WEDNESDAY, 18 AUGUST 2010

1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 12.00 noon pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

Prayers were read.

2. Petitions

Live Animal Trade – Ms L.L. Baker presented a petition from 770 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly investigate the live animal trade with a view to recommending a timeframe for replacement by the export of chilled or frozen carcasses (P. 312).

Plastic Shopping Bags – Mr M.P. Whitley presented a petition from 13 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly ban the use of plastic shopping bags in the State of Western Australia by supporting a private member’s bill which will be introduced by the State Opposition (P. 313).

That this House condemns the Minister for Water for his mismanagement of issues relating to the position of Director General of the Department of Water, specifically:

- (a) misleading the House when claiming to have reprimanded Mr Taylor on numerous occasions prior to him being removed from that position; and
- (b) not complying with appropriate public sector standards in relation to the appointment of the Acting Director General of this department.
