- (c) what reasons does the Minister, and/or the Industry, give for the reduction in rates;
- (d) did the Minister consider the impact on Councils and therefore ratepayers in a reduction of rates? If yes, what explanation does the Minister give to ratepayers in Western Australia for the cost shift? If not, why not; and
- (e) Is the Government planning to compensate cities such as the City of Karratha for the reduction of rates granted for FIFO camps?
