1238. Mr R.H. Cook to the Minister for Health:

I refer to the consultants who have been engaged for work on the Fiona Stanley Hospital Project, can the Minister please detail:

- (a) which companies/organisations have been engaged as consultants on the Fiona Stanley Hospital Project;
- (b) what are the contracts they have been awarded for; and
- (c) what is the value of each of these contracts?

For each quarter from January 2012 to June 2013 can the Minister please provide the average weighted separation costs and the number of average weighted separations for each of the hospitals below:

1240. Mr R.H. Cook to the Minister for Health:

I refer to partnerships that WA Health has undertaken with the following organisations: Farmsafe WA Alliance; Injury Control Council of WA; Kidsafe WA; Ngala Community Services; Oral Health Centre of WA; Royal Flying Doctor Service of WA; Royal Life Saving Society; Silver Chain WA; St John of God Health Care; Cancer Council WA; Heart Foundation (WA Division); and Western Australian Aids Council, and ask, for each organisation:

- (a) what has been the budget from WA Health in 2009–2010, 2010–2011, 2011–2012, 2012–2013;
- (b) what is the budget for each of these programs in 2013–2014, 2014–2015, 2015–2016;
- (c) what services have WA Health contracted these organisations to undertake;
- (d) when will each of these contracts expire; and
- (e) what will be the contract renewal process for each of these partnerships?

1241. Mr C.J. Tallentire to the Minister for Environment:

- (1) Will the Western Australian government adopt a modified approach to greenhouse gas conditions applied under the *Environmental Protection Act* when the Australian Government repeals the *Clean Energy Act* and abolishes the carbon price, consistent with the Minister's public statements about potentially reapplying greenhouse gas mitigation conditions in such an eventuality?
- (2) Given the Australian Government's concession that failure to achieve Australia's 5 percent 2020 target would be preferable to increased abatement funding, and the Prime Minister's statement that no polluters are expected to pay penalties under its scheme, what measures will the Western Australian government consider to ensure that greenhouse gas emissions from projects in Western Australia are managed in a manner consistent with the objectives of the *Environmental Protection Act*?

- (3) Does the Government acknowledge that greenhouse gas emissions from major projects in Western Australia will continue to contribute to adverse impacts on the global and local environment and need to be accurately identified and controlled?
- (4) If yes to (3):
 - (a) what is the threshold above which the Government considers greenhouse gas emissions to constitute a significant environmental threat; and
 - (b) will proponents of major projects be required to publicly report greenhouse gas emissions in the interests of transparency and public accountability?
- (5) If no to (3) why not?
- (6) When consulting with the Australian Government on implementation of the Direct Action Plan, will the Western Australian government support penalties for industries with increasing emission intensities, and if not, why not?
