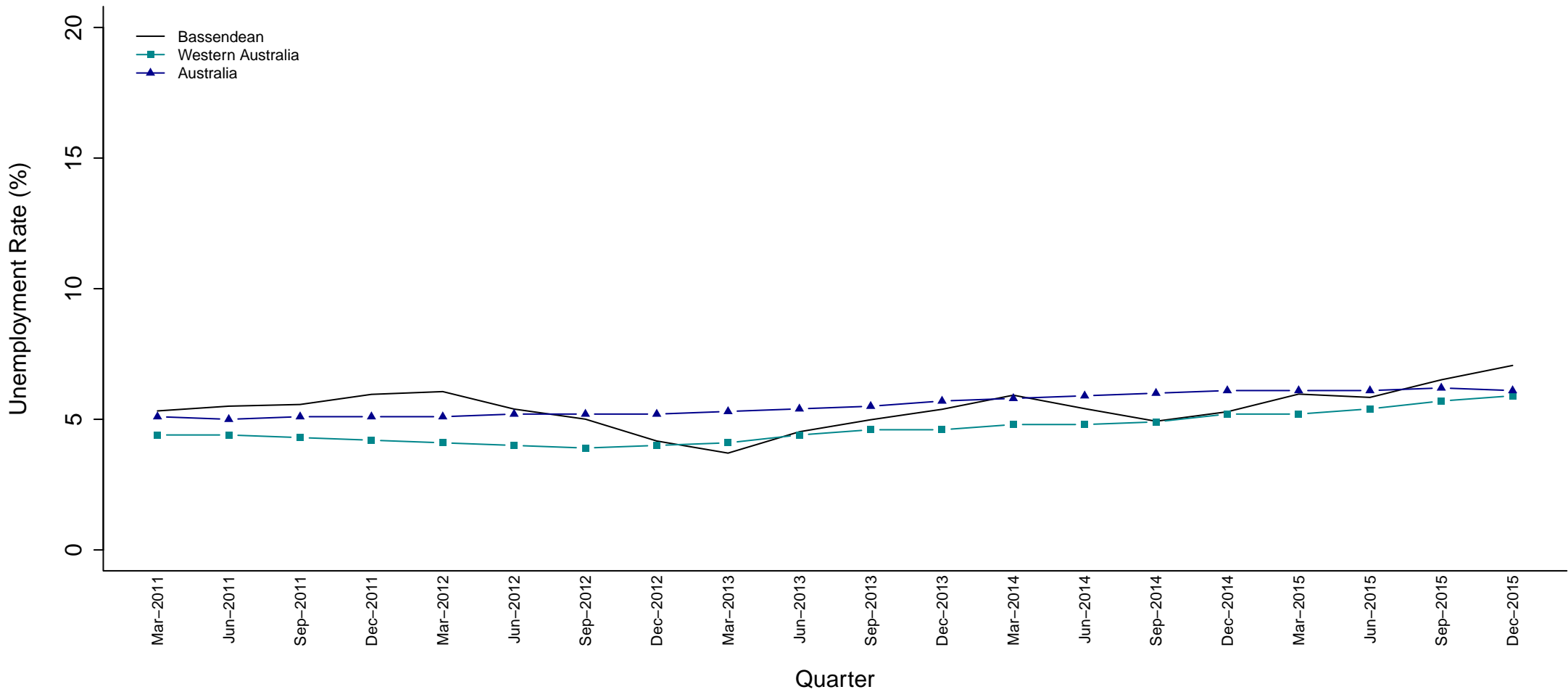

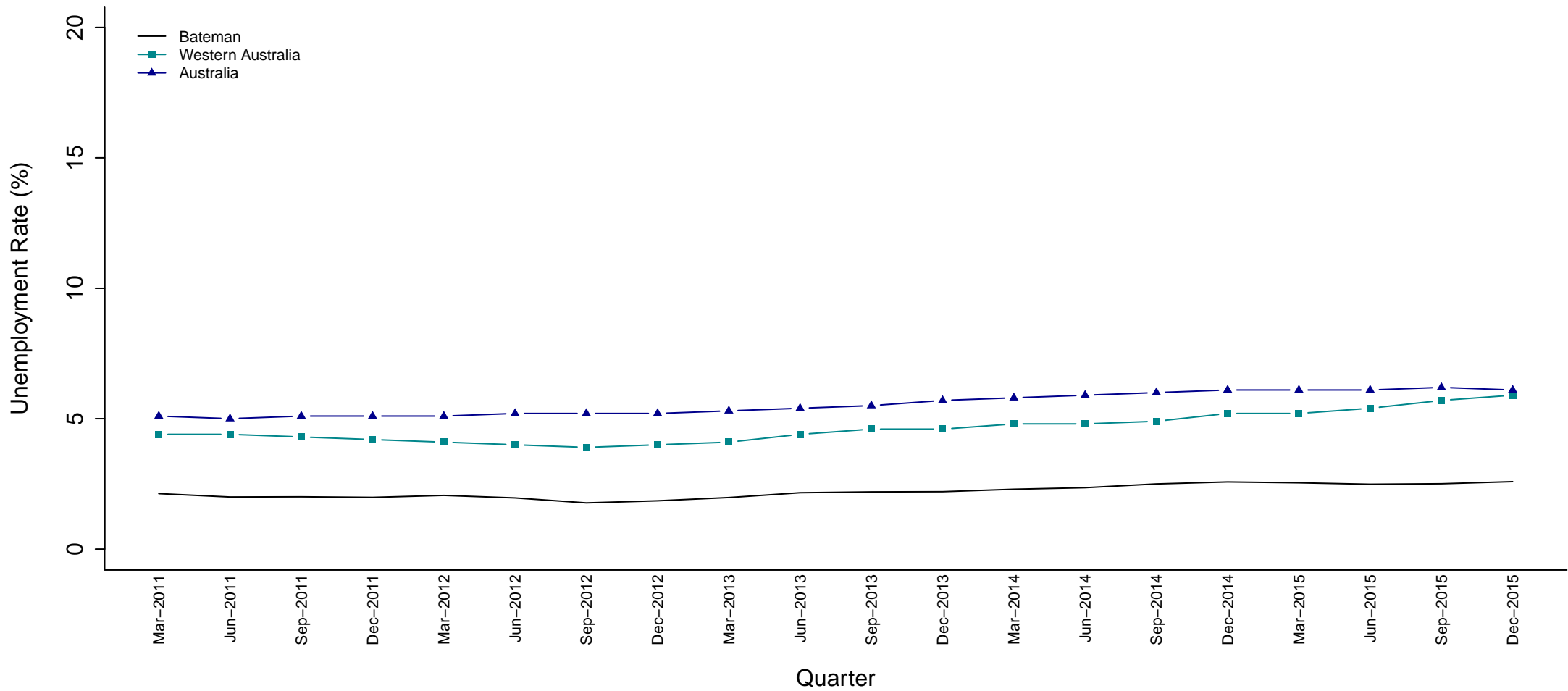

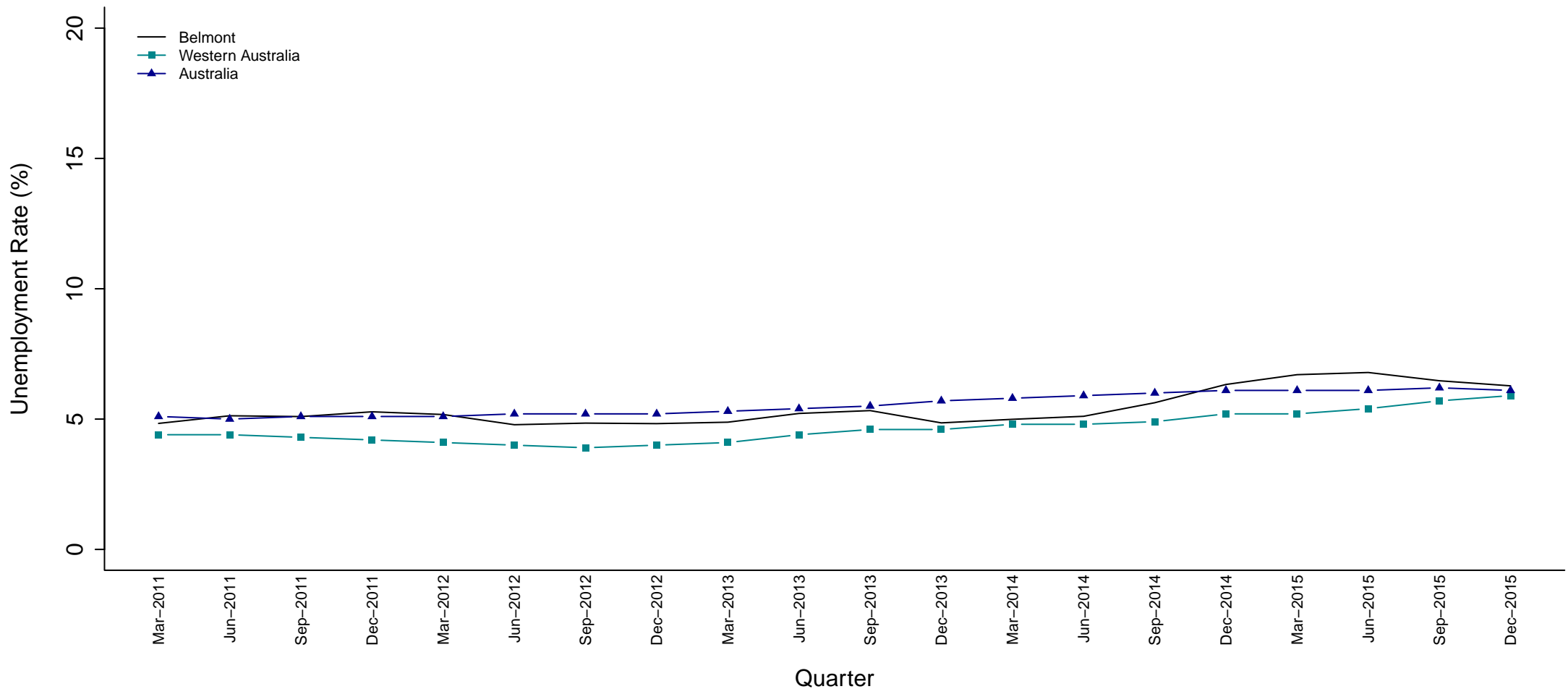

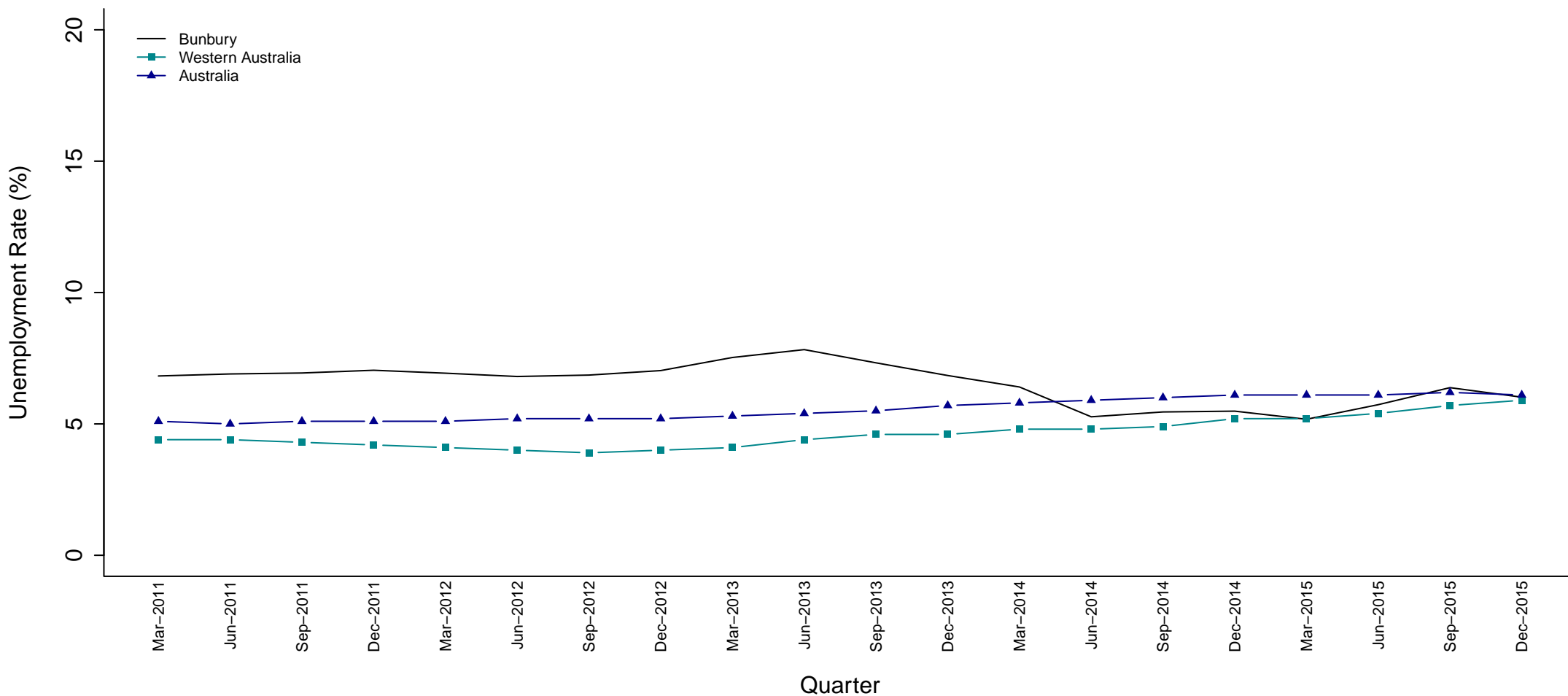

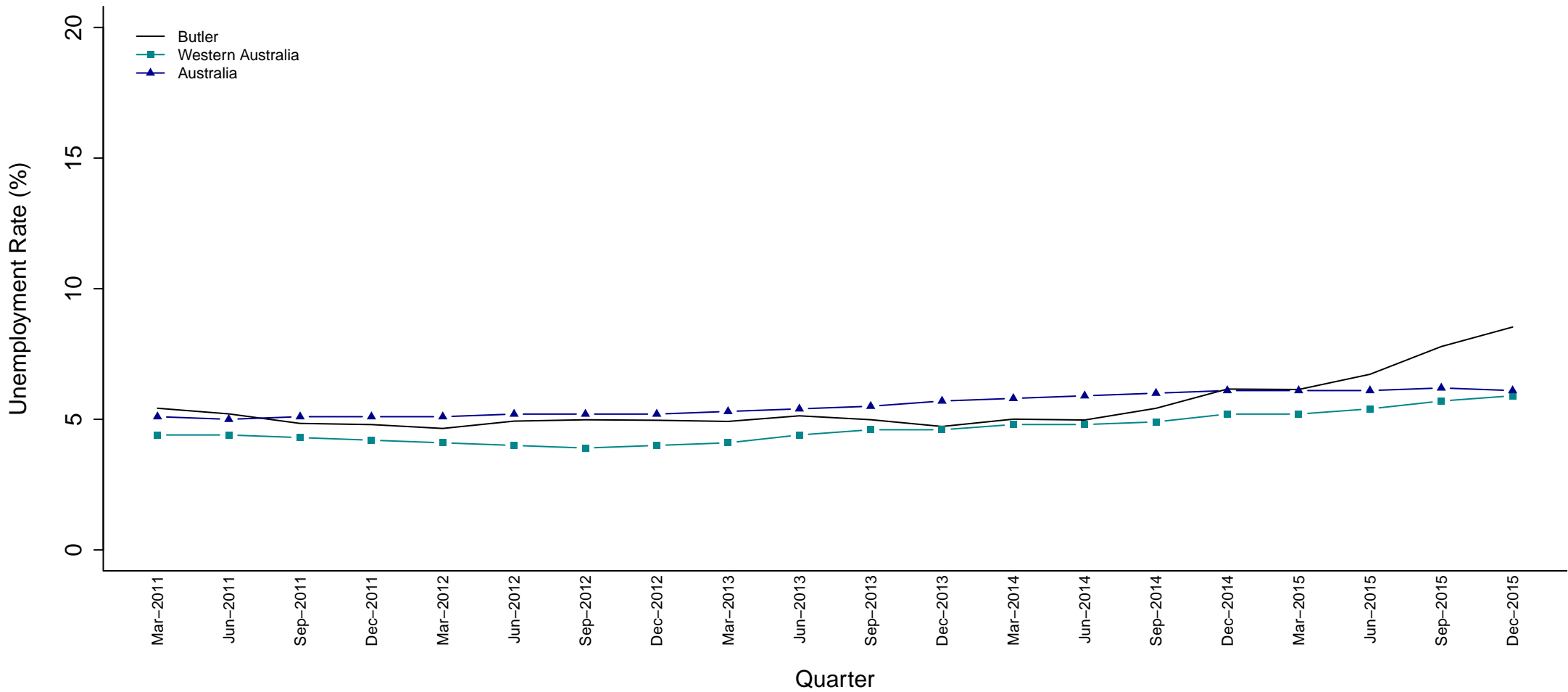

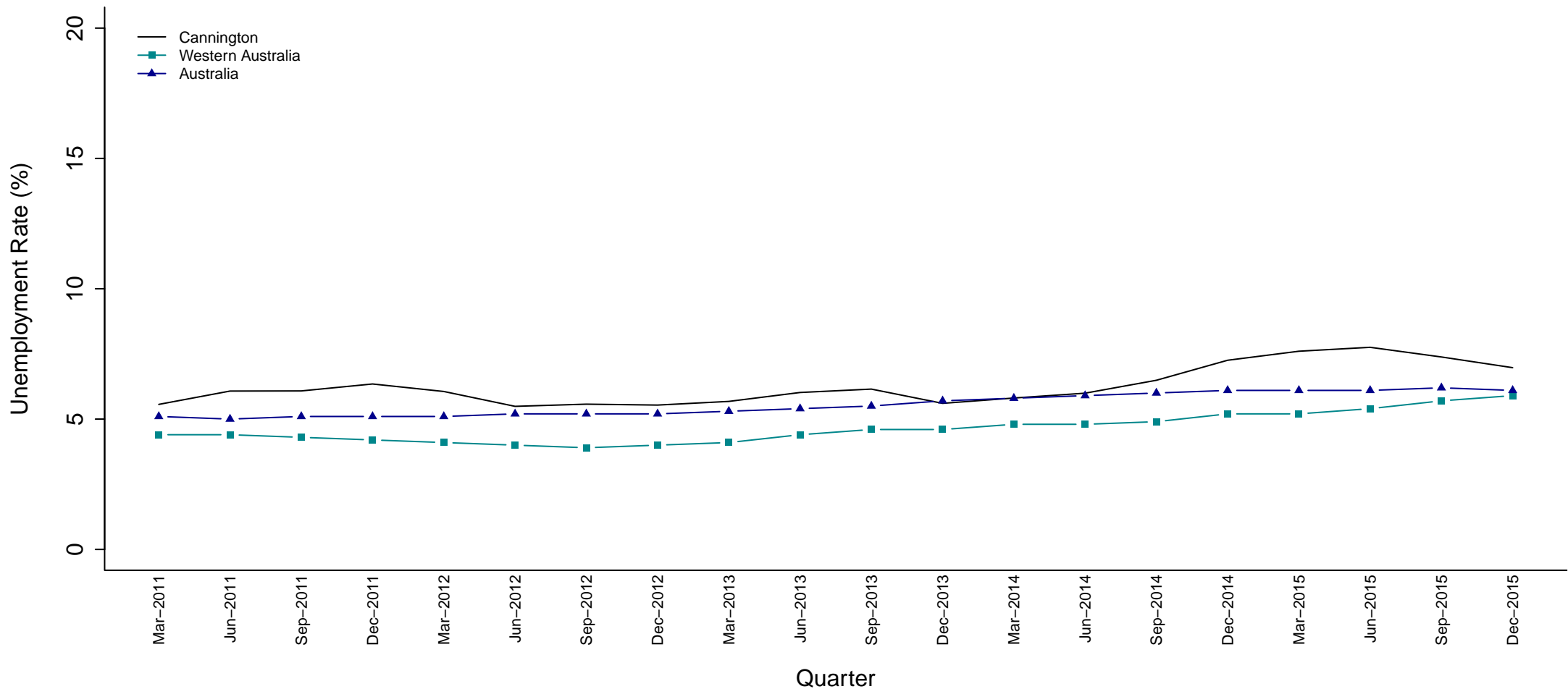

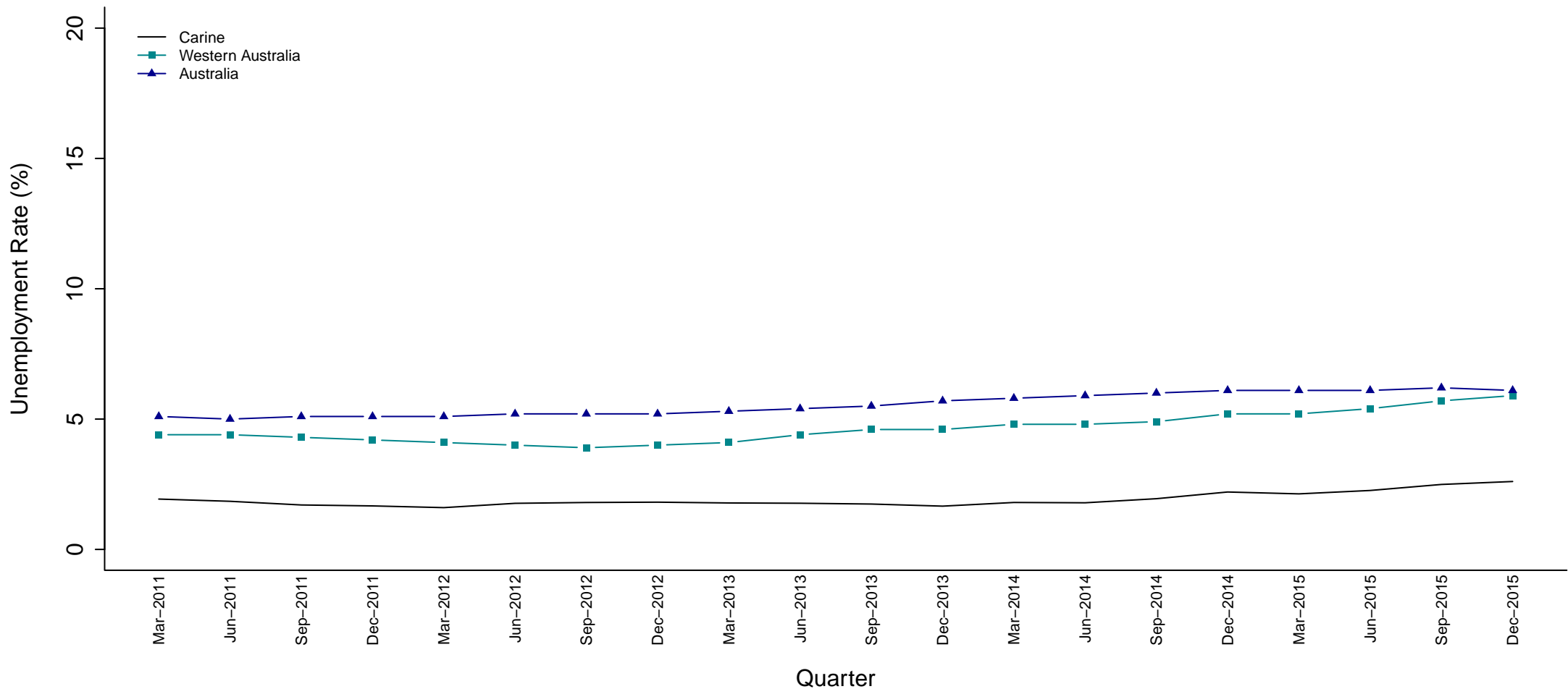

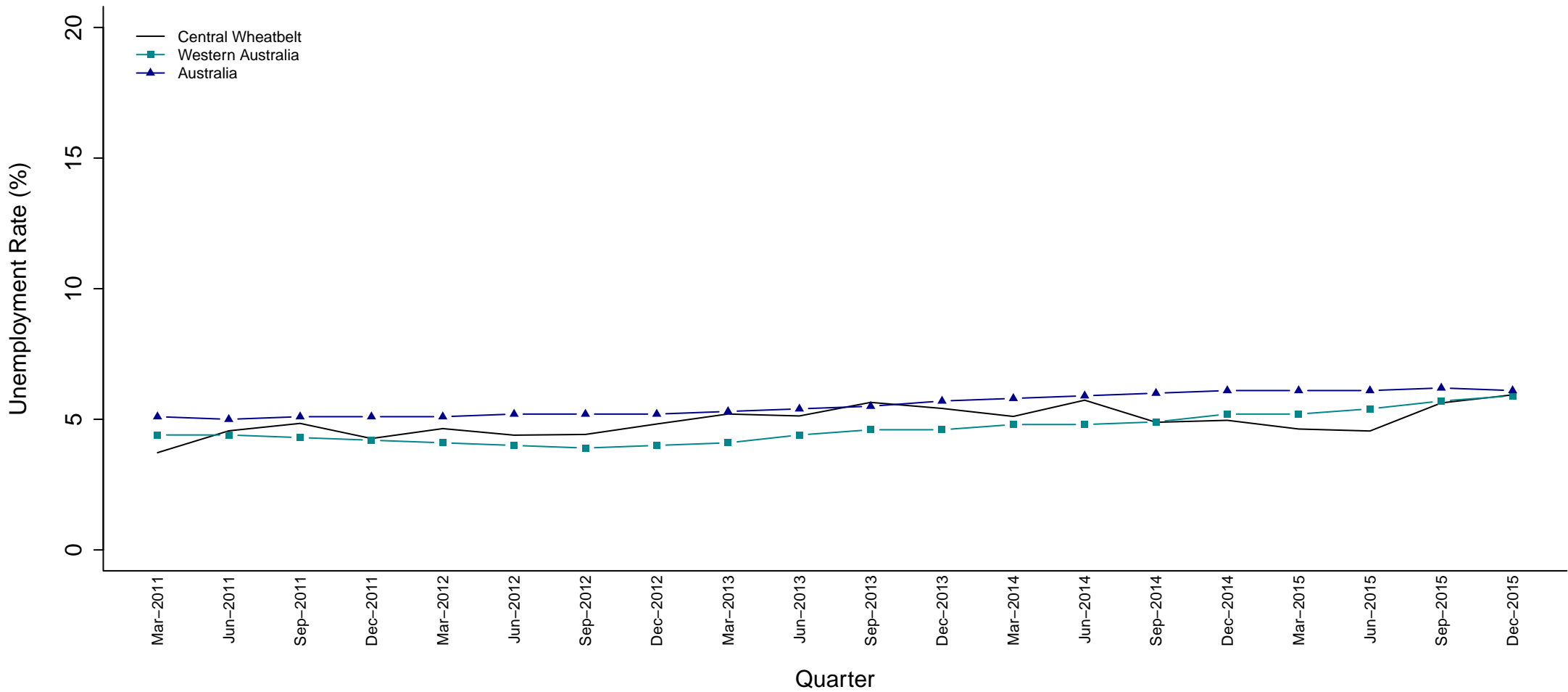

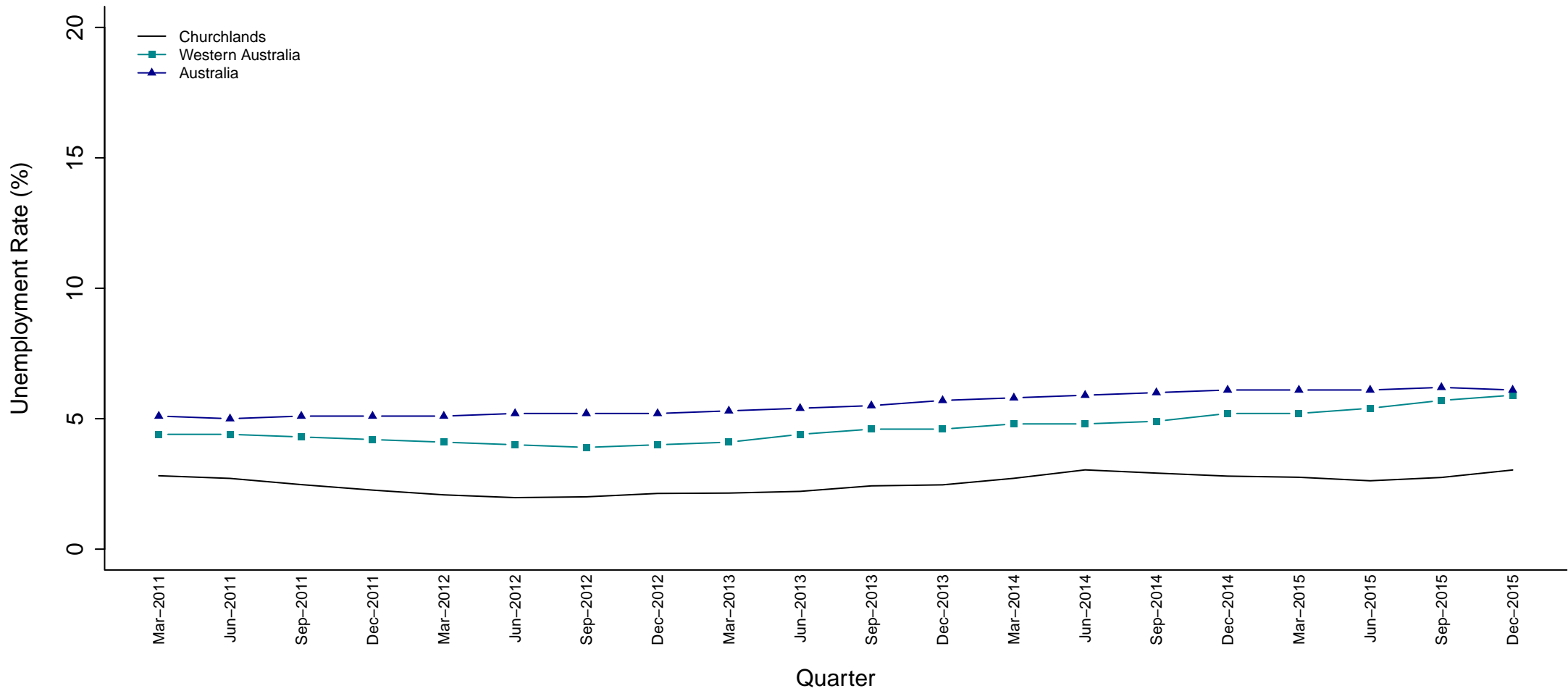

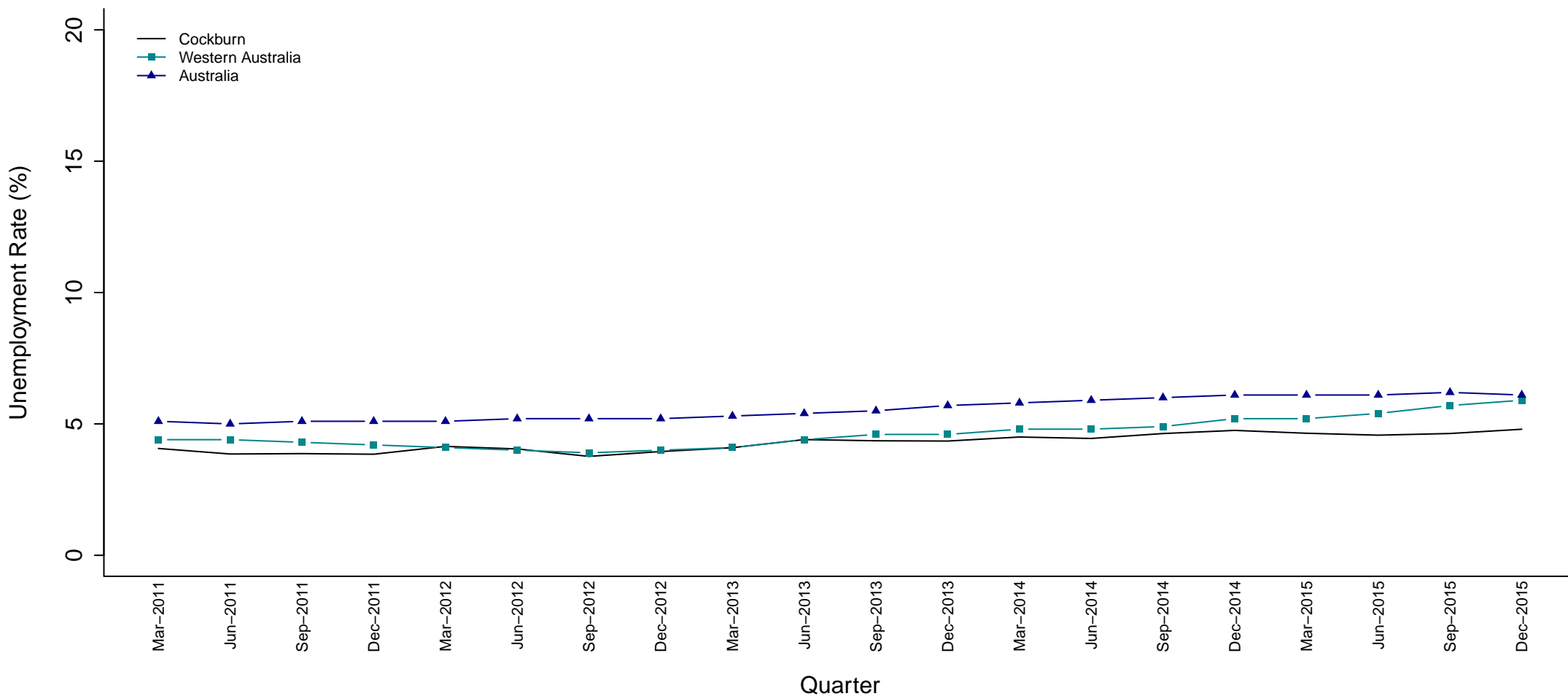

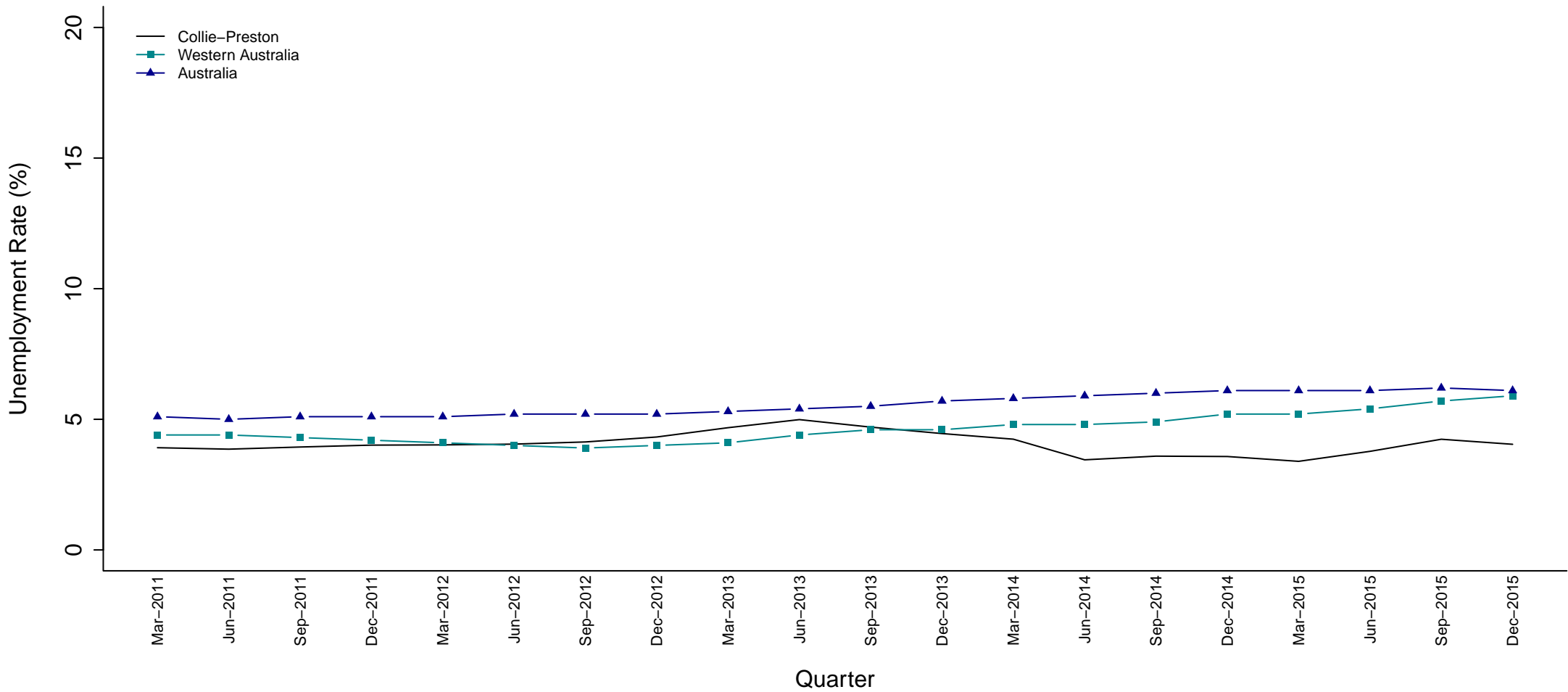

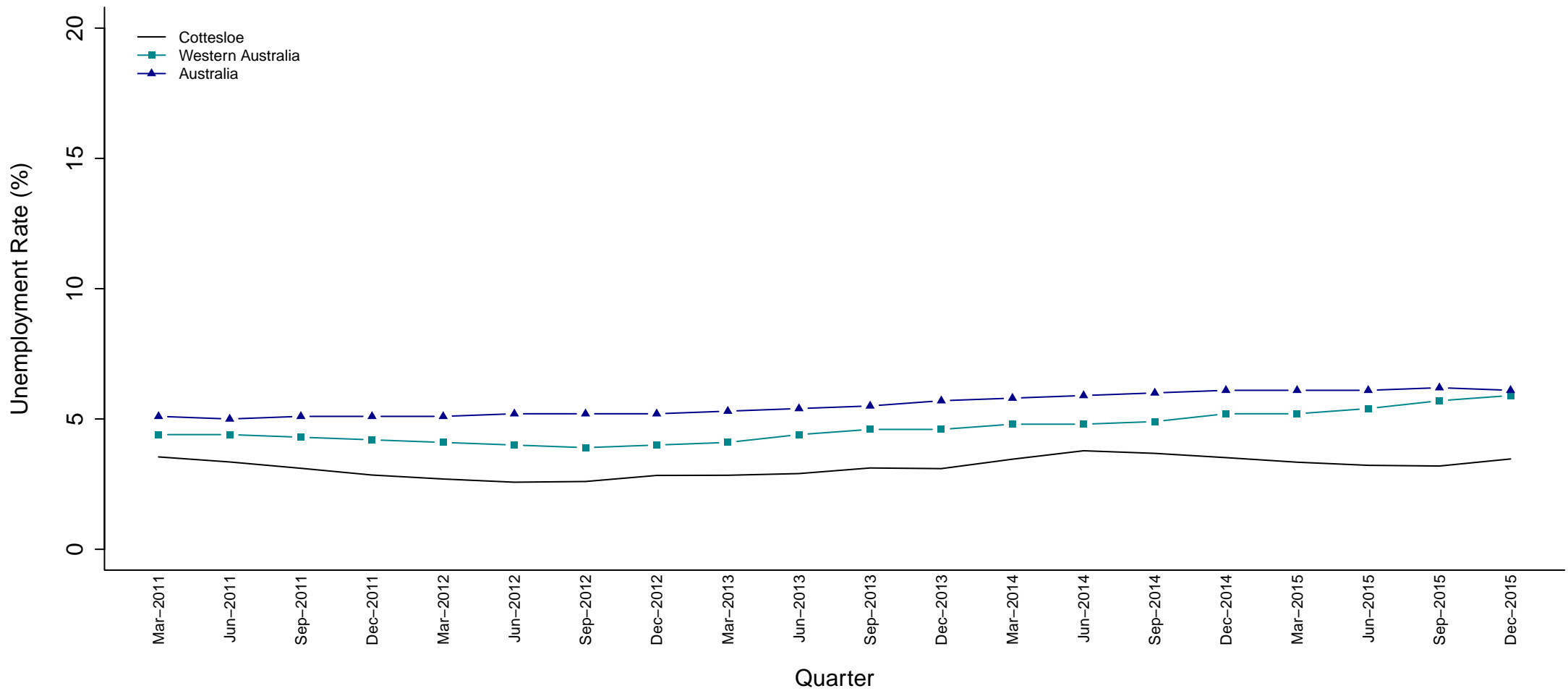

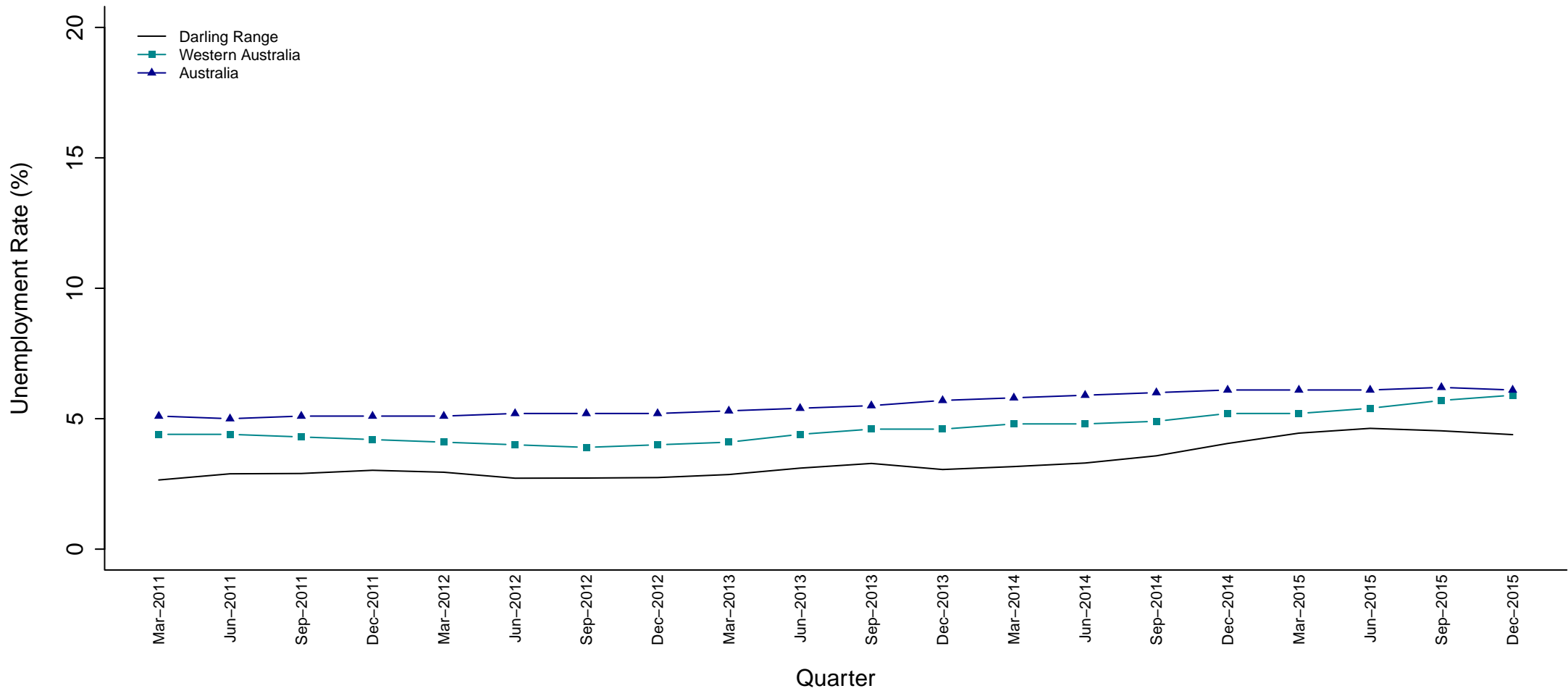

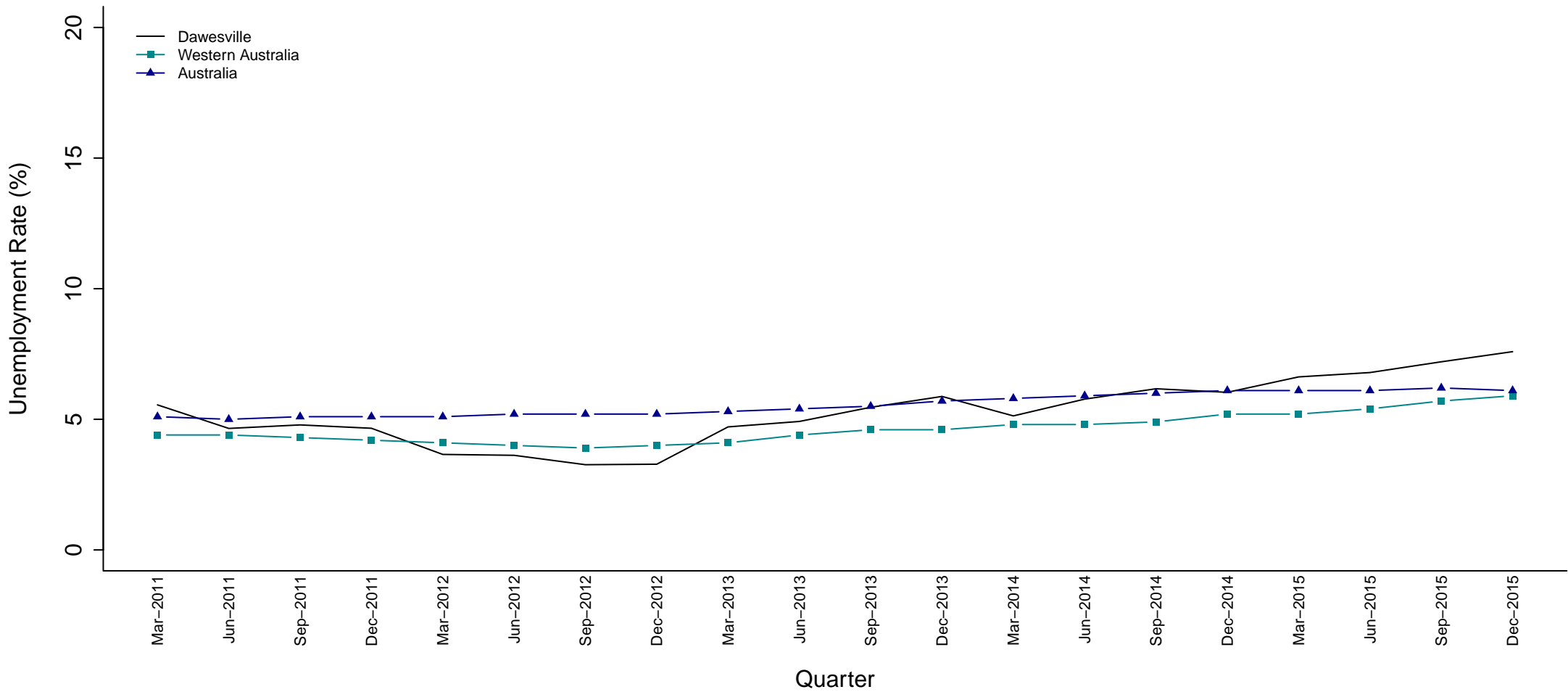

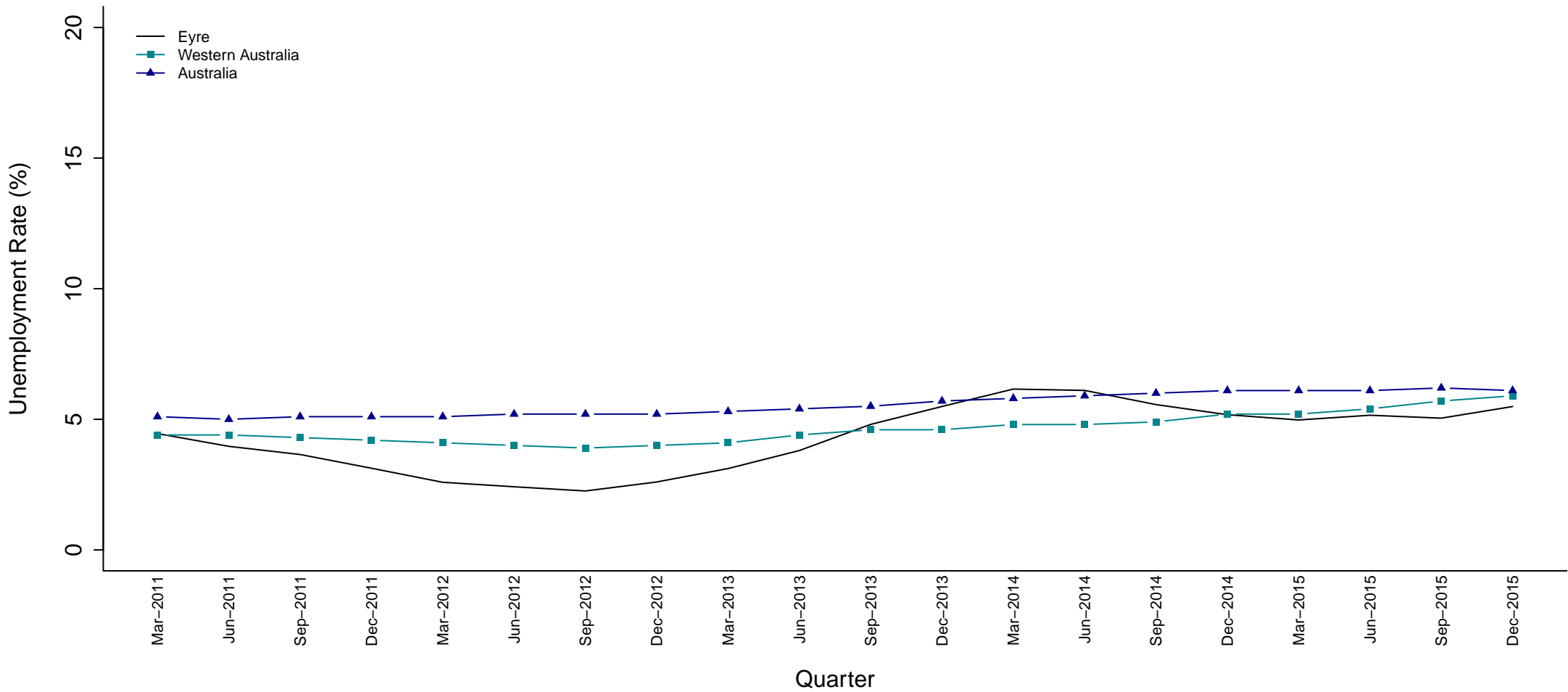

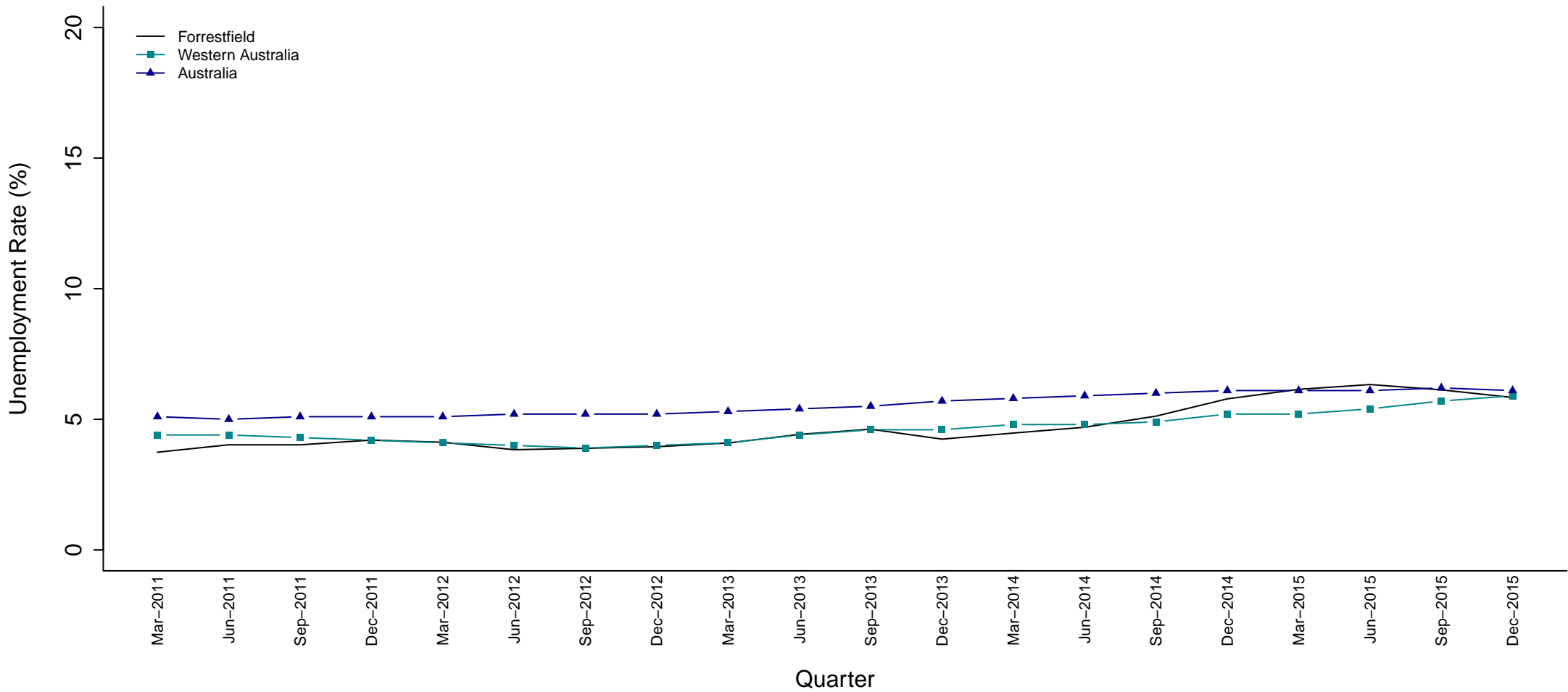

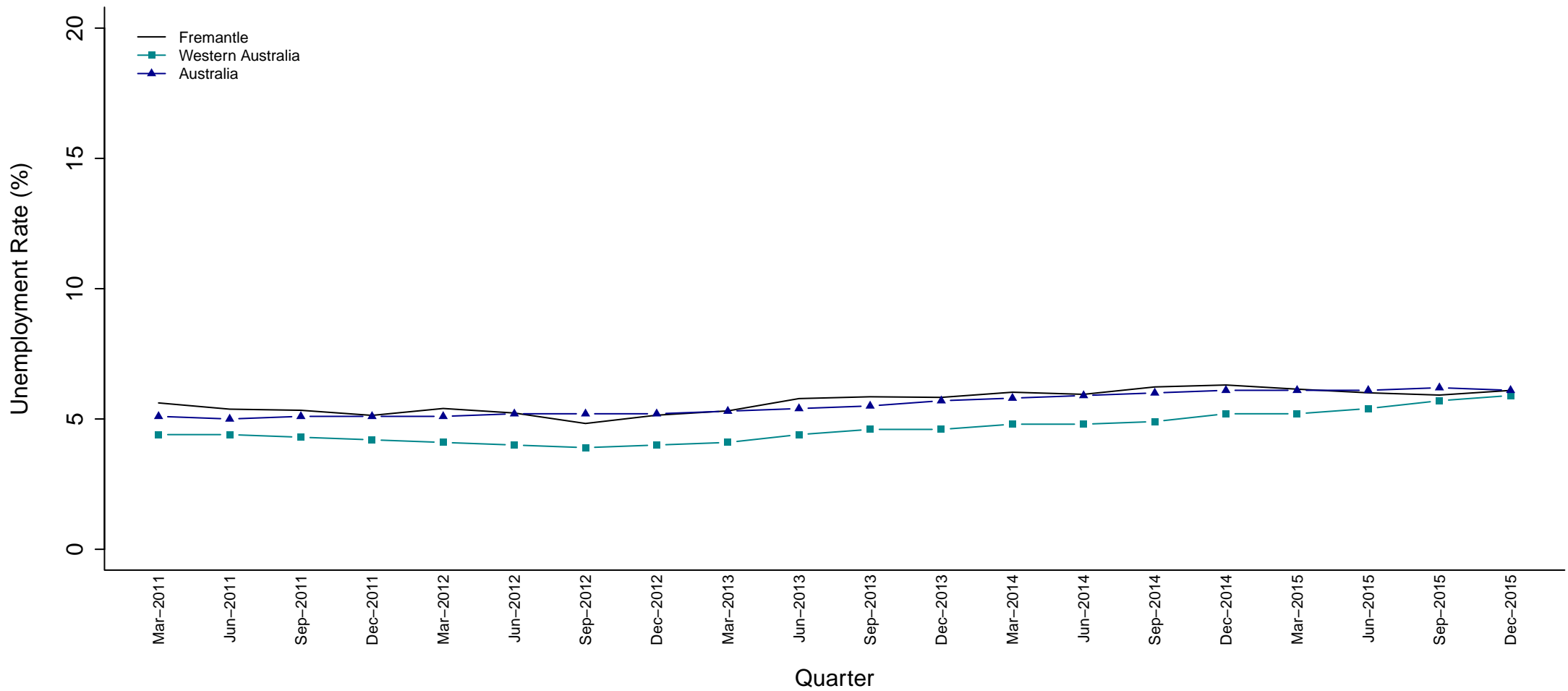

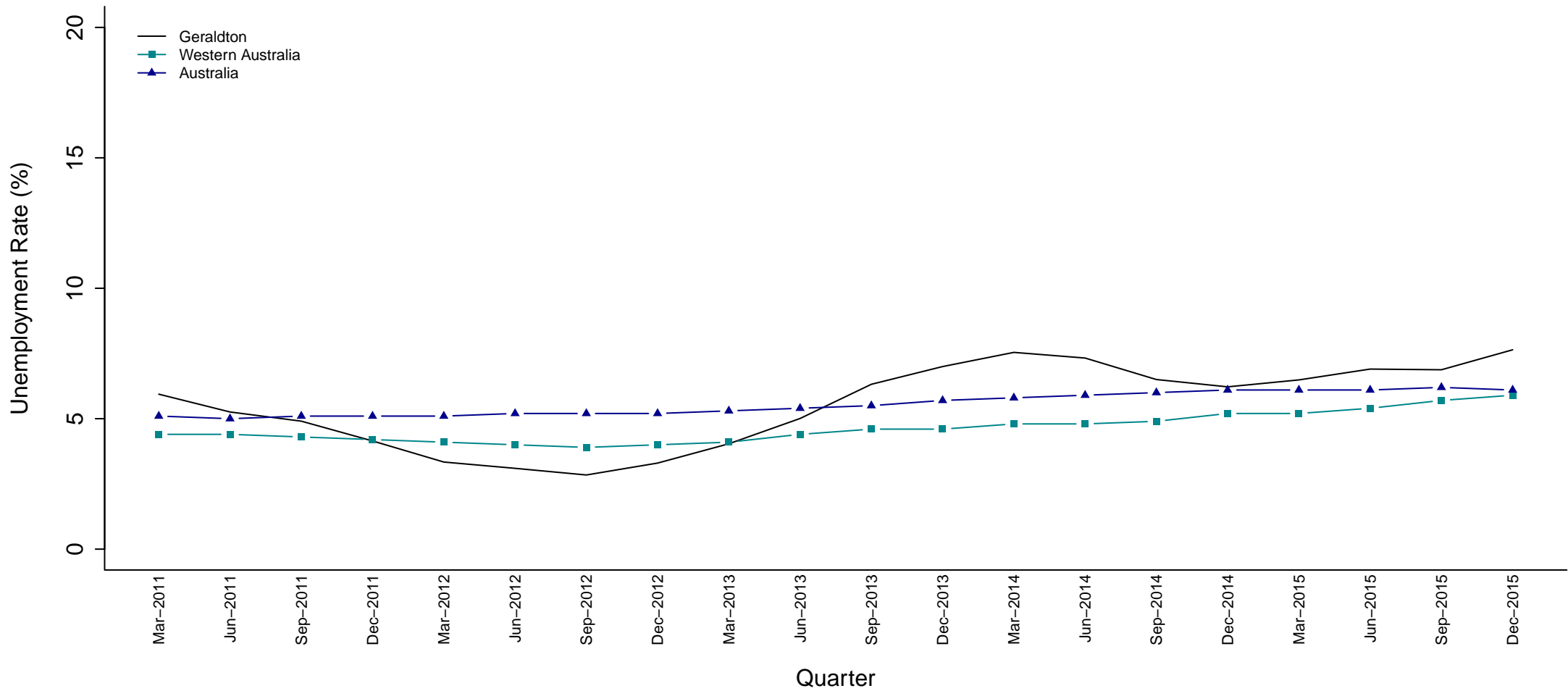

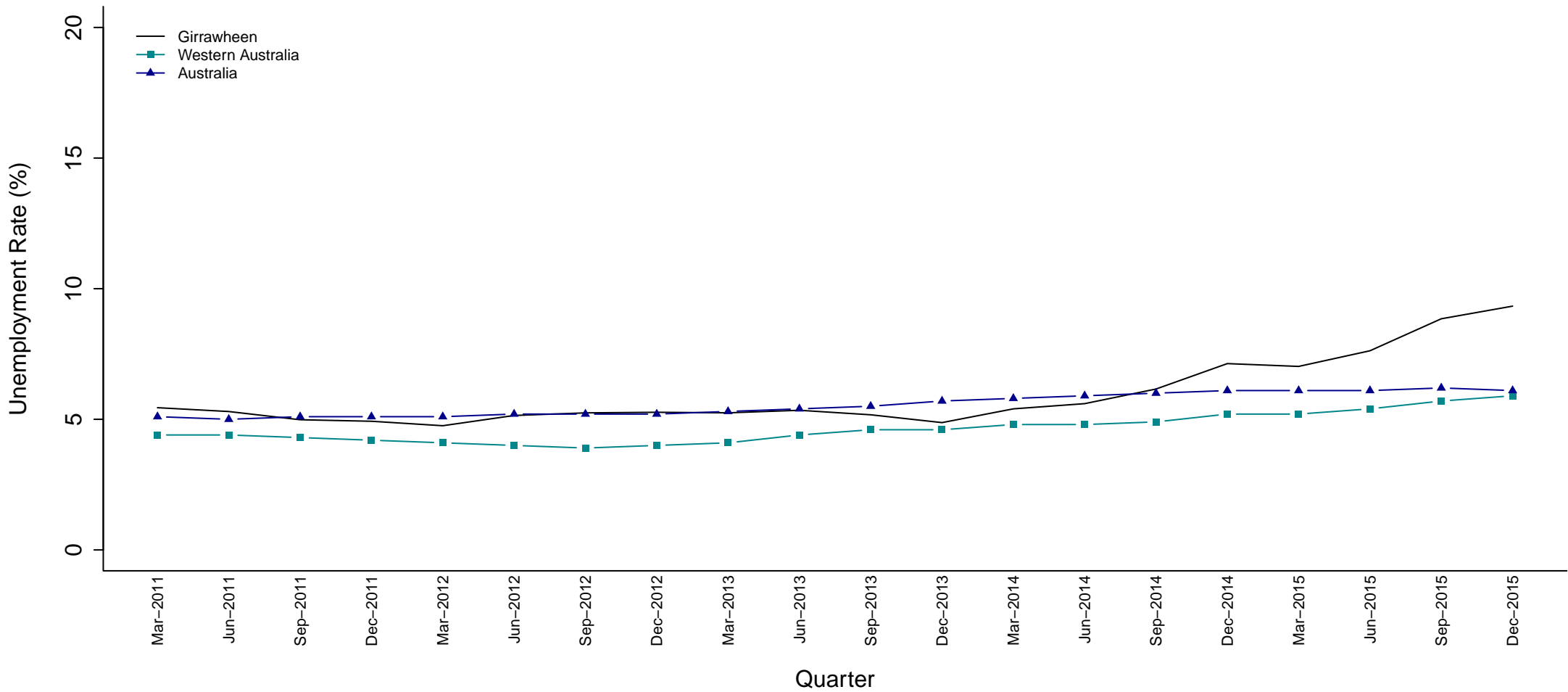

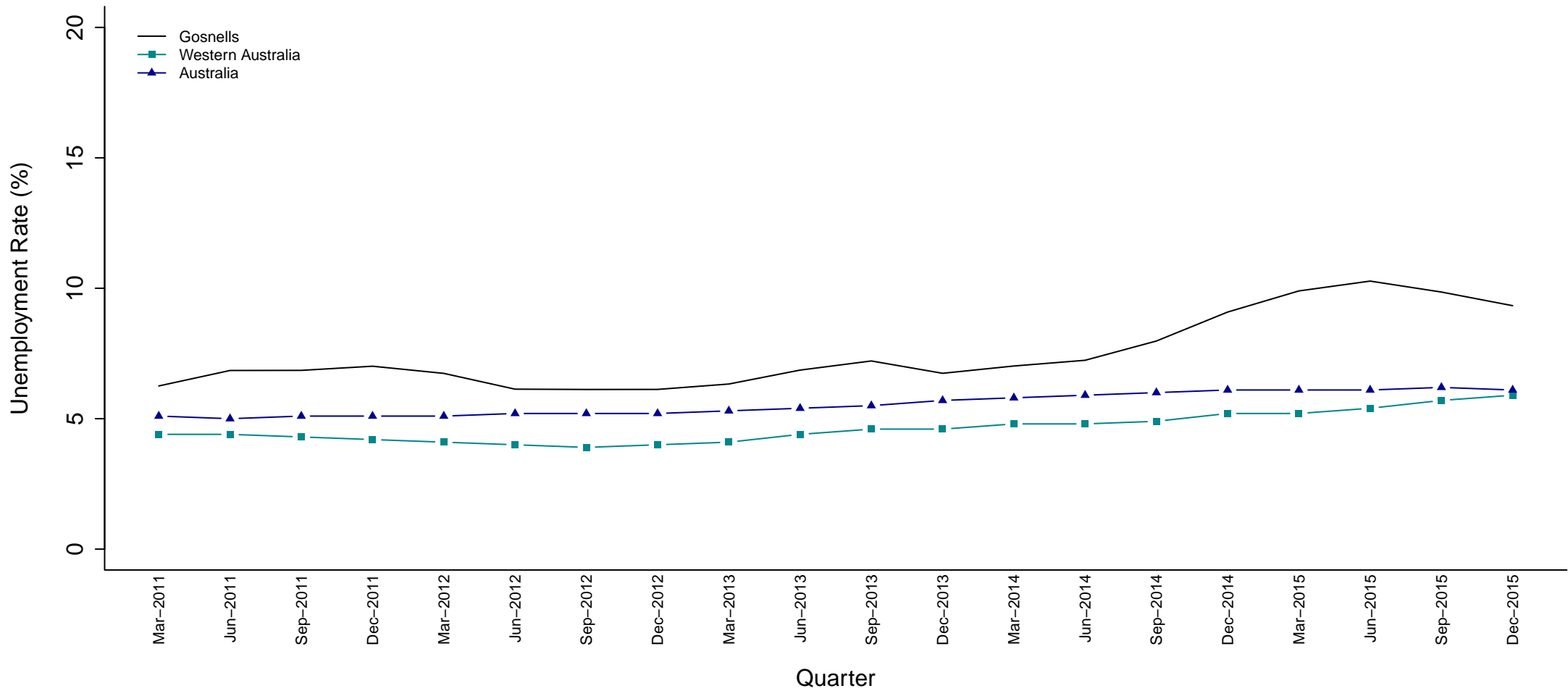

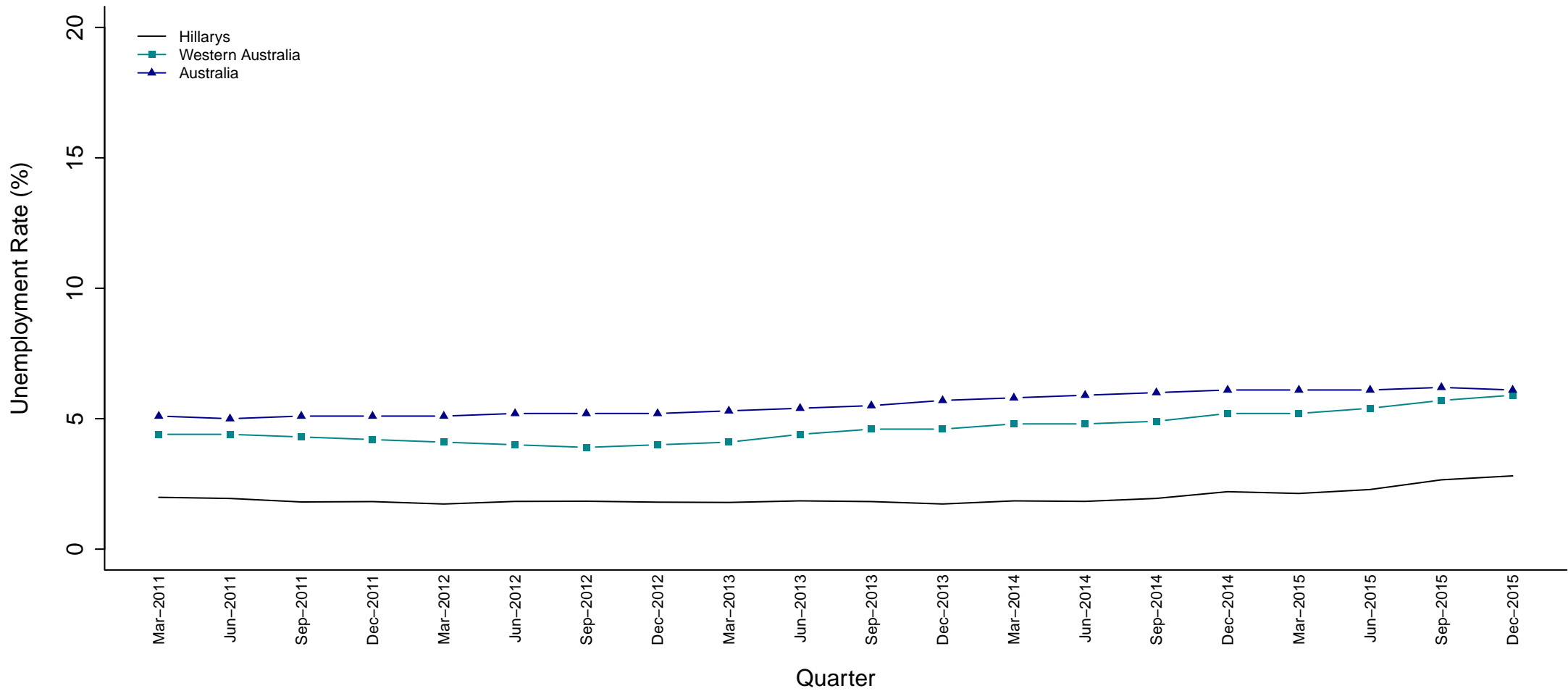

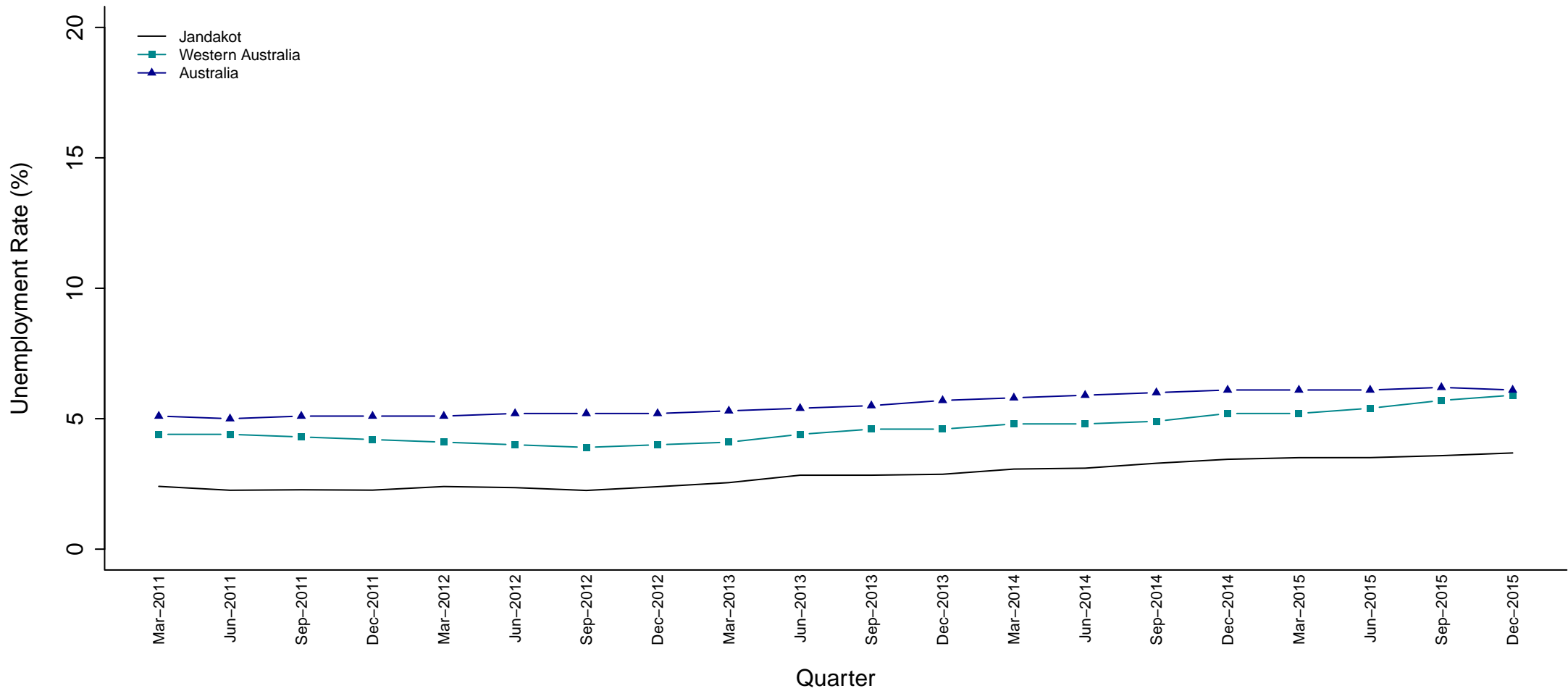

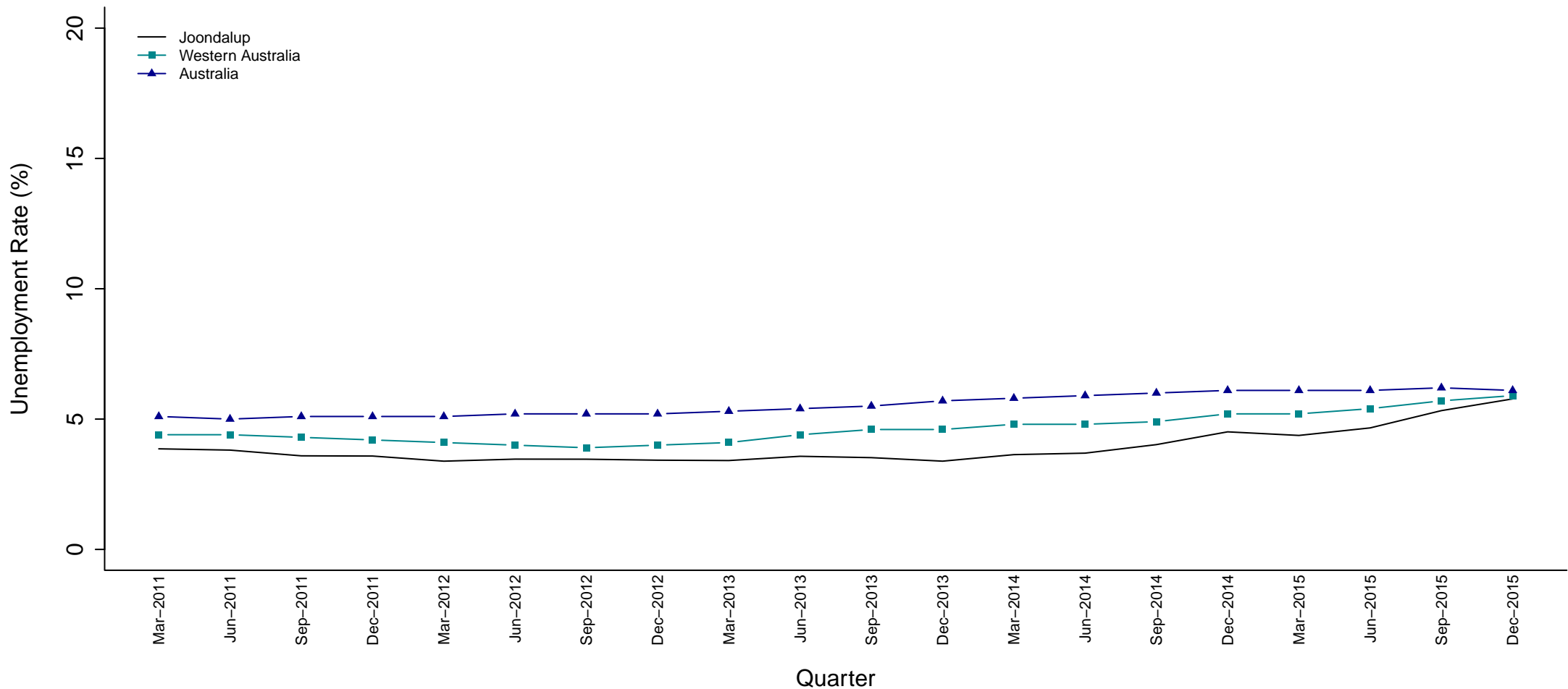

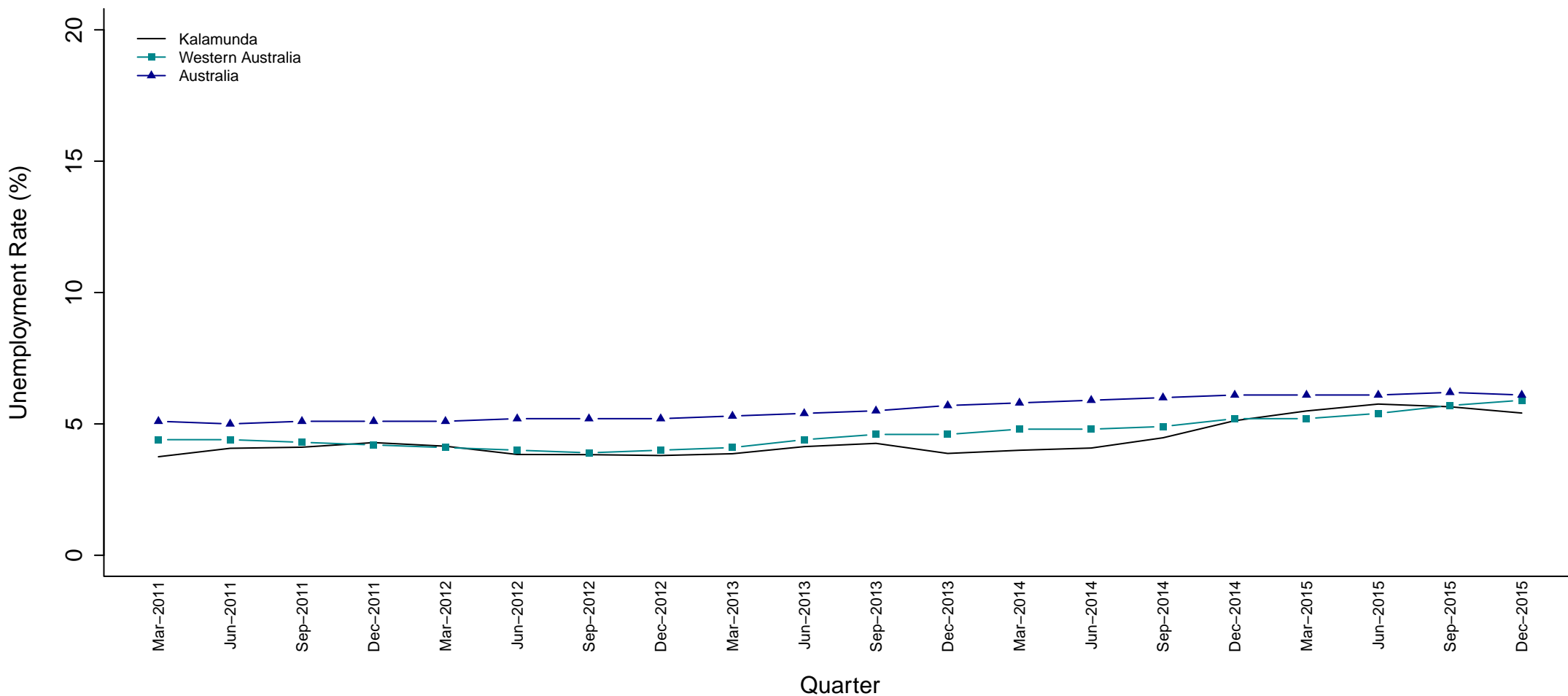

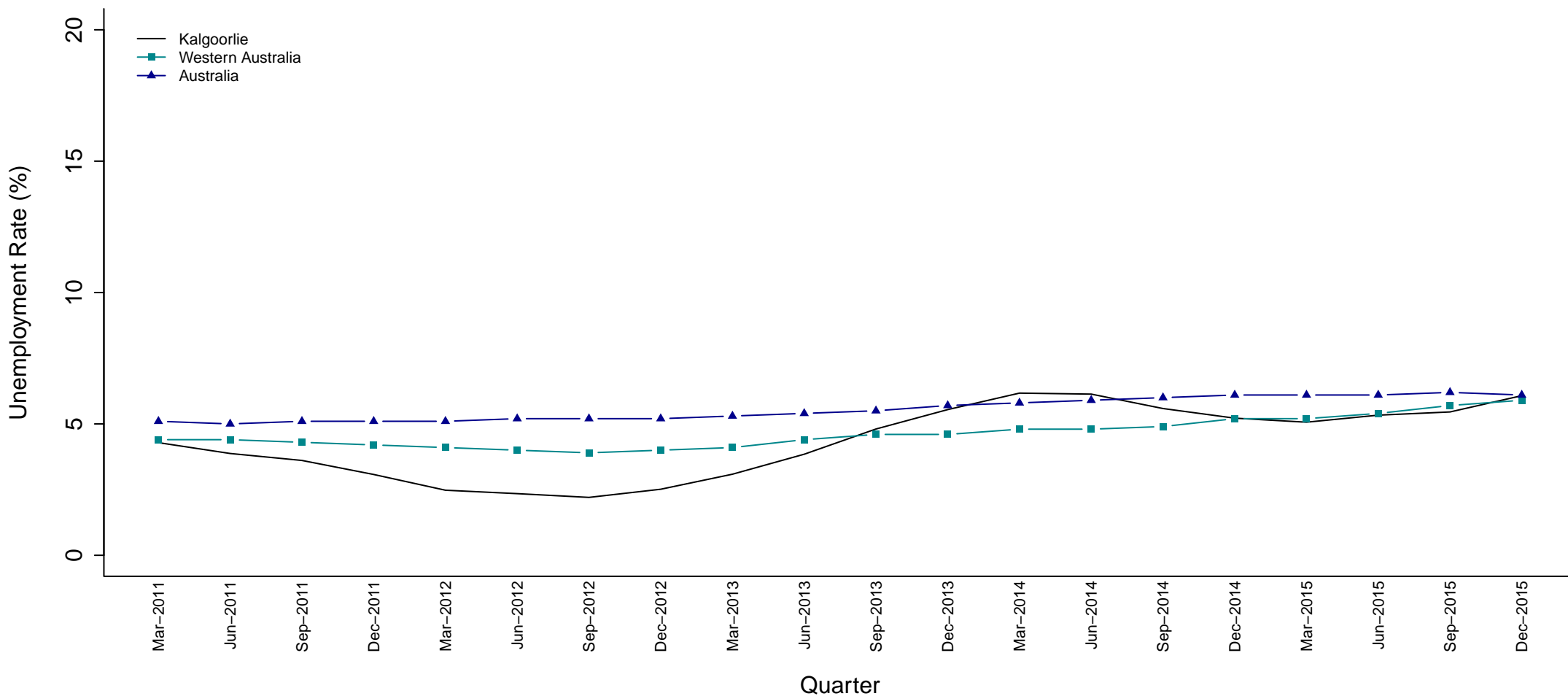

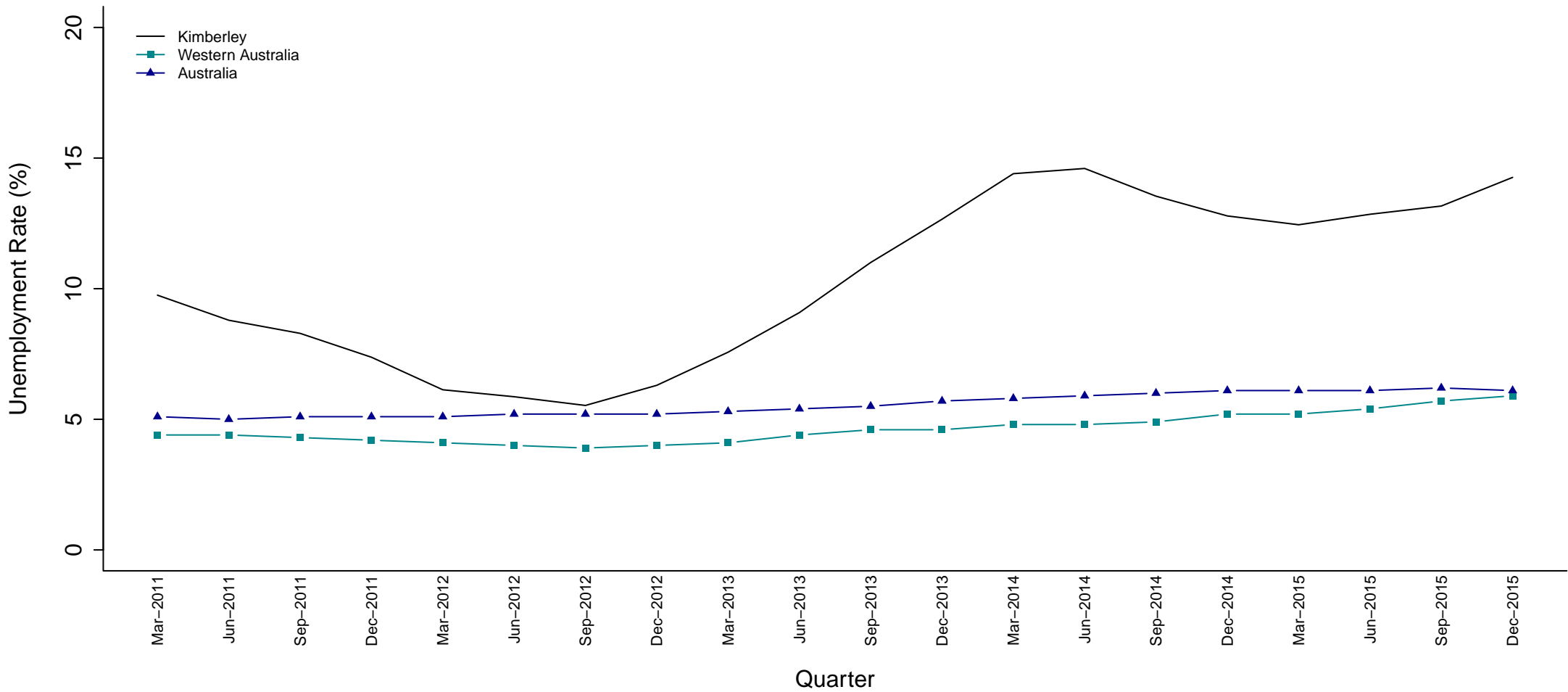

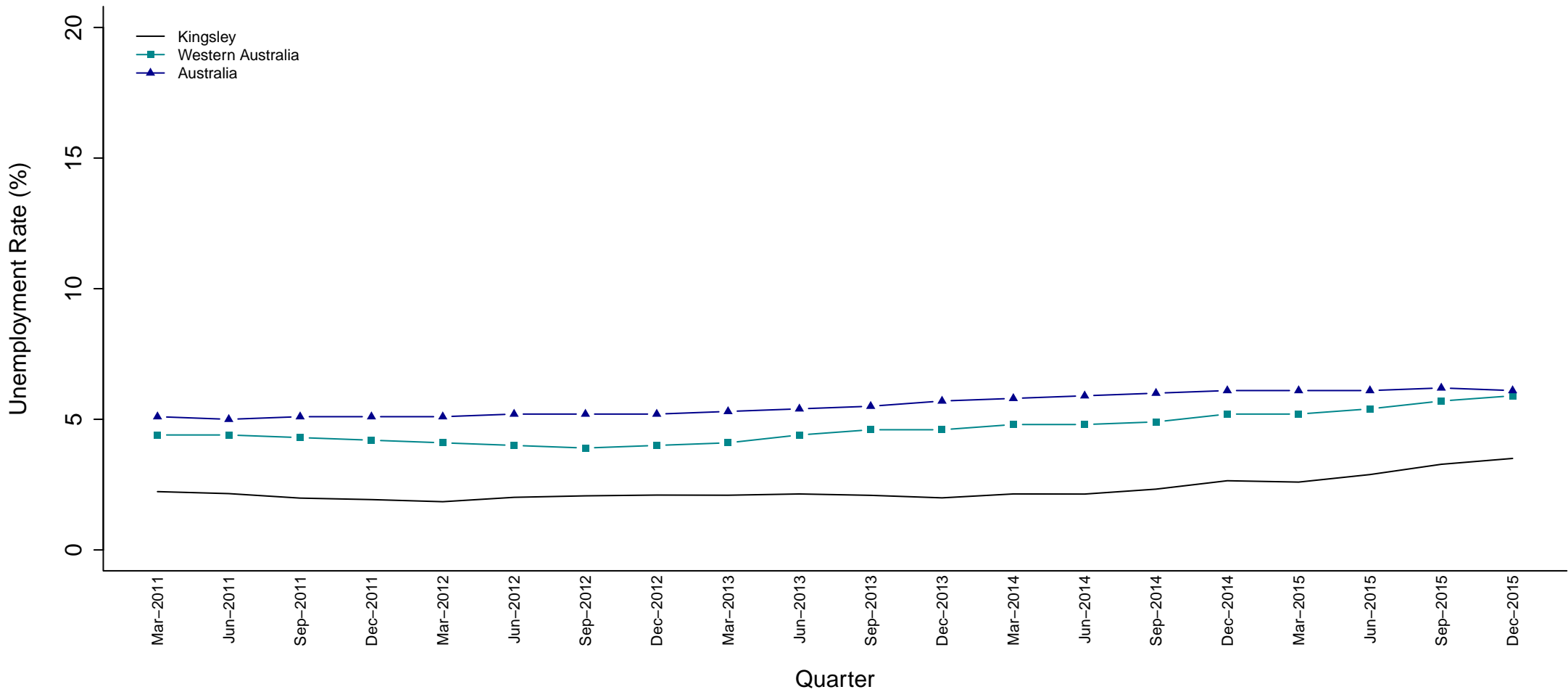

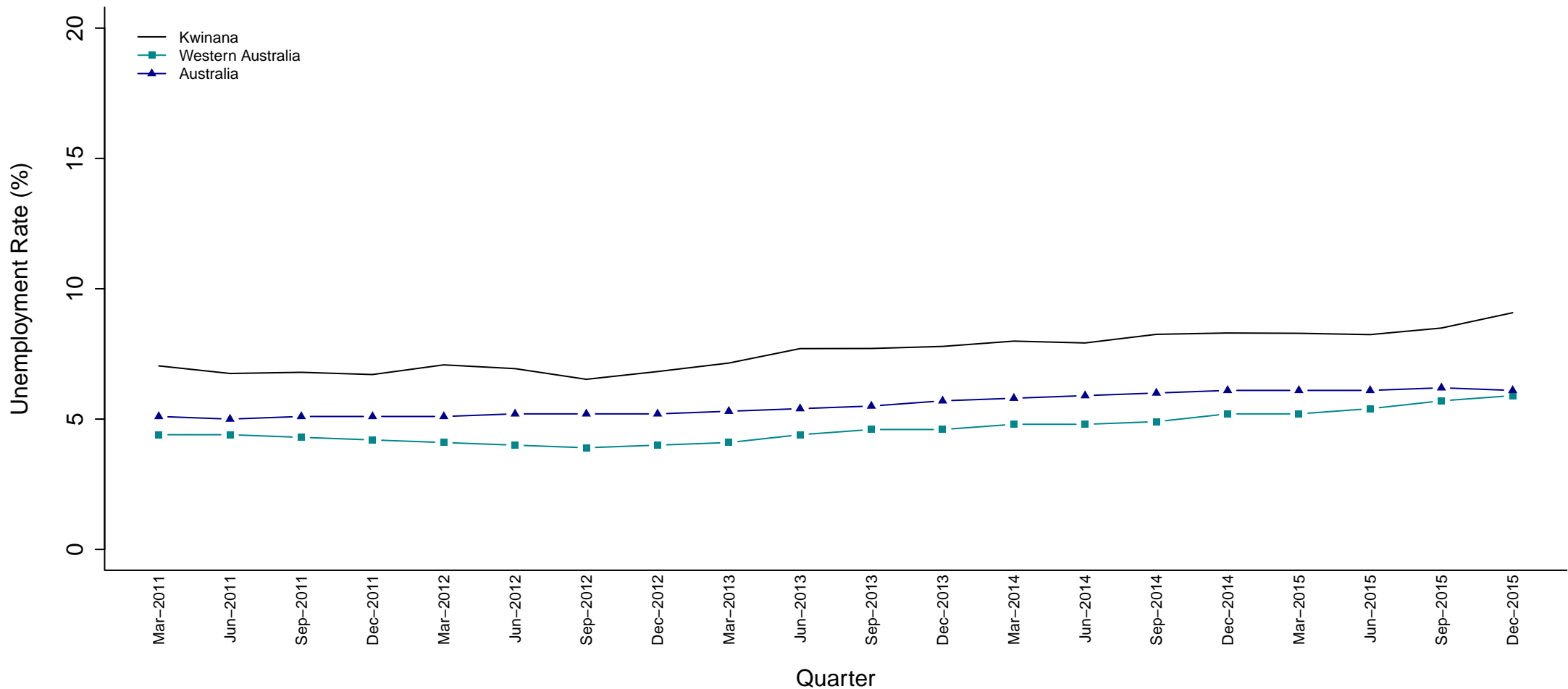

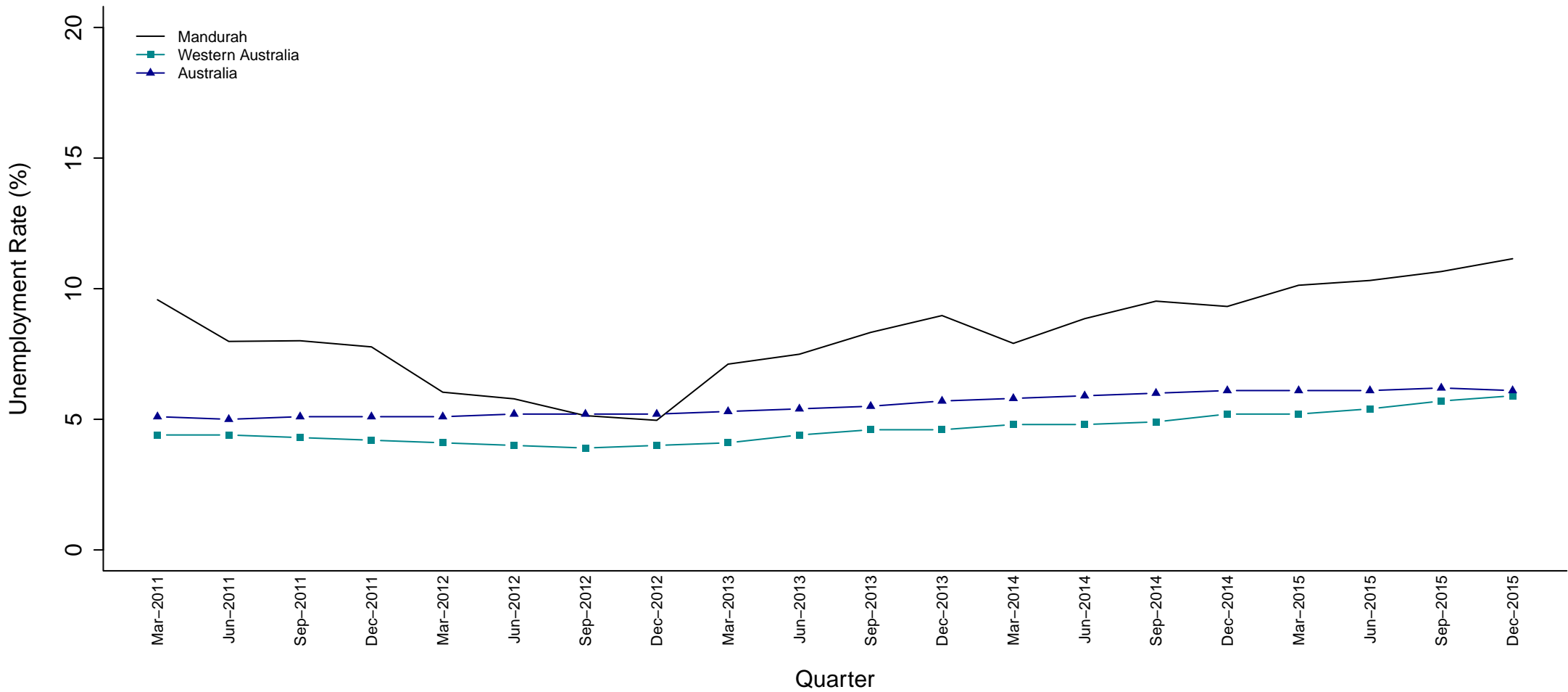

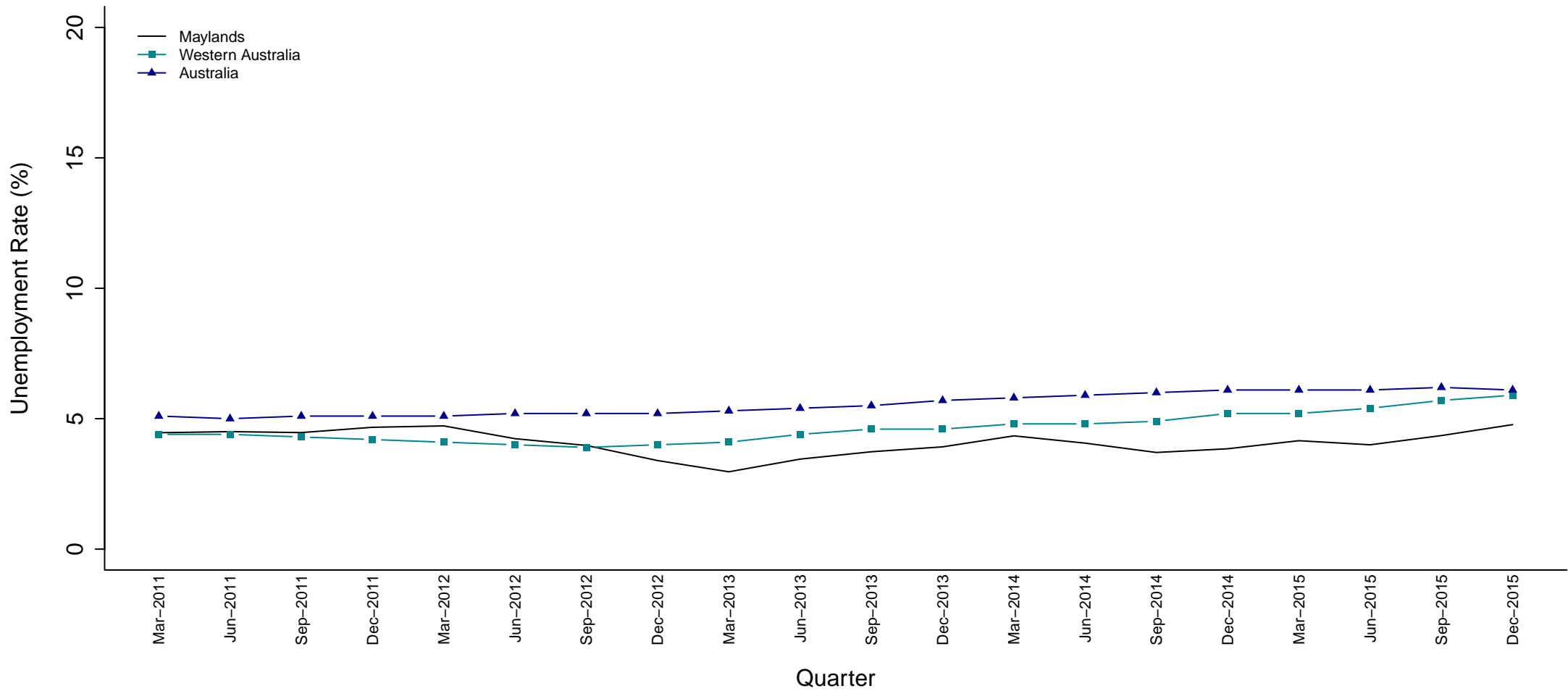

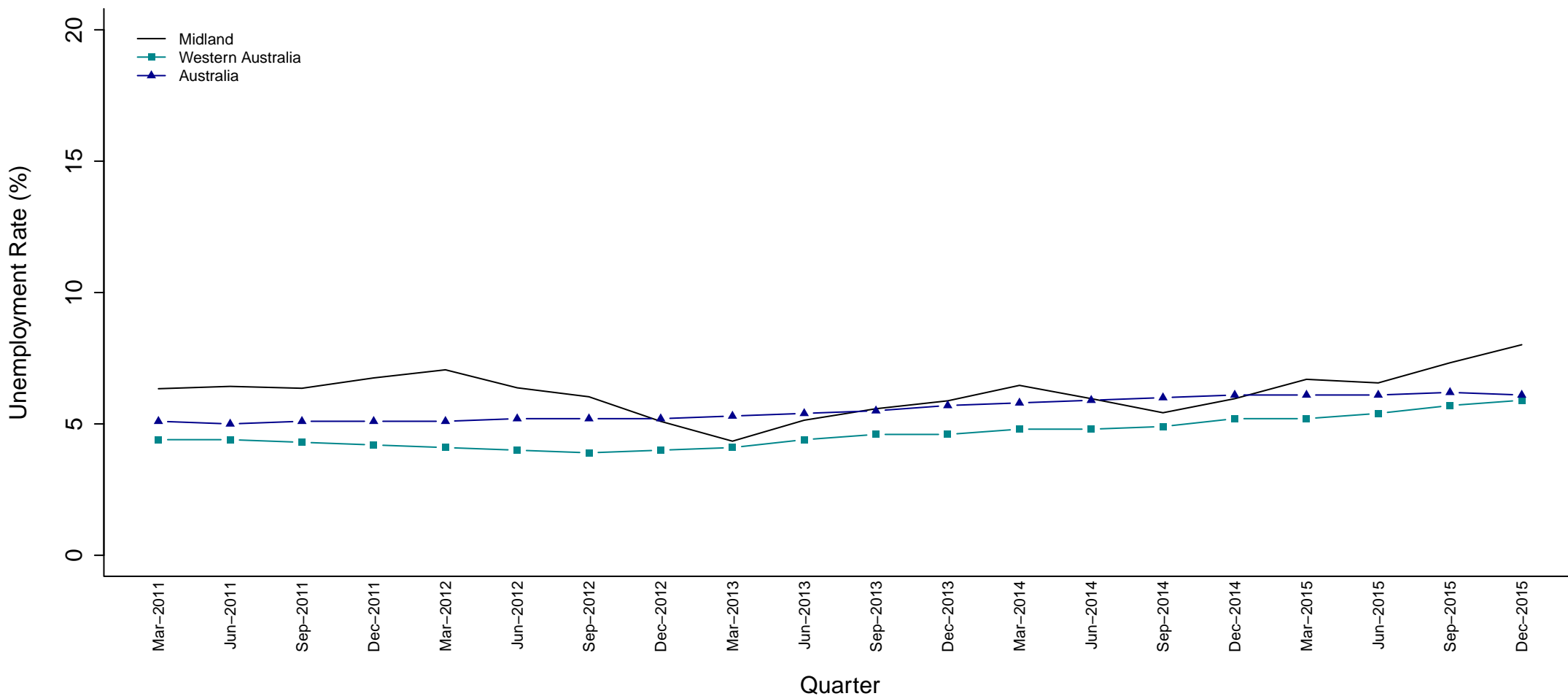

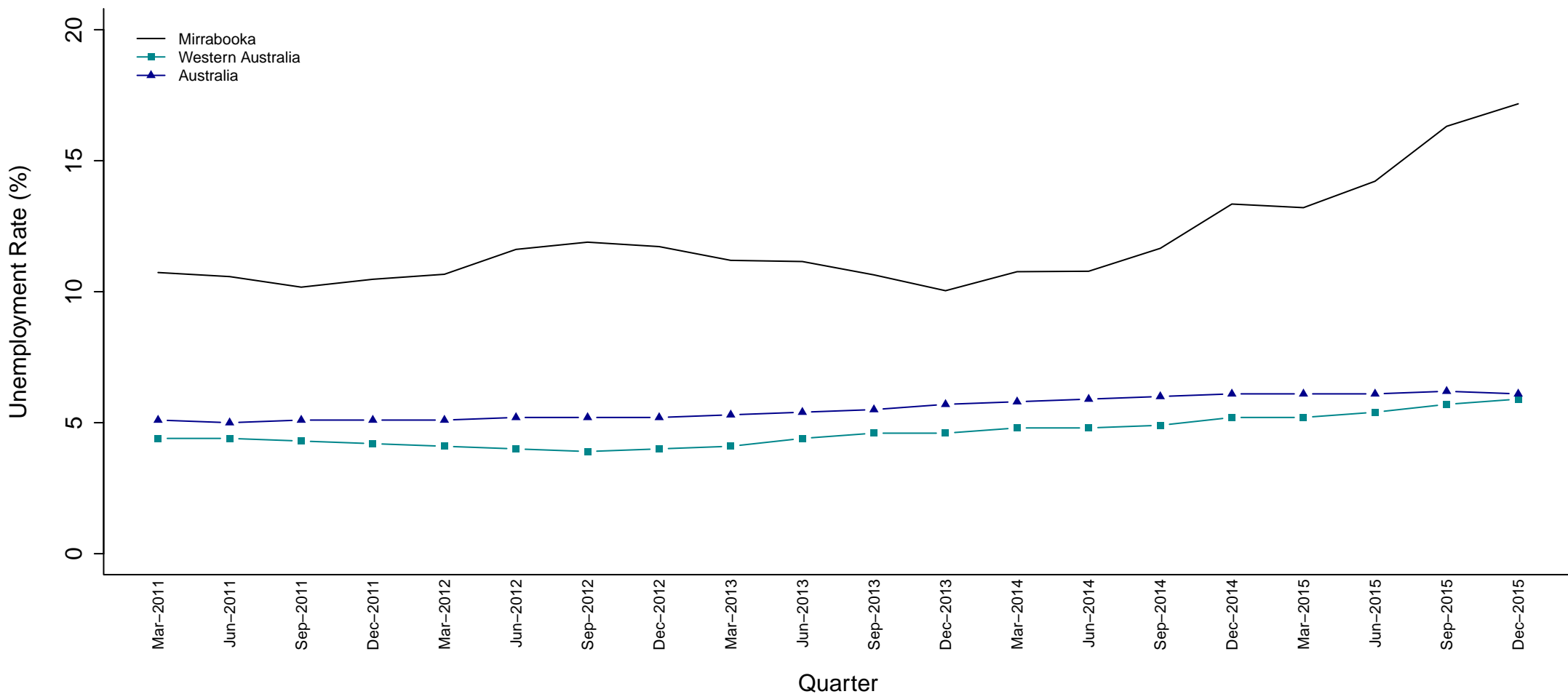

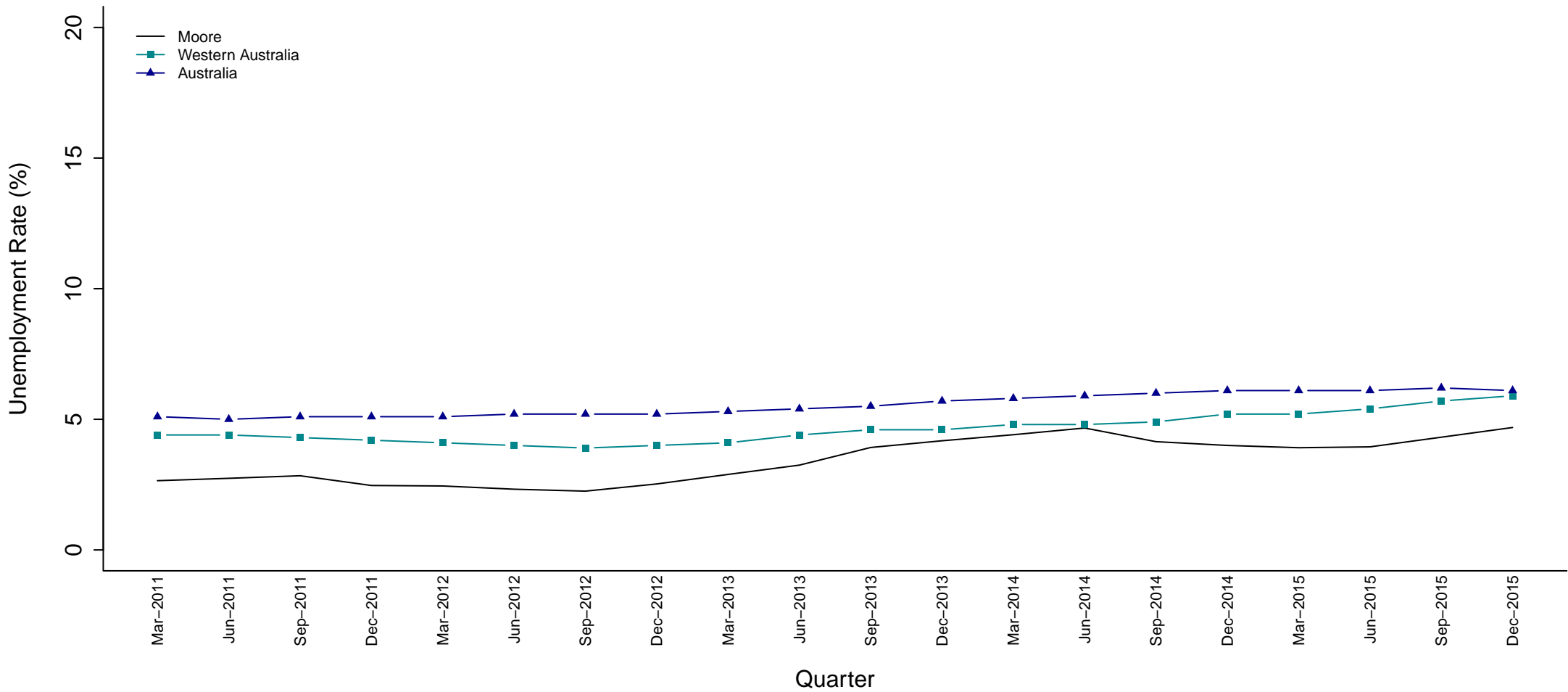

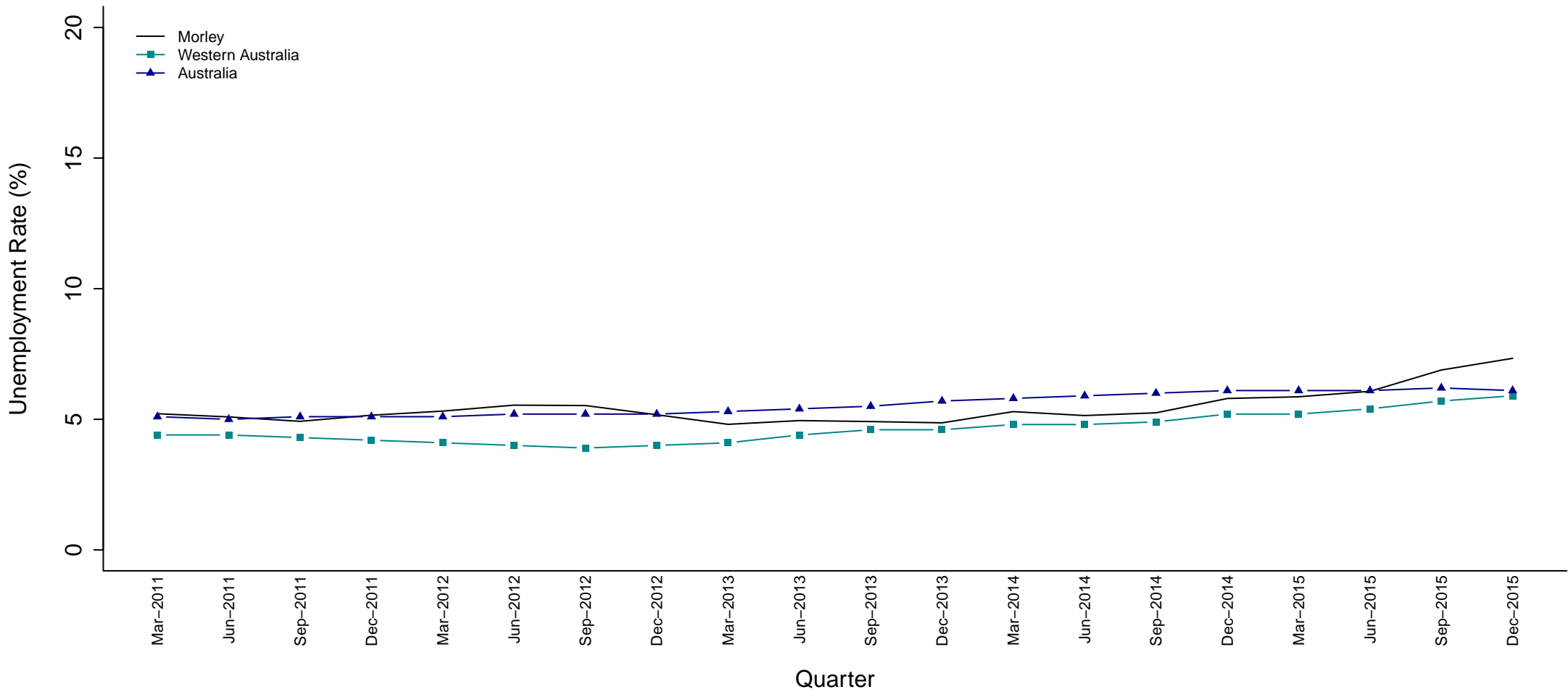

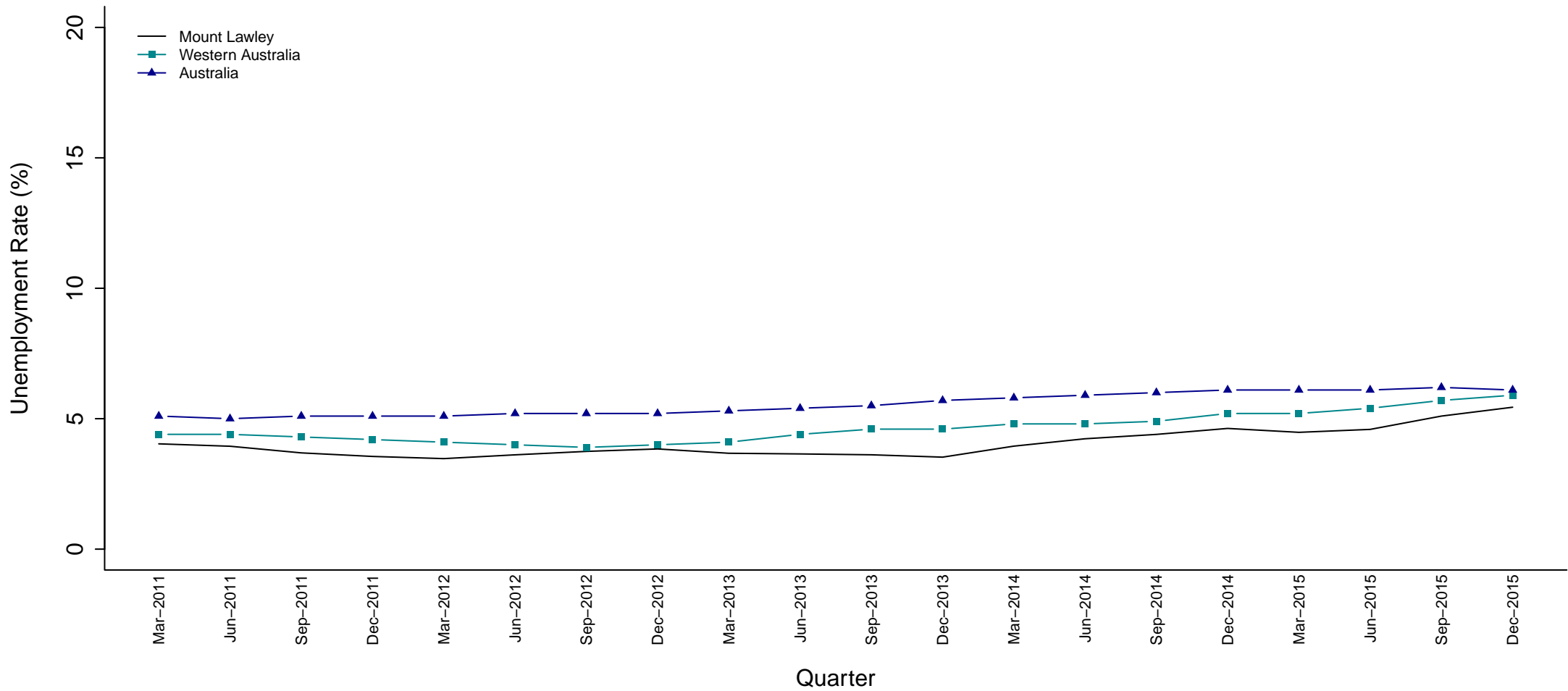

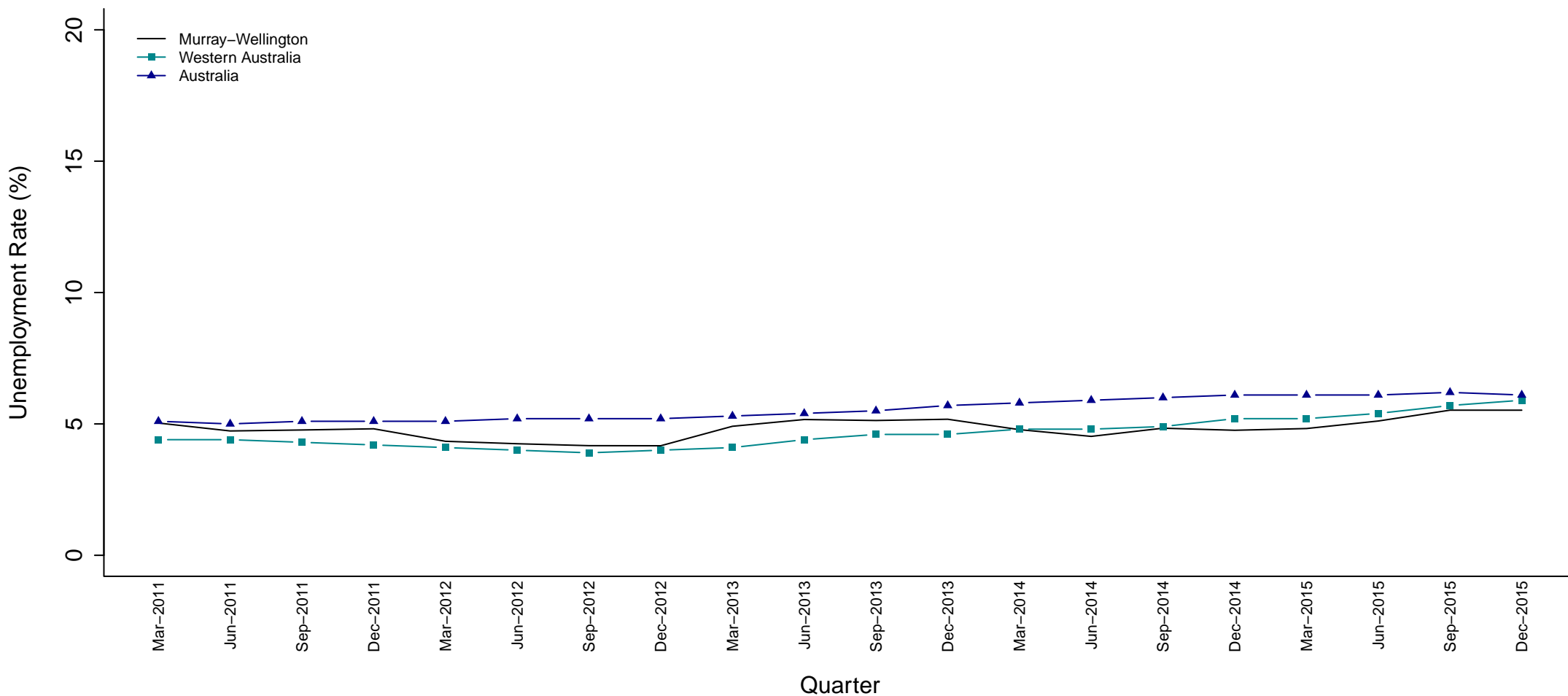

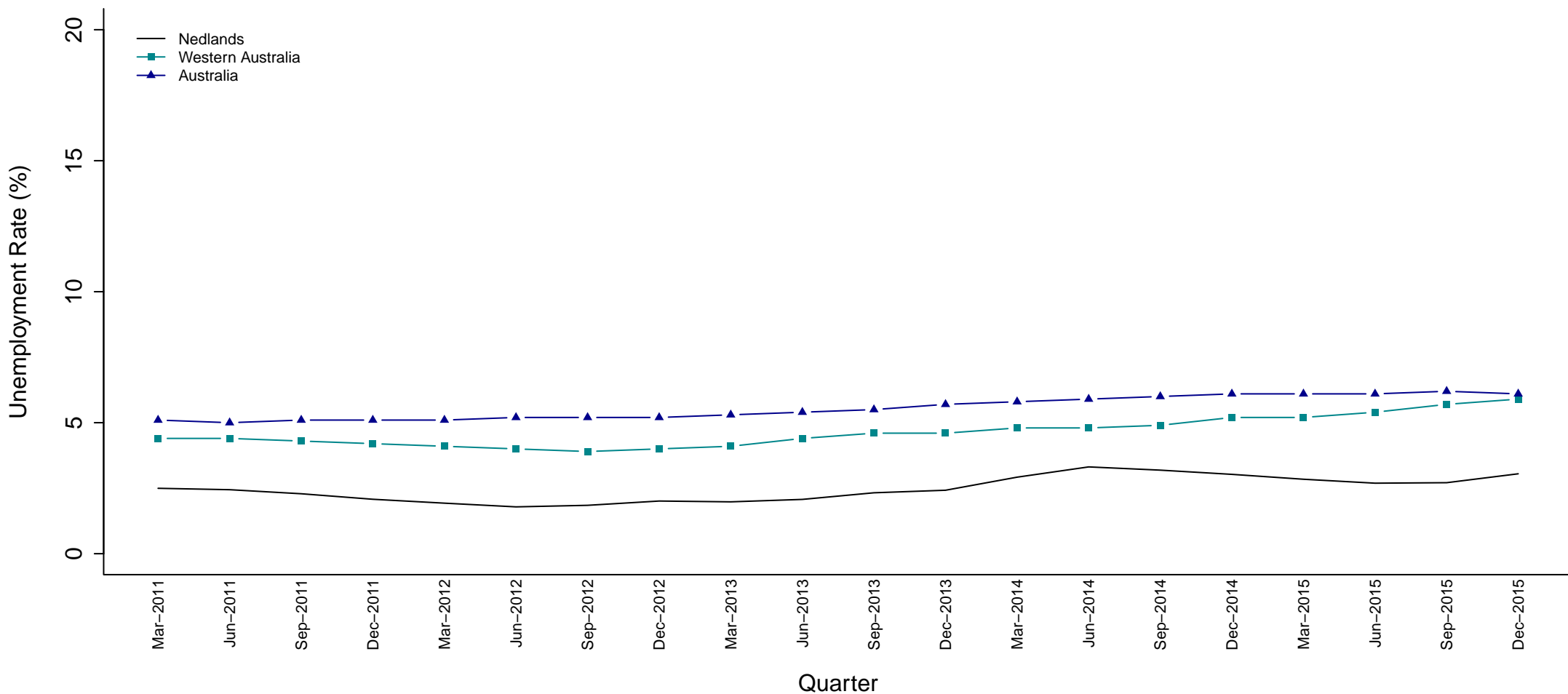

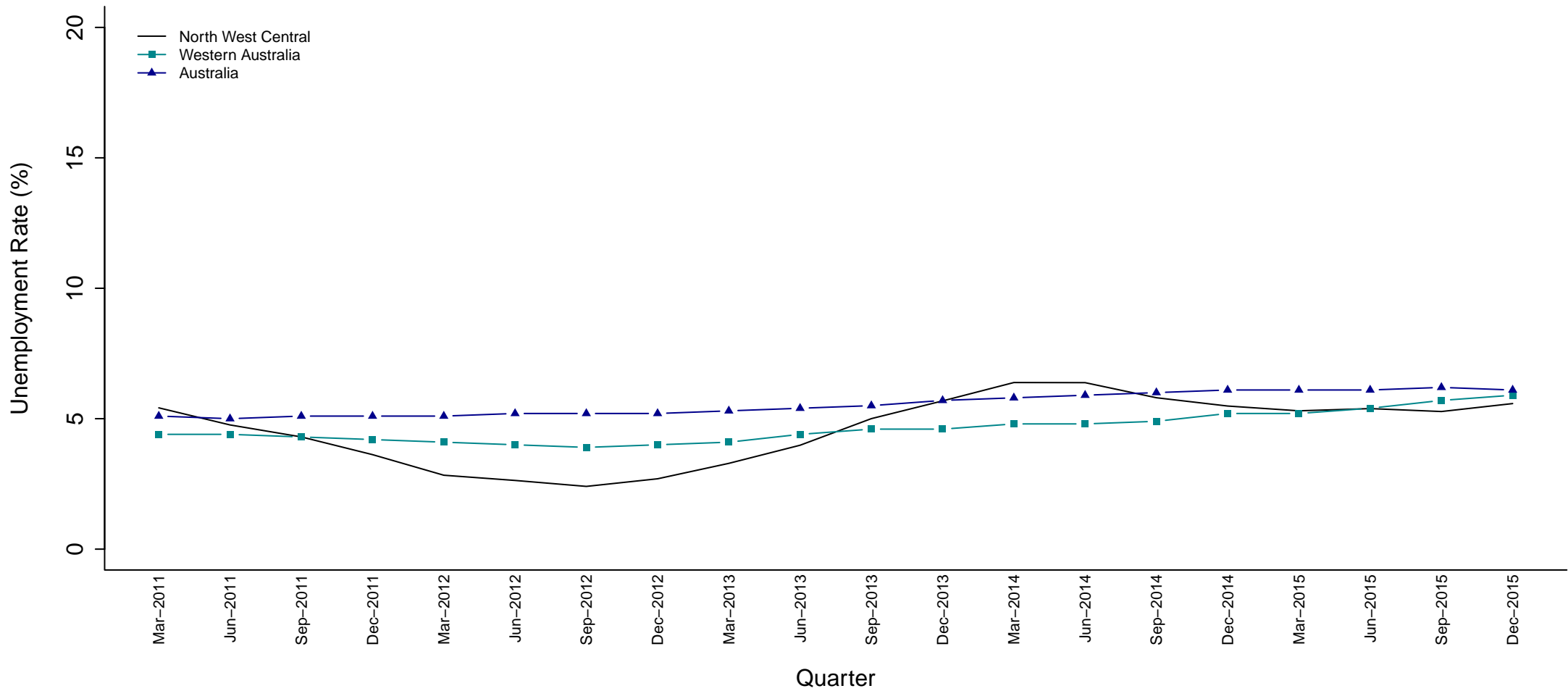

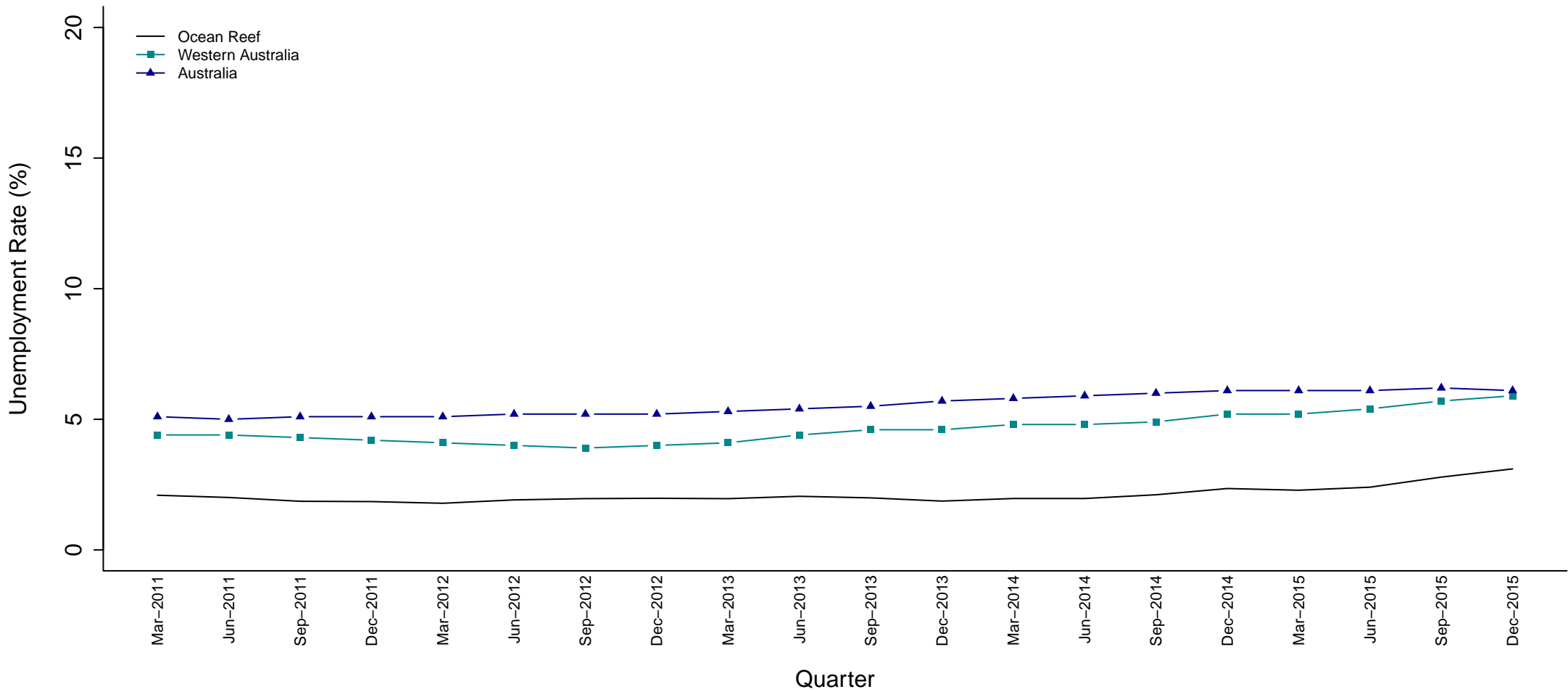

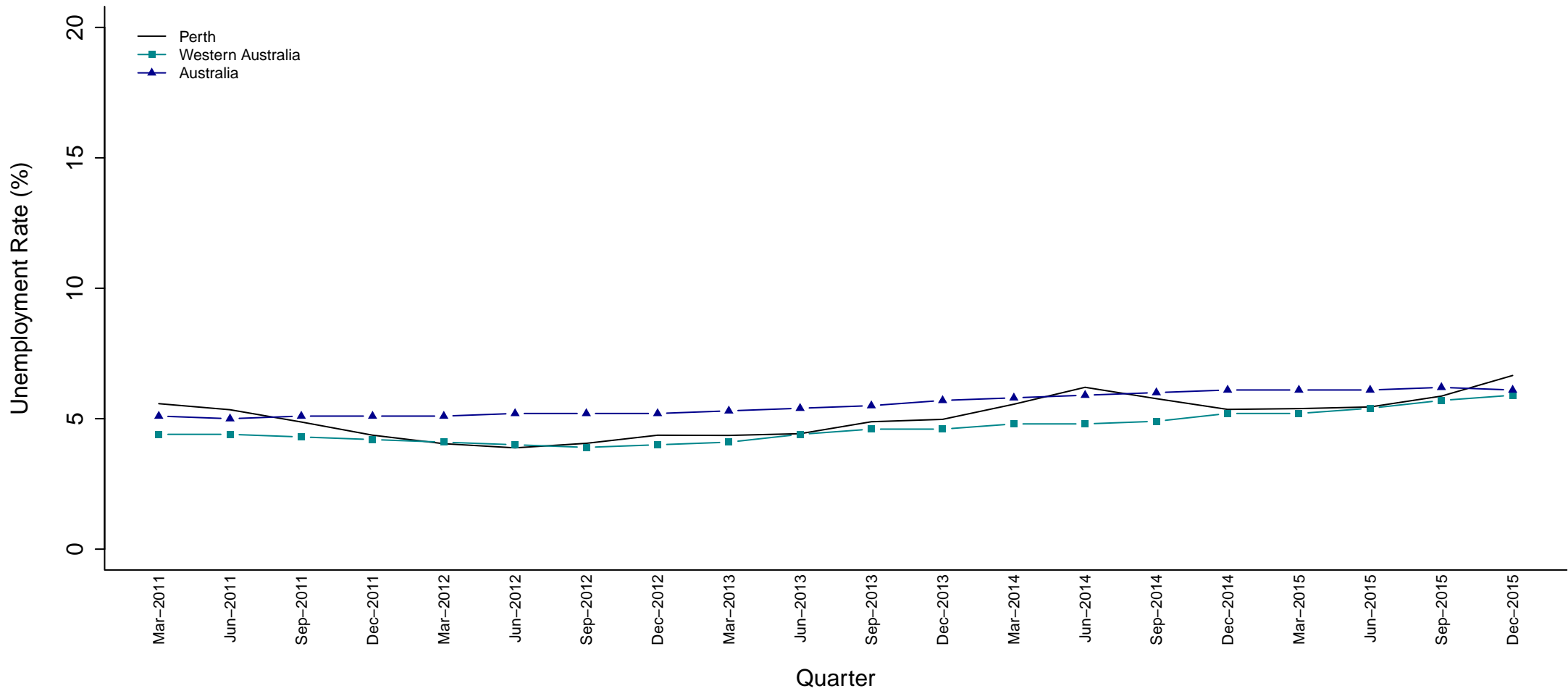

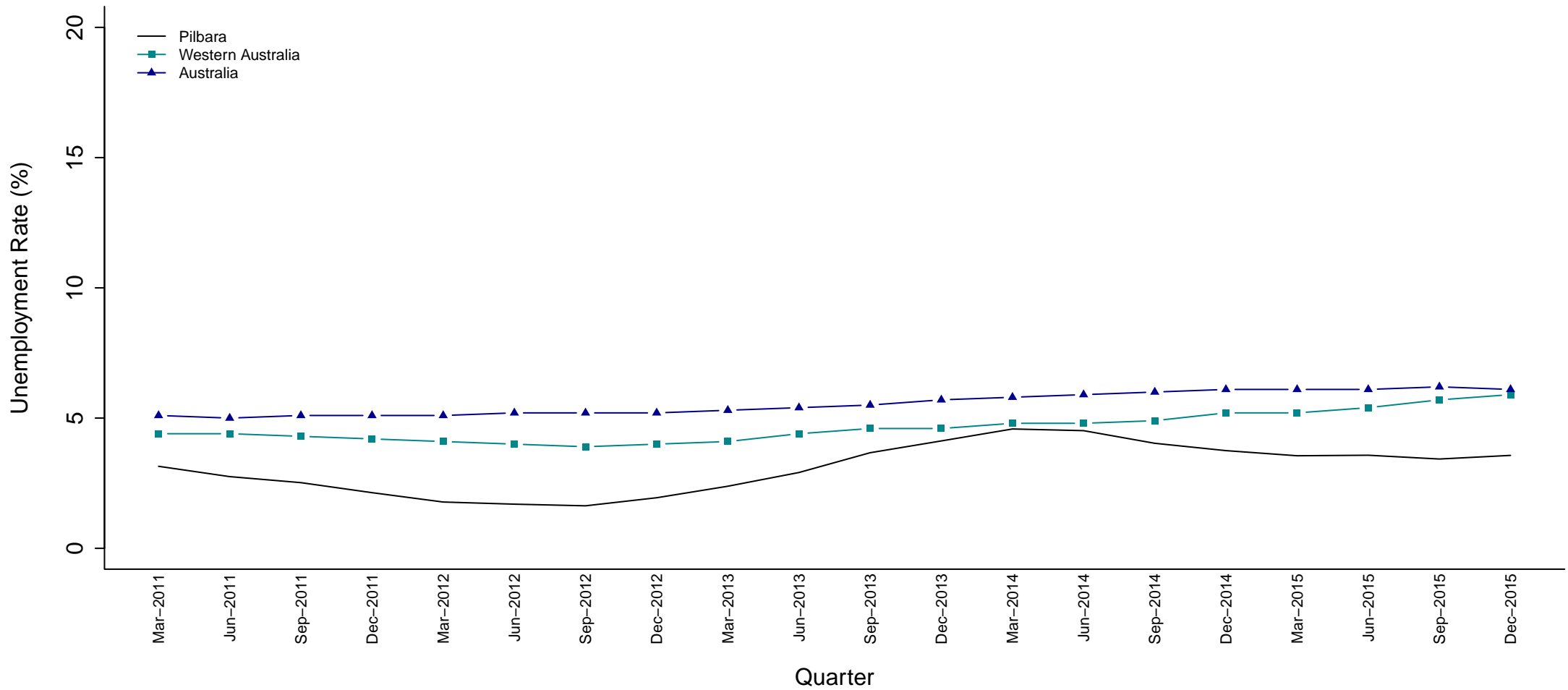

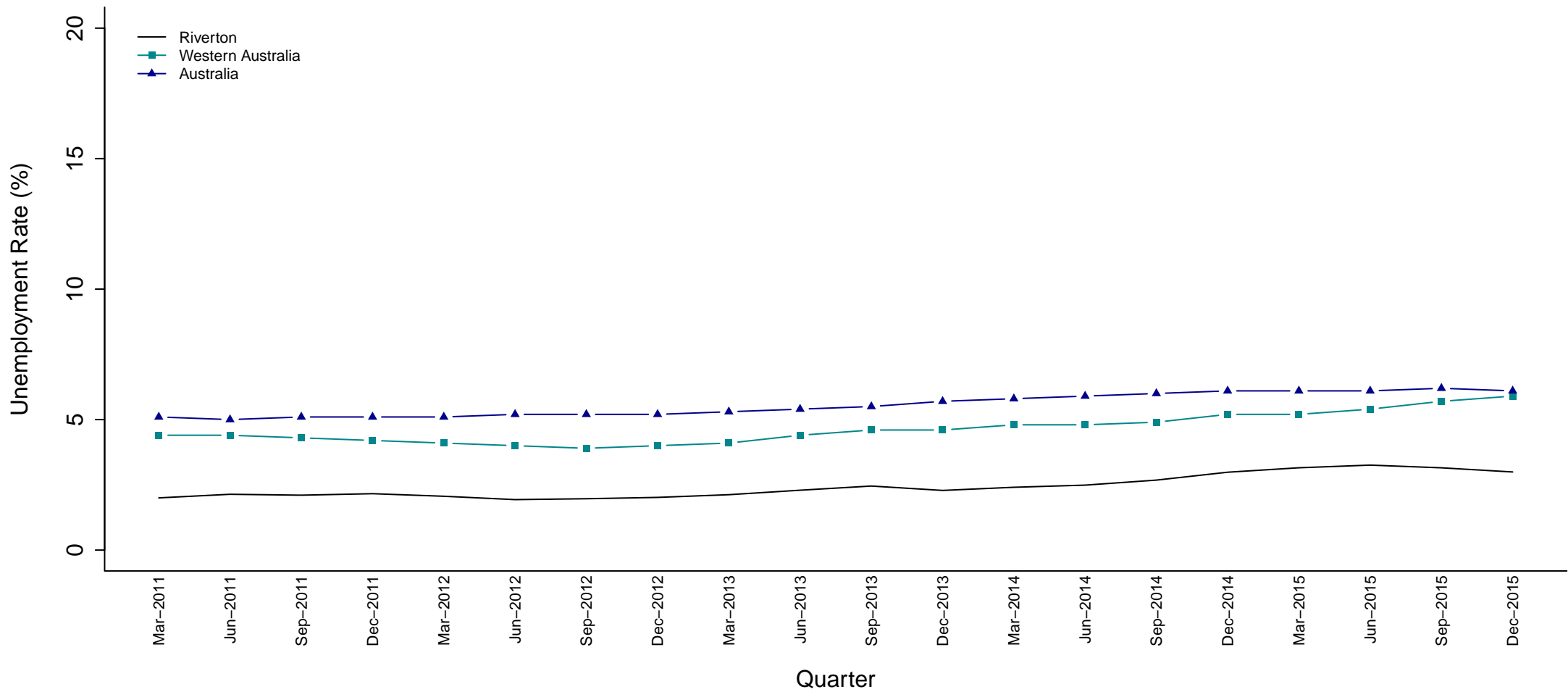

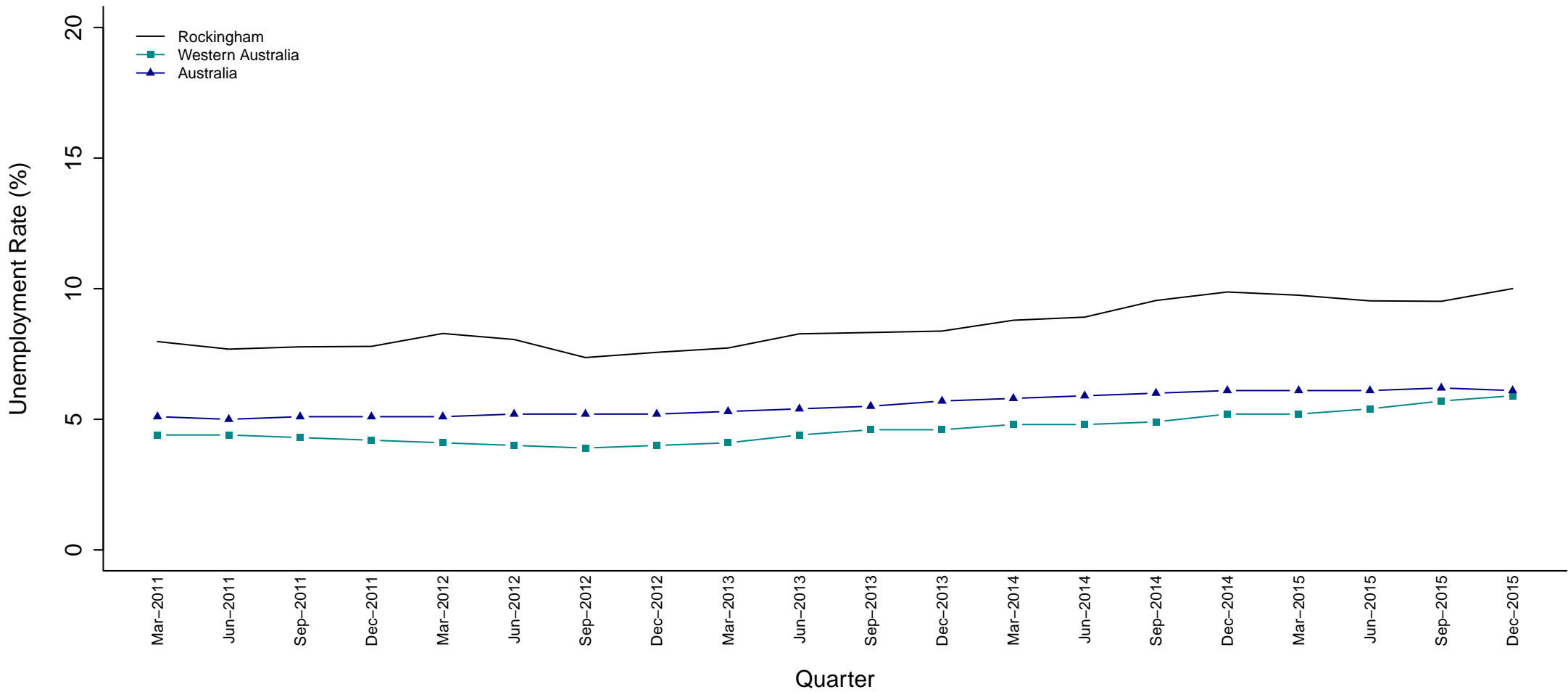

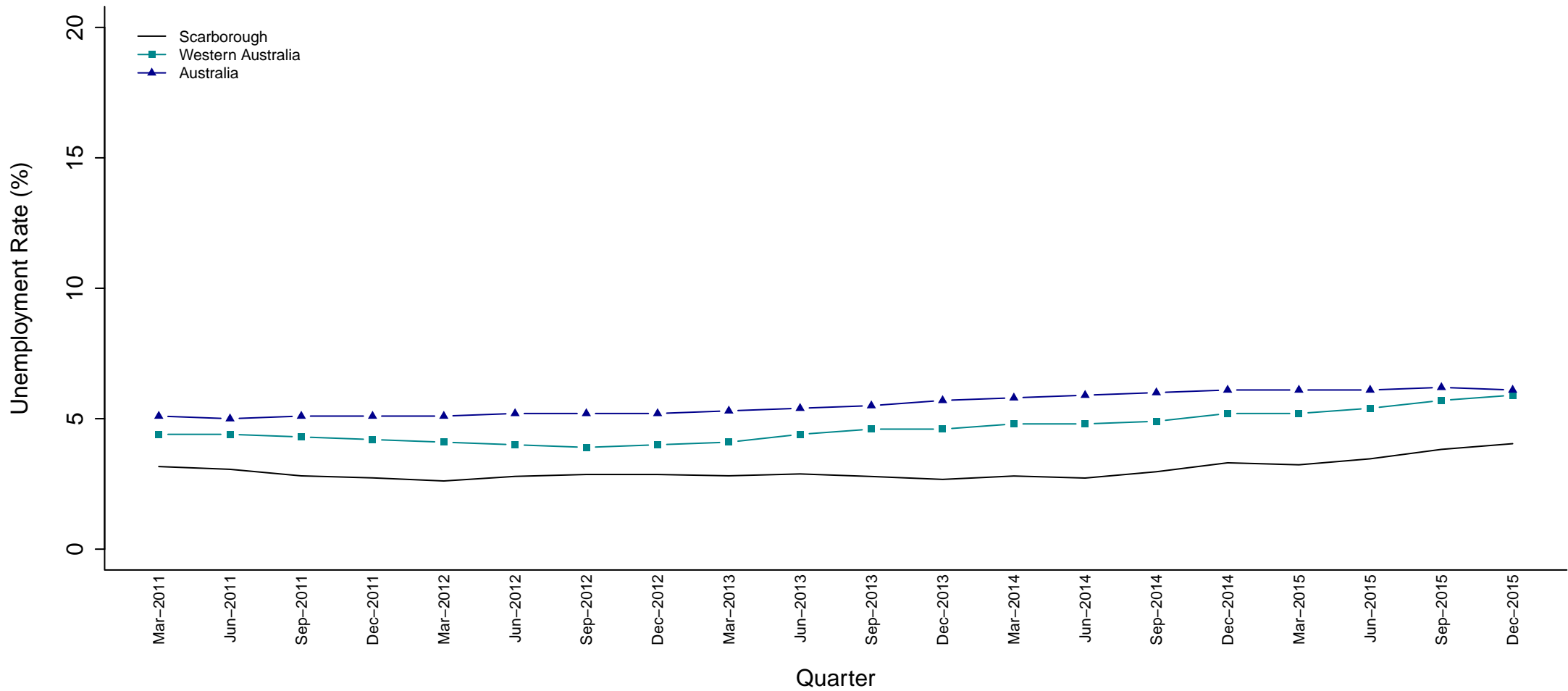

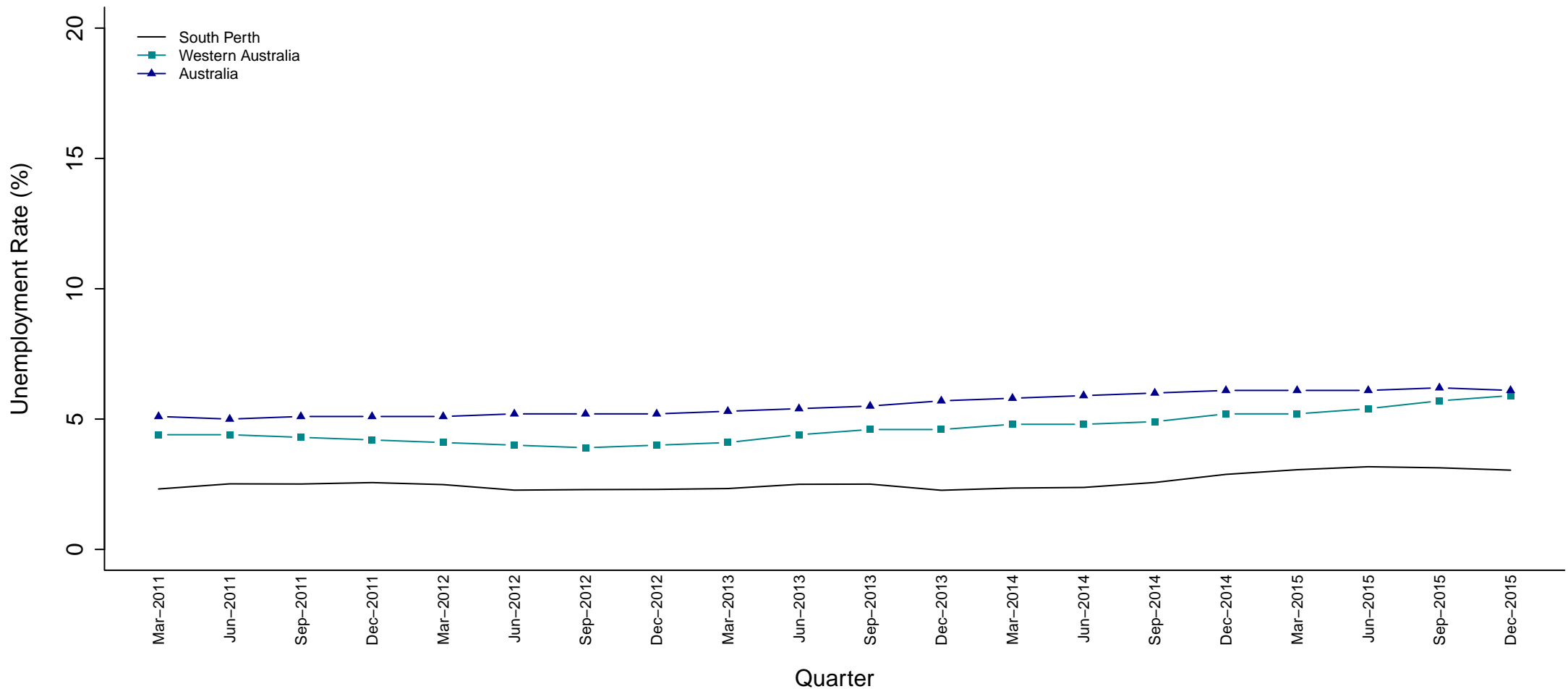

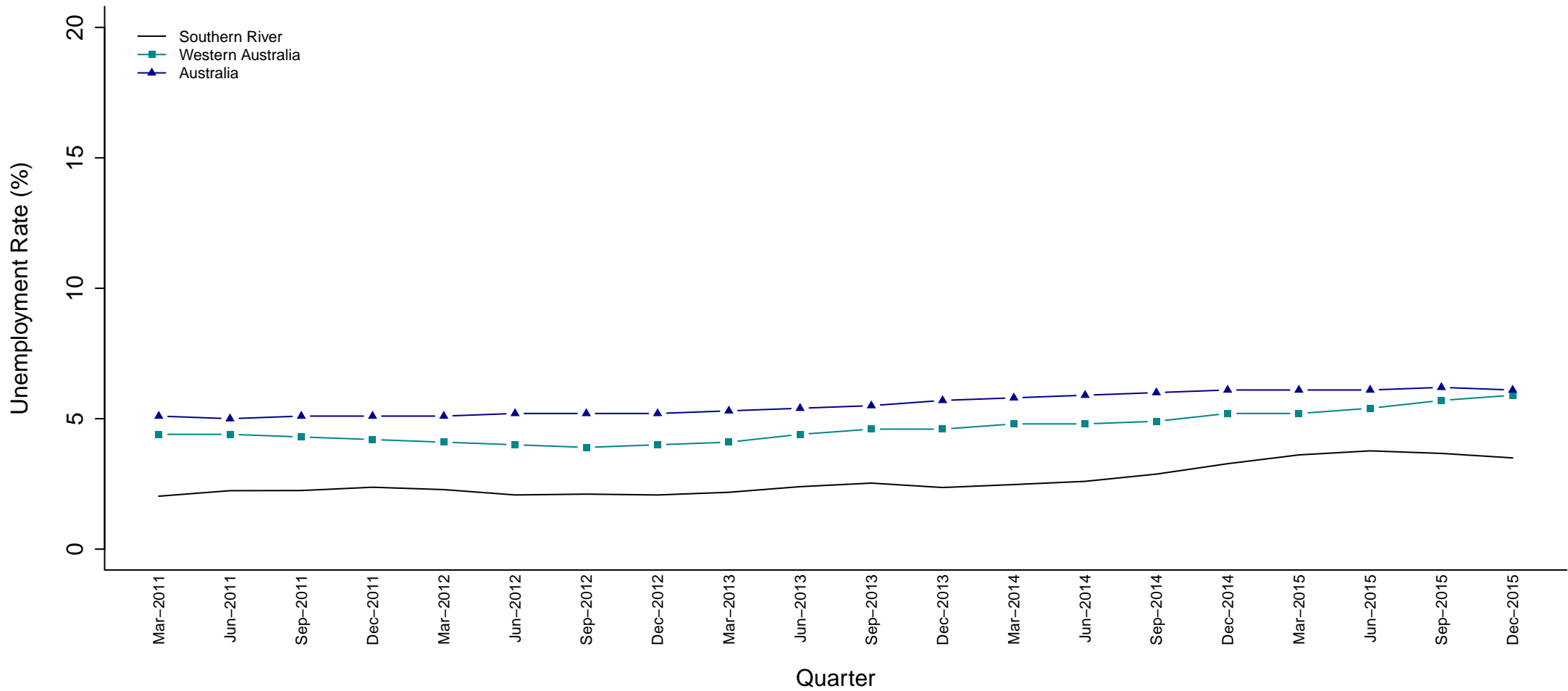

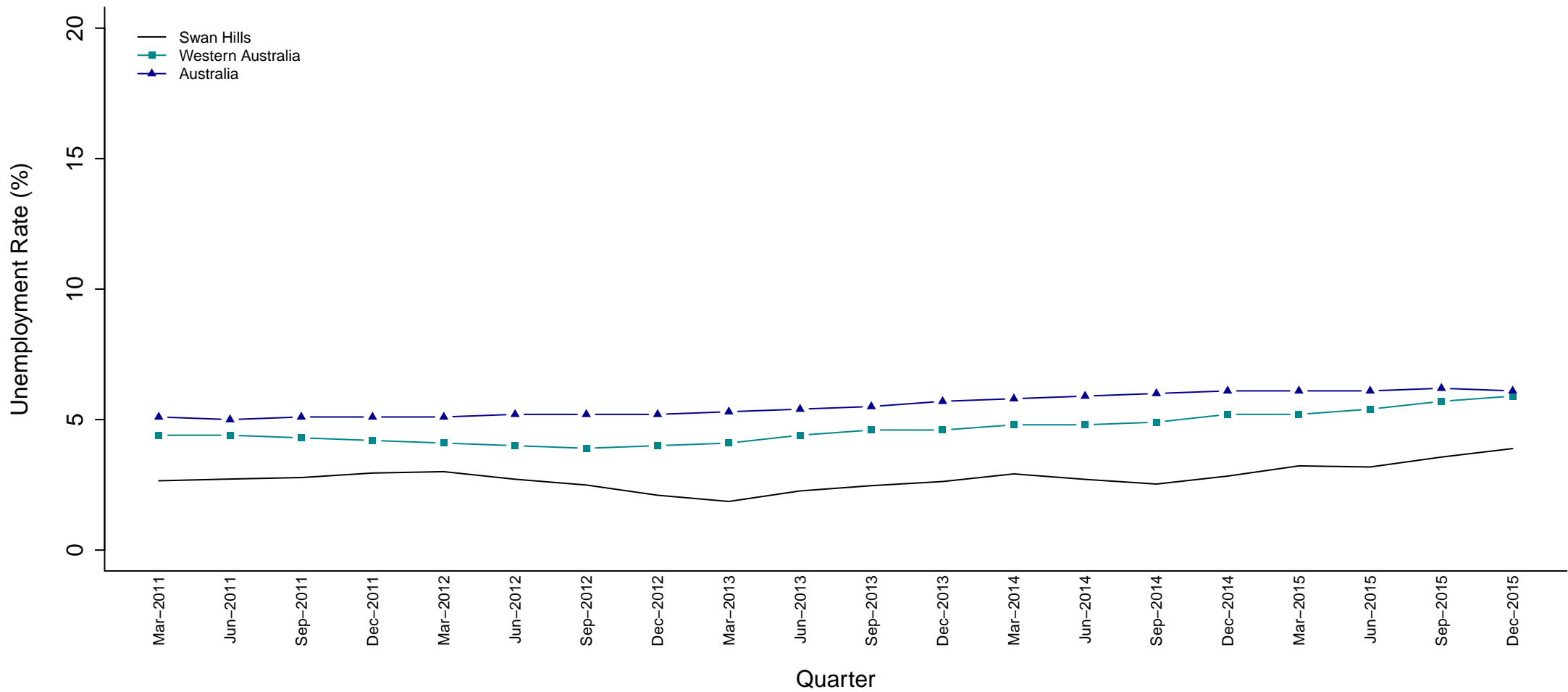

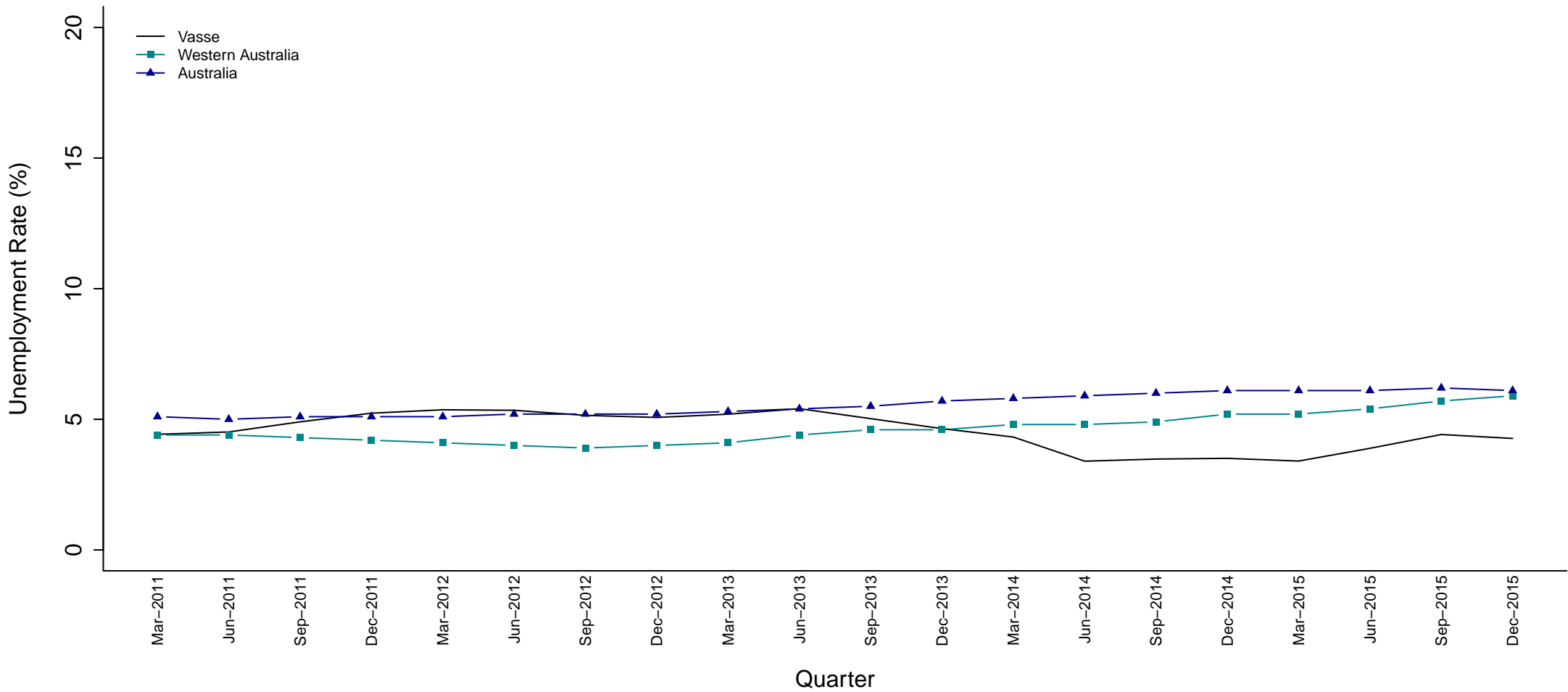

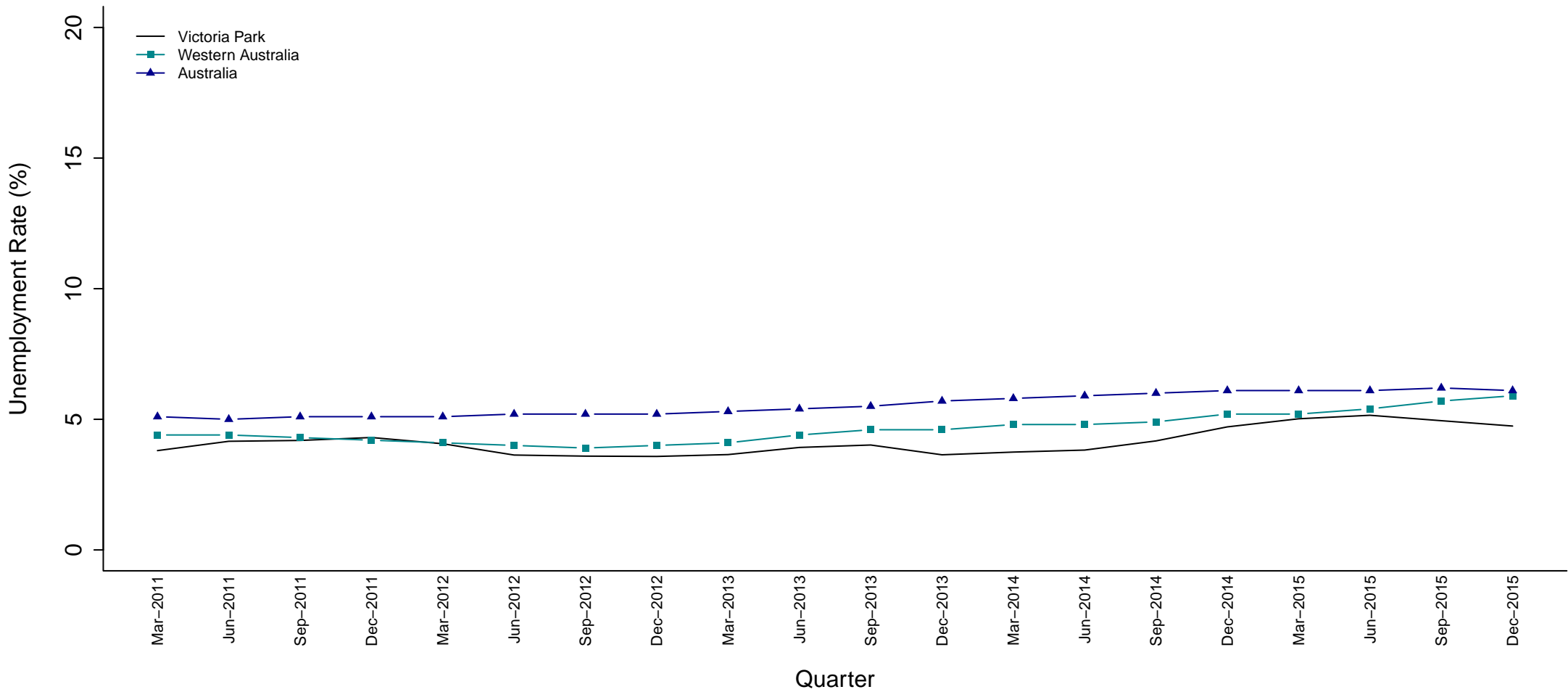

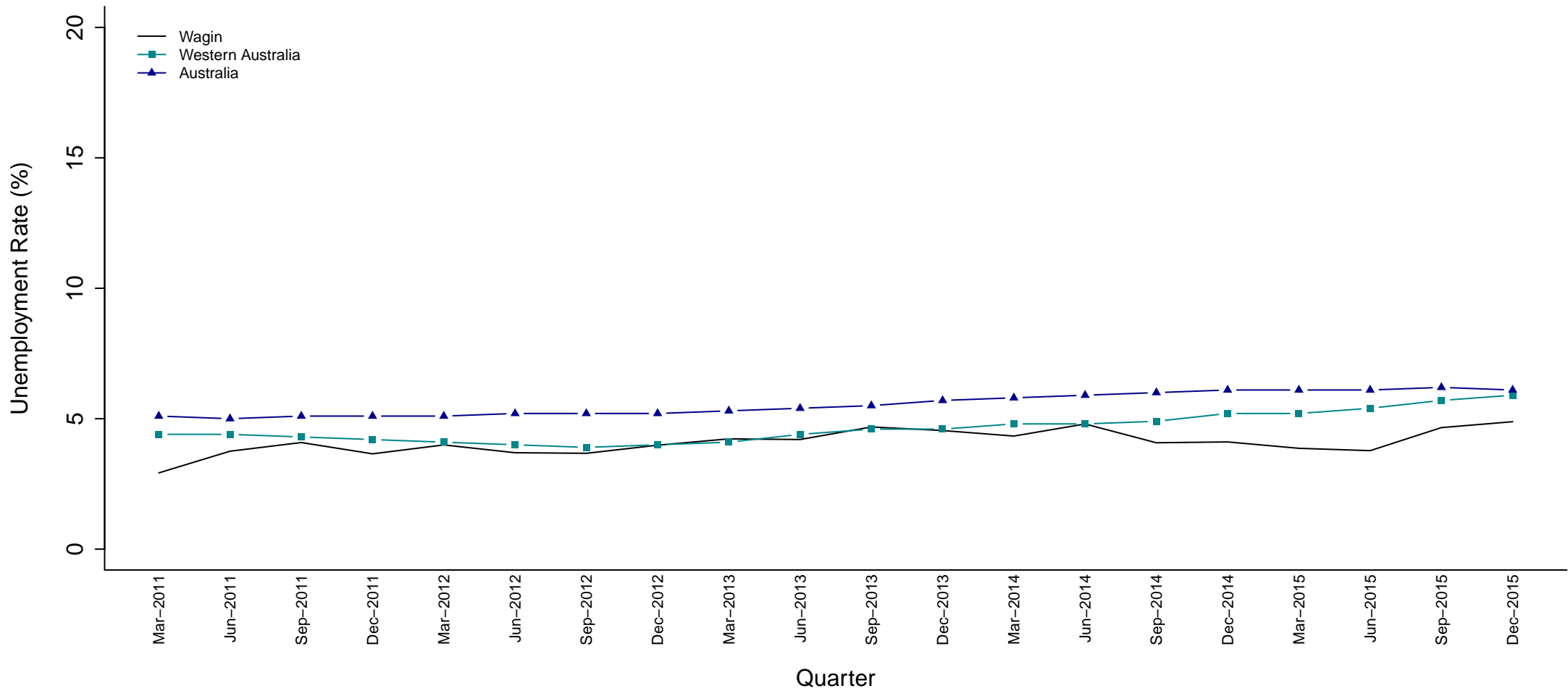

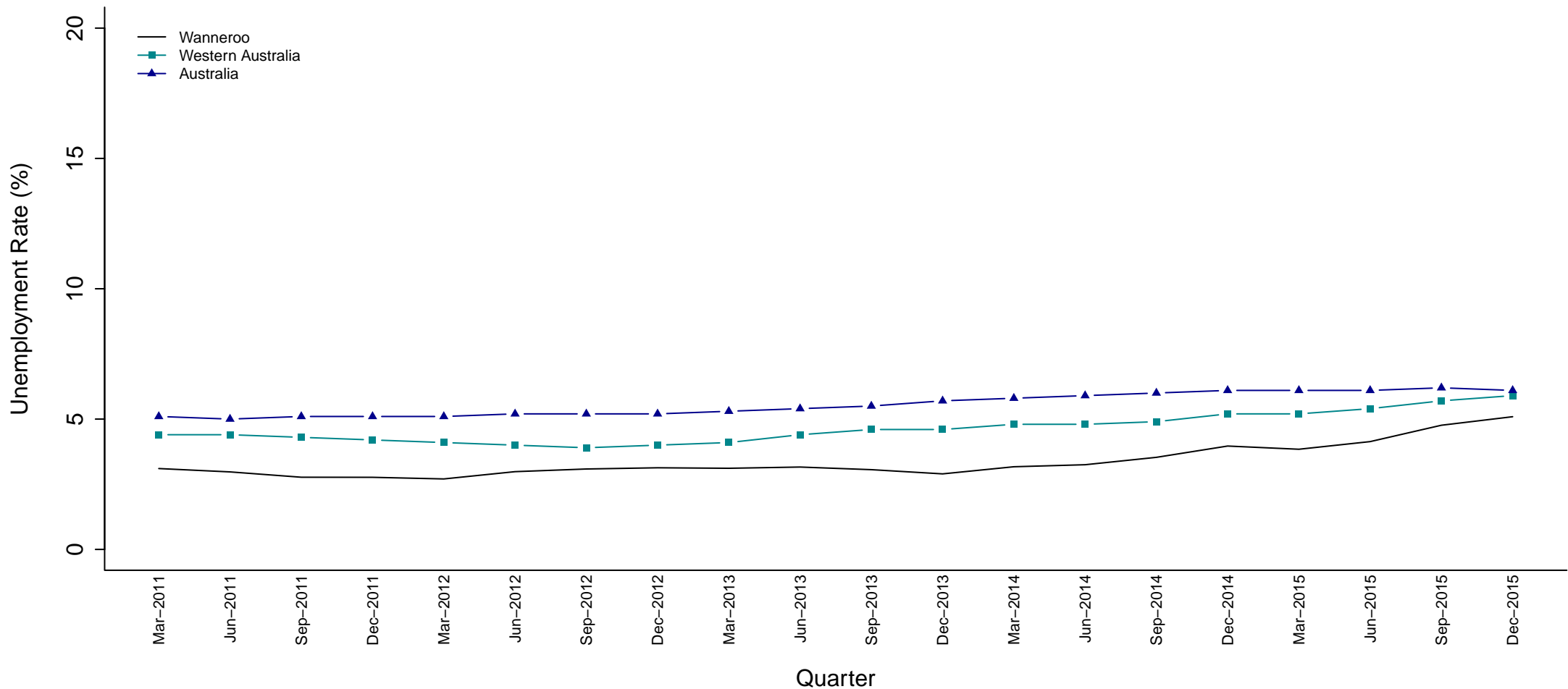

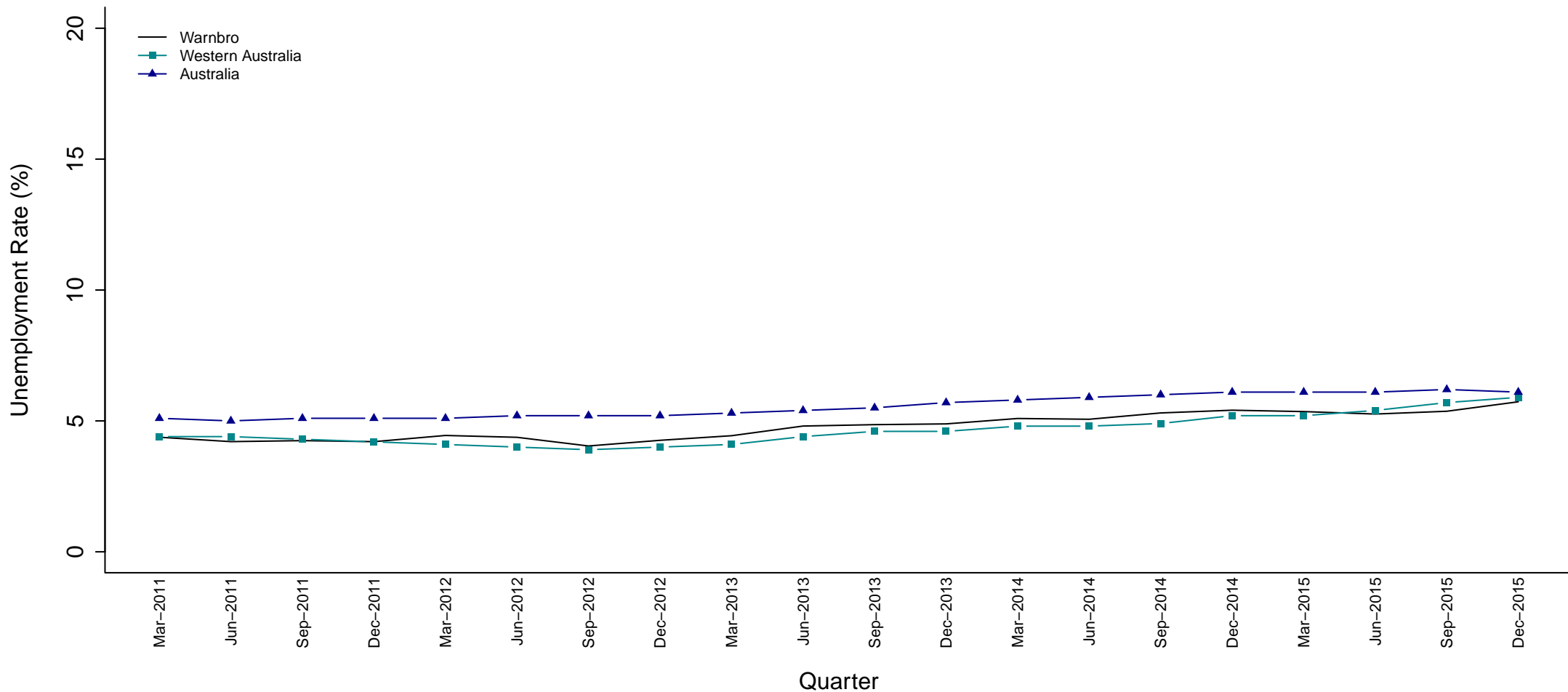

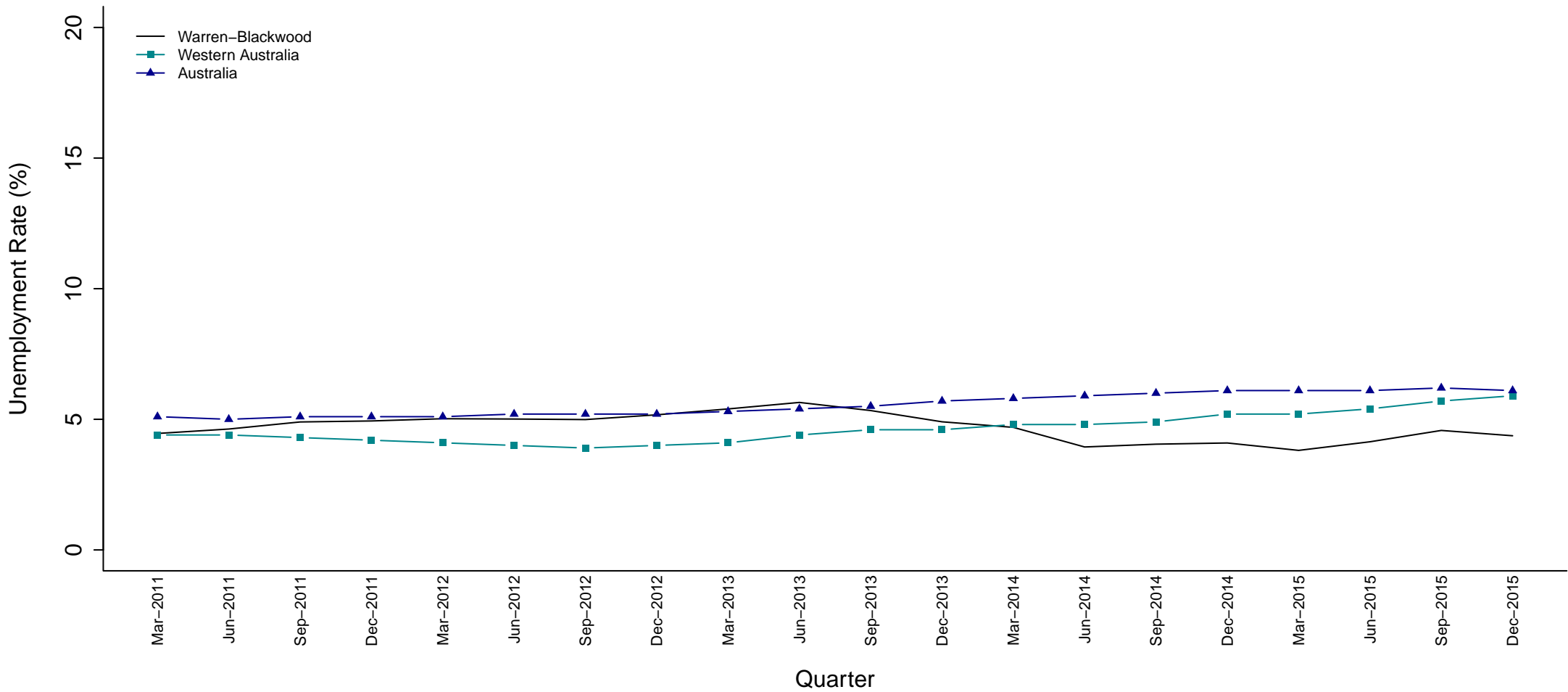

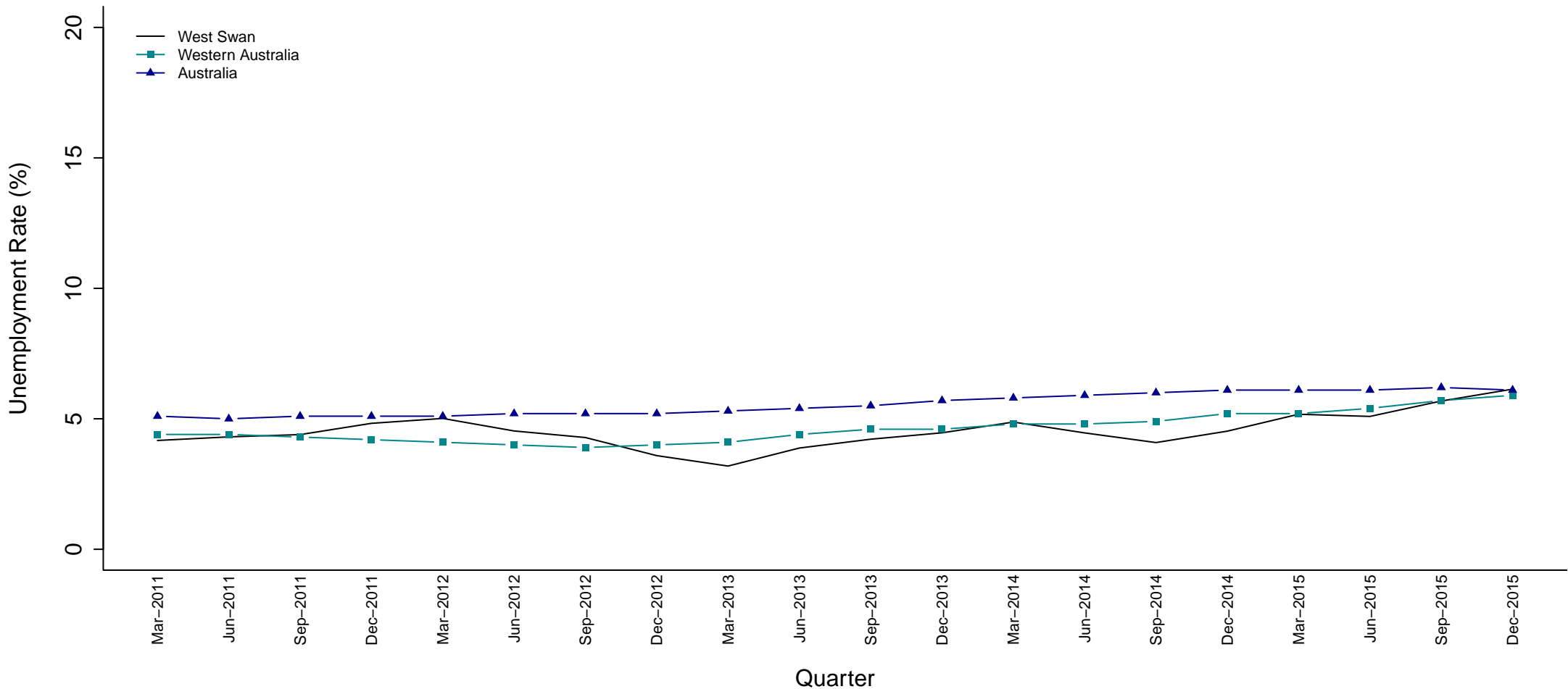

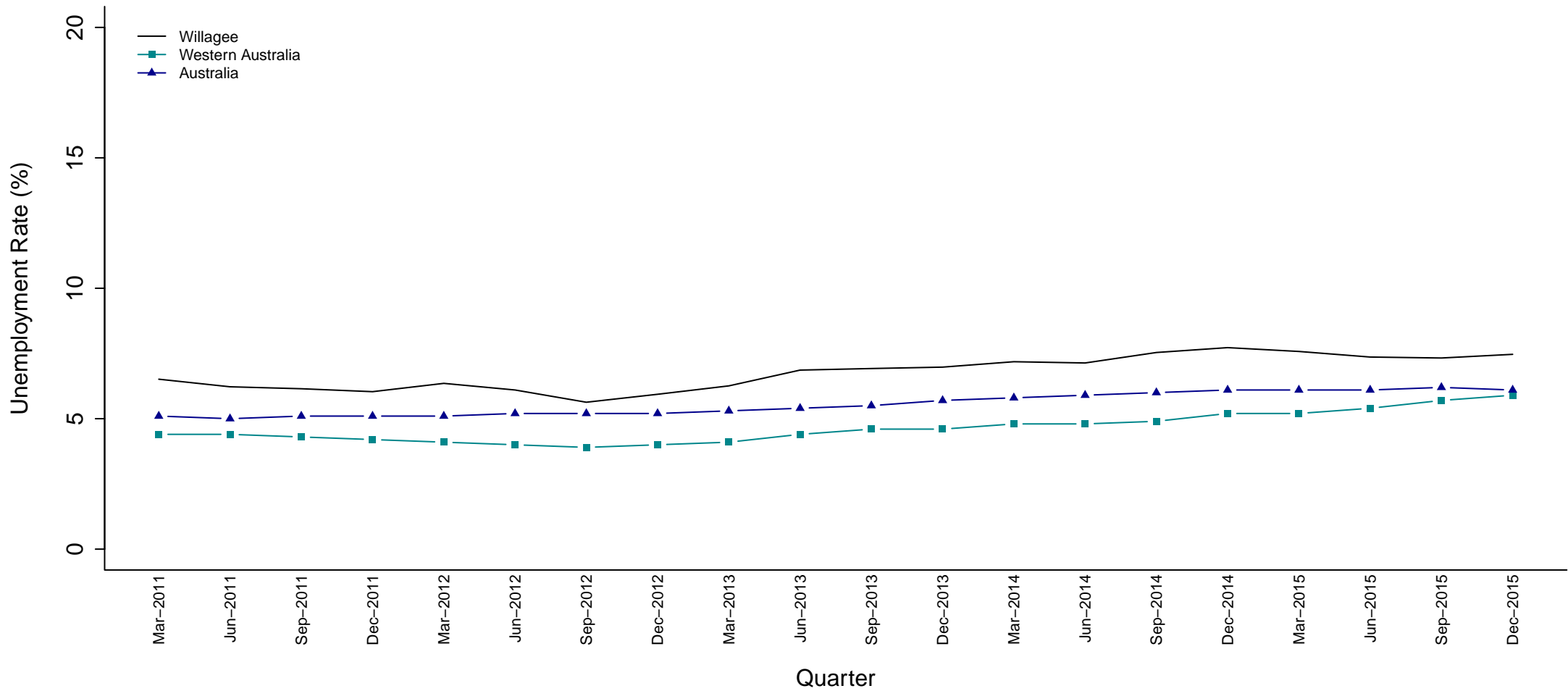
