1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 9.00 a.m. pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

Prayers were read.

2. Petition

The Speaker advised members that a personal explanation should be short, concise and confined to an explanation of matters affecting the member personally and was not an opportunity to debate a matter or respond to earlier debates. The Speaker advised that personal explanations had been used, for example, to explain personal circumstances, to correct errors and sometimes to apologise to the House. The Speaker advised that the Chair needed to hear some of the explanation to determine whether it fit within the guidelines and the explanation should therefore be heard in silence.

12. Speaker's Statement – Points of Order

The Speaker advised members that a point of order was not an opportunity for a member to continue the debate on the matter before the House and that a point of order should be short, concise and confined to the procedural issue. The Speaker advised a member who persisted in raising points of order to respond to debate may be called to order and would be directed to resume their seat and, in serious or repetitious cases, the member may not be again recognised for some time in relation to seeking a point of order.

13. Questions
