1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 12.00 noon pursuant to adjournment.

2. Speaker's Statement – Recent Terrorist Attacks

The Speaker acknowledged the terrorist attacks in Brussels on 22 March 2016, and the recent attacks in Istanbul. Members stood to observe a minute's silence as a sign of respect for the victims of those atrocities.

3. Petitions

Housing Authority Tenants – Ms J.M. Freeman presented a petition from 35 persons asking the Legislative Assembly to call on the Barnett Government to immediately reverse its decision to change the income assessment for Housing Authority tenants, which now incorporates Centrelink and Veteran's Affairs benefits and allowances as assessable income (P. 354).

Group Homes in the Disability Services Commission – Mr D.J. Kelly presented a petition from 12 persons asking the Legislative Assembly to reverse the proposed cuts to Disability Services Commission (DSC) accommodation services, and to ensure that individuals currently in DSC Group homes, their families and guardians are given the choice to stay with their current service provider.
