1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 9.00 a.m. pursuant to adjournment.

Laverton Pre-Primary School – Ms W.M. Duncan presented a petition from 58 persons requesting the Legislative Assembly immediately halt plans to move the Laverton Pre-Primary facility from its existing location and to enter into consultation with the local community regarding a suitable site (P. 418).

Early Childhood Centres – Ms S. McGurk presented a petition from 2436 persons asking the Legislative Assembly to call on the Liberal Government to give community-based early childhood centres and the families that rely on them certainty and reverse the decision to cut the accommodation assistance (P. 419).

Train Manufacturing – Ms R. Saffioti presented a petition from 2758 persons asking the Legislative Assembly to urge the Government to insist that trains are built in Western Australia to maximise local opportunity and create jobs for the future (P. 420).
