Page 8, lines 24 and 25 – To delete "does not have confidence in the prison officer's suitability" and substitute:

" has determined that the prison officer is not a fit and proper person ".

Page 9, lines 13 and 14 – To delete "does not have confidence in a prison officer's suitability to continue as" and substitute:

" determines that the person is not a fit and proper person to be"

Page 10, lines 7 to 10 – To delete the lines and substitute:

Mr B.S. Wyatt moved,

That the House refers the Premier to the Procedure and Privileges Committee to examine whether the Premier misled the House in respect of his statements regarding:

- (1) The existence of any link between the decision to sell public land to Burswood Nominees Limited and the decisions surrounding the location of the proposed new Burswood Stadium.
- (2) The requirement of Burswood Nominees Limited to consent to the Barnett Government developing the proposed new Stadium at the Burswood Peninsula.
- (3) That the Committee reports back to the Parliament by 6 May 2014.
