  - (i) at present; and
  - (ii) for each school year from 2008 to 2014;
- (p) what is the total number of student enrolments aged 12 and over at St Mary’s College Broome for each school year from 2008 to 2015 today;
- (q) will the Minister please specify, at St. Mary’s College Broome, how many students aged 12 and over are classified as “at educational risk”:
  - (i) at present; and
  - (ii) for each school year from 2008 to 2014;
- (r) will the Minister please specify, at St. Mary’s College Broome, how many students aged 12 or over are classified as “at severe educational risk”:
  - (i) at present; and
  - (ii) for each school year from 2008 to 2014; and
- (s) if the Government does not collect this information for St. Mary’s College Broome, can the Minister identify who does?

- (e) please provide details of all types of crashes and accidents, including those involving pedestrians that have occurred in the period as stated in answer to 1 above for the intersections of (a) Denny Avenue and Streich Avenue, and (b) Denny Avenue and Railway Avenue.; and
- (f) over the same period as stated in answer to 1 above, has there been an accidents of any description involving any form of transport, including walking at the level crossing on Denny Avenue? If yes please provide details of all crashes and accidents over the said period?

**4619. Mr D.J. Kelly to the Minister for Water:**

I refer to the current water supply pipe from the Serpentine Pipehead Dam to the Jarrahdale township and I ask:

- (a) when was the current water supply pipe built;
- (b) how long is it;
- (c) have any sections of the pipe been replaced since it was constructed;
- (d) how many leaks have been identified in the pipe in each of the last 5 financial years;
- (e) how many patches are there currently on the pipe;
- (f) how many leaks have been repaired using the black tape that is visible on the pipe and what is the longevity of these repairs;

- (g) how long is it expected to be before the pipe will be replaced;
- (h) what is the anticipated cost of this replacement in today's dollars;
- (i) how much water has been lost from the pipe in each of the last 5 financial years;
- (j) how much does it cost each year to maintain the pipe;
- (k) has the water in that pipe ever failed to meet the required standard at any time since 2002;
- (l) how old are the water tanks that supply the Jarrahdale township; and
- (m) when are the water tanks that supply the Jarrahdale township due to be replaced?
