**Appropriation (Consolidated Fund) Bill  
(No. 2) 2002**

**A Bill for**

**An Act to grant supply and to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Fund certain sums for the capital purposes of the year ending 30 June 2003.**

The Parliament of Western Australia enacts as follows:

**1. Short title**

This Act may be cited as the *Appropriation (Consolidated Fund) Act (No. 2) 2002*.

**2. Commencement**

This Act comes into operation on the day on which it receives the Royal Assent.

**3. Issue and application of moneys**

5 (1) The sum of \$449 253 000 is to be issued and may be applied out of the Consolidated Fund as supply granted to Her Majesty for the year from 1 July 2002 to 30 June 2003.

(2) The sum referred to in subsection (1) is additional to supply granted by the *Appropriation (Consolidated Fund) Bill (No. 1) 2002*.  
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**4. Appropriation for capital purposes**

The sum of \$449 253 000 granted by section 3 as supply to Her Majesty is appropriated from the Consolidated Fund for the capital purposes expressed in Schedule 1 and detailed in the Agency Information in Support of the Estimates for the year.
