2240. Dr A.D. Buti to the Minister for Police:

I refer to the Minister's answer to my Question on Notice (No. 1910) in which you confirmed that there has been changes in the last 12 months with the police procedures for collating Domestic Violence statistics, and ask:

- (a) what are the details of each of these changes;
- (b) what dates were each of the changes implemented; and
- (c) for each of the changes, do these changes apply State-wide or are they restricted to certain areas/regions, and if the latter, can the Minister please provide details of these areas/regions?

2241. Mr R.H. Cook to the Minister for Health:

I refer to Central Referral Service (CRS) introduced at the start of the year for all General Practitioners (GPs) and private specialists referring patients for their initial specialist outpatients in the public health system and ask:

- (a) how much money was originally allocated by WA Health to establish the CRS;
- (b) what has been the actual total cost of the CRS to WA Health to date;
- (c) is it true that obstetric services have reverted back to GPs referring directly to hospitals after only one month of participating in the CRS, and if so why;
- (d) are any other outpatient services no longer participating in CRS;
- (e) can you provide the average turn-around times for processing referrals under both the old system, and under CRS; and

- (f) is the CRS system capable of processing paperless (completely electronic) referrals from all General Practices software systems to all Western Australian public hospitals, including those still using Topas?

2242. Mr F.M. Logan to the Minister for Training and Workforce Development:

I refer to student enrolments at state training providers and ask:

- (a) for each State Training Provider and each registered training organisation that is not a State Training Provider, how many male and how many female students were enrolled in 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013;
- (b) for each State Training Provider and each registered training organisation that is not a State Training Provider, for the years 2012 and 2013, how many male students and how many female students were granted a concession to the full fee rate, in accordance with the VET Fees and Charges Policy 2012 or 2013;
- (c) how many male students and how many female students, at each State Training Provider and each registered training organisation that is not a State Training Provider, for the years 2012 and 2013, have indicated they:
 - hold a Pensioner Concession Card, or;
 - hold a Repatriation Health Benefits Card, issued by the Department of Veterans' Affairs, or;
 - hold a Health Care Card;
- (d) how many male students and how many female students, at each State Training Provider and each registered training organisation that is not a State Training Provider, for the years 2012 and 2013, have indicated they are person or a dependent of a person in receipt of:
 - AUSTUDY, or;
 - ABSTUDY, or;
 - Youth Allowance;
- (e) how many male students and how many female students, at each State Training Provider and each registered training organisation that is not a State Training Provider, for the years 2012 and 2013, are inmates of a custodial institution;
- (f) how many male students and how many female students, at each State Training Provider and each registered training organisation that is not a State Training Provider, for the years 2012 and 2013, have reached the age of 15 but have not yet reached 18 years of age, and who are not due to reach 18 years of age in the year in which they were enrolled;
- (g) how many students, for the years, 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013, entered into a payments plan with their State Training Provider in order to pay student course fees; and
- (h) for the years 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013, for each State Training Provider, how many students defaulted or were unable to fulfill the obligations of their payment plans?

2243. Mr F.M. Logan to the Minister for Training and Workforce Development:

I refer to secondary school students undertaking vocational education and training (VET), and ask:

- (a) in terms of all VET delivered for secondary schools, provide details of:
 - (i) sources of funding;
 - (ii) programs for which the funding is used; and
 - (iii) institutions of delivery and/or auspicing;

- (b) for each State Training Provider, for the years: 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013, through the Delivery and Performance Agreements:
 - (i) what was the funding given to provide VET for secondary school students; and
 - (ii) how many Student Curriculum hours does this funding equate to;
- (c) is the government planning to increase the amounts allocated to each of the State Training Providers via the Delivery and Performance Agreements, to provide VET for secondary school students in 2014;
- (d) for the years: 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013, what was the total funding given to Secondary Schools to provide VET for secondary school students, and what were the sources of this funding;
- (e) for the years: 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013, what was the funding given to each Secondary School to provide VET for secondary school students, and what were the sources of this funding;
- (f) according to the State Training Plan 2013–2016, the Department of Training and Workforce Development and the Department of Education, in collaboration, were to conduct a strategic review of VET in schools, and ask:
 - (i) what were the outcomes of this review;
 - (ii) what is the revised VET in schools policy; and
 - (iii) will the Minister table the relevant reports;
- (g) given the Minister has stated that the new Western Australian Certificate of Education requires a student to achieve either an ATAR or a Certificate II:
 - (i) has the Minister's department identified the difficulties for the Department of Education and the training sector in achieving these outcomes; and
 - (ii) if yes, what are the difficulties and what are the processes put in place to address them;
- (h) for the years 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, in both public and private schools, how many year 11 and 12 students were enrolled in:
 - ATAR courses, or;
 - general courses, or;
 - VET courses, or;
 - a combination of the above;
- (i) for each of the catalogues listed in (h), are the enrolment numbers expected to change in 2014, 2015 and 2016, and if so, what are the expected changes; and
- (j) in 2014 will any student be enrolled in general courses, or, will all students be enrolled in either ATAR courses, VET courses or a combination of both?
