5. Legislative Assembly Standing Committees

The Leader of the House, pursuant to notice, moved,

That for the present Parliament –

- (1) the Procedure and Privileges Committee consists of the Speaker and the members for Kalgoorlie, Butler, Midland and Swan Hills;
- (2) the Public Accounts Committee consists of the members for Alfred Cove, Bateman, Belmont, Victoria Park and Cannington;
- (3) the Community Development and Justice Standing Committee consists of the members for Armadale, Balcatta, Collie-Preston, Girrawheen and Morley;
- (4) the Economics and Industry Standing Committee consists of the members for Cockburn, Geraldton, Joondalup, North West Central and Willagee; and
- (5) the Education and Health Standing Committee consists of the members for Eyre, Forrestfield, Hillarys, Mirrabooka and West Swan.

7. Joint Standing Committee on the Corruption and Crime Commission

- (1) for the present Parliament, in accordance with Legislative Assembly Standing Orders 288 to 292, a Joint Standing Committee on the Corruption and Crime Commission be appointed by the Legislative Assembly and the Legislative Council; and
- (2) the Legislative Assembly requests the Legislative Council to agree to a similar resolution.

8. Joint Standing Committee on the Commissioner for Children and Young People

The Leader of the House, pursuant to notice, moved,

- (1) That for the present Parliament –

- (a) pursuant to section 51 of the *Commissioner for Children and Young People Act 2006*, a Joint Standing Committee on the Commissioner for Children and Young People be appointed by the Legislative Assembly and the Legislative Council;
- (b) the Joint Standing Committee shall comprise of 2 members appointed by the Legislative Assembly and 2 members appointed by the Legislative Council;
- (c) it is the function of the Joint Standing Committee to –
 - (i) monitor, review and report to Parliament on the exercise of the functions of the Commissioner for Children and Young People;
 - (ii) to examine Annual and other Reports of the Commissioner; and
 - (iii) to consult regularly with the Commissioner;
- (d) a report of the Joint Standing Committee will be presented to the Legislative Assembly and the Legislative Council by members of the Joint Standing Committee nominated by it for that purpose; and
- (e) the Standing Orders of the Legislative Assembly relating to Standing and Select Committees will be followed as far as they can be applied.

- (2) That the Legislative Assembly requests the Legislative Council to agree to a similar resolution.

Debate ensued.

9. Queen Elizabeth II Medical Centre Amendment Bill 2013

That a bill for “An Act to amend the *Queen Elizabeth II Medical Centre Act 1966*.” be introduced and read a first time.
